## Child still in coma in Gladewater home

In November of 1993 an incident at a local residence led to a seven-year-old boy's coma and the double suicide of J.R. and Kitty Lappe.  
It's been over a year since the incident and Danny Kerr is still in a "near coma state" at Truman-Smith Center, a nursing home for severely handicapped children in Gladewater, Texas.  
According to a Child Protective Services spokeswoman Linda Edwards, he has been showing some signs of improvement.  
She added that his four brothers and sisters are still in the custody of CPS and are positively responding to treatment and therapy.  
A lawsuit filed by the Kerr children's natural parents, Danny, Sr. and Samantha, is still pending; however, a hearing has not been set.  
The children were taken away amid allegations that their parents and five other family members, including their grandparents, sexually abused them.  
They were all indicted on charges of aggravated sexual assault.

## Coach Grissom ready to begin

Colorado ISD's new athletic director and head coach, 51-year-old Bill Grissom, will be ready for a challenge when he starts his first official day January 16.  
Grissom, who has an impressive record as a football coach, also has some impressive credentials as a track coach.  
As head track coach at Hamlin, he helped develop a program that produced nine district championships, two regional championships and two state championships.  
to what we ask them to do, then I see some good possibilities for the entire program.  
Grissom said he would be making changes in off-season programs and that making adjustments to the block scheduling utilized by CISD would factor in.  
"I'm going to have to make adjustments to this new type of scheduling," he said. "But, the key [to developing a winning program] is to have a good solid off-season program."  
According to Grissom, he is not sure whether he will be bringing some of his staff from Stanton with him to Colorado City.  
"More than likely, everybody at Stanton will move up and my first assistant, Mark Cotton, will become head coach," he said. "I really need to do some evaluations of who I have available here before I ask anyone [from Stanton] to make the move."  
Grissom and wife Sharon have two sons, Monte of Midland and Russ of Wichita Falls.  
Grissom expects to arrive in Colorado City this week, but is unsure when his wife will be able to join him.

CISD is hoping for the same results. As athletic director, Grissom will be involved in all the sports programs sponsored by the school district.  
The former Stanton coach added that he would like to get students involved in the football program to participate in other sports, including basketball and track.  
He said he feels that if students are involved in several different activities throughout the year the athletics program will benefit as a whole.  
"I'd like to get as many kids involved in the athletic program as I can," he said. "If the kids respond

## City fights for grant

The city is competing against 38 other communities, including Loraine and Westbrook, for the grant. Of the 38 cities, 14 to 18 will be awarded the state grant monies.  
Contreras made his presentation to a board of 12 people as part of phase one of the competition, which is split into two phases. During the first phase, each competing city is judged on a 350 point scale by the panel.  
Colorado City received 323 points and is sixth on the list; Westbrook was awarded 315 points to come in 23rd; and Loraine received 308 points to come in 32nd on the list.

by the Upshur County Grand Jury in 1993. None of the accused have gone to trial over the allegations and all are still being investigated by the Attorney General's Office.

In interviews stemming from October 1991 to November 1993, Danny and his siblings said they had been forced to participate in ritualistic sex abuse and satanic rituals.

Because of what they had gone through, the children had learned to become unconscious at will and used it as a self-defense mechanism to block out what was happening to them.

It is believed that this is what triggered the incident that occurred at the Lappe residence last year.

Because of the suicide of the prime suspects, investigators have never been able to determine whether or not the incident was intentional.





## Irrigation Conference & Trade Show begins Wed.

The 1995 Texas Irrigation Conference and Trade Show is set for January 11-12 in the San Angelo Convention Center. This is San Angelo's first time ever to host the conference, which has traditionally been held in Lubbock or Amarillo.

Registration is from 12:30-1:30 p.m. January 11 and 8-8:30 a.m. January 12. A \$10 per person fee will be charged at the door. The fee includes the second day's lunch.

Conference sponsors are the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Lubbock-based Texas Agricultural Irrigation Association and the Tom Green County Field Crops Committee.

The featured speaker for the event is Rick Perry, Commissioner of Agriculture. During the luncheon on January 12, Perry is slated to give an update on legislative issues facing Texas agriculture.

"San Angelo may seem to be an

odd place for such an event since we are generally thought of as a dryland farming area," said Tom Green County Extension Agent Rex Jones, one of the conference coordinators. "This stigma is rapidly changing."

"Over the past five years we've seen a major surge in irrigation usage here. In Tom Green County alone, there are now over 30,000 irrigated acres," he said.

"The increased interest stems from new water-saving technologies that make irrigation possible even in areas with limited underground water resources. In West Texas, even a small amount of irrigation eases the risks of dryland farming," Jones added.

Jones said that some topics and many commercial exhibits in the trade show will deal with "limited irrigation water needs."

He said the trade show is a major component of the conference that regularly draws participants from across Texas and other states.

"The trade show offers participants a look at the newest products and techniques that are making the watering of crops an economically viable practice here," Jones said.

"There's never been a show in this area that has offered producers such a 'one stop shopping' opportunity in terms of irrigation products and knowledge," he added. Exhibits will be open the entire two days.
