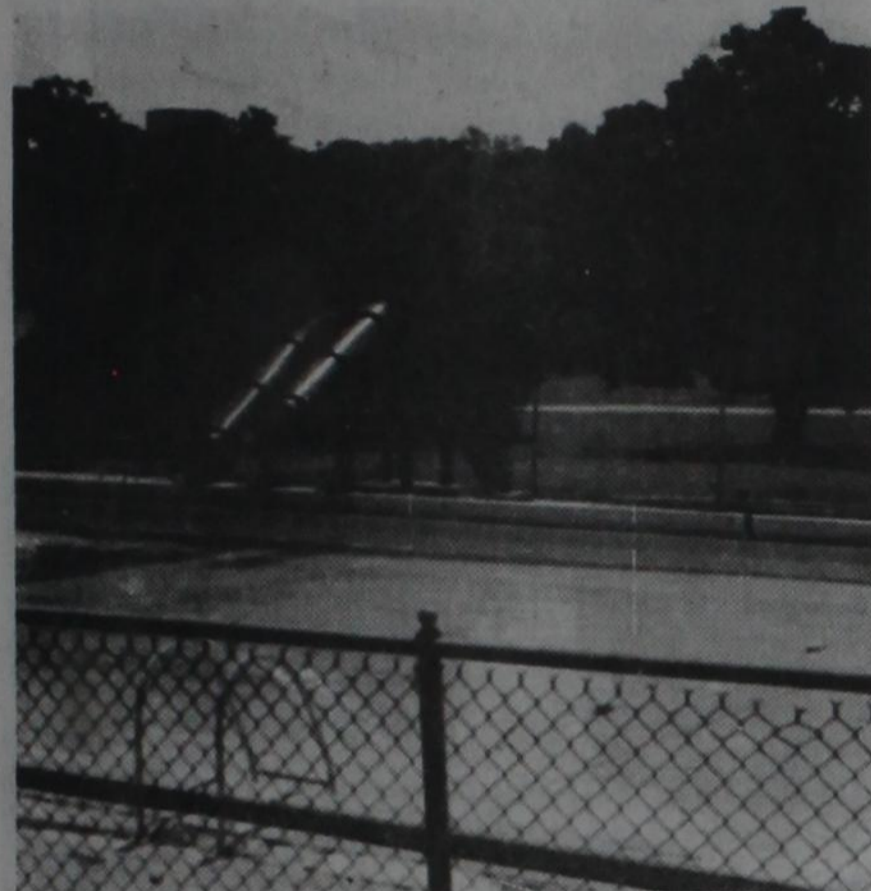

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## A Monsoon Came To Ranger In Two Ways Last Weekend

At the same time a seven inch rain flooded Ranger, the much waited on slide had arrived and had been installed and was ready to go at the city pool.

The rain did not hamper children of all ages trying out the new bright red double flumes of the new Monsoon Flumeslide.

The pool invites all to come see or to try out the slide. One flume is elbow shaped and is sixteen feet long with the other flume twelve feet long. It is installed over eight feet of water so swimming ability is needed. There are no age or weight limits only fitting a twenty inch opening. Fresh water is running down both flumes.

The slide has been partly purchased with two thousand dollars already being donated and with a bank note set up at People's State Bank as Swimming Pool Slide fund in hopes of more donations. The slide will be dedicated to the children of Ranger and to the City by its citizens when the note is paid. It was ordered and installed for the pleasure of using it this summer.

The attendance at the Ranger Pool has been the largest in many a year. Four thousand seven hundred forty-five have passed the doors to enjoy the cool, clear water from June 1-August 1. Ranger has had swimming lessons, weekly ladies night and two weekly family nights. Private and semi-private parties has sold eleven family passes.

The Ranger Pool has been an asset to Ranger and its Citizens this summer. The pool is planning to be open in the evening after school and on the weekends through Labor Day.

The Ranger City Pool is owned by the City of Ranger and has created six summer jobs for citizens. Come out and enjoy your pool.

## Agriculture Viewpoint

Area peanut producers need to scout for yellow striped army worms under and on top of the canopy of the peanut plant. Checks in fields this week indicated a large amount of worms and in many cases severe canopy defoliation.

