



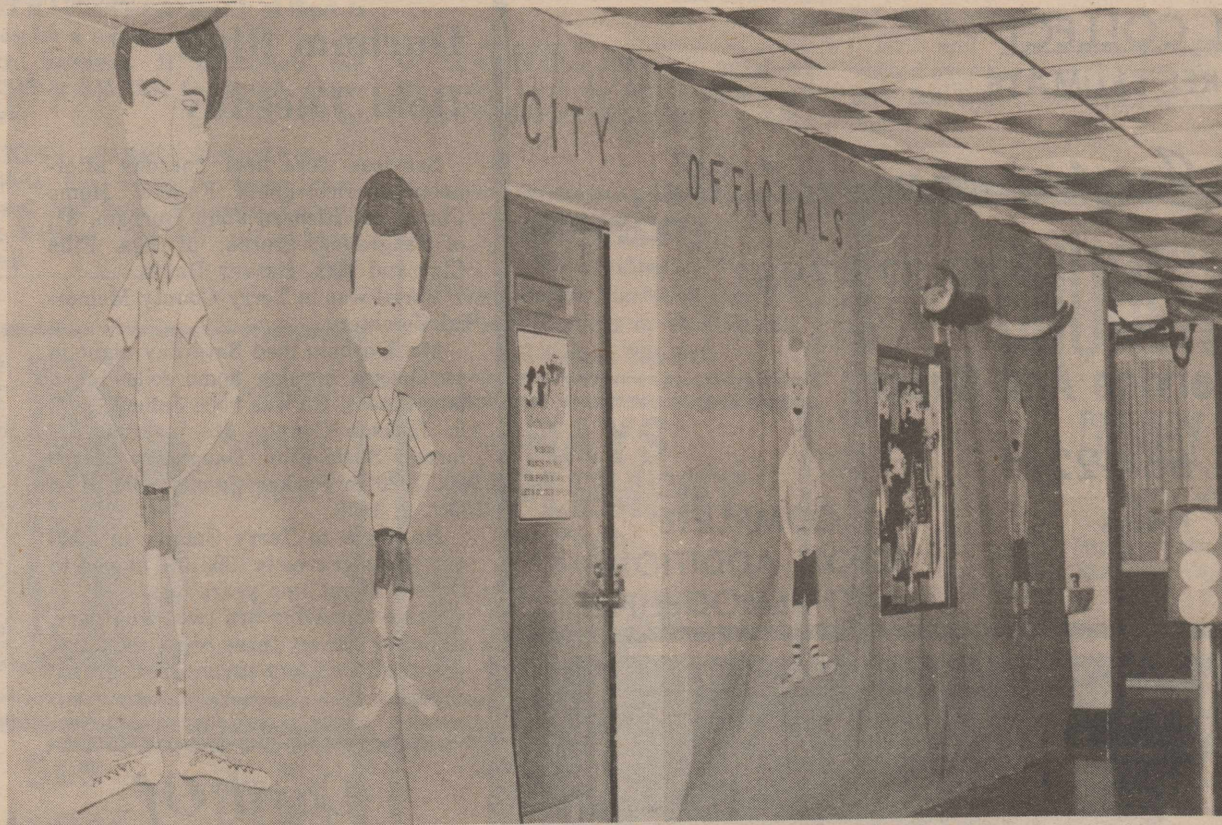

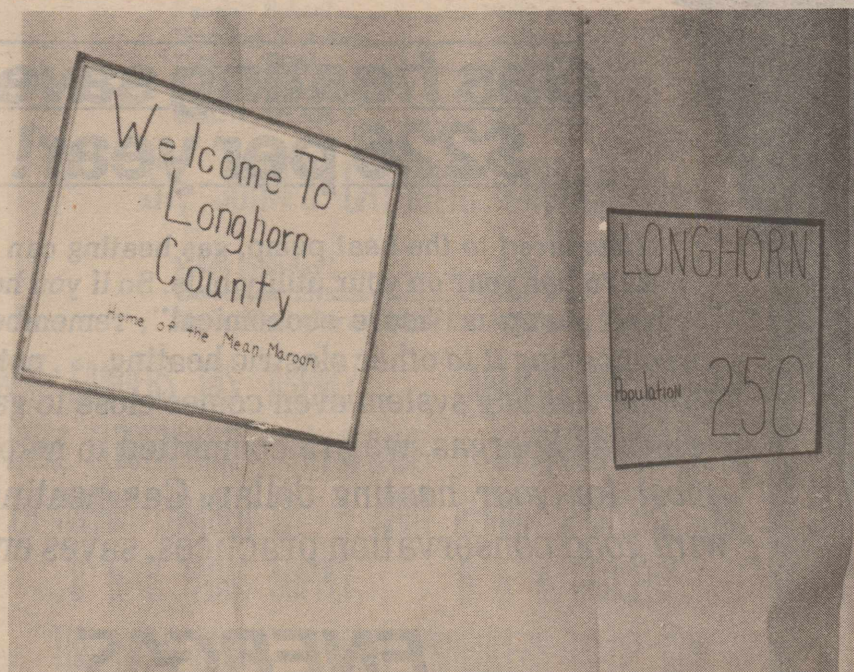

Cook Of The Week

Recipes are shared this week with a young teacher-homemaker who is still very much a newcomer to the community. Elaine and Kerry Seiwert moved to Hart just before school started after she was employed to teach at Hart High School.

