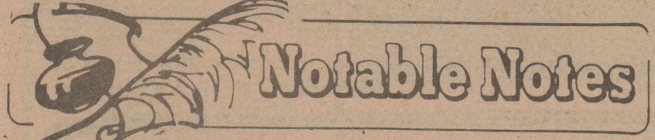
bodies will be on Saturday, April 4. Absentee balloting begins March 16 and will continue through March 31.

## 20 Indicted By Grand Jury

Aransas County's grand jury, convening for the first time in 1981, returned 17 indictments against 20 persons Friday afternoon, January 30.

The indictments were the result of a grand jury session that began Tuesday morning, January 27. Docket call for these cases is 10 a.m. February 13.

Indictments included two returned against Charles Wright who was charged with the December 24 burglary of a shrimp boat, "Jennifer V." owned by Ivan Viducik and the January 10 burglary of Char-

lotte Plummer's Seafare Restaurant.

Also indicted on two counts was Phillip Chupe who was charged with the January 17 theft of money — more than \$200 but less than \$10,000 — from Dolores N. Miller.

Chupe was also included in an indictment for the January 8 burglary of a building owned by Lou LeBlanc. Also indicted on this charge were Joe Pulido and J.D. Aleman.

## CPR Training Turns Hand Wringers Into Life Savers

Because Rockport is considered a high risk area for heart attacks and cardiac problems, some concerned Rockport individuals are trying to teach area residents how to save lives.

They want to teach the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) lifesaving technique to as many Rockport area residents as they can.

Ken Clark of the Concern Center and the American

Heart Association, and Iris Jenkins, who teaches CPR in the Rockport-Fulton High School health classes, both feel that CPR is an invaluable to everyone and area residents in particular.

Clark has just finished a class in which 10 people were taught the technique and will soon be forming another.

Anyone interested in becoming a CPR student may call the Concern Center at 729-7722 or Clark at 729-1146.

Rockport heart attack statistics are high due primarily to the number of older residents in the area, but heart attack victims are not the only persons able to be saved by CPR.

The statistics for on-the-water accidents — recreational as well as work-related — could be lowered if more people knew this technique. Both Clark and Jenkins cite former students who, because of their CPR training, were able to

save area drowning victims.

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation can be used in cases of electric shock, suffocation (both infant and adult), sensitivity reactions to insect bites, strokes, smoke inhalation and drug overdoses.

The technique is not difficult to learn and there is ample opportunity to get into CPR classes. Clark conducts classes through the Concern Center "when-

ever he can get enough people together." As a former heart attack victim, he urges everyone to learn the technique before they need it, not after.

He wants to make his students "lifesavers, instead of hand-wringers," but acknowledges that most people do not come in to take the course until they've had a scare involving someone close to them.

Jenkins agrees and cites

## Harry Davis Makes Best Bread In Town

Residents of Trav-Trailer-R-Inn will tell you that Harry Davis makes the best bread in town. If the number of people at Harry's recent bread-baking lesson is any indication, that claim may be the truth.

Davis became a baker's helper in Lansing, Michigan in 1928 when he was 14 years old. He kept baking right through the depression, a fact illustrating his statement, "If you're a good baker, you'll never have to worry about a job... people will always need to eat."

He opened his own bakery in Whitehall, Michigan in 1945 and later worked as a bakery supervisor until his retirement 15 years ago.

He and his wife Barbara have lived in Rockport at the Trav-Trailer-R-Inn for the past four years and despite the fact that he seldom bakes any more, the residents of the park persuaded Davis to share his expertise with them in a demonstration of bread baking.

Davis explained to his neighbors that "there are a few know-hows in turning out a good loaf of bread. Keep salt and yeast sepa-

rate, test your liquid before adding it to yeast by dipping your little finger into it. It should be lukewarm, not hot."