Although in general the

peanut plant in a very insect tough plant there comes a point when matters need to be taken in to the management stage. Generally speaking when 30-40% of the leaves are damaged and scouting reveals a population of 12-14 medium to small worms per foot of row then insecticide application may be necessary. If only a population of large worms (1 inch or better) is

detected, then most likely an insect application won't pay because these worms should pupae in 3-5 days any way.

If insecticide applications are necessary 1 1/2 pints of Lannate L.V/acre will smoke'em. Other compounds may cause spidermite outbreaks and then your insecticide bill will surely run up.

I spoke this week with Clyde Crumbley an Extension Entomologist for peanuts in West Texas and his 12 years of experience with worms in pe-

nuts indicates the use of a carbonate insecticide such as Lannate L.V. and not organophosphate or pyrethroids.

Dear Editor:

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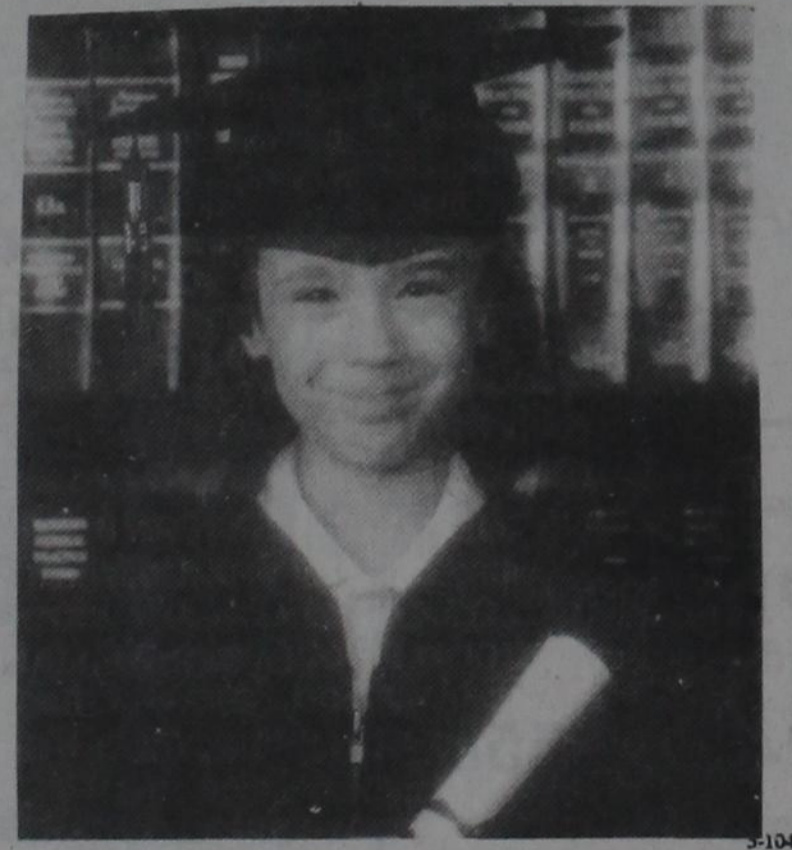
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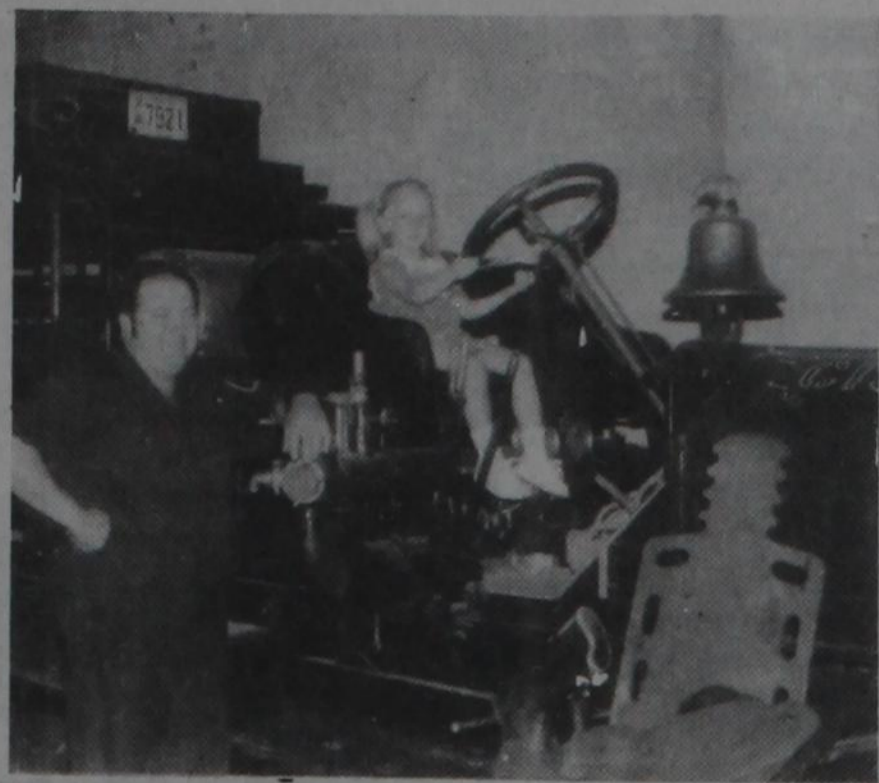
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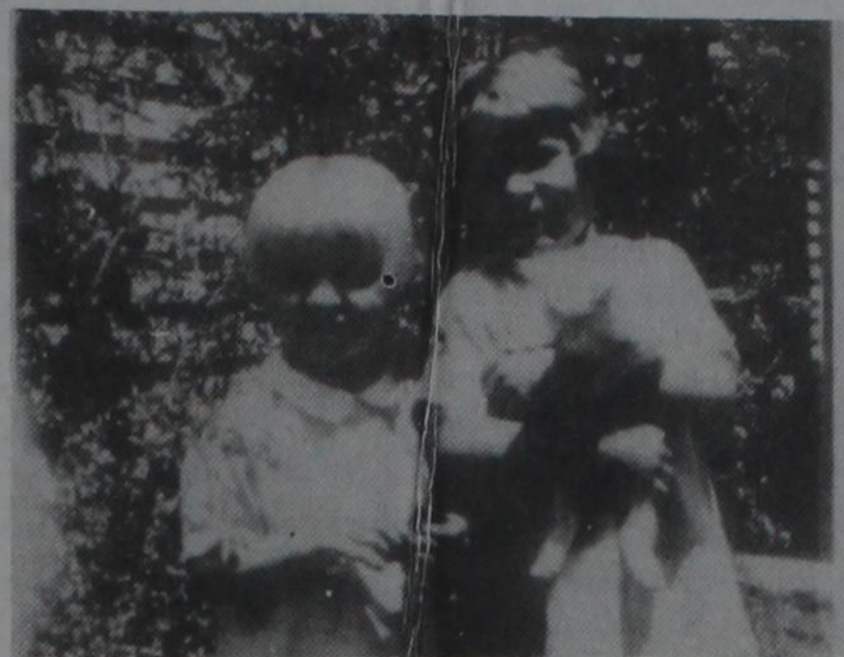
## Two Generations Visit Same Cisco Fire Truck

