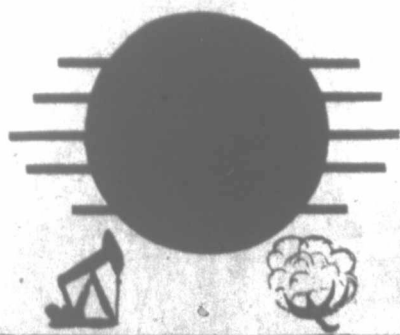

New tax rate set by county commissioners

The Commissioner's Court of Mitchell County voted a budget of \$2,490,983.30, Monday and set a tax rate of .3907 (39 cents) per hundred dollars of valuation.

This is a tax increase of approximately 7 cents per one hundred dollars of valuation.

Bill Vick, a representative of the Chevron Oil Company, suggested that the Commissioners Court take sufficient funds from the county's 3.2 million surplus to avoid a tax increase.

Paul Boyd Hunter, spokesman for the commissioners, pointed out that the budget called for a use of \$131,847.05 from the unencumbered funds, but that he didn't feel that it was prudent to use more. "I am concerned for next year," he said. "If we should be forced to build a new jail," he continued, "that would take all of it."

Hunter said that times may be

harder next year and that the money may be needed more next year.

County Judge Bill Carter, said, "I think the time has come to use some of that surplus—that's just the way I feel."

Both commissioners Ed Roach and Johnnie Shackelford concurred in opposing the use of any more of the surplus. All four commissioners voted for the budget, as is. Judge Carter voted "No" because of the raise in taxes.

The budget does not include a salary increase for county employees. A \$3,000 supplement has been voted for District Judge Weldon Kirk and Judge Kirk may issue a court order to increase salaries of court reporter Charlie Walker and the district coordinator Betty Joy of Sweetwater.

The court voted to buy a new

truck from Hutchins Ford for \$15,583. The low bid was offered by Gene Messer Ford of Lubbock. Commissioner Ed Roach made a motion to accept the low local bid.

Bidding on a new dump bed for the truck was to be relet because of some confusion concerning the alternates to the specified bid.

The commissioners also:

Voted "no increase" in the government trapper's salary. \$7,870 was budgeted for the year of 1987 and the trapper will be paid at the rate of \$900 a month until "the money runs out."

Accepted the audit report on the transfer of Charles Watlington's office.

Appointed Neil Rollins of Westbrook and Fanny Fae Feaster of Colorado City to the library board for three years.

Chamber discusses fair

Co-chairmen of the Mitchell County Fair, to be held September 25, 26, and 27, are to be Mark Raschke and Ray Ritchey, according to the Chamber of Commerce Fair Committee at a meeting of the board of directors Monday.

This is the third year that both have served as co-chairmen, so little that comes up should surprise them.

County Agent Mike Mauldin appeared before the directors to ask for use of the arena on one of

the fair days for a horse show. One of the 4-H groups is interested in learning horsemanship. Permission was granted.

The board granted the Tourism Committee \$983 from the \$1,000 given by the City from the Hotel-Motel tax, for part of the payment on a half page ad in the Visit West Texas brochure. The board also allowed the committee an additional \$50 to be listed on the back of the brochure.

The total cost of a page is \$3,300. Billy Joe Woods will take half the page. The Chamber of

Commerce will take the other half. Committee Chairman Jim Baum said that contributions had made up part of the difference between \$933 and \$1,850 but that he still needed to get about \$400.

The board also:

Voted to buy a \$100,000 liability policy for the fair, and

Confirmed David Hoover as secretary-treasurer for the next five months and decided not to fill vacancies caused by two recent resignations.

Water problems still plague council

Councilman Robert Hoback, chairman of the Council's water survey committee, reported Tuesday night that his committee had been discussing Colorado City's water problems with engineers including Parkhill, Smith and Cooper and they confirm what Colorado City's Water Department has said. More water is needed from the filter plant to the elevated towers and also that more elevated storage is needed.

Lloyd Ledbetter, present as a visitor, exhorted the council to greater effort in pressing on with solutions to the present water problems. He mentioned that a contractor had discussed the possibility of building a 32

unit apartment building north of Interstate 20 and had made application to FHA for funds, but Ledbetter added, "Where will he get the water to operate?"

"The area north of IS 20 is killed for future development," Ledbetter said, "without water."

Tom Rees, sitting in as City Attorney for vacationing Pete McKinney, said that he owned land east of the Gulf station, and had been approached by fast food franchises, but they would also need water to operate.