SAUSAGE AND BLACK BEANS

2 lb sausage
3 lg garlic cloves
2 c cooked beans
1 t salt

1/2 t pepper

8 oz elbow macaroni, cooked
Brown sausage with garlic. Drain. Stir in undrained beans, salt and pepper. Simmer 10 mins. Toss with hot macaroni.

DINNER ROLLS

2 1/2 c flour
1 t baking powder
1 t salt
1/4 c sugar
1/2 c warm water
1 pkg dry yeast
1 c buttermilk

Dissolve yeast in warm water and set aside. Mix dry ingredients in given order. Cut in shortening. Stir in buttermilk and yeast-water. Blend thoroughly.

Dough may be refrigerated in large covered bowl, or made into rolls.

Turn dough onto floured board and knead lightly. Roll out and cut with biscuit cutter. Place on greased pan. Let rolls rise slightly (if they have been refrigerated, allow more time). Bake at 400° until lightly browned.

BUTTERSCOTCH CARAMEL PIE

1 10-inch baked pie shell
2/3 c brown sugar (packed)
2 T cornstarch

1/8 t salt
2 c milk
2 egg yolks, slightly beaten
2 T butter or margarine
1 t vanilla
20 caramel candies

Blend sugar, cornstarch and salt in 2-qt saucepan. Combine milk and egg yolks, gradually stir into sugar mixture. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens and boils.

Stir in caramels, 2 or 3 at a time, until all are completely melted. Allow

mixture to boil approximately 3 mins. until thickened. Remove from heat. Stir in butter and vanilla. Pour into pie shell. Top with meringue. Bake at 400° for approximately 10 mins. until a delicate brown.

Longhorns Hand Valley

Loss In 'Sweet Victory,' 23-7

After an off week, the Hart Longhorns traveled up the road to face the undefeated Valley Patriots. At night's end, the Scrappy Longhorns had showed a lot of heart and determination in a very sweet, but tough 23-7 victory. The win at Valley upped the Longhorn record to 2-2 for the year.

After taking the opening kickoff and making one first down, the Longhorns were forced to punt. Valley moved from its own 17 to Hart's 18, but the Longhorns defense stiffened, forcing the Patriots to give the ball up on downs.

Midway through the second quarter the Longhorns got their offense rolling from the 35 yard line. With good line blocking and key runs from Alex Carrasco and Coy Myrick, Hart had a first down at the Patriots' 25 yard line. QB Derek Rich then hit Jorge Barretero for a 25 yard scoring toss with 6:53 remaining in the half. Clay Barnes added the PAT giving Hart a 7-0 lead.

Valley took the ensuing kickoff and drove to the Longhorns' 4 yard line. The big play was a 47 yard pass from Richey Fuston to Kevin Hendrix. Hendrix was run out of bounds at the four by David Hernandez. Not willing to give up, the Longhorns dug in and held the Patriots for four downs.

At the half the scoreboard still read Hart 7 and Valley 0.

Valley came out "all fired up" to begin the second half of play. Taking the ball at their own 28 yard line following the kickoff, the Patriots found paydirt in only two plays. Hendrix reeled off 21 yards on the first play from scrimmage and followed it with a 51 yard touchdown run. Hendrix then added the PAT, which tied the ballgame, with only 27 seconds left in the third quarter.

Unable to move after the kickoff, Hart gave the ball back to Valley at their own 31 yard line. From here the Patriots moved to Hart's 14 yard line. Facing fourth down and less than a yard, the Longhorn defense stopped Hendrix thus adding more frustration to the Valley offensive unit.

Hart then mounted a good drive of its own. Aided by good runs from Alex Carrasco and Bobby Valadez, the Longhorns got as close as the 20 yard line before the Patriots intercepted a Hart aerial in the end zone, ending the third quarter with the score still knotted at 7.

Midway through the final period Hart was forced to punt from the 50 yard line. Punter Derek Rich got off a booming, high punt. Valley tried to field the punt at the one yard line. However, good coverage by Jorge Barretero, Dale Scott, and Abel Reyna forced a fumble and Jorge Barretero recovered it in the end zone for a Longhorn score. Bobby Valadez ran for two points to give Hart a 15-7 lead with 5:23 remaining in the ballgame.

Hart, now feeling victory, held the Patriots twice in a row. With less than three minutes left, Bobby Valadez circled left end, broke a tackle at the line of scrimmage and went the 25 remaining yards for the touchdown that iced the game. Coy Myrick added the final two points to push the score to its 23-7 margin and a Hart victory.

"It was a big win for our youngsters and our program," commented head coach Ken Hoskins. "Our specialty team played super throughout the game, especially Derek's punting. This win was truly a team effort." Coach Hoskins added that the offensive line had made great improvement over the past two weeks allowing us to hold onto the football, and not giving the Patriots' explosive offense too many opportunities to score.

Hart will meet Olton on Friday, October 9 in Longhorn Stadium at 8 p.m. It will be the Longhorns' Homecoming, so come out and watch your Longhorns in action.

8-2 To Valley

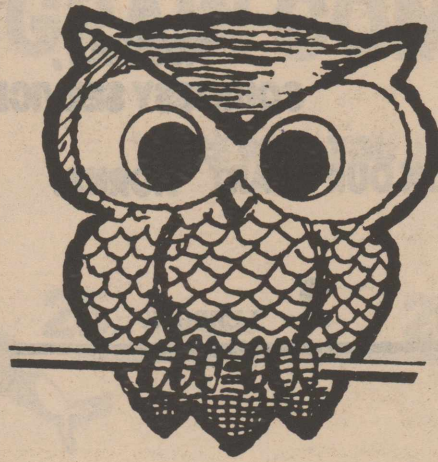