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## Dietary Guidelines As Applied To Children

Today, many Americans have diets that contain too many calories and too much fat (especially saturated fat), cholesterol and sodium. Their diets are low in whole grains, fruits, and vegetables, and high in fats and sweets. In addition, people have become more inactive over the years.

preventing chronic diseases, and meet the nutrition goals. These changes take into consideration the total diet as we plan meals that are based on an average weekly nutrient analysis. From the Healthy School Meals Book from USDA

Most experts agree that food choices and exercise can help to prevent chronic diseases such as heart disease, certain cancers, diabetes, stroke and osteoporosis, that are leading causes of death and disability among Americans. A good diet can reduce major risk factors for chronic diseases such as obesity, high blood pressure and high blood cholesterol. The exact role of diet in some of these diseases is still being studied.

Unfortunately, children's diets reflect some of the same drawbacks found in the general American diet. The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) 1993 School Nutrition Dietary Assessment (SNDA) study shows that the eating patterns of children and youth parallel the eating patterns of the nation. Generally, children are consuming too much fat, saturated fat, and sodium, and too few carbohydrates. The study found that students' daily intake averages 38 percent of calories from fat, and 15 percent from saturated fat, compared with the Dietary Guideline goal of 30 percent or less from fat, and less than 10 percent from saturated fat.

