The Academic Training

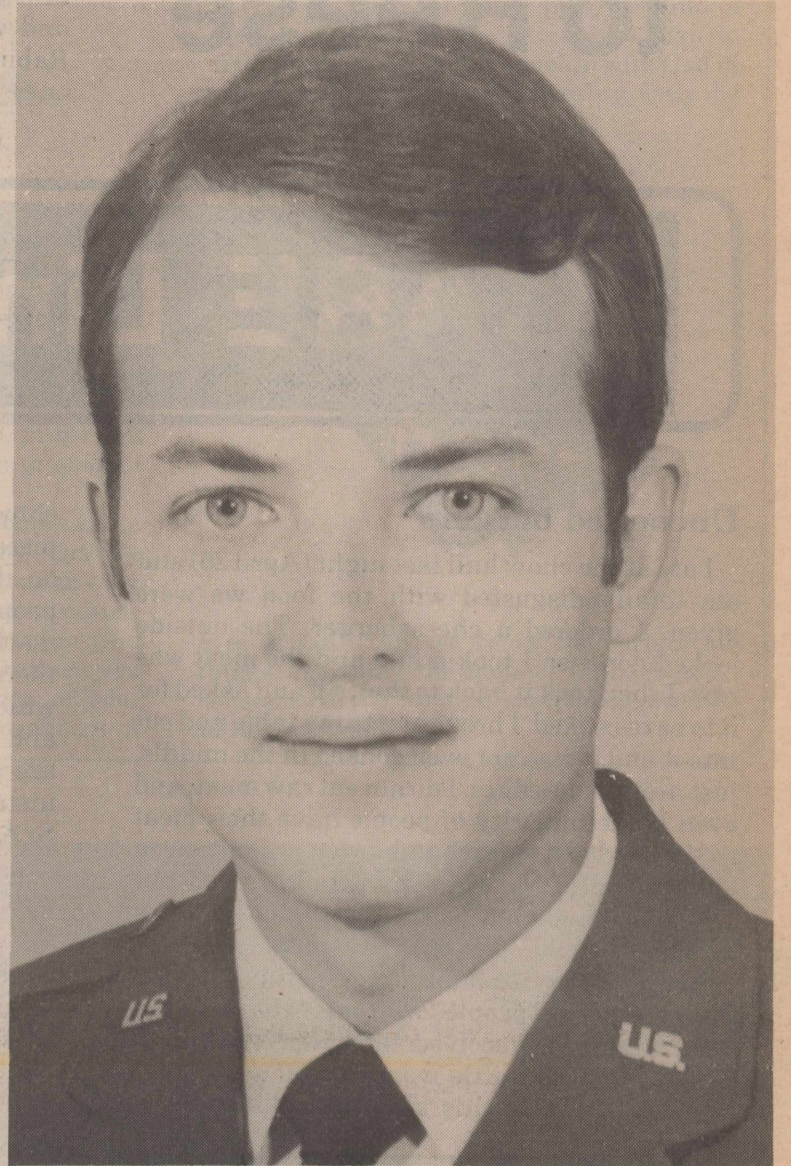

## Reese wraps up AFW observance

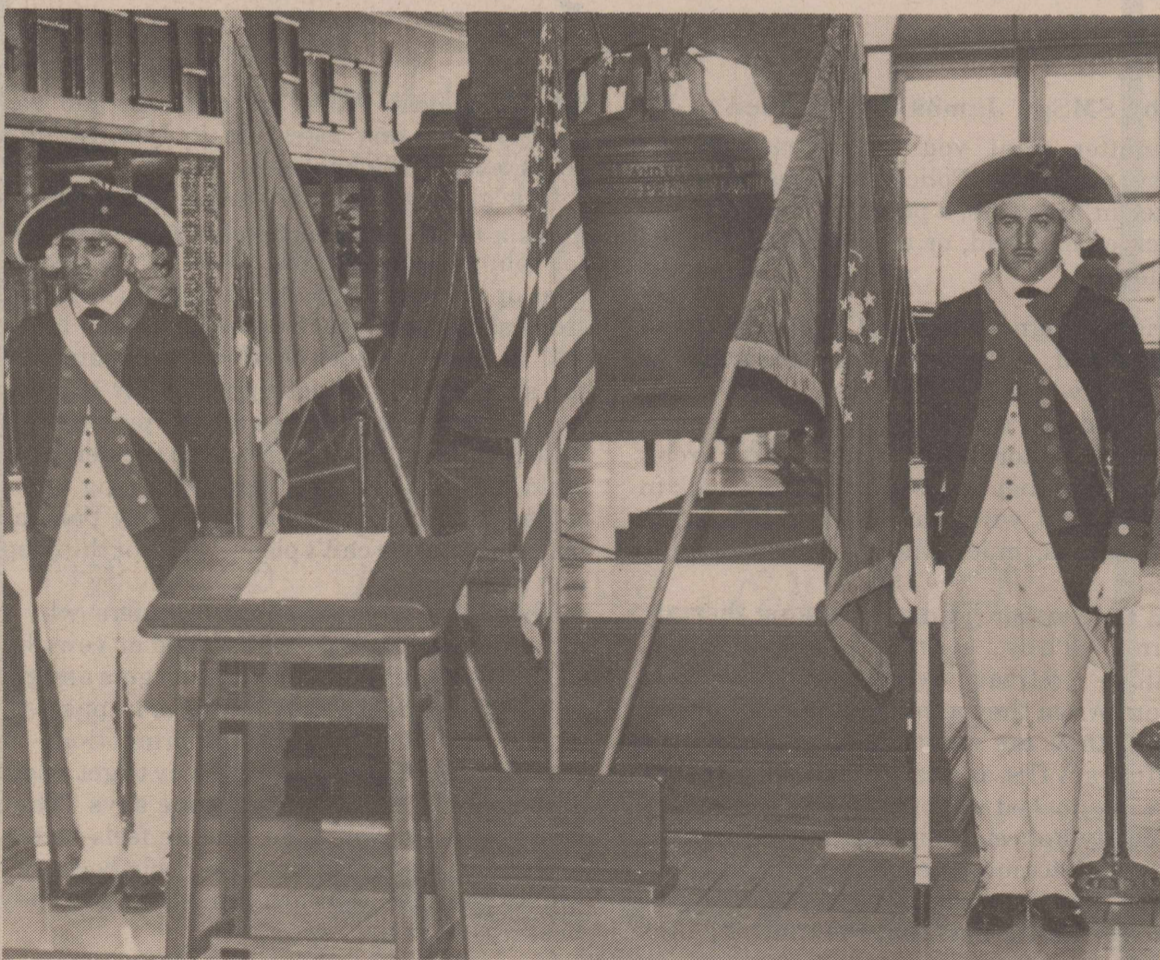
## Duty hours change

Starting June 1, most people on Reese will be going to work and leaving for home one-half hour earlier than they are now.

### Uncooked burgers

I ate at the chow hall last night (April 26) and am totally disgusted with the food we were given. I ordered a cheeseburger. The outside looked done, so I took a bite and the meat was raw. I then took it back to the grill and asked for it to be re-cooked. I brought it to my table and cut into it and it was not even cooked in the middle, just around the edges. I do not eat raw meat, and even if the majority of people have their meat medium done, this hamburger wasn't even close. I understand the meat is in frozen patties and they plop them on the grill, a few extra minutes would prevent red meat and the rejection of a lot of hamburgers left on trays. I know a lot of people who get the kind of hamburgers I received and leave without finishing them. Little wonder so much food is left uneaten with this kind of cooking at our

chow halls. People don't want the rubbery pieces of pie either, they don't taste good. Why do they keep serving them? There are a lot of people who agree with me concerning these matters. There is no excuse for dirty glasses. If there is a menu planning board or a board which exists for the purpose of my complaints and others, please do something about it. There are a lot of airmen out here who eat soup and instant foods rather than eat at the chow hall.

