FRESH STRAWBERRY PIE

2 c. sugar
2 c. water
1 sm. pkg. Strawberry Jello
5½ T. flour
Red food coloring if desired

Cook above mixture until clear and syrupy. Let cool. Add 2 pints sliced strawberries to cooled mixture. Pour into baked pie shells. Top with cool whip or ice cream. Garnish with strawberries.

QUICK AND EASY COBBLER

1 c. water
½ c. sugar
½ stick oleo

Boil above ingredients. Pour over a frozen fruit pie which has been broken into chunks. Bake 350 degrees until bubbly and brown.

GREEN ENCHILADAS

1 lb. ground beef
1 t. salt
¼ t. garlic, minced
Brown lightly
1 can cream of chicken soup
¾ c. evaporated milk
½ lb. velveeta cheese
Heat until cheese is melted
1 pkg. green onion dip mix
1 small can chopped green chiles
1 small jar pimientos
Add to cheese mixture.
½ lb. longhorn cheese, grated
1 c. chopped onion
Add to meat.
1 doz. tortillas, softened in corn oil.

Fill each tortilla with meat mixture, roll tightly and place in shallow 8x10 dish. Pour cheese sauce over tortillas. Cover with foil and bake 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

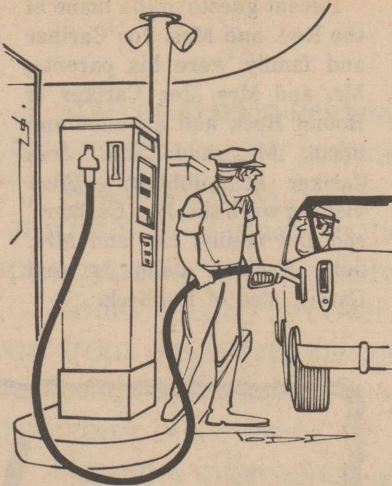

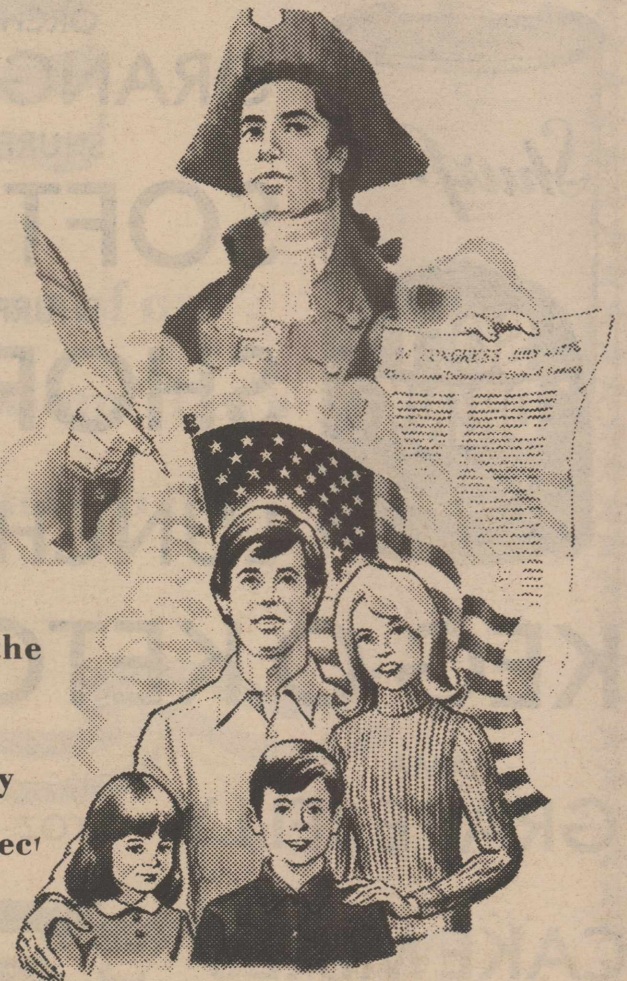
