

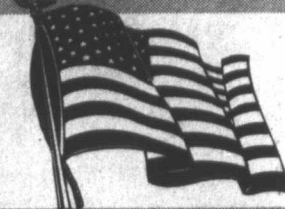

Children: Start your turtles! Fun, food, prizes offered at Harvest Festival Saturday

Lots of activities will be offered at the 37th annual Lynn County Harvest Festival to be held at the courthouse square in Tahoka this Saturday, Sept. 15. The festival features live entertainment, a classic car show, art/photo show, food booths, games, and cash prizes from audience participation. Admission to the festival is free. Bring lawn chairs for seating on the courthouse lawn.

The Harvest Festival Princess and Queen will be named during the afternoon, and an outside movie night on the square will be offered at dark to conclude the day's activities. A complete schedule and list of booths is printed on page three of this issue. This year, handicap parking for the Harvest Festival will be designated on the south side of the courthouse, to allow closer access to the event for drivers with handicap parking stickers. Enter from the west for south handicap parking.

Festival fun starts at 10 a.m. with turtle races for the children (kids must bring their own turtles, decorated, for the races). Like last year, the turtle races will be held in the street on the east side of the courthouse, instead of the north side.

Food and game booths also open at 10 a.m. Entries in the art/photo show will be displayed in an office window on the west side of the courthouse square throughout the day, with awards to be presented at 3 p.m. on stage at the festival. People may vote on their favorite art/photo entries at a table set up near the display.

Antique cars will be displayed in the fifth annual Classic Car Show to be held on the west side of the courthouse square, with this year's show expected to be even better than last year's successful show. The car show is popular with festival attendees, and owners of the vintage cars are usually delighted to talk about their vehicles with interested onlookers.

Throughout the day, trivia questions will be asked from the stage, with the audience winning cash prizes for correct answers throughout the day. In addition, "Minute to Win It" type contests will be offered on stage for prize money. Area merchants are generous at Harvest Festival, donating the cash for the prize giveaways. Cadillac Jack's band will perform throughout the day as well.

The City/County Library will have their annual Silent Auction fundraiser, with bids

closing at 3:30 p.m. The popular booth features a variety of items to bid on, with all proceeds benefitting the local library.

This year's Harvest Festival raffle ticket offers four chances to win on the ticket that is being sold by Harvest Festival Queen and Princess candidates. The grand prize is a \$1,000 prepaid Visa card, and other prizes on the ticket include a \$250 prepaid Visa card, \$100 food voucher at Thriftway Grocery in Tahoka, and \$100 gasoline from Witt Butane in Tahoka. drawings for the prizes on this ticket will be held during the afternoon of the festival, most likely between 4:30 and 5 p.m.

The Harvest Festival Movie on the Square will begin at dark, around 8:15 p.m. Bring quilts or lawn chairs for seating on the courthouse lawn. The movie will be shown on the wall of Tejada's Café, facing the courthouse, and admission is free. Lynn County Hospital District will have snacks available for purchase, including cotton candy, popcorn and soft drinks.

This year's feature stars Elle Fanning and a terrific cast of teenagers in a movie produced by Steven Spielberg and directed by J.J. Abrams. In the summer of 1979, a group of friends in a small Ohio town witness a catastrophic train crash while making a Super 8 movie and soon suspect that it was not an accident. Shortly after, unusual disappearances and inexplicable events begin to take place in town, and the local deputy tries to uncover the truth—something more terrifying than any of them could have imagined. 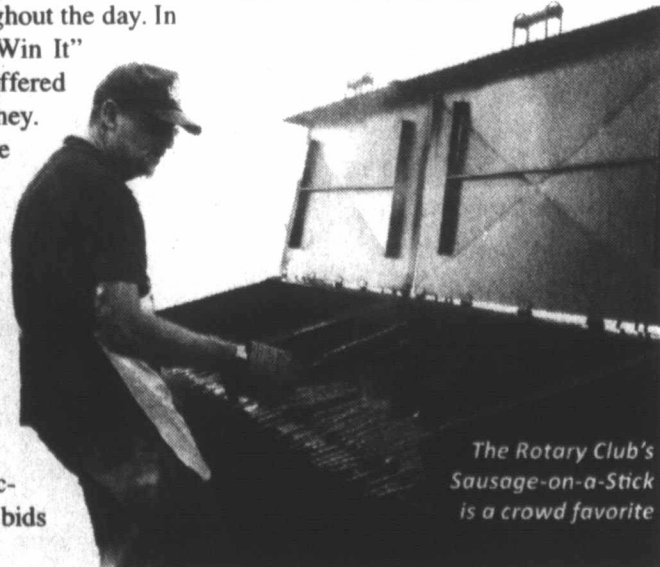

