August Draft Calls Told For County

August draft calls for Eastland County include one induction and five pre-inductions, according to Mrs. Jewell Reeves, secretary to the Texas Local Board No. 36, Selective Service System.

The state quota for Texas draft boards in August calls for 552 men, Colonel Morris S. Schwartz, state Selective Service director, said.

The state's August call of 552 compares with a quota of 349 for July and 187 for June. The August call is the state's share of a national quota of 12,000, all for the Army.

Colonel Schwartz also announced pre-induction physical and mental examinations for 1,500 men in August.

Local board quotas for the August call already have been figured and sent to the state's 137 local boards.

The August quota will be filled with men who are at least 22 years old on August 1, except volunteers and those legally termed delinquent under the draft law, who may be younger.

All males are required to register under the draft law on their 18th birthday or within five days thereafter.

County To See Large Amount Of REA Loan

The Rural Electrification Administration recently announced approval of a \$659,000 loan to the Comanche County Electric Cooperative Association.

The loan will finance 6.0 miles of distribution line to serve 483 customers, to build 25 miles of tin line, finance system improvements including the conversion of 60 miles of existing line to higher capacity, and to provide reimbursements of general funds expended for construction, which were previously approved.

Counties served by the Comanche County Electric Cooperative Association include Eastland, Brown, Callahan, Comanche, Miles, Shackelford, and Stephens.

A large amount of the loan will be spent in Eastland County and also the surrounding areas.

The Association has borrowed a total of \$4,208,000.00 and has repaid in principle, \$1,600,000.00 plus over \$800,000.00 in interest.

Approximately \$400,000.00 of the repaid amount was done so ahead of schedule.

Membership equity in REA totals approximately 20 percent.

Liquor Raids Are Held In Ranger

His wife is the former Beth Chastain, who was born in Merkel, and came to Eastland with her father, an attorney, during the oil boom in 1917.

The Terrells moved to Eastland Oct. 1, 1960, and Mr. Terrell, in addition to his work on the gas measurement manual, has devoted a great deal of time to the raising of paint burros.

The Terrells do not have any children.

L. E. Corbell, 62, Killed In One-Car Wreck Thursday

Funeral services for Louie Edward Corbell, 62, of Eastland who was fatally injured in a one-car accident Thursday at 12:05 p. m., were held Saturday at 2 p. m. in the Hamner Funeral Chapel, with Dr. Cyrus Barcus, Methodist minister, officiating.

Interment was in the DeLeon Cemetery. Rev. B. J. Manley was in charge of graveside rites.

Mr. Corbell was fatally injured when his car overturned about 13 miles southeast of here, in the Kokomo Community. He was alone in the car when the accident occurred.

An Eastland resident for 20 years, Mr. Corbell was employed as butcher at the Worth Food Store in Cisco. He was formerly employed with the Ernest Frozen Food Co. here.

He was born in DeLeon on Sept. 5, 1901 and was married to Margaret Hudson in Eastland on Jan. 19, 1934. He lived at 310 N. Dixie.

According to Highway Patrolmen who investigated the accident, he became the fourth person killed in highway accidents in the state since the holiday death count began.

Surviving are his wife; one son, Dickie, of Eastland; one daughter, Mrs. D. W. Donegan of Fort Worth; two brothers, H. W. and Leon, both of Fort Worth; two sisters, Mrs. Nettie Pittman of DeLeon and Mrs. Bertha Butler of Odessa.

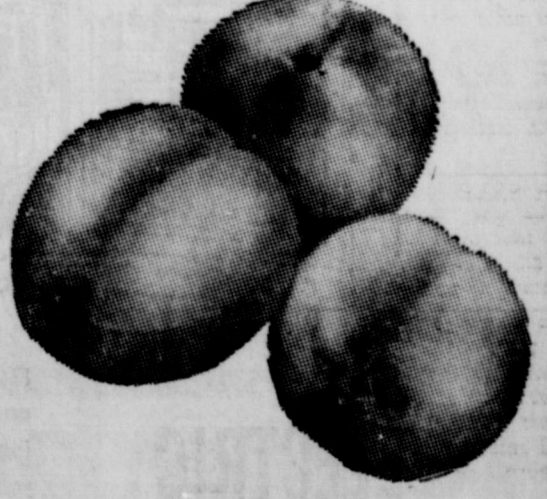

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — A veteran has asked me as his personal physician to get a report of the VA x-ray and laboratory studies made at a recent examination. How can I get this information from the VA?

A — You may secure Form 3288 from the Veterans Administration which will authorize the release of information from the veteran's records. Or the veteran concerned may send to the VA a written statement granting permission to release the information to the doctor.

Q — Are members of my immediate family eligible for VA hospitalization?

A — Veterans only are eligible to receive care in a VA hospital. First priority goes to veterans with service-connected disabilities; after that Service men without service-connected disabilities who are unable to pay for hospital care.