The council has an application filed for a \$300,000 grant for improving the water distribution system and may hear more from it this week.

Sales tax figures down

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Friday sent out checks, for local sales tax payments to the 1,026 cities which levy a one percent city tax. Bullock said the monthly allocations were down 14 percent in August, possibly due to a downturn in the Texas economy.

CISD board trims 1986-87 budget

The Colorado City school board Monday night voted for a \$5,620,186 budget for the forthcoming fiscal year, down from last year's \$6,058,062.

The budget is down but so are the revenues. The school administration expects revenues of \$5,320,914. School Superintendent Charlie Uelton says that \$299,242 of "carry over" money will be used to make up the difference between the two amounts. Uelton says that "carry over" money is money that was not spent last year.

The tax rate will not be set until the legislature completes its special session.

The final report on personnel indicates a reduction of nine and one half persons.

The Colorado School District spent \$3,955 on each student in 1985-86 and will spend \$3,750 during the coming year.

Members of the school board expressed interest in resurfacing the track at Wolf Stadium, expected to cost in the \$42,000 range. The board instructed

Uelton to accumulate some information on the project, which may be done this year.

The board accepted the resignation of Debra K. Shawn, who is moving to Alabama and approved the hiring of Sheila Kay Thompson, Larry Hudson, and Christine Burtner.

The board also:

Accepted an invitation to meet new members of the school faculty on August 25. Visiting with both old and new teachers will begin at 8:30 a.m. in the Middle School cafeteria.

Approved the selection of Joe Morren, CPA for auditing the schools accounts. His fee is \$7,248.

Approved the elimination of two school bus routes. These routes will be consolidated with two other routes. The school administration will have the option of running short routes inside the city.

Selected Preston Dairies to provide milk for school cafeteria.

Chamber committee elects to buy ad

The Tourism Committee of the Chamber of Commerce voted Monday to buy a page in the "Visit West Texas" brochure. One hundred thousands of these slickly printed, attractive pamphlets are produced and distributed each year.

The Chamber and Billy Joe Wood will buy a full page at a cost of \$3,300. Wood has volunteered to raise one half of the money and the Chamber of Commerce will spend \$333 of the money received in the hotel, motel occupancy tax and will raise the balance of their half from contributions.

The brochure, according to Penny Solomon, is distributed to tourist information centers in Texas, to Chambers of Commerce and members of the West Texas Travel Council and to four travel shows that are held outside the state.

Cotton is new pastor of church

Many of the Council's actions, Tuesday night, concerned water. The Mitchell County Utility Company was given permission to install a pump in the clear water well at the filter plant. The Westbrook school system made the same request, but action here was postponed pending a conference with school officials.

The Utility company feeds a 6 inch line and connects into the water supply at the filter plant. Westbrook schools taps into the city's 16 inch line across from the compress.

City Manager Brenda Tarter said that her recent session with the Odessa water schools was eye opening. Population growth is rapidly running the state of Texas out of water. She said that speakers at the water clinic predicted that in five to 10 years, drinking water would be produced by reverse osmosis.

The council also:

- accepted the resignation of

councilman Tom Lovell from the council. Lovell has moved out of the city limits.

-heard complaints from Evelyn Rose, who said that she has fleas, roaches and ticks, which she thinks come from the house west of her. The house east of her is weedy and an eyesore.

-heard a request from attorney Dell Barber that two properties of his be exempted from a domestic animal ordinance, if one is passed.

-approved a bid of \$48,000 to sealcoat the airstrip.

-heard a report from Ms. Tarter that swimming pool receipts for July, totaled \$7,212. "First time I've known the swimming pool to make money," she said.

-accepted a report that Walter Mitchell had been appointed full time caretaker at the park.

Youths hurt in accident

Two Colorado City youths suffered minor injuries at 6:30 p.m. Sunday when their Honda motorcycle jumped a borrow ditch and ran into a field and overturned.

The accident happened at the intersection of the Fisher Park road and the north-south county road. The Fisher Park road dead ends at the intersection, and the two riders, riding in the rain, failed to see the turn.

The two were John Bradley, 17, driver of the vehicle, and Daniel Frasier. Frasier was not hurt badly, according to Tom Johnson, highway patrolman. He was shaken up, treated for cuts and released. Bradley had bruised ribs, perhaps a bruised liver, and cuts on his forehead. He was hospitalized overnight for observation.

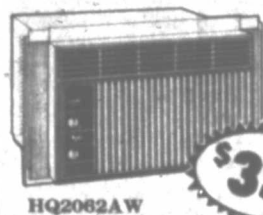
