Midwest Electric Manager, set to give the annual address at 9:00 p.m. Mr. Ammons served as the General Manager of Midwest Electric Cooperative for 28½ years before resigning in July, 1976 to accept the position of General Manager of Tri-County Electric Cooperative,

at Azle, Texas. He assumed duties at Tri-County in August, 1976 and remained there until his retirement in March, 1983. In October, 1983, Mr. Ammons retirement was interrupted when the board of directors of Fort Belknap Electric Cooperative, Inc. at Olney, Texas persuaded him to serve as interim General Manager until they had time to

select a permanent manager. In December 1983 the board hired a permanent manager and Mr. Ammons again retired on December 31, 1983. Johnnie and his wife, Ethel, have been busy the past several months visiting children, relatives and traveling the country in their new mobile recreation unit.

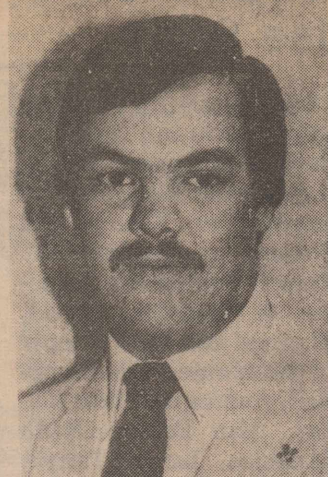
A native of Fisher County, Kemp has a B.S.