Davis' recipe for the best bread in town:

1/4 cup of yeast  
2 Tbsp. of salt  
1/4 cup of sugar  
2 cans of milk (1 quart when mixed)  
canned shortening  
3 1/2-4 lbs. flour (regular not self rising)

Combine salt, sugar and canned shortening. When well-mixed, add warm liquid, then add enough flour to make a firm dough. Last, add yeast that has been dissolved in warm water.

Knead dough on floured board, punching it down to break up any bubbles inside. Place in a greased pan or bowl.

Let rise for one hour, 15 minutes and punch down again. Let rise for five minutes, and punch down and separate into five loaves. Place in greased pans and let rise for 45 minutes.

Bake in pre-heated oven for 20 minutes at 375 degrees.

**Holiday Beach Residence Burglarized**

Delicate surgery is now being used to treat arrhythmias (abnormal heart rhythms). Procedure known as "activation sequence mapping" pinpoints the heart tissue that is causing the abnormality.

Microwave energy can be used to save the fingers and toes of patients with frostbite by warming them very gently, says a doctor at the University of Utah College of Medicine in Salt Lake City.

It's easier to PREVENT obesity than cure it, says doctors — and prevention starts with infants. Clinic at the Nassau County Medical Center in New York (and others) utilize behavior modification on the youngest children.

To reduce the risk of certain birth defects in the infants of diabetic mothers, two Boston hospitals are utilizing a special pump that administers a constant injection of insulin to the mother to provide nearly normal blood sugar levels.

# Feline Panleukopenia

Dr. Lutz is a graduate of Baltimore City College and Texas A&M University. He specializes in small and exotic animal practice. He was an instructor of small animal diseases and surgery in the Veterinary School at Texas A&M and was in private practice in Waco for 25 years.

Over the years feline panleukopenia has been known by a variety of names: feline distemper, infectious enteritis, cat fever and cat typhoid.

This is a highly contagious virus disease that occurs

wherever there are cats. Cats of any age may be stricken. Young kittens are most susceptible.

This disease, like all preventable diseases, is so inexpensive and easy to prevent — and so hard to cure. It has a high mortality rate. For example: kittens, less than four months of age, may die at the rate of 75 percent.

This virus has appeared in all parts of the United States and most countries of the world. A healthy cat, not inoculated against this disease, can become infected without coming in contact

with an infected animal. Transmission of the virus can occur from the urine, fecal material, nasal secretions or even fleas of an infected cat.

Remember, an infected flea can be within a block of your house, hop into your yard and bite your cat.

The first signs of this virus is general depression, loss of appetite, high fever, lethargy, vomiting, dehydration and hanging over the water dish.

Treatment is limited to supportive therapy. There are no antibiotics that can kill the virus. Strict isolation of a sick animal is essential.

The area where you treat

the patient should be warm, free of drafts, and clean. Plenty of "tender loving care" is very important. Cats may lose the will to live, so frequent petting, hand feeding, the use of heating pads, and good nursing care is essential.

How to prevent this disease: By vaccination — it's just as important to inoculate your kitten against this disease as it is to inoculate your child against smallpox, typhoid, polio, etc.

I prefer to give the first injection at the time of weaning. The follow-up injection should be given in two to three weeks.

Vaccines offer the safest

protection. Most vaccine are made from live virus treated to destroy their ability to cause disease. They stimulate the cat's body to produce protective antibodies. These vaccines are very effective in preventing the disease.

They must be administered before the cat is infected. The vaccine cannot be used as a treatment.

Once a cat is immunized, the vaccination must be repeated annually with a booster injection to maintain effective immunity.