Since school meals provide a significant contribution to a child's diet, it is especially important that school meals be changed to provide choices that include lowfat foods, vegetables, fruits and whole grain products. It has become clear that changes are necessary to provide children with healthy meals.

To help achieve the changes the USDA School Meals Initiative for Healthy Children will provide children with school meals that promote their health, and assist in

**ORNERY TOENAILS**

People ordinarily take toenails for granted, remembering to trim them from time to time -- sometimes only when they begin to wear holes in socks. No wonder that it comes as a painful surprise when a toenail becomes ingrown. This occurs when the side of a nail grows into the skin. The result usually is swelling, redness and pain. That isn't all: piercing of skin can lead to infection. In some people, heredity may make nails more likely to grow inward. Sometimes it's injury, tight shoes or fungus infection that triggers the process. Often, it's failure to trim toenails straight across.

The podiatrist frequently treats ingrown toenails. Relief often is provided by removing only the ingrown side of a nail. Other cases may call for further steps. The most important safeguard against developing an ingrown toenail is to trim nails straight across, not contouring corners, so that they have a better chance to grow straight.

## Stenholm Supports Final Passage Of Welfare Reform

Congressman Charles Stenholm voted to pass the welfare reform conference agreement, legislation reforming the nation's 61-year old public assistance program, after winning a change allowing Texas to continue its welfare reform experiment. The House passed this legislation by a vote of 328 to 101, following White House confirmation that the President would sign it into law.

Stenholm was one of 12 House conferees appointed to work out differences between the House and Senate versions of the legislation.

"There is universal agreement that our current welfare system is broken and must be dramatically overhauled," said Stenholm. "While

this welfare reform conference agreement is far from perfect, it is preferable to the current system and is a significant improvement over the welfare legislation considered earlier this Congress."

As a conferee, Stenholm worked for changes that would give states the increased flexibility needed to move welfare recipients to work, and to allow states to provide vouchers for needy children whose parents' benefits are discontinued because of the time limit on eligibility. In addition, he was successful in adding a provision allowing Texas, and other states who had secured waivers from the federal government to implement their own welfare reform plans, to

move forward with those plans.

"Americans are a compassionate people who are willing to lend a helping hand to hard workers experiencing temporary difficulties and especially to children who are victims of circumstances beyond their control," added Stenholm. "But Americans are also a just people who expect able-bodied folks to work and to take responsibility for themselves and their families."

The conference committee also agreed to other recommendations Stenholm made in bipartisan legislation introduced earlier this year. Under the final agreement, no one will lose Medicaid coverage as a result of the bill.

"The House bill would have denied Medicaid to thousands of individuals, removing \$9 billion of Medicaid assistance from

the health care system and shifting costs to health care providers," noted Stenholm. "Failure to correct this would have affected the cost, availability, and quality of care to everyone, particularly in rural areas."

The conference agreement contains a requirement that Congress review the impact of the bill in three years. This review process will allow Congress to make a number of changes needed to ensure that welfare reform succeeds.

"While this report does provide states with additional flexibility to implement work programs, the work provisions in the bill may result in unfunded mandates on states and make it more difficult to move welfare recipients into the work place," said Stenholm. "It is critical that we fix the current welfare program and move towards a system

## Guest Slot

(EDITOR'S NOTE: The following is from newspaper files. It is undated but pertinent local history.) Author Unknown

The Eleventh Supreme Judicial District of Texas (served by the Eastland Court of Civil Appeals) is comprised of 23 counties: Palo Pinto, Stephens, Eastland, Erath, Comanche, Brown, Coleman, Callahan, Taylor, Nolan, Mitchell, Howard, Dawson, Borden, Scurry, Fisher, Jones, Shackelford, Throckmorton, Baylor, Knox, Haskell and Stone-wall. It was established in 1925 and has continuously been located in Eastland.

It is one of the new Courts of Civil Appeals in Texas for which the Legislature provided that the local government should provide suitable quarters and library without expense to the State. As a result, the people of Eastland County have a considerable investment in the Court. When our present courthouse was built, express provision was made for such Court; of the 7 floors in the courthouse, the Court has the upper 2. If the Court had not been located here or if the State had provided funds for its quarters, the County would not have spent approximately \$88,000.00 on the Court (2/7 of total cost of \$313,280.82).