*We were not aware that hamburgers were being left on the plates, because the meat was not fully cooked. Control of waste is a definite concern, and we are very appreciative of ways to cut back on waste. All cooks will be made aware of this problem. Individuals may request any degree of cooking they prefer on their hamburgers or cooked to order.*

*Pies and cakes are cooked on a demand basis, and our intention is to not cook too many at one time. Presently pies are cooked every other day while cakes are cooked every third day. The requirement to keep these items refrigerated tends to firm them up, even if they are only refrigerated for a short time period.*

*Regulations require us to maintain very high sanitary conditions. Both Food Service personnel and the base veterinarian maintain stringent controls over sanitary conditions. The local water causes the appearance of utensils and glasses to be dirty when they are not. This is true even with a water softener which we have. Two individuals from Civil Engineering are assigned to insure that the dishwasher and water softener are in proper working order through daily inspections.*

To find God in all things requires the inner eyes of faith. Faith is the inner eye that sees him in the face of a child, in the first light of



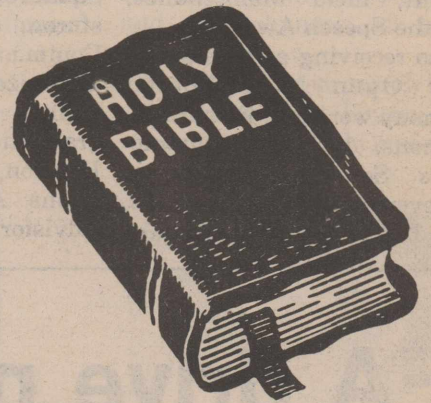

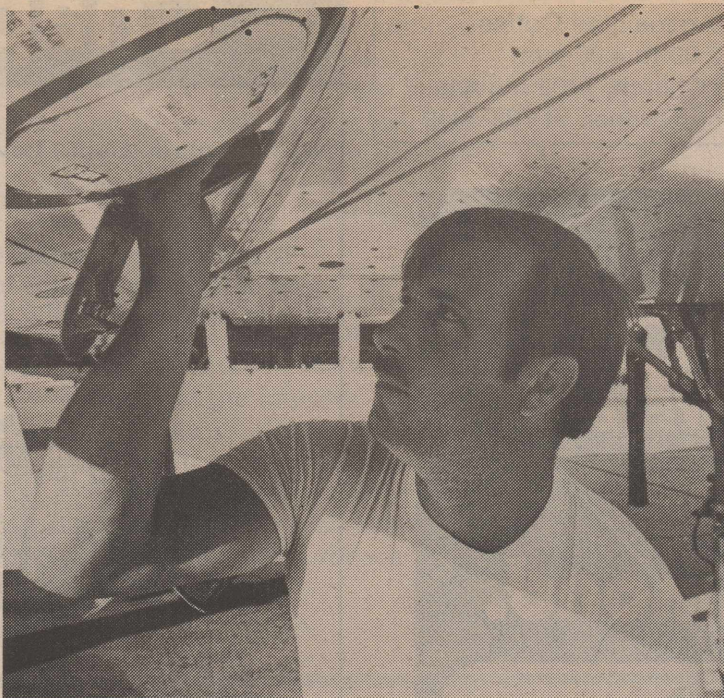

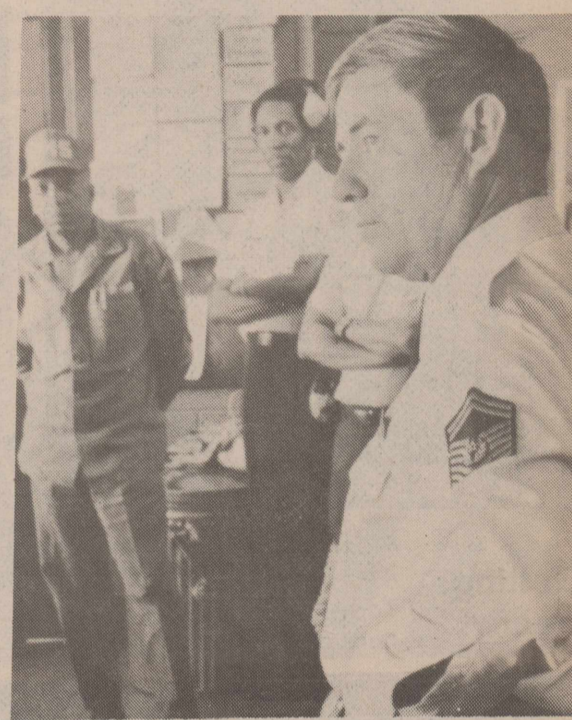
Jokingly he said that everytime he dons the special chevron that only Robert D. Gaylor wears, he knows what Clark Kent felt like when he slipped into a phone booth.