**French Onion Soup**

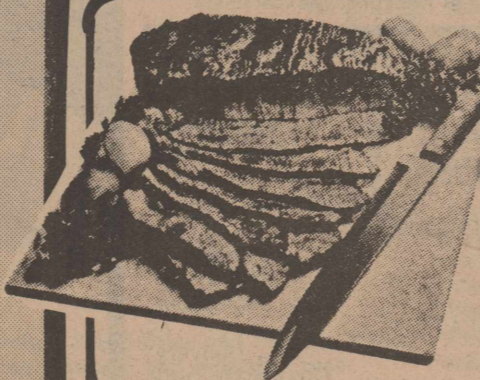
- 3 lbs. onions
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1 1/2 tpsps. pepper
- 2 tbsps. paprika
- 1 bay leaf
- 3/4 cup flour
- 1 cup white wine, optional
- 3 qts. salted beef bouillon

- French bread slices
- Swiss cheese slices

Slice onions 1/8 inch thick. Melt butter in large soup pot and add onions. Saute over very low heat 1 1/2 hours. Add pepper, paprika, bay leaf. Stir in flour until blended. Add wine, blending well. Heat 10 minutes. Add bouillon and simmer 2 hours. Adjust color, if wished, with caramel coloring or brown cooking sauce. Season to taste with salt. Refrigerate overnight to blend flavors. To serve, heat soup, fill fireproof individual bowls with soup, top with three (1 1/2-inch slices French bread) and top each bowl with 1 1/2 ounces each of Swiss cheese slices. Run under broiler until brown about 5 minutes. Makes 2 quarts soup.

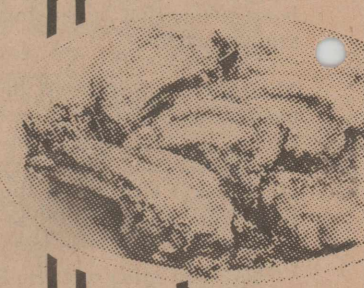

# Senior Citizens Eligible For Income Tax Benefits

AUSTIN — Some senior citizens find they have the time to travel; others enjoy meeting new friends or taking up new hobbies; and others are still on the workforce.

If you are age 65 or older, no matter what you do, you should be aware of certain tax benefits that apply to senior citizens, say IRS officials.

For instance, anyone 65 or older is entitled to an extra exemption of \$1,000. That means an automatic reduction to income of \$2,000 for single persons and \$4,000 for a married couple—both 65 or older—who file a joint return.

Do senior citizens have to file at all? In some cases, yes, since filing a tax return has nothing to do with age; it's income that decides that question.

Single persons 65 or over do not have to file a Federal income tax return if their income was less than \$4,300. The limit for a married couple filing a joint return, with only one spouse 64 or older, is \$6,400; the limit is \$7,400 if both spouses are 65 or over.

For tax purposes, persons are considered to be 65 on the day before their 65th birthday. Social Security payments are not taxable.

Another special benefit is the "Credit for the Elderly." The credit can in some cases—but not all—reduce taxes owed by as much as \$375 for single persons and \$562.50 for married couples who file a joint return.

Generally available under certain circumstances to persons 65 or over, the credit can sometimes apply to those under 65, particularly if they have retirement system income.

However, in certain instances other income such as maximum Social Security payments will wipe out the credit. Senior citizens who are

thinking about selling their personal residence should consider the once-in-a-lifetime \$100,000 exclusion of the gain on the sale of it.

An awareness of the tax consequence is essential before selling a personal residence at any age, but doubly so for those 55 or older.

The IRS has more than 90 free publications on various tax subjects. Of special interest to older taxpayers are the following: 505, "Tax Withholding and Estimated Tax"; 523, "Tax Information on Selling or Buying Your Home"; 524, "Credit for the Elderly"; 554, "Tax Benefits for

Older Americans"; and 575, "Pension and Annuity Income".

These are available through the mail by using the order blank that comes in each tax package, or by calling the IRS number listed in the local telephone directory. They are also available at most IRS offices.

