LITTLEFIELD, April 9.—The population in the Littlefield independent school district has increased 2,000 during the past year, according to the official school census just completed by J. S. Hillard. Last year there were 1,994 scholars. The eastern part of the district has been taken off in the meantime by the formation of the new school district, taking out children.
