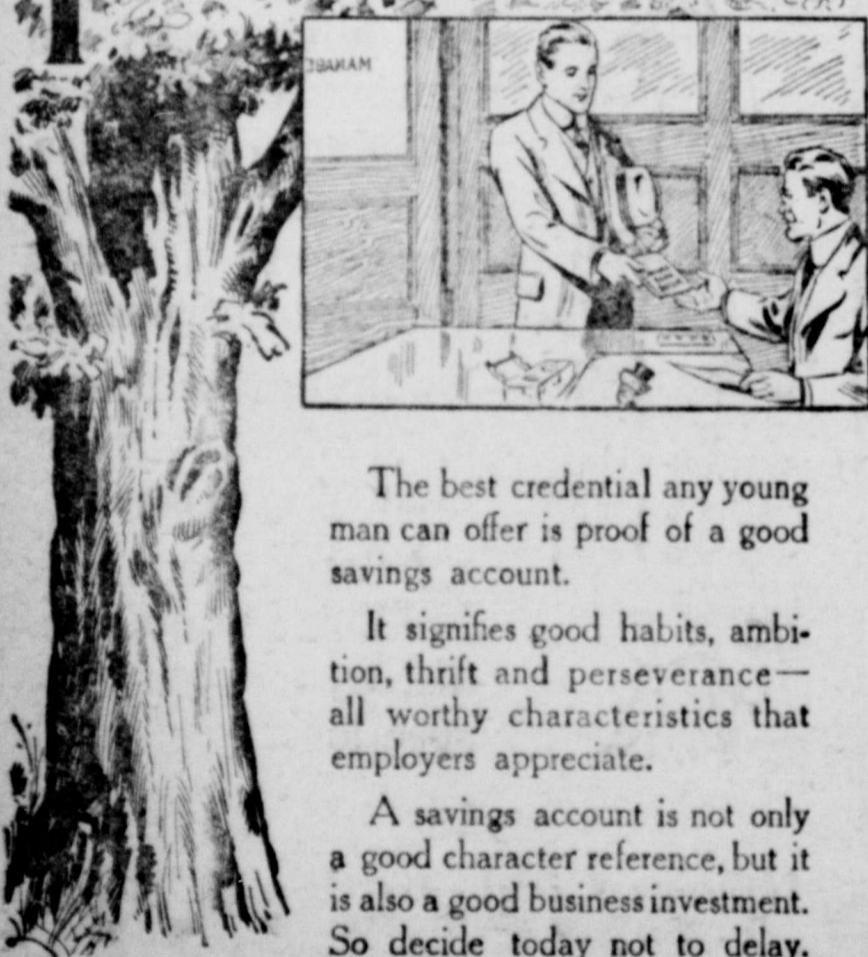

## "THE GYPSY TRAIL" PLEASES AUDIENCES

"The Gypsy Trail" is the first dramatic success of a young Cleveland newspaper man, Robert Housm, but although not yet through its first season it is destined to find a place in stage history alongside such delightfully thorough and through American comedy dramas of recent years as "The Fourtime Hunter," "The Man from Home," "The Boomerang," "Turn to the Right" and "Mister Antonio." Yet at times it is a bigger play than any of them.

As widely romantic as its Loshivar motive, in spite of its agreeable satire, "The Gypsy Trail" is filled with little homey touches that make one forget it is a play. Furthermore it has bits of modern philosophy as regards matrimony. They are delivered by a very genuine character of another generation—A grandmother who has not forgotten her own youth and romance—and strike home in a way that makes one both remember and like them.

The story is simple, but incredulous enough in places to be interesting. With "all the young men playing the stock market instead of the guitar" Francis Ray-

mond, a conventional daughter of a conventional, well to do father finds it impossible to fall in love with the ultra-conventional and prosaic Edward Andrews society Sand fate seems to have allotted to her. Her American fairness leads her to give him a hint as to her reasons. She wants Romance. Being the type of a man who would humor her in all things, Andrew under takes to provide it, but in a most unromantic way. He hears of the Loshivar story and promptly arranges to kidnap her. Just as she is about to be really and romantically thrilled, however, Francis learns that the kidnapping is merely a perfectly proper and conventional kidnapping with all the comforts of home including Andrew's grandmother for a chaperone.

Then romance hammers its way into the plot vividly past the safe guards, of Convention. The chaffeur Andrew has employed to do the actual kidnapping is a widely romantic, adventurous soldier of fortune. Fate—and Grandmother Widdemore—do the rest. Notwithstanding that dramatic outcome and probably to keep the play from ending with the second act, which really is too good to spoil, this modern young Loshivar, Micheal, who has known the poetic spell of the gypsy trail, runs away at almost the very hour Francis confesses her love for him. Oh, certainly, he

comes back. He comes back in all senses of the word in the third act—first romantically to be spruced and then conventionally to be accepted. Yet you feel most clearly Convention never, never would have won the battle for Micheal without the aid of Romance, even though Micheal does turn out to be—but that's telling.