Rotan Season Tickets Are Still Available

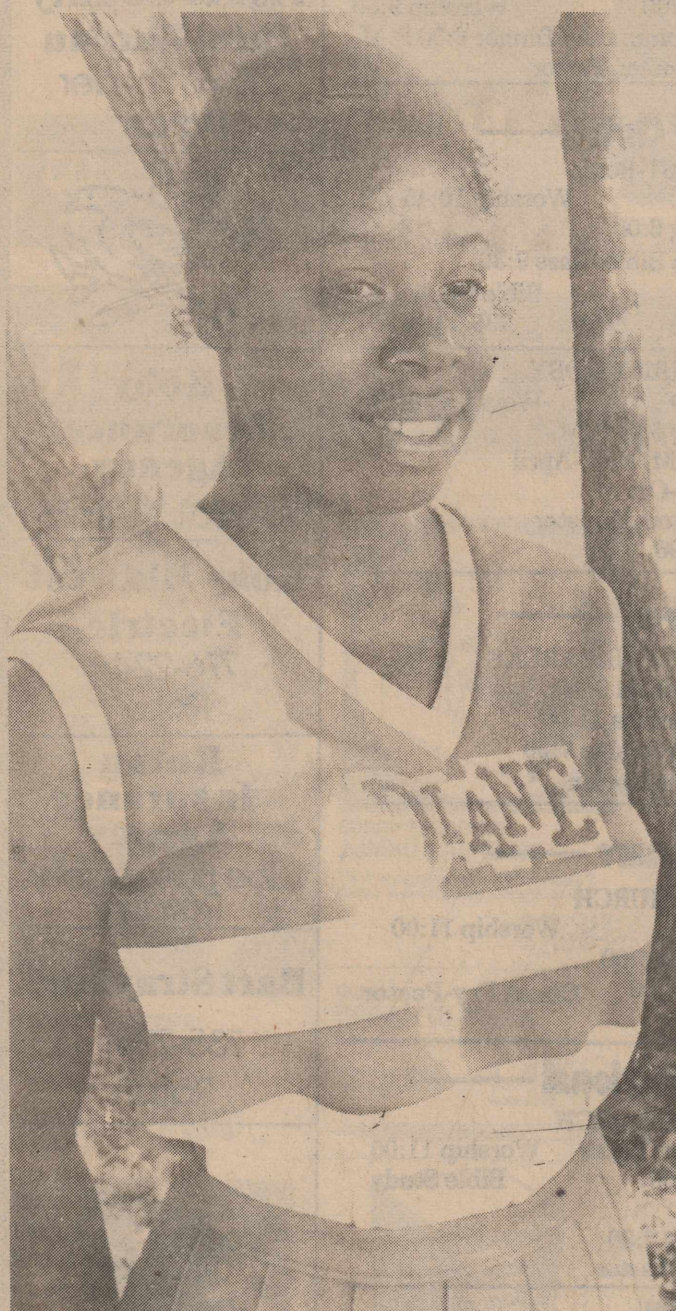

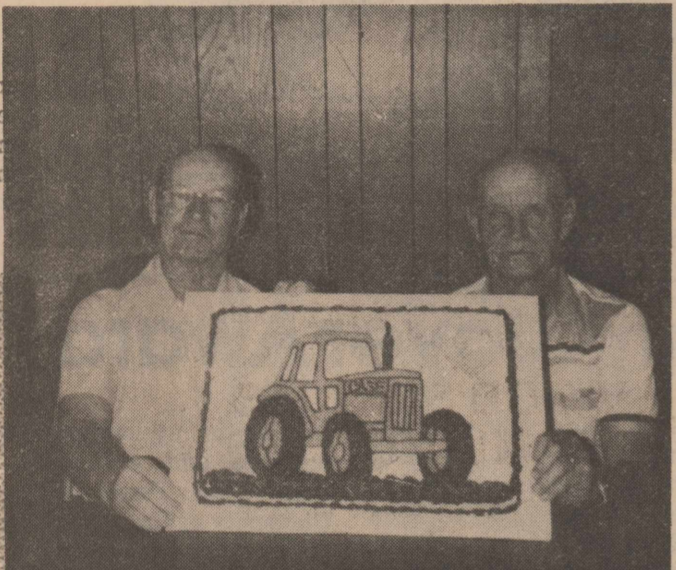

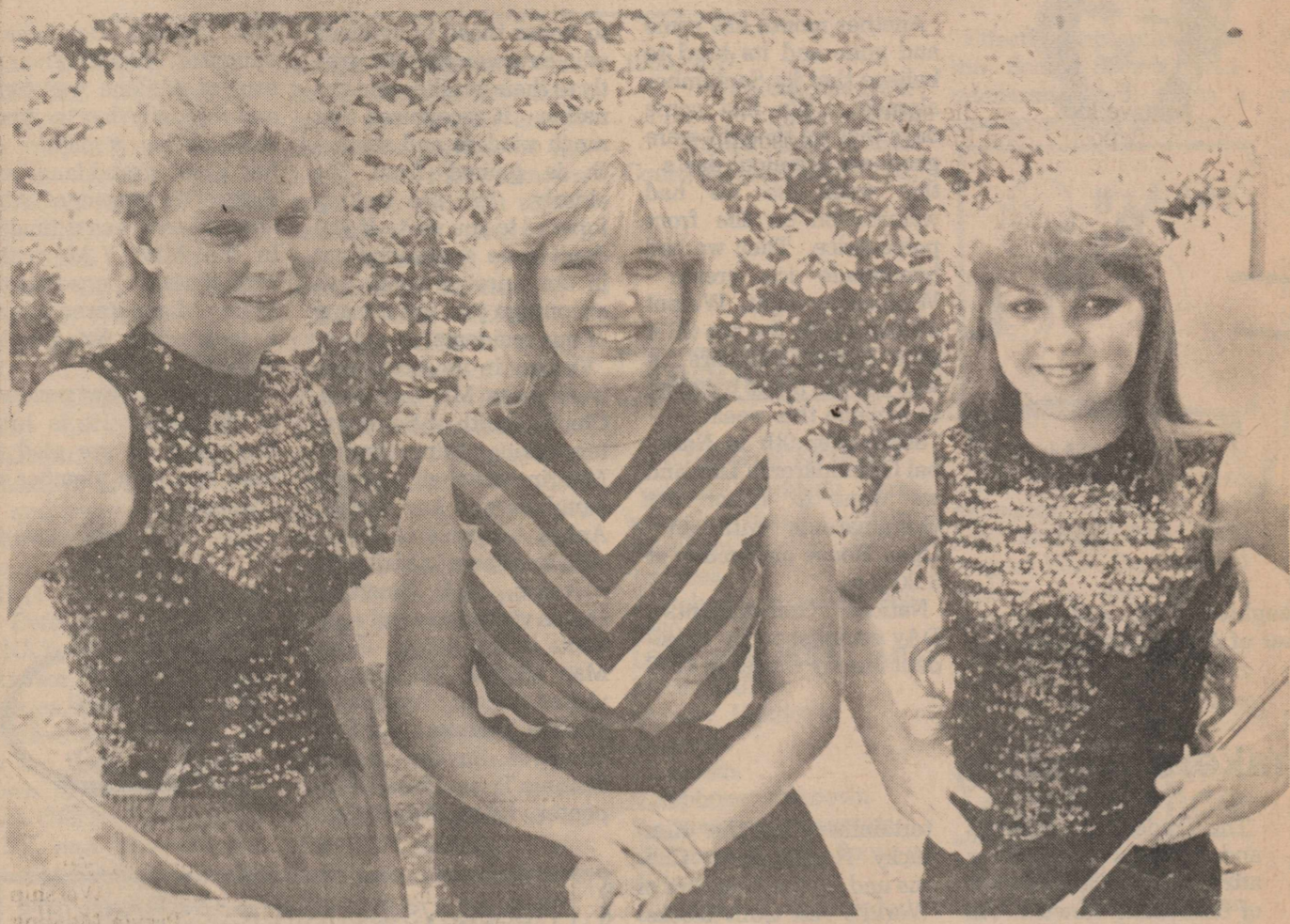

CROP INSURANCE PROCEEDS

Many individuals will receive payments of crop insurance proceeds during 1984. The law generally provides that cash basis taxpayers must include these proceeds in gross income for the year in which these payments are received.