Prior to the opening of the present courthouse, the County had to rent the 4th floor of a local bank building for quarters, the rent amounting to \$13,650.00.

Local attorneys contributed a portion of the library, the judges' bench, carpet and drapes for the courtroom at an undetermined expense. The County spent \$5,532.34 on the library, \$2,626.15 on furniture and fixtures, and \$1,354.66 on repairs and replacements in the present courthouse up to 1930 (later figures are not yet available). The County also spent \$2,471.07 in restoring the rented quarters to original condition after the present courthouse was completed, as required by the lease.

The County has, of course, furnished through the years light, heat and water to the Court, at an undetermined cost.

It has been reliably estimated that it would cost at least one million dollars to replace the courthouse today; thus, that portion used by the Court represents a large investment in terms of today's dollars.

A breakdown of cases reported in the Southwestern Reporter (2nd) for the past 12 years shows that 53.763% of the cases came from nearer Abilene than Eastland; that is, 53.763% of the cases came from counties laying West or mostly West of a North-South line bisecting Callahan County.

### ELECTRONIC TAX PAYMENTS REQUIRED

Did your business make federal tax deposits of more than \$50,000 during 1995? If so, you must start making such payments by electronic funds transfer beginning January 1, 1997.

You may use either of two deposit methods - the ACH (automated clearing house) "debit" method or the ACH "credit" method. The initial step for either method is to file IRS Form 9779 to set up your account.

Under the "debit" method, a taxpayer contacts the Treasury, either by telephone or computer, and gives instructions to withdraw and apply to the appropriate tax liabilities specified amounts from the taxpayer's bank account. This may be done at any time between one and thirty banking days before the due date of the payment. The withdrawal will be made on the due date. A "threshold" withdrawal amount may be established when the taxpayer sets up his account to help prevent erroneous overdraws. Taxpayers who timely notify the Treasury to withdraw, and have adequate funds, will be deemed to have paid their liabilities on time.

Under the "credit" method, taxpayers, instruct their financial institution to transfer funds to the Treasury's account at the Federal Reserve Bank. Taxpayers remain liable for late payment penalties if their bank fails to make a transfer. However, our local bank does not presently have the capability to perform this method for taxpayers.