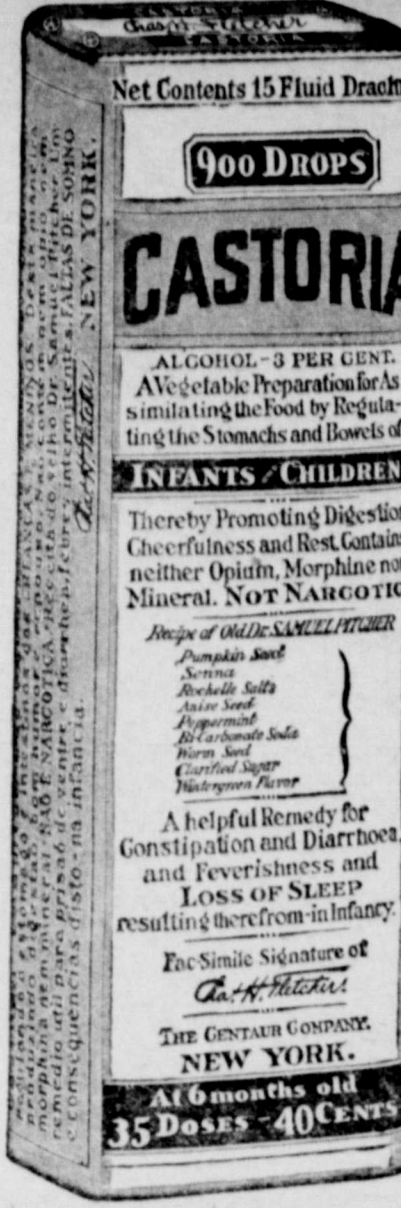

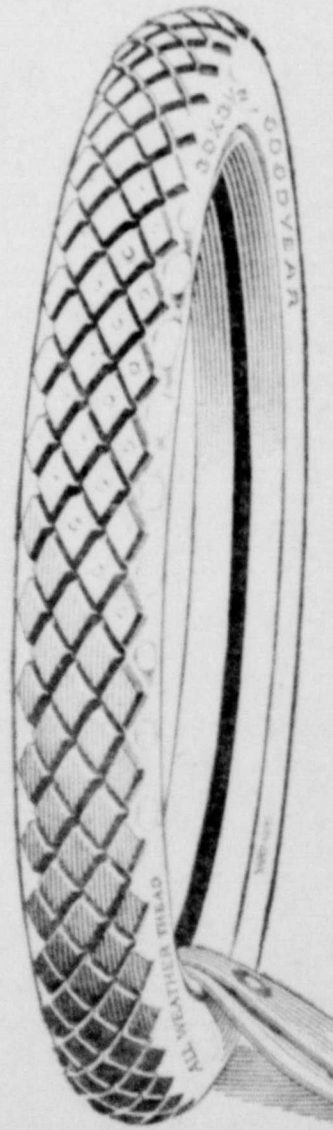

**CHILD INJURED BY CAP OF DYNAMITE**



**OFFICERS FOLLOW WOMAN;  
ARREST CHECK SWINDLER**

A chase after who it is alleged is one of the smoothest check swindlers to operate in Texas for some time, ended at the Central Hotel in Ballinger Wednesday morning when Sheriff Perkins of this city, and Sheriff Hamilton, of Coleman,

placed the hand cuffs on J. C. Pior alias C. R. Collins, alias A. H. Richards, and other assumed names. The man registered at the local hotel as C. R. Collins, Celina, Texas, and was assigned to room No.

15. A phone message from Coleman to Sheriff Perkins late Tuesday morning, arriving at three o'clock from Coleman. On the same train came the Coleman Sheriff, and a printer by the name of Wade, who identified the man as the same party who had some cashier's checks printed at Coleman the day before. The woman registered at the Central Hotel as Mrs. W. H. Morris, Fort Worth.

Keeping watch on the woman led to the whereabouts of Collins. Notwithstanding that the train she came to Ballinger on passed through Coleman, the woman chartered a jitney and paid the driver six dollars to bring her to Coleman Junction, where she caught the train. The sheriff was not asleep and he caught the train at Coleman which the woman a few minutes later boarded at the Junction, and following her to Ballinger Collins was located.

Collins, or Pior, or Richards, or whatever his name might be is wanted at several different places for putting over check deals which netted him several hundred dollars, or perhaps thousands of dollars. The officers making the arrest did not know how many places the man was wanted, further than that he would first be carried to Abilene to face trial for drawing \$250 cash on a bad check at a bank at Merkel. This occurred three months ago, and since that time the bank detectives have been trailing him over Texas. It is also known that he is wanted at Dallas for a similar charge. The Bankers Association it is claimed have a nice reward hanging out

for him. The man's ending began when he went to a printing office in Coleman a few days ago and had some cashier's checks printed on a bank at Celina, Texas. The printer became a little suspicious and reported the unusual transaction to a Coleman banker. This put the Coleman Sheriff on the man's trail. It developed that the man had left Coleman, but his wife had not left and the sheriff kept a watch on the woman and followed her to Ballinger.

