GENERAL PATTON IS WORSE

HEIDELBERG, Germany, Dec. 21 (AP)—Condition of General Patton has taken a turn for the worse due to pulmonary infection and the outlook is grave, the medical bulletin at the army hospital said today.

MACARTHUR SAYS NO ROW WITH SOVIETS

TOKYO, Japan, Dec. 21 (AP)—General MacArthur today denied broadcast reports that his headquarters was embroiled with the Russians over the assignment of Soviet occupation troops to Japan and that MacArthur threatened to resign.

MASARYK IMPATIENT WITH POLAND, HUNGARY

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia, Dec. 21 (AP)—Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk expressed impatience with Poland and Hungary today, declaring emphatically that Czechoslovakia would cede no territory to either country.

He charged Poles with terrorizing Czech population in former German territory and said Hungary had failed to live up to agreements and hinted Czechoslovakia might have territorial demands for its own.

GENERAL GEORGE S. PATTON DIED

HEIDELBERG, Germany, Dec. 21 (AP)—General George S. Patton, Jr., colorful American General who spearheaded the sensational Allied dash across France and Germany, died today.

Death came to one of the most colorful World War II leaders after his heart was affected by lung complications developed after his neck was broken in a motor accident a week ago.

STATE SCHOOLS' VET CASH OKEH

Attorney General Answers Dr. Painter by Saying That Veterans Administration Can Pay

AUSTIN, Dec. 20—(P)—In answer to an opinion requested by Dr. T. S. Painter, acting president of the University of Texas, the attorney general has ruled Texas institutions of higher learning can legally receive from the veterans administration payment for furnishing education and training to veterans of World War II.

Under provisions of a law passed by the last legislature, schools can receive amounts up to \$100 a semester from the veterans administration.

Attorney General Grover Sellers in an opinion released yesterday said:

"If the maximum rate is prohibited by federal law for any particular class of ex-serviceman or woman, then the tuition rate may be such as agreed to by the governing boards of the state institutions providing they are not less than the established rates for civilian students nor less than the estimated cost of tuition."