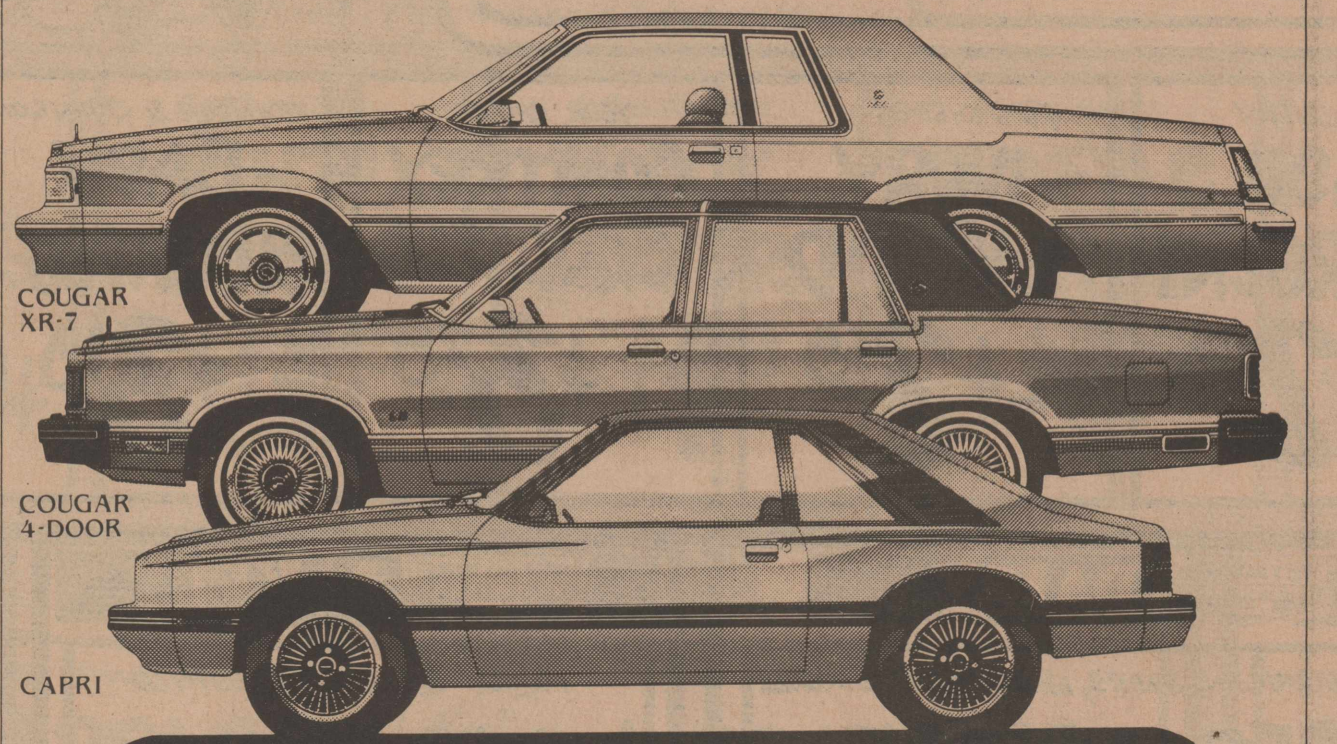

**Record-Setting Shark Caught Off Port Aransas**

AUSTIN — A new record for blacktip sharks was set in 1980 when Richard Goldgar of Missouri City caught a 166-pounder while fishing out of Port Aransas on June 2.

The Texas Parks & Wildlife Department in Austin also reports a new record for whitetip sharks set in 1980 when Joe T. Surovik landed a 106-pound whitetip out of Port Lavaca on April 24.

But the records set by two Rockport residents — for white marlin and wahoo — continued to be unbroken during the past year.

George Taggart set the state record for white marlin when he caught a 111-1/2 pounder off Hospital Rock on August 5, 1979. The marlin was 93 inches long with a 33-inch girth.

The record for wahoo caught in Texas was set on May 17, 1975, by Mrs. Billie Loden of Rockport. She hooked the 112-1/2-pound fish southeast of Port Aransas. The wahoo was six feet, 1-1/2 inches long with a 35-1/4 inch girth.

The biggest catch of 1980 — and appropriately, a record-setter — was the 871-pound hammerhead shark landed by Mark Johnson of LeMarque, fishing out of Galveston on July 4.

