**GUBERNATORIAL PORTRAITS**



ARAM J. POTHIER  
(By Associated Press)

PROVIDENCE, R. I., July 22.—Governor Aram J. Pothier, who staged a "come-back" as chief executive after he passed his seventieth year, is called the state's Dick Whittington.

Bow Bells told young Whittington that he would be three Lord Mayor of London, but no bells rang for young Pothier when he came to Rhode Island as a boy from his birthplace in Quebec. Even without them he managed to be seven times governor, and the end is not yet in sight.

Five of these terms Governor Pothier served while a comparatively young man. Then a Democratic filibuster in the state senate brought him back to the state house after the Republicans drafted him as their candidate in 1924. Despite his age, he has not missed a legislative session since.

RAYMONDVILLE, Tex. (AP)—From 14 carloads of watermelons, John Wilde, big watermelon grower near here, took seven barrels of choice seed for next year's planting. About 2,000 acres of melons were planted in Willacy county this year and the acreage is expected to be larger next year.

RAYMONDVILLE — (AP)—The Edinburg independent school district has set aside \$70,000 for construction of a school building at Hargill. Fifty thousand dollars will be used for the building and \$20,000 for equipment.

CARTHAGE, Tex.—A contract has been awarded at \$68,440 for paving the public square and several main streets of this city.

**RUMANIA RIOT CLAIMS SEVERAL**

BERLIN, July 22.—A dispatch to the Nacht Ausgabe from its special correspondent at Bucharest says that a demonstration in favor of Prince Carol occurred there today.

The demonstrators are said to have been dispersed by the cavalry.

Several in the crowd were reported to have been killed.

PARIS, July 22.—Richer by his father's bequest by \$400,000, the former crown prince, Carol of Rumania, now appears to cherish the idea of mounting the throne he repeatedly renounced, judging by statements to the press in which he refers to himself as King Carol.

Meanwhile his application for permission to return to Bucharest to attend the funeral of King Ferdinand has not been answered, according to his own statements.

BUCHAREST, July 22.—In a simple golden oak casket covered with flowers from Queen Marie and his daughter, King Ferdinand rested today in the Golden Hall at the Cotroceni Palace.

Thousands of Rumanians passed the bier to do honor to their beloved king.

The body will lie in state until Sunday when burial will take

place at the royal mausoleum at Curtes de Agres.

## 82,000 SEE PRIZE FIGHT

(By Associated Press)  
**NEW YORK, July 22.**—Charles Mathison, one of the judges of the Sharkey-Dempsey fight, declared he would make the following report to the State Athletic Commission.  
 "Jack Sharkey was hit below the waist-line immediately before the knock-out punch and Jack Dempsey should have been disqualified."  
 Referee Jack O'Sullivan said the blow which preceded the knock-out punch was a fairly delivered one.

**NEW YORK, July 22.**—Motion picture operators and laboratory men who developed the official motion pictures of the Dempsey-Sharkey fight today announced that the films show the disputed blow which contributed to the Dempsey victory was apparently fair.  
 The pictures were later shown to newspaper men, attended by Tex Rickard, who said that in his opinion the blow was a fair one.  
 The pictures showed Sharkey wearing his trunks pulled higher up than Dempsey was wearing his which led the newspaper men to assert that this fact had probably contributed much to the confusion of the witnesses of the battle.

**NEW YORK, July 22.**—Last night's Dempsey-Sharkey battle drew a gate of \$1,075,000 and an attendance of 82,000, according

to Tex Rickard's estimate. Here are the promoter's figures: Dempsey's share, \$252,759; Sharkey's share, \$206,893; Rickard's share, \$454,188; and federal tax, \$53,750.



The governor talked to the men separately for a little more than one hour. When he left the prison the executive told newspaper men he had nothing to say about the interviews.

### OKLAHOMA OIL FIRM PROTESTS

(By Associated Press)  
OKLAHOMA CITY, July 22.—A written protest against the Corporation Commission making any order to restrict the drilling or to curtail the production of the Seminole Field has been made to the commission by the Gypsy Oil Company.

The protest followed the issuance of a temporary restraining order yesterday under which no wells may be shot or drilled into the sand in certain sections, pending a hearing for a permanent order.
