He knows his business...I suspect he has a slight problem with ever staying in one place for long...he's worked at newspapers from Florida to New Mexico.

But he mumbled on, pitifully, about how lucky we were to own our papers, and how he had missed his opportunities to own papers over the years.

He loves the newspaper business, like most of us in the business, one doesn't do it without a love for it.

We didn't have a job for him...but gave him a list of other papers to head west towards...to see if perhaps they had an opening.

He drove off, disappointed, but still smiling and pleasant.

Cindy looked at me, I looked at Cindy. She said, "Is THAT where we're headed?" We tried to laugh it off.

No one knows what misfortune plagues a stranger...no one knows what mistakes he may have made to get in such sad shape.

But even trying to laugh it off, all day we were quiet, a little disturbed.

That night I laid down, counted my blessings and said the old "there but for the grace of God, go I" line.

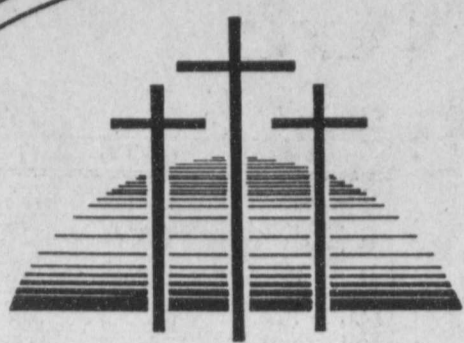

Their car has been replaced, and they have received some funds from an insurance company, at no expense to the County.

I have apologized and now again apologize for the incident. I also resolved on that night to never drink alcohol again and I have not and will not.

I was assessed, by the County Judge of Lamar County, the same punishment anyone else charged with the same offense would have received. I asked for no special treatment and was given none.

I have sought and do seek your forgiveness and understanding, which I feel that I have already had from my God and my church.

I have spoken to many of your children and grandchildren about the many pitfalls of alcohol and all other drugs and will continue to do so.

Some have said that I have some nerve in asking for my job for 4 more years, but I call it concern for good law enforcement and my continued dedication to fight against all drugs.

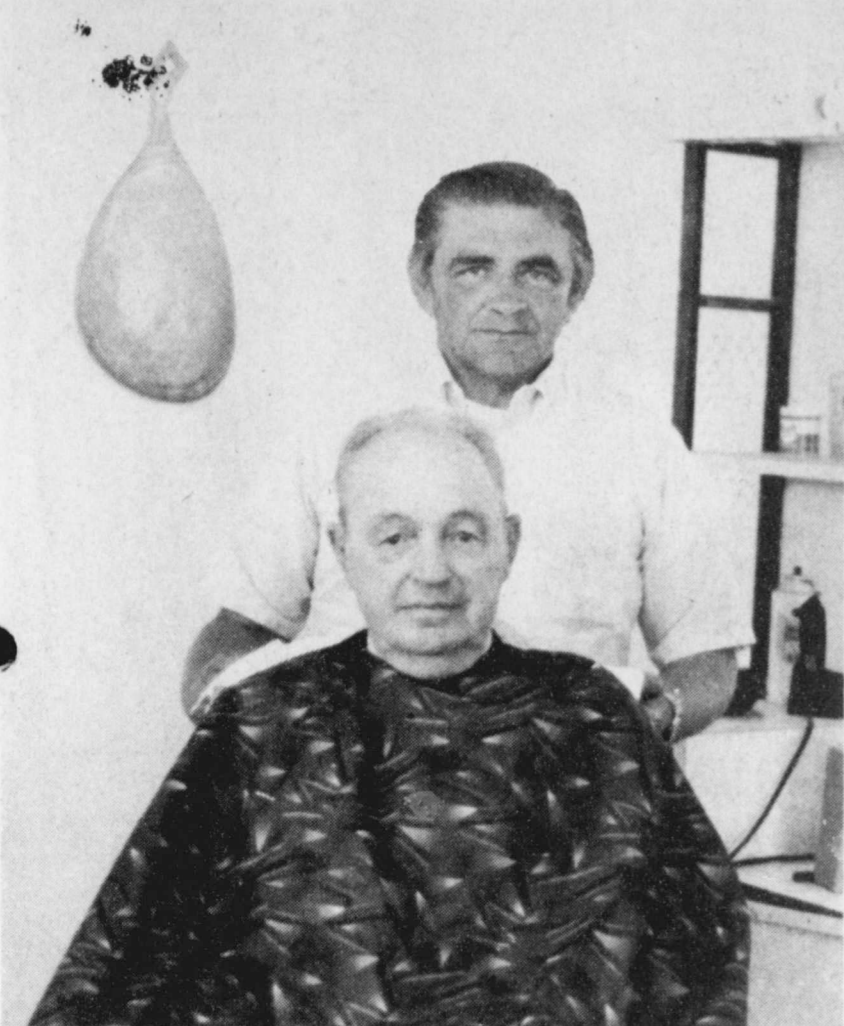
I was encouraged by many leaders in this community not to throw away 25 years of training, experience, and knowledge because of one unfortunate incident.

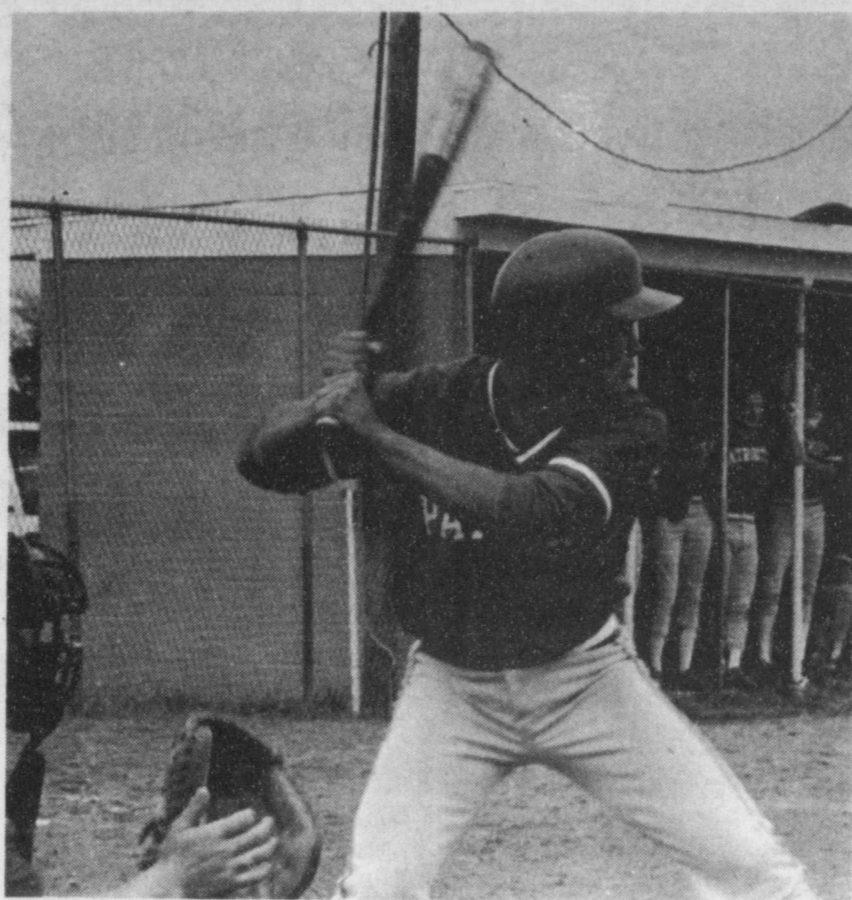