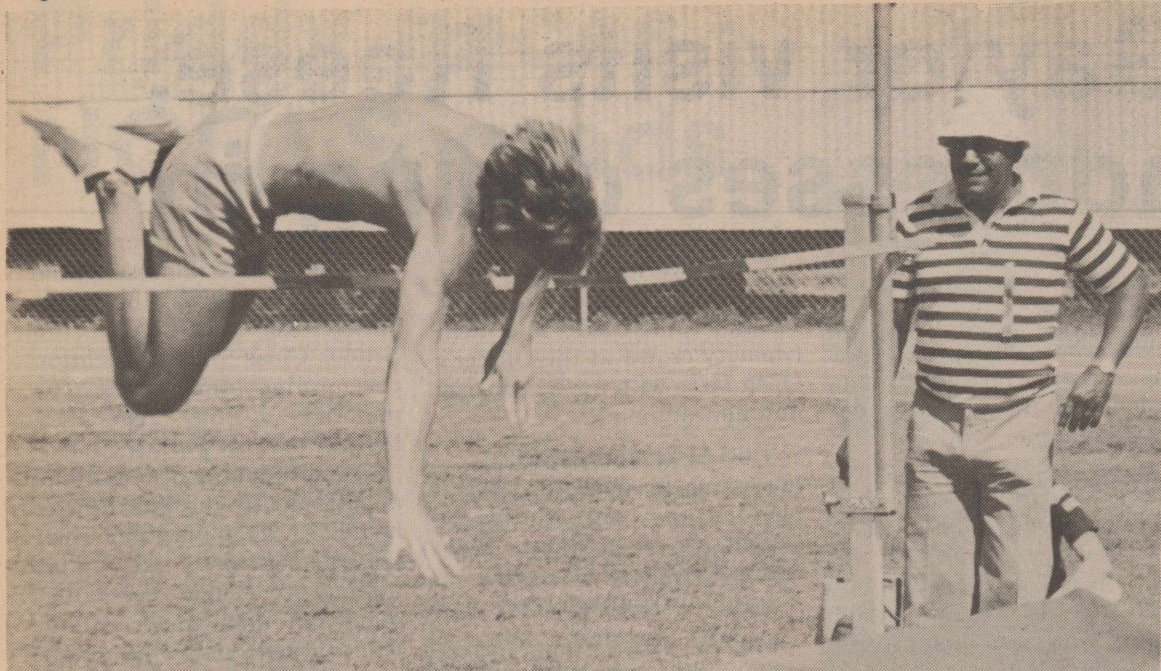

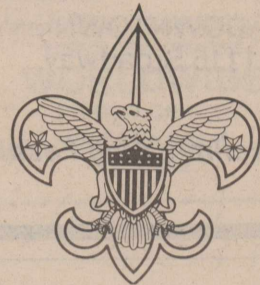

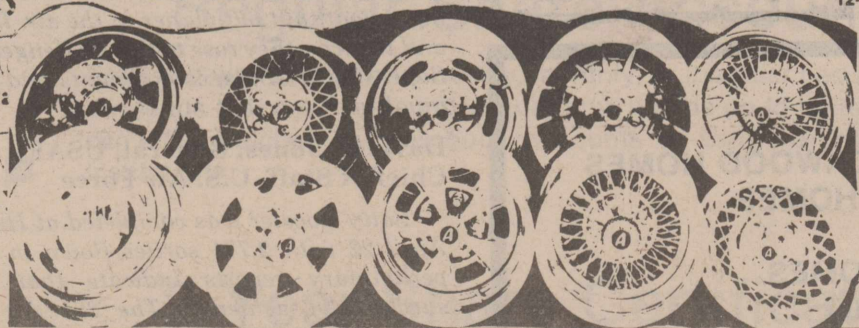

# AF to test meters in family housing

Utility meters are being connected to military family housing at Little Rock AFB, Ark., and Cannon AFB, N.M., as part of an energy conservation test.

