Lay Witness Program Concluded Sunday

The Lay-Witness meeting sponsored by three Lorraine churches, The First United Methodist, Lorraine Gospel Mission and First Baptist, proved to be a great "success" and was climaxed with a three-hour evaluation service at the First Baptist Church Sunday night at 7 o'clock.

Plans for the three-day "witness" began three months ago when the three churches voted to sponsor this new way of revival. Ralston Bruce was appointed General Chairman.

Herman Maule of Lamesa was Co-Ordinator and Mrs. Maule, pianist. Cramer Goad of Hurst was song leader and Ricky Petty of Carrollton was Youth Leader. Mr. Maule came to the meeting as a Witness, but was met with the word that Co-Ordinator Mack Burdette was in the hospital and had sent word for him to take his place as Co-Ordinator.

The three-day services began with a 24-hour Prayer Vigil from 3 p.m. Thursday to 3 p.m. Friday.

Witnesses began to arrive at 4 p.m. Friday and were met by their respective hosts. The witnesses held their team sessions before each service.

All meals were served at the school cafeteria, returning to the Methodist Church for services which opened with Mr. Maule presiding and calling on witnesses to give testimonies. The youth, led by Ricky Petty, then went to the Baptist Church for their session and adults assembled in group meetings led by two or more members of the team.

Saturday at 10 a.m. eight homes were open for coffee when two or more members of the team met with groups for coffee and cookies after which they directed the group in a sharing session. Sunday team members met with Sunday School classes in the churches, directing the talks, before the general meeting at the First Methodist Church when Mr. Maule gave his testimony of how the Lord had led in his life.

Jerry DuBose of Hale Center and Aaron DuBose from Denton brought special music at each service and the morning hour closed with a commitment service.

After the noon meal, farewells were said by the team members, 37 of them, and the Sunday night services at the First Baptist Church was presided over by Mr. Bruce when 49 adults and young people gave their testimony in words and four in song as to the blessings they received during the meeting.

Mr. and Mrs. Jerry DuBose of Denton, though not members of the team, were guests in the Royce Mahon home and attended all services giving their witness. Others were present from Colorado City and Roscoe.

Ralston Bruce takes this way to say Thanks to the three pastors, to women who prepared and served the food, to all who helped in any way to make this three-day meeting the success it was.

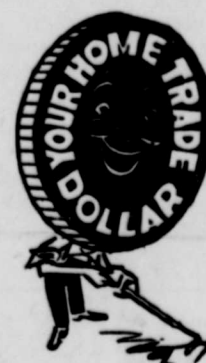
The Coffees and Mrs. Vannoy planned to attend the Palo Duro Canyon pageant Tuesday night as they were en route to Colorado.