Runner-up was the 837-pound tiger shark — also a record specimen — landed last July 4 by Robert L. Derrick of Alta Loma.

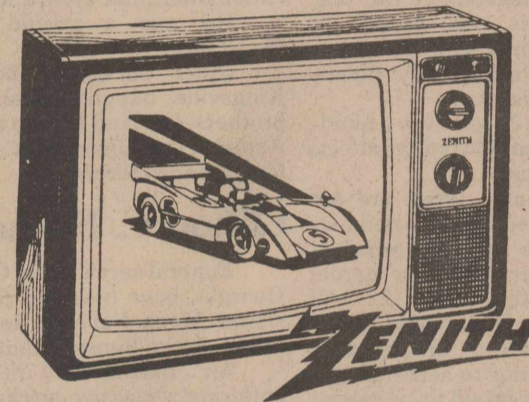

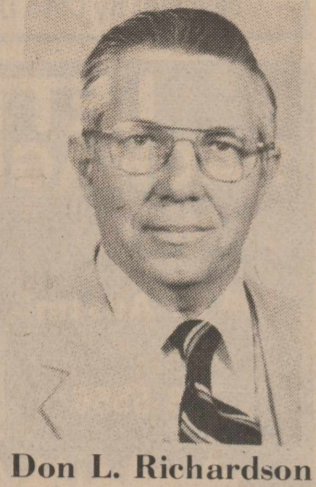

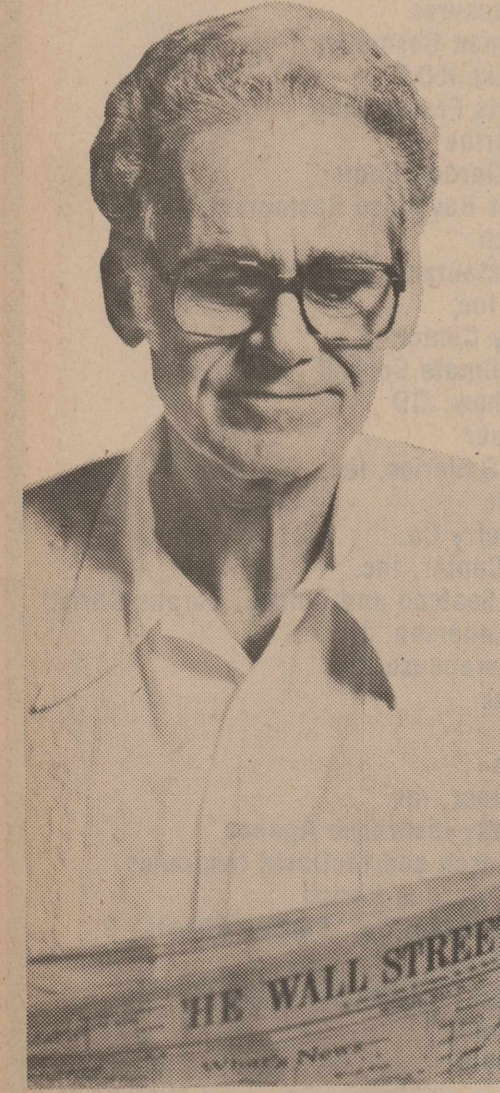

## Mabel Wallace Sasse

### Services Held For Aransas County Native

Editor's note: The following was sent to the Pilot by Crystal Ragsdale, now of Austin, and is reprinted essentially as submitted to capture some of the flavor of Aransas County before the turn of the century.

Memorial services for Mabel Wallace Sasse, daughter of Aransas County pioneers, were held Sunday, February 1, in St. Peter's Episcopal Church, Rockport, with the Rev. Walter D. Clark Jr. officiating.

Burial was in the old Lamar Cemetery. Mrs. Sasse died Friday, January 30.