Installation of the meters is scheduled to be completed by June 30, with actual testing to last from Oct. 1, 1978-Sept. 30, 1979.

Congress directed the Department of Defense to test the feasibility of metering utilities as a conservation measure. Family housing at Army and Navy installations is included in the test.

The services and DOD will compare energy consumption in the test quarters with norms

established by a tri-service energy committee. Information from the test will be used to determine whether all military family housing should be metered, Air Force housing officials said.

There will be no charge for utilities used during the test. Families in the test quarters who use more energy than the norm will receive a mock bill to let them know how their energy use compares to the test standards.

In establishing the energy norms, the DOD committee will consider the size, age and type of housing unit; building materials; number of occupants; local climate and the

energy consumption for a similar civilian family and house in the same area.

When the House of Representatives passed its fiscal year 1978 military construction bill, it authorized DOD to install meters in all military family housing and to set reasonable limits on utilities use. The House Appropriations Committee proposed the test program instead of metering all housing at once.

Congress has said metering beyond the test program would require "express prior approval" of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees.

education and was the driving force behind many initiatives for improved military education programs.

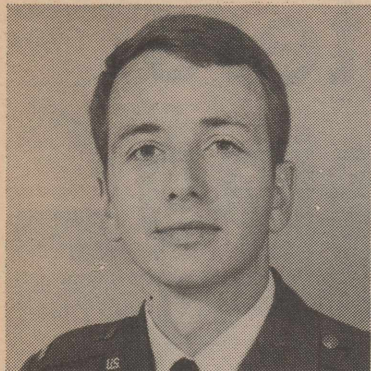

The EWC meets every first Monday of each month. The meetings are held at 7 p.m.

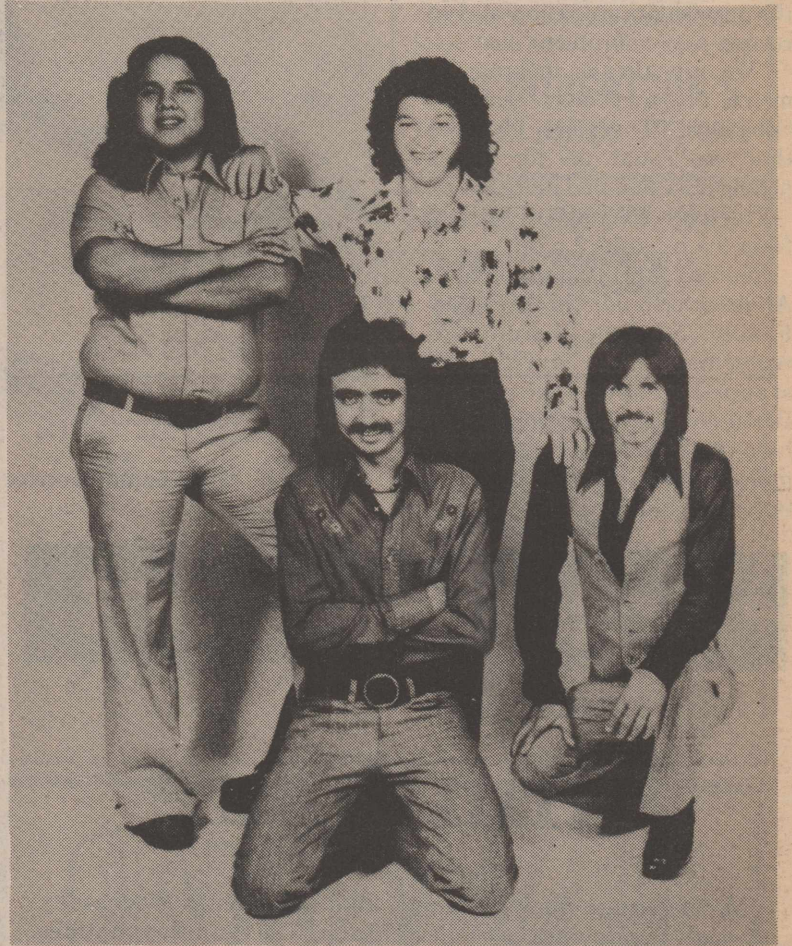
## Base Chapel slates Bible School class

# AF briefs

## Reserves Hold Exercise

Air Force Reserve units and more than 20,000 personnel across the United States have completed the largest short-notice test mobilization/deployment conducted in recent times. Activated the first weekend in May, Operation Redoubt—Phase II, added realism by deploying more than 1,000 reservists and some 500,000 pounds of equipment to bases throughout the country. The practice involved all procedures that would occur in an actual recall and will serve to streamline the mobilization process.