Tahoka VFD to serve burger dinner at Homecoming

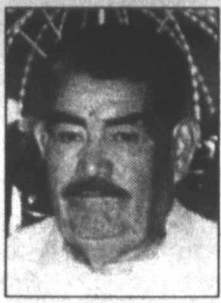

Tahoka stumbles at Ralls; Eagles to land here Friday

A disastrous first quarter including a fumble returned early for a Ralls touchdown put the Tahoka Bulldogs in a hole they never could quite dig out of last Friday despite an even showing for the last three periods. Ralls won the game 27-13 to hand Tahoka its second straight loss of the season.

This Friday night the Bulldogs will host the Class AA Roosevelt Eagles at homecoming. Roosevelt, like Tahoka, has lost twice, although one loss was to a Class AAA team.

Fernando Zavala of Ralls returned the fumble 21 yards to score, and Ralls later went up 15-0 after Kaleb Reese scored. Preston Hammonds scored for the Bulldogs on a 7-yard pass from Trystan Hilger, to cut the lead to 15-7 after John Ryan Barrientez kicked the extra point in the second quarter. But another Ralls touchdown before the half made it 21-7 at that point.

Each team was scoreless in

the third and had 6 points in the fourth. Ke'Shawn Hood ran 17 yards to score for Tahoka early in the fourth, cutting the lead to 21-13, but Ralls scored later in the quarter on a 35-yard run by Jonathan Van Gundy.

Hood was the game's leading rusher, with 132 yards on 19 carries. Hilger completed 6 of 20 passes for 71 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. Hammonds caught two passes for 37 yards and Kordell Baker snared three for 29 yards.

On defense, Ethan Curry was counted in on 17 tackles to lead that category, and Ray Parmer had 16. Luke Hawthorne and Swade Hammonds also did well.

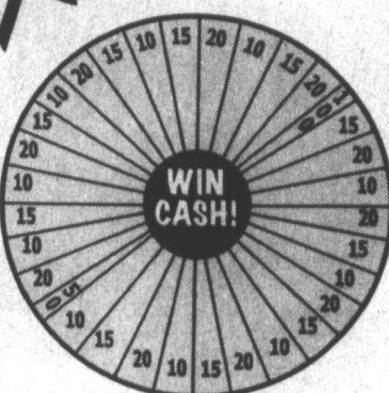

Officers recover stolen pickup

Officers in Oklahoma have recovered a 2006 GMC pickup stolen in Lynn County Aug. 27, according to the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept.

The pickup was recovered in Edmond, OK and a 29-year-old Brownfield man was arrested there as a suspect. The pickup was stolen from Jimmy Bragg at West Point, who said the suspect had been working for him as a farm hand for about a week before both the suspect and the pickup were missed.

Sheriff's officers also are investigating two other incidents, including the theft of 48 sheets of 3/4-inch plywood taken from a location in O'Donnell, according to a report filed by Bruce Vaughn on Sept. 4.

The other incident was a terroristic threat, which a Wilson woman said came from a Lubbock suspect.

In Lynn County last week, seven persons were in jail, with two held for Gaines County. Police arrested one person for public intoxication and took a report of a stolen dog that later was canceled when the dog returned home.

Of the five persons jailed last week, one was a female facing six different charges, all related to driving. Four other

persons were held for a court order, theft over \$500, driving while intoxicated third offense or more, and public intoxication.