She was born September 21, 1884, on the Blackjack Peninsula on one of the John Brundrett ranches. Her parents were Charles Messer and Minnie Johanna Hastings Wallace. She spent her early years in the unspoiled wilderness along St. Charles Bay.

She and her older sister Annie, hatless and barefoot, spent their days wading up and down the lonely beaches. They chased wild cattle back into the brush and found oysters to crack and eat at the water's edge.

During the hot summers her mother and father would split and salt the mullet her father had caught with his cast net, then arrange the fish on the roof of their house to dry.

Often at night Mabel would carry the coal-oil lantern for her father while he walked along the edge of the bay with a gig to spear a half-buried flounder. He always planted spring and fall gardens and set out sweet potato slips in the sandy soil.

During the 1886 storm that destroyed Indianola her father nailed bed slats across the doors of their house, but the wind lifted the house off its post foundation and set it alongside.

Charles Wallace played the violin for the dances at Blackjack and Lamar and accompanied the serenaders at Christmas as they went from house to house on the Peninsula.

He made his own cast nets and carved his own duck decoys. Mabel's mother became a crack shot at killing ducks and wild turkeys.

For mail and supplies they traveled from the Blackjacks to Lamar and Rockport by sailboat, in the Brundrett's "Sis" and Mabel's grandfather Edward D. Hastings' "Skipjack."

Mabel often visited him and his family in Lamar at his home by the Big Oak Tree long before the term Goose Island was introduced or the park site designated and when the oak's great branches still bent down to the ground.

Mr. Hastings operated a merchandise store in Rockport in the 1890s.

Some time around 1900 the Wallasses moved their young family of six daughters and one son to Rockport to a house on Live Oak Street. This house was given to her mother by an aunt, Mrs. Rufus (Betty Higgins) Carroll.

When Mabel's mother died in 1900, the 16-year-old Mabel assumed the role of mother to her younger sisters and her brother. She daily turned her milk cow out to graze in what is now downtown Rockport.

Soon after the family moved to Goliad, they became members of the Episcopal Church. In 1903

Mabel entered nurse's training at Valley View Hospital in Victoria and completed her education. She became a trained nurse in 1906, before the term Registered Nurse had come into use in Texas.

She worked as an independent professional woman for years, traveling by train and by horse and buggy, day and night in all weather, on her cases to homes on farms and ranches in the Victoria, Goliad and DeWitt County area.

She was married to Berthold Carl H. Sasse of DeWitt County in 1916. The couple moved from Victoria to Corpus Christi in 1923 and remained there until they moved in 1940 to San Antonio, where B.C. Sasse died in 1956. Mabel lived in her home until 1978.

She was active in a San Antonio writers' group, was an avid reader on world religions, philosophies, and poetry and was a painter in what has come to be known as the "primitive style."

Survivors include her daughters, Crystal S. Ragsdale of Austin and New Braunfels and Mrs. Ray S. Heller of McLean, Virginia and San Antonio; four grandchildren; her sister Thelma W. Glaze of Corpus Christi; her brother Bruce

E. Wallace of Enid, Oklahoma; numerous nephews and nieces and cousins, including her Hastings-Brundrett cousins in Rockport.

Kinsmen served as pallbearers: Dale Murray, H.F. Murray, Bruce W. Carlisle, Robert W. Williams III, Christopher W. Williams, Wesley E. Cleveland and Paul C. Ragsdale. The family has requested that memorials in her memory be made to St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Rockport or to the Rockport/Aransas County Public Library.

ABC Learning Center. Because of a delay in receiving ABC Learning Center's request, the preschool could not be included in the United Fund's original 1980 allocations. a case she was involved in while working for the Emergency Medical Service. CPR was performed on a baby that had suffocated, a possible crib death victim, and within a month the child's mother had enrolled in a CPR class.

Jenkins had an emergency of her own after she learned and had been teaching the technique. Her son, Briegle, at that time 15 months old, fell into the family swimming pool.

By the time the accident was discovered the baby had turned blue and had stopped breathing, but with CPR he was revived.

