DALHART - Keeping the tradition alive, the 13th annual Trail of Sales will be June 7, according to Kay Rogers, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service family and consumer science agent in Dallam and Hartley counties.

Trail of Sales communities participating include Channing, Dalhart, Hartley and Texline. Maps with selling sites and additional information will be posted online at <http://dallam.agrilife.org/>, at the Dalhart Area Chamber of Commerce and The County Times Two.

Hard copies will be located at the AgriLife Extension office located at 401 Denrock. in Dalhart, convenience stores and selling sites.

"Look for the 'I'm a Proud Supporter' signs and thank the seller for support the Texas Extension Education Association and our community," Rogers said.

The first Trail of Sales was held in 2002 after Susie Breitling, former AgriLife Extension

agent and founder of the event, saw the need to create a community resource economic development event that would benefit families and businesses alike, Rogers said.

Dallam and Hartley county residents agreed and the event has become a tradition over the years, she said. Along the way, if an organization was unable to continue hosting the event, they found another organization to take their place to insure the event continued.

Rogers said this year the Trail of Sales has come full circle as the Texas Extension Education Association members of Dallam and Hartley counties and AgriLife Extension joined forces to host the 13th annual Trail of Sales.

The \$15 fee charged to be a part of the Trail of Sales goes to support the Texas Extension Education Association and the numerous community service projects, adult and youth educational events and scholarships to graduating seniors.

In the past, the clubs have supplied favors/awards given to youth participating in the Bi-County 4-H Fashion and Food Shows and provided the community with meals to promote healthy family meals, Rogers said. This year the Dallam and Hartley County Library was selected to be their major community service project.

mentation Continues at Brisk Pace with Universities and State Cooperative
rams Now Set to Help Educate Farmers

May 29, 2014 - Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that the U.S. Department of SJA) is awarding \$6 million to universities and cooperative state extension services to develop online and other materials and train experts to educate producers about several key farm bill programs. The new Web p farmers and ranchers determine what participation in programs established by the 2014 Farm Bill will mean.

Vincennes, Indiana, will receive a grant from the National Endowment for Democracy (NED) to support the work of the Food and Agricultural Policy Institute (FAPRI) at the University of Missouri and the Agricultural and Food Policy Center at Texas A&M University. FAPRI will receive a total of \$3 million to develop the new and train state-based extension agents who can in turn help educate farmers.

Farmers and ranchers understand new Farm Bill programs and what the programs mean for their families is one of top priorities," said Vilsack. "With the resources we're providing, university experts will help ensure farmers and ranchers are highly educated as they make critical decisions about new programs that impact their livelihoods. The new tools we developed will empower farmers and ranchers to select the plan that best fits their unique needs."

PO Box 7 resources will help farmers and ranchers make an educated choice between the new Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) program and the Price Loss Coverage (PLC) program. Using the new online tools, producers will be able to use data on their specific farming operations combined with factors like the geographical diversity of crops, soils, weather and market prices across the country to test a variety of financial scenarios before officially signing up for the new program options for the 2018-19 marketing year. Once a producer enrolls in the ARC or PLC program, he or she must remain in the program through the 2023-24 marketing year.

tools will be provided for other programs as well. Sign-up for the newly established Margin Protection Program for (MPP) begins late this summer and enrollment for "buy-up" provisions under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance (NAP) will begin early next year. An online MPP tool will be available when sign up begins and the NAP buy-up insurance resource will become available to producers in the fall for the 2015 crop year.

201 University of Illinois, as lead for NCPE, and FAPRI at the University of Missouri and AFPC, at Texas A&M, as co-leads for NAAFP will develop the ARC and PLC Web tool program. The University of Illinois will also develop the online sources for MPP and NAP.

SDA will also award \$3 million to state cooperative extension services—a nationwide network of experts based at land-grant universities—for outreach and education on the new Farm Bill programs. Funds will be used to conduct public education outreach meetings where producers can speak with local extension agents and Farm Service Agency (FSA) staff. Outreach meetings will begin late this summer to help farmers and ranchers understand the new programs and their options.