A Tahoka woman told Police Friday that someone apparently had stolen her female English bulldog from the back yard. However, officers were advised two days later that the dog had returned home. The owner had valued the dog at \$1,500.

HPWD board sets 2012 Tax Rate

During their Aug. 27 regular meeting, the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District Board of Directors approved a resolution adopting a 2012 tax rate of \$0.00754 per \$100 property valuation to fund operation and maintenance of the district.

Persons with \$100,000 in property valuation would pay \$7.54 to the district in 2012 under the adopted tax rate.

This is the third year in a row that the tax rate has been lowered by the Water District's Board of Directors. The 2011 tax rate was \$0.00776 per \$100 valuation.

Although the tax rate was lowered, some residents within the district's 16-county service area may see a slight increase in their water district taxes—due to increased property valuation.

In other business, the district's board of directors approved applications for water well permits; adopted the proposed 2013 budget; and selected an appraiser to determine dry land and irrigated land values for use in the district's cost-in-water income tax depletion allowance program for tax year 2012.

In addition, the board modified the order for the Nov. 6 general election in District Directors' Precincts Three and Four by approving an election services contract/joint election agreement with Bailey County and approving a joint election agreement with Deaf Smith County.

The board also approved participation in a new Texas Water Development Board project to update the northern and southern Ogallala Aquifer and Dockum ("Santa Rosa") Groundwater Availability Models (GAMs).

WHEN A LADY came into the newspaper office one day last week, I noticed her vehicle parked just outside the door was a Jeep, and I asked her if she knew how Jeep got its name.

Another theory is that the vehicle, manufactured by Willys and then Ford for the military, was classified by the military as a GP, or General Purpose vehicle, and the word Jeep came from "GP." However, the Internet sources say the term General Purpose was used by the Army to describe a quarter-ton reconnaissance vehicle, and not the Willys.

Anyway, the comic strip character story sounds more believable. And more fun. If someone wants to part with \$5 or so, they still can order a decal of the comic strip Eugene to stick on their Jeep.

Some people give their cars or trucks personal names. I never did that, and never owned a Jeep. I did have a car once I should have named Clunk.

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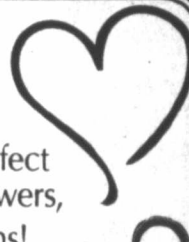
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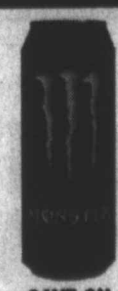
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Annual Lynn County Ag Tour planned for September 19th