However, given a proper set of circumstances, the reporting of these proceeds for income tax purposes can be deferred to the next year. The law provides that a cash basis taxpayer can elect to include crop insurance proceeds in gross income for the tax year following the year of damage or destruction provided he normally would have reported income from the crop in that following year.

For example, suppose you receive crop insurance payments during 1984 on a failed cotton crop. If you can establish that normally you would have received and reported the income from that cotton crop in 1985, then you can elect to report the income from the crop insurance in 1985.

To make the income-deferring election, you must file a statement on a timely filed return affirmatively electing the special break. The statement should also list the crops damaged, the cause of the damage, the name of the paying insurance company, and the total amount of payments received.

If you have received or will receive crop insurance payments during 1984, you should consult your tax advisor concerning the possibility of deferring the reporting of those proceeds for tax purposes until 1985.

Dickson urged active participation stating "your voice and support will help make the Rotan Booster Club an organization dedicated to making all athletic events a meaningful learning experience for our youth."

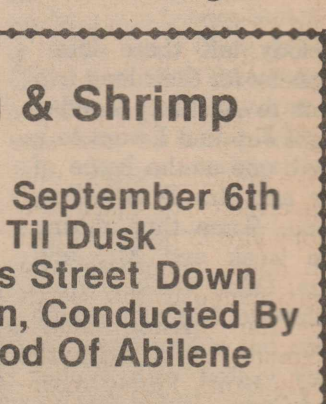

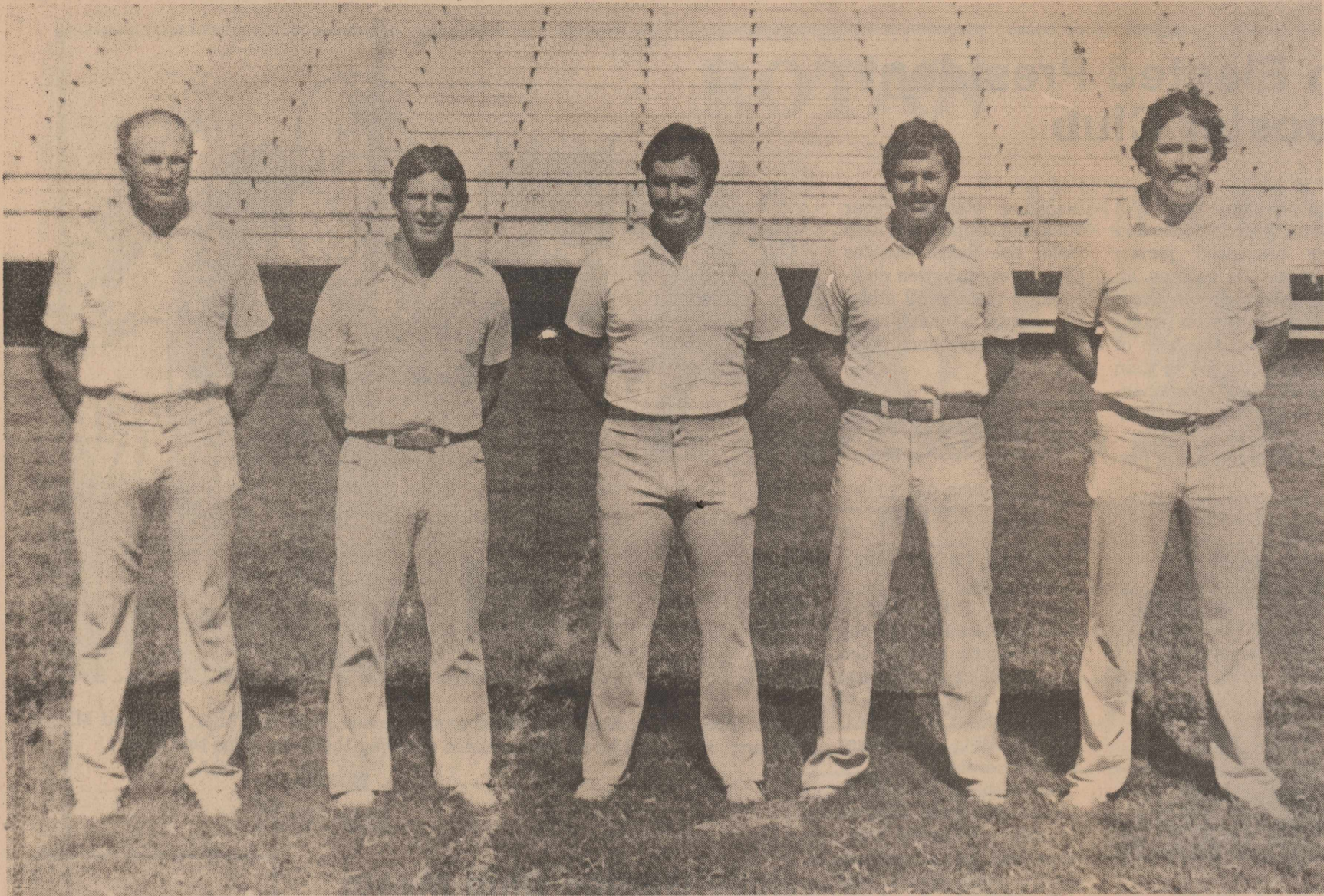

