An inquest conducted by Justice of Peace Frank Kendall determined that he had suffered a heart attack after being thrown off his tractor when it backed into a ravine. The body was found by Walter and Slats DeBord.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday from the First Methodist Church here by Rev. W. M. Culwell and Minister S. W. Sanders. Burial was in Rowe cemetery with Murphy-Spicer Funeral Home in charge.

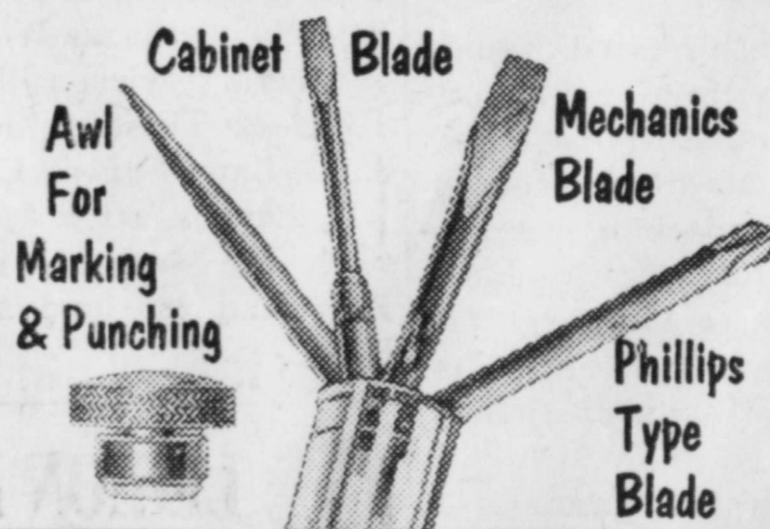

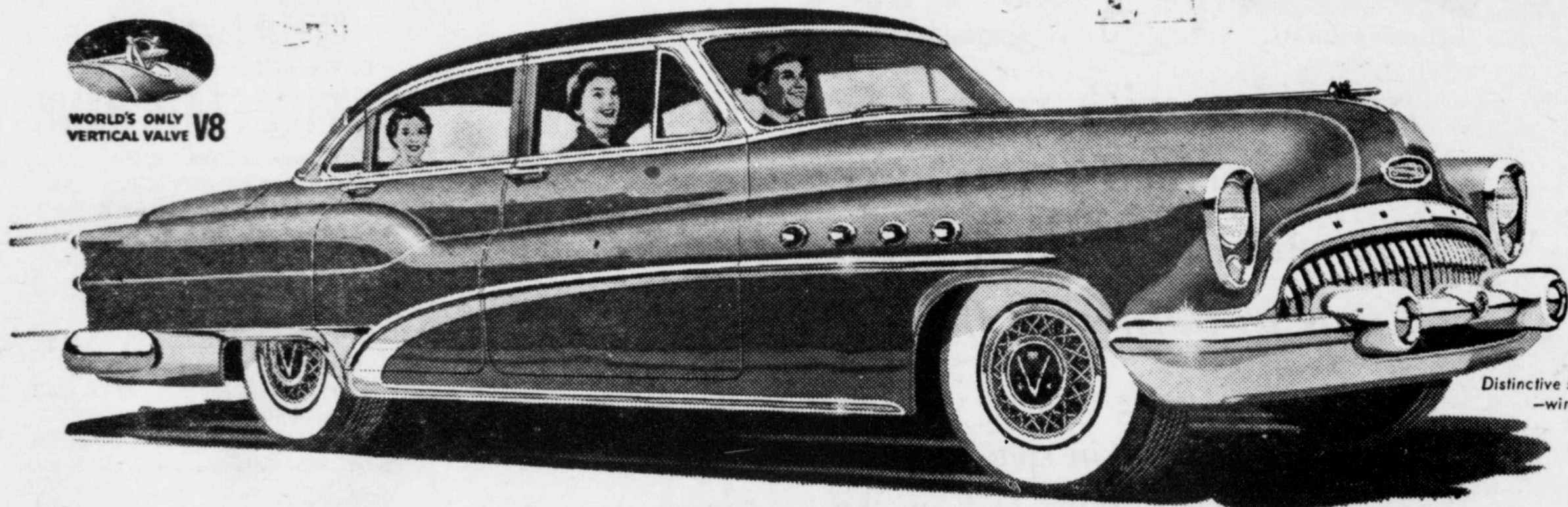