Jenkins stresses that because she knew what to do she saved her son's life. Had she not been trained, she believes the baby most likely would have died before the ambulance arrived.

Bill Aston, Chief Paramedic for the EMS, stresses that although their service is fast, time is of the essence when a person's heart has stopped — 6 to 10 minutes is usually the time elapsed before death — and even the fastest ambulance service often does not arrive at the scene within that time.

Aston urges everyone to take advantage of the training, especially if they have a relative or friend with a heart condition.

The two CPR instructors feel anyone who owns or works in a restaurant or similar public place should learn CPR and the "hug of life" technique for choking victims. They say many such persons do not have the training.

Jenkins said, "every restaurant has to get a beer license to operate, but there isn't any law requiring them to have CPR training and there should be."

Jenkins has trained many high school students and Clark has trained more than

300 people in the community in the last four years. But they both urge more people to come in and be certified. They also pointed out those already certified must recertify every year since research is constantly going on and there have been changes in the technique.

Another important factor, according to Clark, is that CPR must be performed only by someone who has had the proper training in what to do and when to do it.

Anyone attempting the technique without the training could further injure and possibly kill the person they are trying to save.

The candidate must also have lived in Texas for 12 months and in the city for six months immediately preceding the 31st day before the election and must reside in the ward he or she seeks to represent on the council.

Candidates for the school board will file in the school administration building.

In Fulton, it is anticipated that candidates will file for office in Fulton's City Hall.

Persons wishing to vote in the April 4 elections must have registered to vote by March 5.

No person may vote in a city election unless he or she is a resident of that city on the day of the election, and voters who move from

one ward to the other in Rockport prior to election day must transfer their registration to the new address in order to be eligible to vote in that ward on April 4.

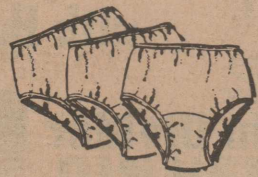

# Bentsen Seeks Protection For Independents

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Senator Lloyd Bentsen has introduced legislation to exempt from the "windfall profit" tax the first 1,000 barrels of oil a day pumped within the U.S. by an independent producer.

Both producers and royalty owners would be exempt under the bill.

"If we are sincerely concerned about increasing domestic oil and gas production, I can think of no more efficient or effective way to go about it," Bentsen said in remarks. "Year after year it has

been demonstrated that independent producers invest \$105 in new production for every \$100 they generate in revenue, and this at a time we need every drop of oil we can produce in this country," he continued.

"If we want to make maximum effective use of our energy assets in America, it simply makes no sense to place a windfall profit tax on the first 1,000 barrels of daily production from our independent producers. It makes no sense to take \$22 billion out of production over this decade."

The Senate, in November, 1979, approved a Bentsen amendment to the so-called "windfall profit" tax which would have provided the 1,000 barrel a day exemption for independent producers.

The House version of the "windfall profit tax" included no exemption for independents. Under the House bill independent producers would have paid a total of \$57 billion in "windfall" taxes.

The conference committee which met to iron out differences in Senate and

House versions of the "windfall" tax agreed, at the urging of Bentsen, on a compromise which reduced the total tax paid by independents from \$57 billion to \$22 billion, a savings of \$35 billion.

Bentsen noted that even though the tax on independents in the final version of the bill was substantially reduced from what the House originally proposed, \$22 billion is still a heavy tax burden.

And he said independent producers will wind up paying a lot more than that

by the time they fill out all the paperwork needed to pay the tax.

"Most of the oil and gas found in this country is due to the efforts of our 12,000 independent producers. Independents drill 90 percent of the wildcat wells in this country. They find 75 percent of the new oil and gas fields. They account for 54 percent of our new and gas reserves," Bentsen said.