While universities work to create new online tools, producers now have access to a preliminary website that gives them a chance to begin familiarizing themselves with the new programs and the type of information they will need to consider when deciding which program options work better for them. At this site, farmers and ranchers can view ARC and PLC projected payments, ARC guarantees, and PLC payment rate projections. These tables are available on the [FSA website](#).

Today's announcement was made possible through the 2014 Farm Bill, which builds on historic economic gains in rural America over the past five years, while achieving meaningful reform and billions of dollars in savings for taxpayers. Since enactment, USDA has made significant progress to implement each provision of this critical legislation, including providing disaster relief to farmers and ranchers; strengthening risk management tools; expanding access to rural credit; funding critical research; establishing innovative public-private conservation partnerships; developing new markets for rural-made products; and investing in infrastructure, housing and community facilities to help improve quality of life in rural America. 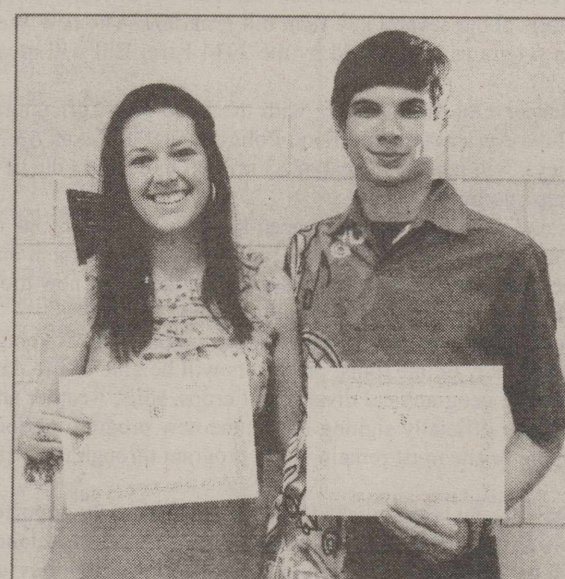

APPLICATION. City of Stratford, P.O. Box 188, Stratford, Texas 79084, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Land Application Permit (TLAP) No. WQ0010293002 to authorize the disposal of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 375,000 gallons per day via irrigation on 331 acres of land. The domestic wastewater treatment facility and disposal area are located approximately 600 feet north of State Highway 15 and 1.2 miles east of the intersection of State Highway 15 and U.S. Highway 287, in Sherman County, Texas, 79084. TCEQ received this application on March 25, 201. The permit application is available for viewing and copying at Stratford City Hall, 518 North 3rd Street, Stratford, Texas. ADDITIONAL NOTICE. TCEQ's Executive Director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After technical review of the application is complete, the Executive Director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the county-wide mailing list and to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application.

If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify an individual

member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission Meeting.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised in timely filed comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. TCEQ may act on an application to renew, a permit without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mailing list for a specific applicant name and permit number, and/or (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on, the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

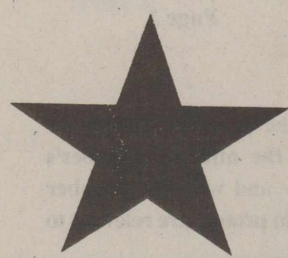

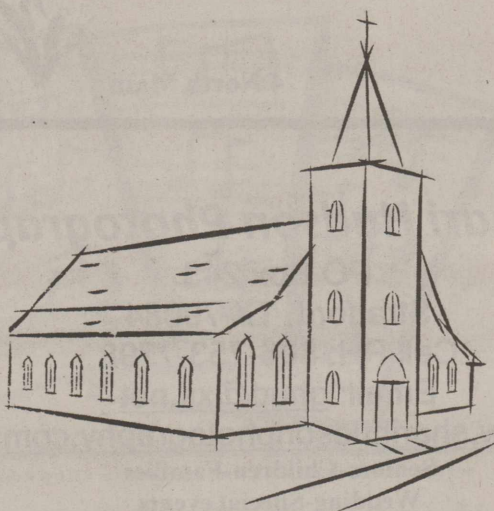