Collins, Pior, etc., it seems had been making Ballinger one of his stopping places for two or three weeks. He was a nice looking young man well dressed and made an impression which made it easy for him to break into society. He was doing well along that line here, and is said to have been going in Ballinger's best society. He represented himself as being a representative for a prominent truck firm.

When arrested in his room at the hotel about seven o'clock Wednesday morning, he requested the officers to leave the room and go down stairs and give him time to dress. The officers assured him that they were in no particular hurry, and would wait in the room for him.

As the man was repeating his request for the officers to leave the room, the sheriff's eyes fell upon an automatic pistol sticking under the man's pillow, and grabbed it. At the same time the man slipped some checks out of his pocket and attempted to destroy them but the officers succeeded in saving the pieces of the checks, but they had not been placed together sufficient to determine what bank they had been drawn on.

It is the opinion of the officers that the man was ready, and had

The woman did not seem to be disturbed over the arrest of her husband, but showed considerable pride in trying to keep the matter a secret and tried to conceal the bracelets which the officers presented the man with by covering them with his coat and keeping the coat sleeves pulled down over his hands. The couple claimed that their home was in Fort Worth, where they were married a few months ago, and the man a few days ago purchased a fifty dollar bank draft at Coleman. He had this in his possession when arrested and claimed that he purchased it to send to his mother.

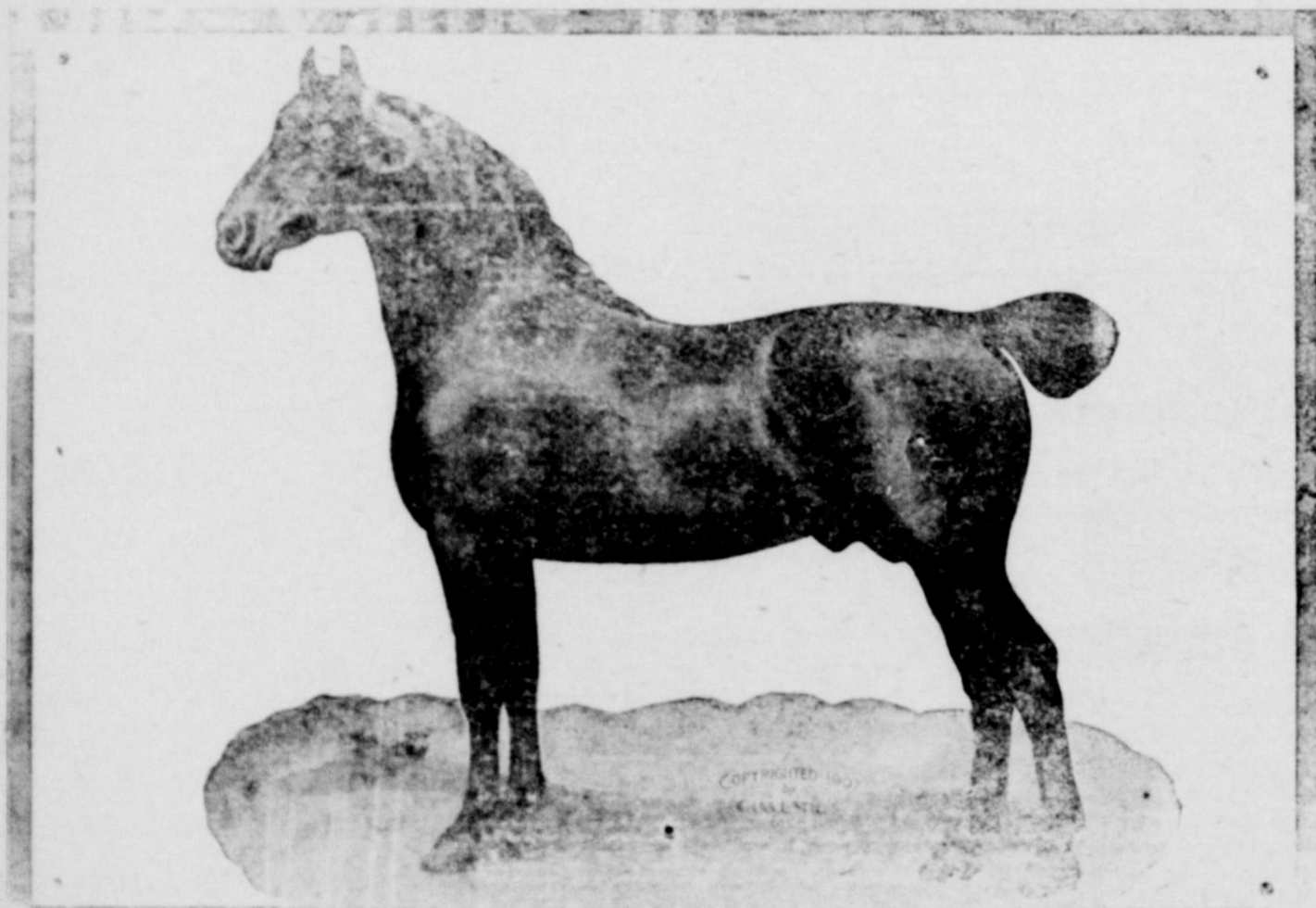