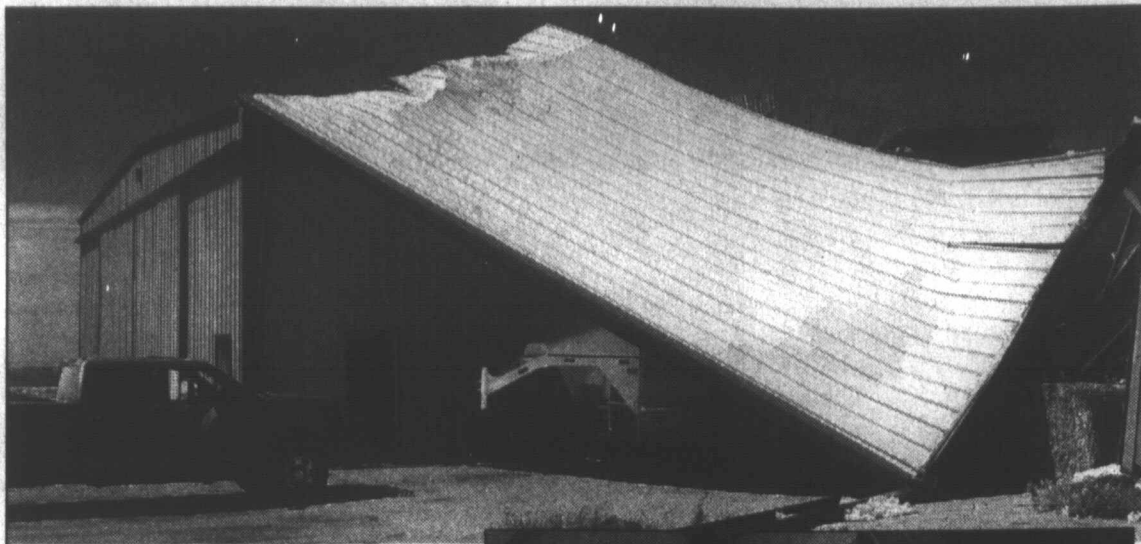

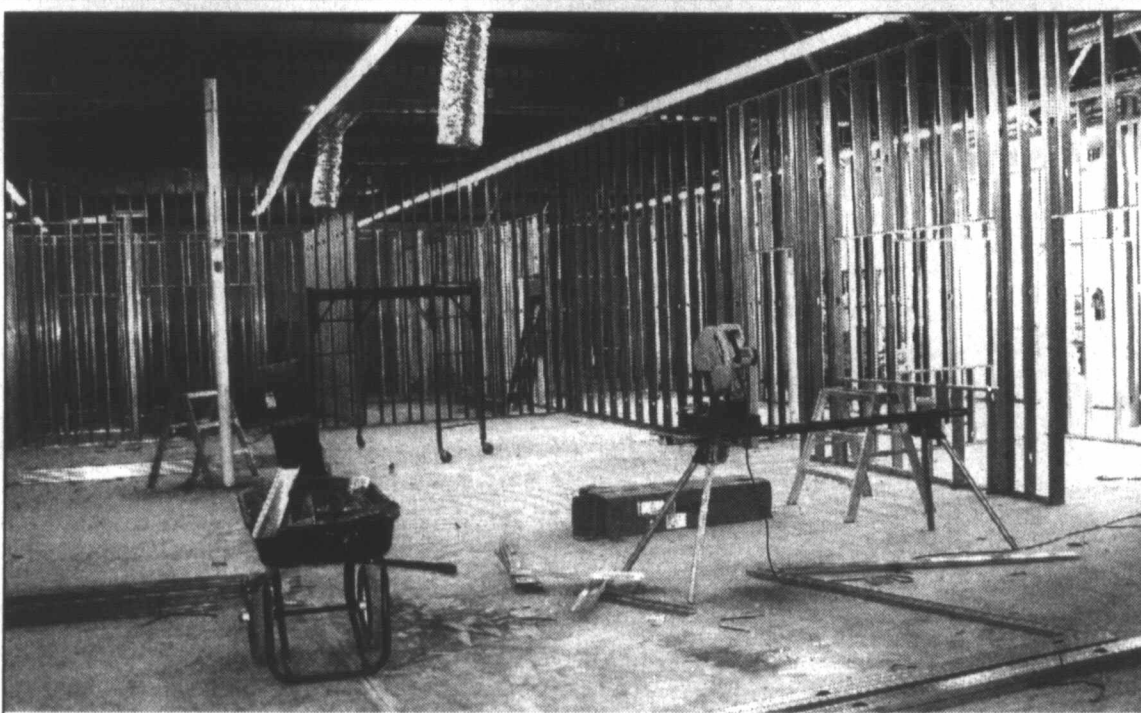

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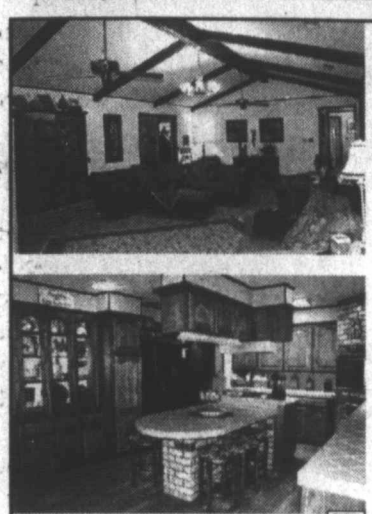