Business taxpayers subject to the new requirements already should have received an enrollment form from the IRS. If you didn't receive Form 9779 with instruction, and you think that the requirements might apply to you, call 1-800-945-8400 for an enrollment packet. (You also may choose to participate voluntarily.) Allow yourself enough time to set up your account before yearend and to begin working with the new system. 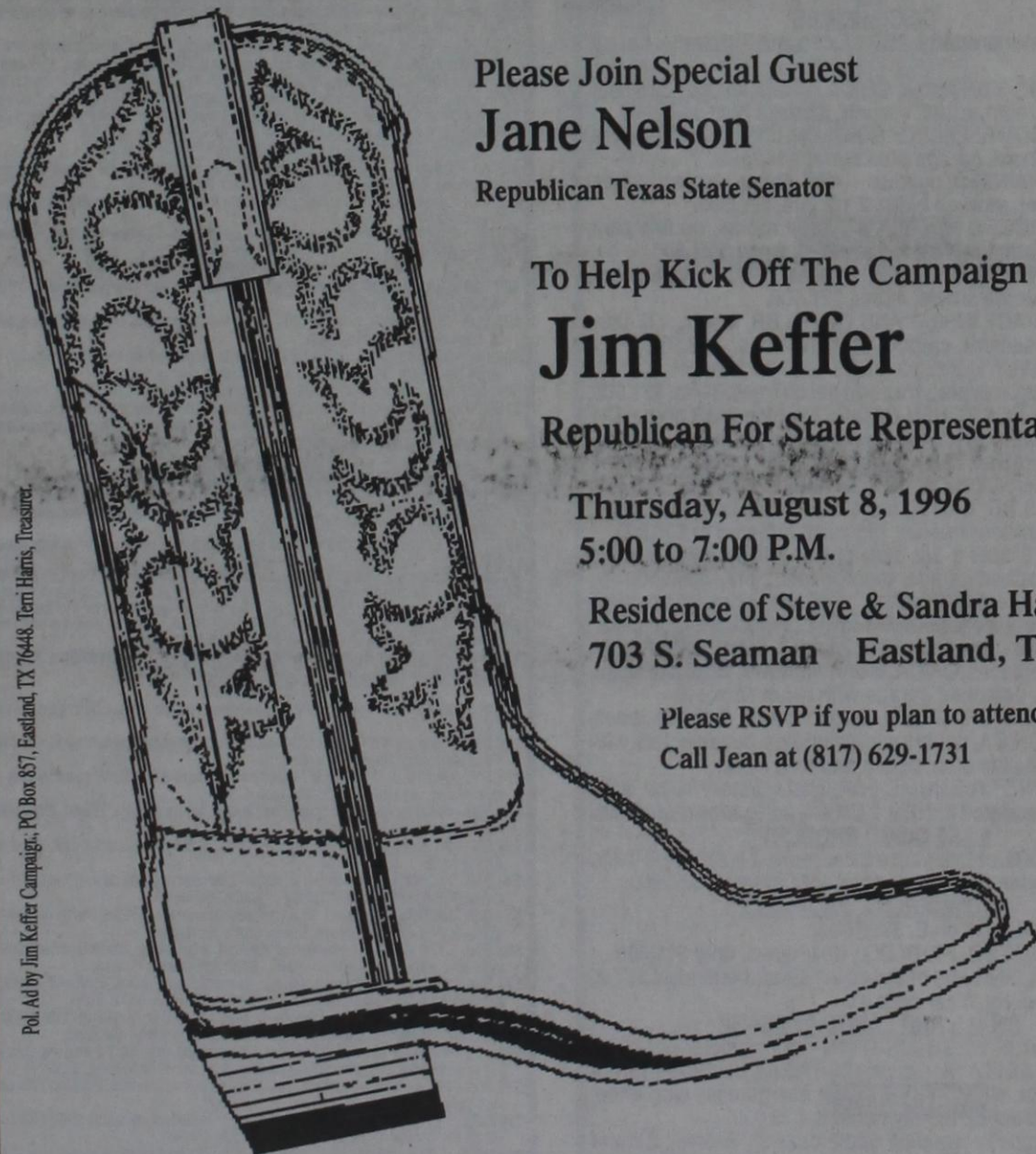

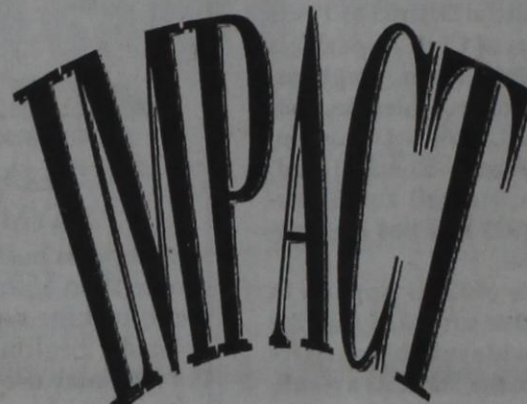

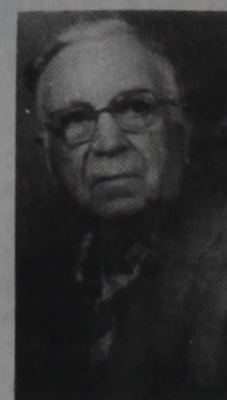

The Eastland Police Chief showed a video from the State Attorney General's office on telephone fraud. Funderburgh also discussed the subject and answered questions after

the viewing.

In connection with the film, he advised the Lions to "Support the local Crimestoppers -- they are doing a fantastic job."

He said Crimestopper Board members were selling Associate memberships right now for \$12 per year.

He said that we need citizen participation in crime prevention, and crimes include the shady practices of some telephone solicitors. "This is on the increase, including in Eastland County," he said.

"All telephone marketing and solicitations are not illegal, but a lot of them are, and everyone who gets a suspicious call needs to be very careful.

"All they want is your name, address, bank account and credit card information!" the Police Chief said.

The film gave more detailed information on various types of fraud.

Attorney General Dan Morales stated that 10 billion is lost each year through telemarketing schemes.

He said that 50 percent of the people targeted are over the age of 50. They are singled out because they are at home more, and can answer the phone. They generally have more money, and are more trusting.

"Therefore con artists can manipulate them," the Attorney General stated on the video.