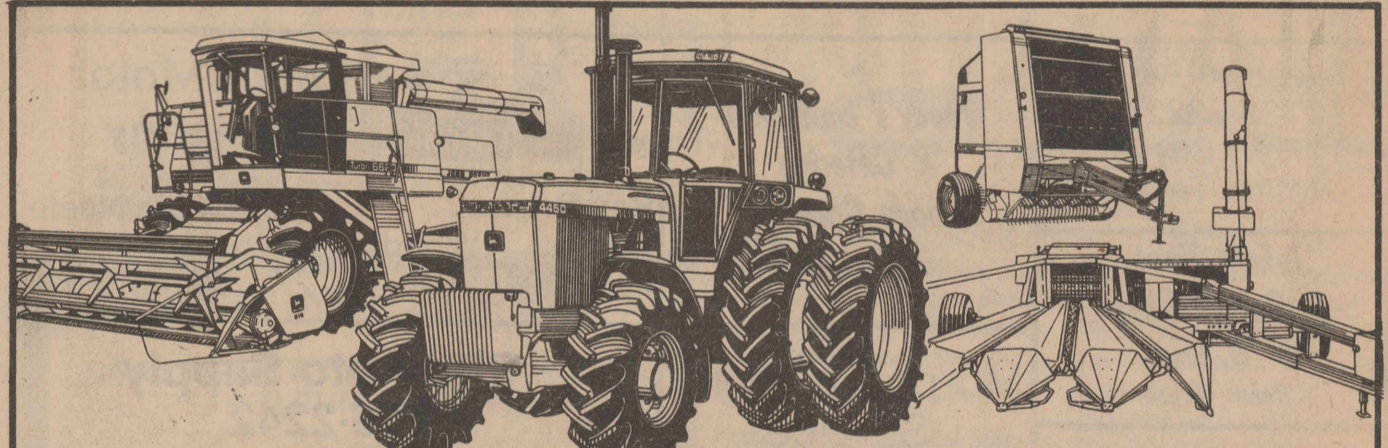

Social Security Administration Begins New Program

Practically all individuals who receive Social Security or Supplemental Security Income benefits on behalf of a beneficiary will be required to account for the use of those benefits.

The Social Security Administration is responsible for selecting representatives payees for beneficiaries who are unable to

manage their own funds. In most cases these beneficiaries are under 18 years of age, but payees are also selected for adults who are physically or mentally incapable of making best use of the benefits.

Once a representative payee is selected, Social Security has a responsi-

bility to see that the payee administers the benefits in the beneficiary's best interest.

Approximately 200,000 accounting forms will be mailed each month to representative payees.

This form must be completed and returned by the date specified on the form. The payee will indicate how the money was used to meet the beneficiary's needs and that any funds not used are saved for the beneficiary in a manner that assures the beneficiary's interest.

Those who don't respond for the request to account will be personally contacted by a Social Security representative.

Beginning in September, 1984 the Rotan Independent School District will provide tutoring sessions for students having difficulties in the classrooms. 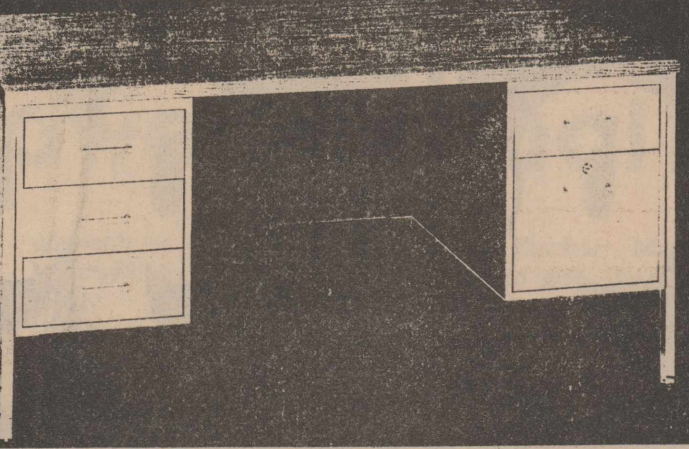