## AF begins cruise missile studies

The Air Force has issued a request for proposals (RFP) to industry to begin studies on the feasibility of using wide-body aircraft as cruise missile carriers. The RFPs went to the Boeing Aerospace Co., Lockheed Aircraft Corp., and McDonnell Douglas Aircraft Co., all producers of domestic wide-body transport aircraft. Wide-body aircraft are being examined as a possible supplement to the B-52 cruise missile carrier force. One or more contractors will be selected for the study effort. Award of contracts is expected within 60 days. The program is directed by Air Force Systems Command's Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio.

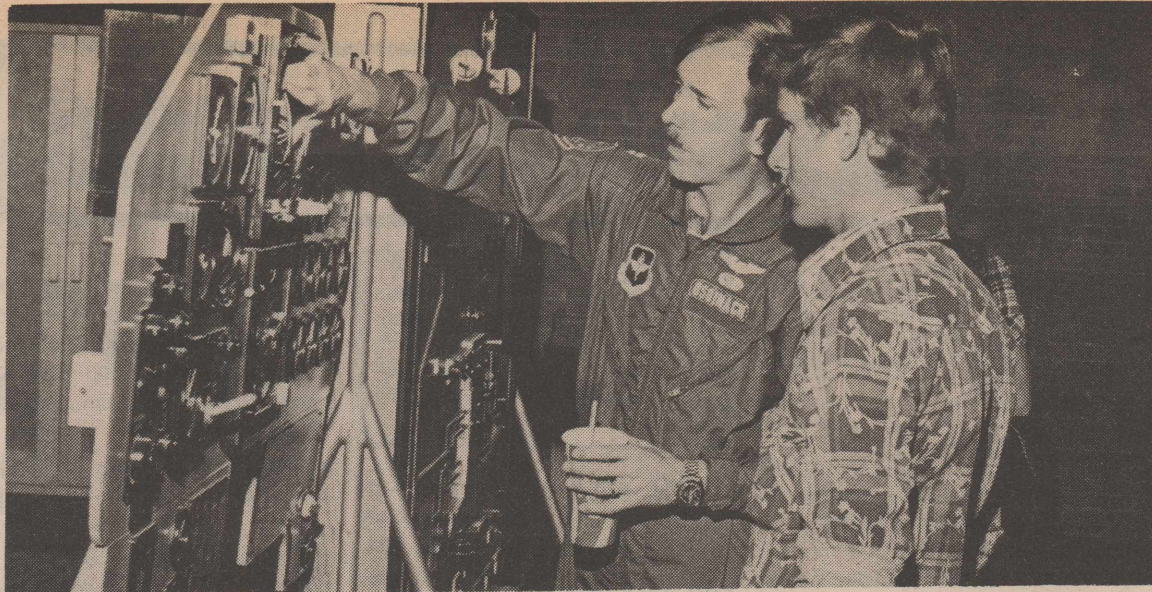

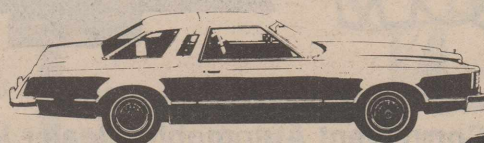

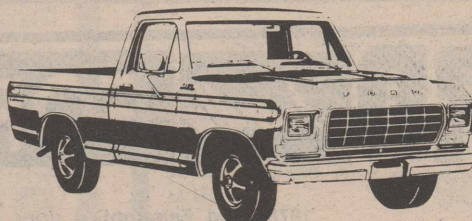