He described various schemes in which people are told they have won prizes, but need to send a little money "up front," purchase something, or need to pay shipping and handling charges for their prizes.

Also, there are the shady "charitable" organizations which keep most of the money they collect.

The Attorney General advised people not to give to a charity unless they know exactly what it does and where the money is going.

On another angle, some people contact fraud victims and promise to recover their money - if they will pay for it first.

"Never send money to collect money," Morales warned. "Legitimate companies will collect for a fee from what they recover.

"And never give out personal or banking information,"

After the viewing Funderburgh discussed fraud and other schemes that are barely legal and certainly not ethical.

It was brought out that most people are annoyed by telephone solicitation of any kind. The frequency of these calls was discussed -- and how bothersome it can be if your name is on some kind of "list."

The talk turned to shady practices by mail: magazines which send you a free copy, then bill you for a "subscription," and others which solicit for "early renewals."

Funderburgh was asked about calls for contributions from people claiming to belong to Law Enforcement Organizations, or Firemen's groups.

"Be careful on Law Enforcement solicitation," he advised. "Call your local lawmen about the organization before giving anything."

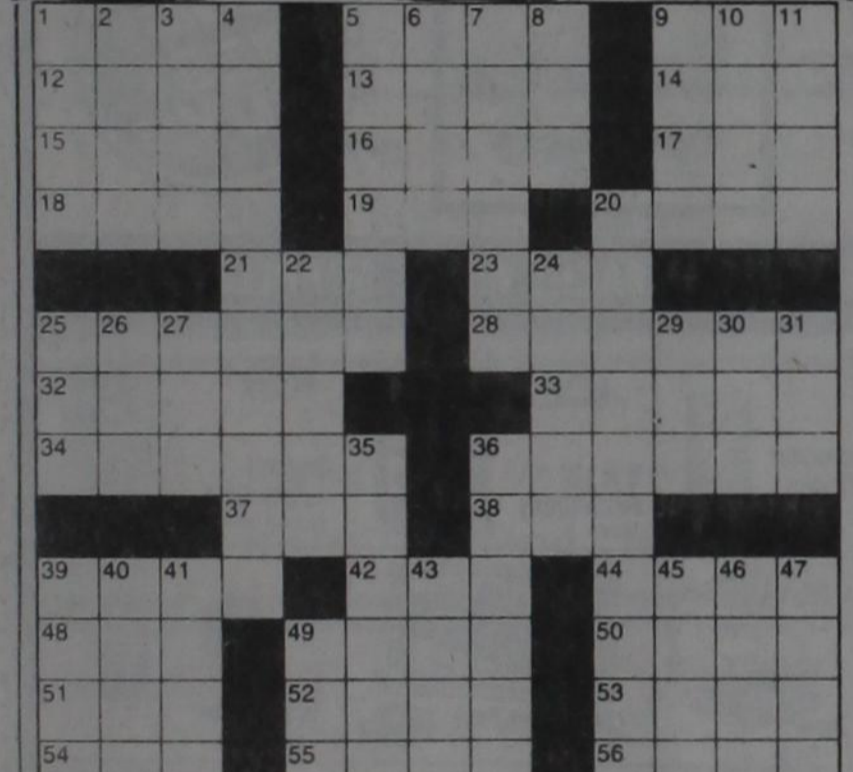

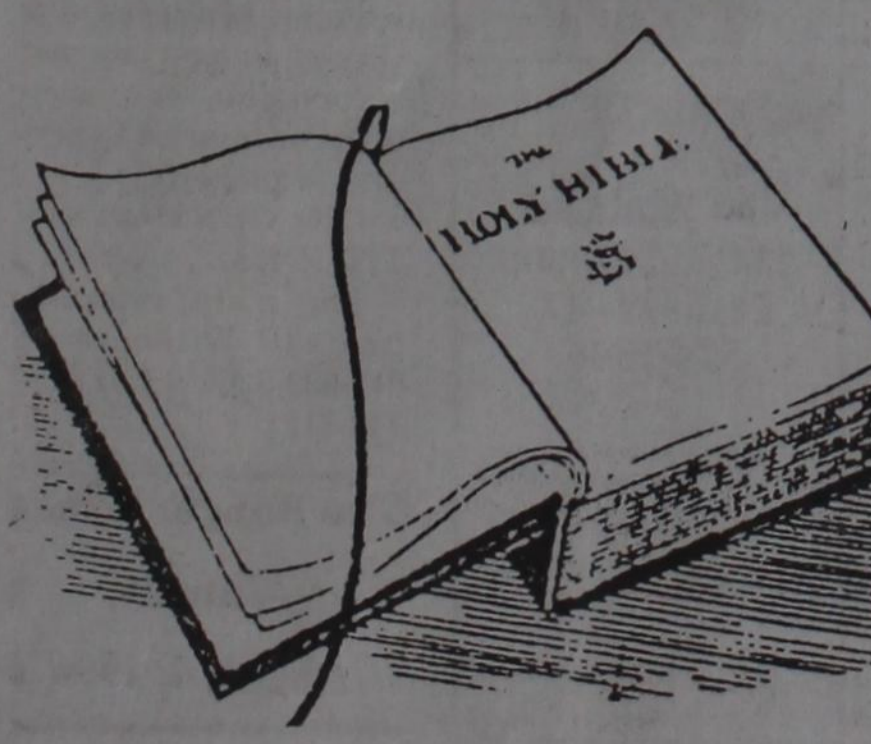

## Who is at the Helm?

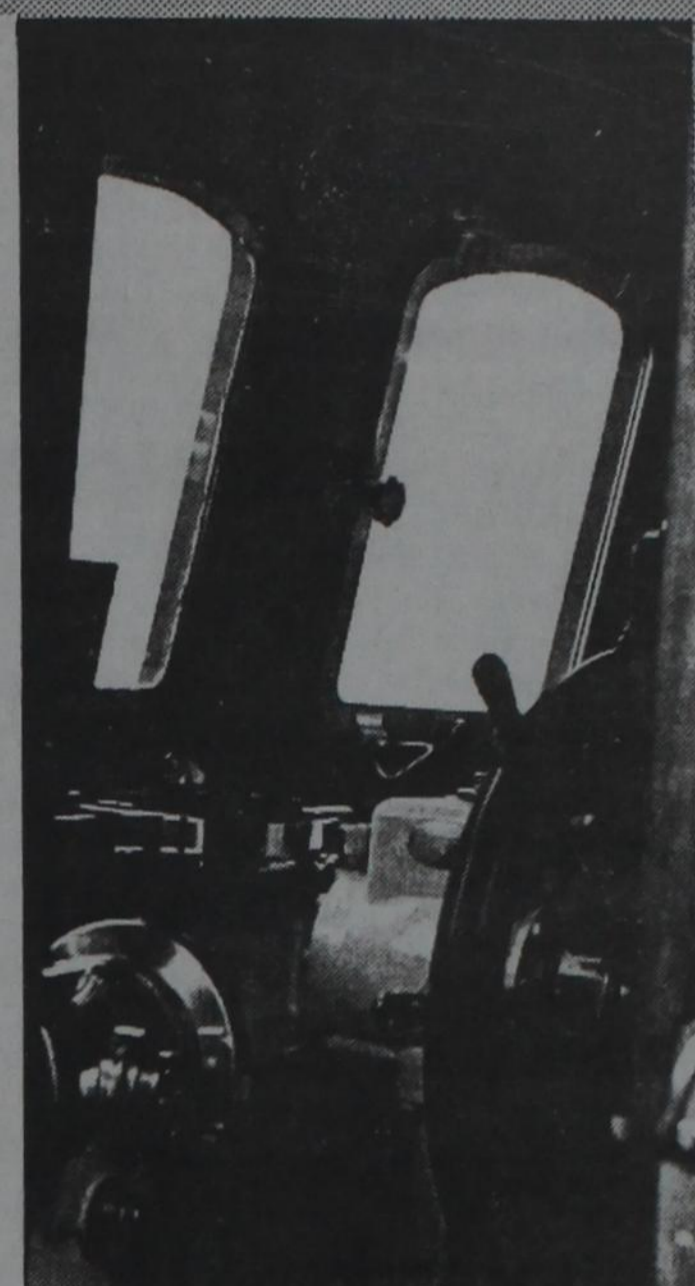
Who guides our lives? Are we a ship without a helmsman? Are we adrift, going no place?