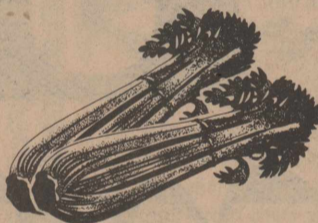

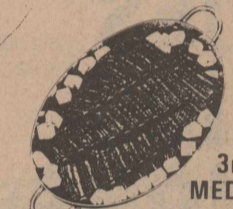

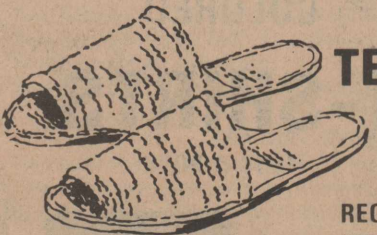

Jefferson Davis and his wife lived in the mansion only from April till the end of May 1861 when the Confederate States' capital was moved to Richmond, Va.

**Mengden Introduces Bill To Prohibit 'Social Promotions'**

AUSTIN — Senator Walter Mengden, Republican from Harris County, has pre-filed legislation to prohibit school districts in Texas from engaging in "social promotions," in which all students are automatically promoted from one grade to another without regard to academic achievement.

SB 142 establishes a state policy that students be required to demonstrate basic competencies appropriate for each grade level before being promoted to a higher grade level or awarded a high school diploma.

The bill requires the governing boards of all school districts to adopt basic proficiency tests in reading, writing, mathematics, social science, and natural science that are appropriate for each grade level and to prescribe minimum standards of achievement on the tests for promotion to the next grade or for receipt of a high school diploma after completion of the 12th grade.

No student may be promoted or given a diploma unless he or she has demonstrated a minimum level of achievement of the tests.

An exception to this requirement is provided for mentally retarded students in special education programs. However, a high school diploma awarded to a student in a special education program must indicate the student's exceptional status.

In addition, SB 142 requires all school districts to submit reports to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) at the end of each school year regarding the number of students who passed, failed, and repeated courses in summer school.

The TEA would investigate the practices in those districts that appear to be passing an abnormally high ratio of students. If, after being warned, a district persisted in automatically passing all or almost all students, the district would lose all state aid.

There is no such thing as automatic success in the things we do," he said.

"It's time to realize that education is very serious and extremely important," he added. "Students absolutely must learn the basic fundamental things they need to take their place in society. Schools do no favors to those students by handing out social promotions and automatic diplomas."

"In fact, those schools do the greatest disservice to those students and to the state as a whole," Senator Mengden said.

**'Moonlighting' Income Taxable**

AUSTIN — Income earned while "moonlighting" is taxable and must be reported on the Federal tax return, whether payment is received in a regular payroll check or in cash, say IRS officials.

The following questions and answers deal with some of the main points of reporting "moonlighting" or sideline income:

Q: What kinds of occupations would qualify as "moonlighting" jobs for tax purposes?

A: Some examples are — an athletic coach umpiring a sports event in off-duty hours for compensation; a

policeman doubling as a cab driver or a school teacher babysitting during the evenings or weekends.

Q: In many cases, employers of second jobs don't furnish W-2, "Wage and Tax Statement," forms. Do taxpayers have to declare the income if they don't receive a W-2?

A: Yes. Income from any source is taxable unless excluded by law. If a W-2 is not furnished, the taxpayer should keep a careful record of the dates, employers and type of employment. The income is declared on line 8 of the 1040 Form and on line 7 of the 1040A.

Q: Is income from self-employment as a second job taxable income?

A: Yes. Income must be declared regardless of the amount. If you have earned at least \$400 in net profit from self-employment, you are also subject to self-employment tax.

Q: How about a person who moonlights as a baseball umpire? Are there any expenses he or she can deduct?

A: Possibly, if the job required the person to wear special clothing, or use special equipment. The cost and maintenance of such items might be a miscellaneous deduction.

Q: How can I get more detailed information about taxable income and deductible expenses?

A: You can order free IRS Publication 525, "Taxable and Nontaxable Income," and 529, "Miscellaneous Deductions." These booklets are available by using the order blank in your tax package or calling the IRS Forms/Tax Information number listed in the telephone directory.
