ANOTHER "LOONEY."

Dr. Hickey Stricken with Insanity.

Yesterday a well dressed and prepossessing man entered the Menger Hotel

and among other irregularities smashed a wash-bowl to pieces. This caused his

arrest, when it was discovered that he was demented in mind. He was taken

before Judge Dwyer, who sent him to the poorhouse to await instructions from

his brother, a wealthy citizen of Buffalo, New York, who was telegraphed the

facts in the case. The unfortunate man's name is Hickey,

and he is a physician. He came to this country for his health, and became

embarrassed in his finances. He remained with a friend in the country a few

miles from the city for some time, but at last became dissatisfied and came to the

city. Father Johnson, learning of his condition, very generously sent him to the

Santa Rosa Hospital, paying the expenses out of his own private means, but

yesterday Hickey became deranged, and suddenly got into his head that some one

at the hospital was going to murder him. He left the hospital and went to the

are some who claim that the burns were not sufficient of themselves to produce

death so soon; that another agency, other than fire, was at least partially responsible
