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Commission Looks At City Administration

Twelve of the 15 members of Rockport's City Charter Commission gave tentative approval to part of one article and discussed four more in subcommittees during a three-hour session Tuesday night, June 12, at City Hall.

The commission also voted approval on Articles II -- Powers of the City -- and III -- The City Council -- during the meeting that began at 7 p.m.

Members present at the meeting were chairman N.F. Jackson Jr., Larry G. Boone, Richard McMakin, Bill Walston, Ed Armstrong, Jimmy Little, W.C. Underwood, Walter Clark, Simon Sorenson, Delmar Hiller, Murray McMillan and J.C. Harlan.

The Commission tentatively approved the first three sections of Article IV, which outline the qualifications, method of appointment and duties of the City Manager, City Secretary and Municipal Court judge and clerks.

In subcommittees, Commission members discussed proposed Articles V, on Nominations and Elections; VI, Initiative, Referendum and Recall; Article VII, Municipal Finance; and Article VIII, Tax Administration.

Still to be considered under Article IV are the duties, method of appointment and qualifications of the City Attorney, City

Engineer, other administrative departments, offices and agencies and the personnel system.

The commission will meet again at 7 p.m. Tuesday, June 19.

The Commission has been working since January on a City Charter, Jackson said, using charters of 12 other cities as models in addition to talking to members of the Texas Municipal League and members of charter commissions in other cities.

The 15 members of the Commission were elected in November, 1978, to begin drafting a City Charter for Rockport, after it was determined that the city had a large enough population to become a Home Rule City under Texas statutes.

County Reports No Traffic Fatalities

Rural traffic accidents during May claimed twelve lives in seven fatal accidents. Six of the 21 counties that make up the Corpus Christi District of the Texas Highway Patrol reported fatal accidents, but Aransas County was not among them.

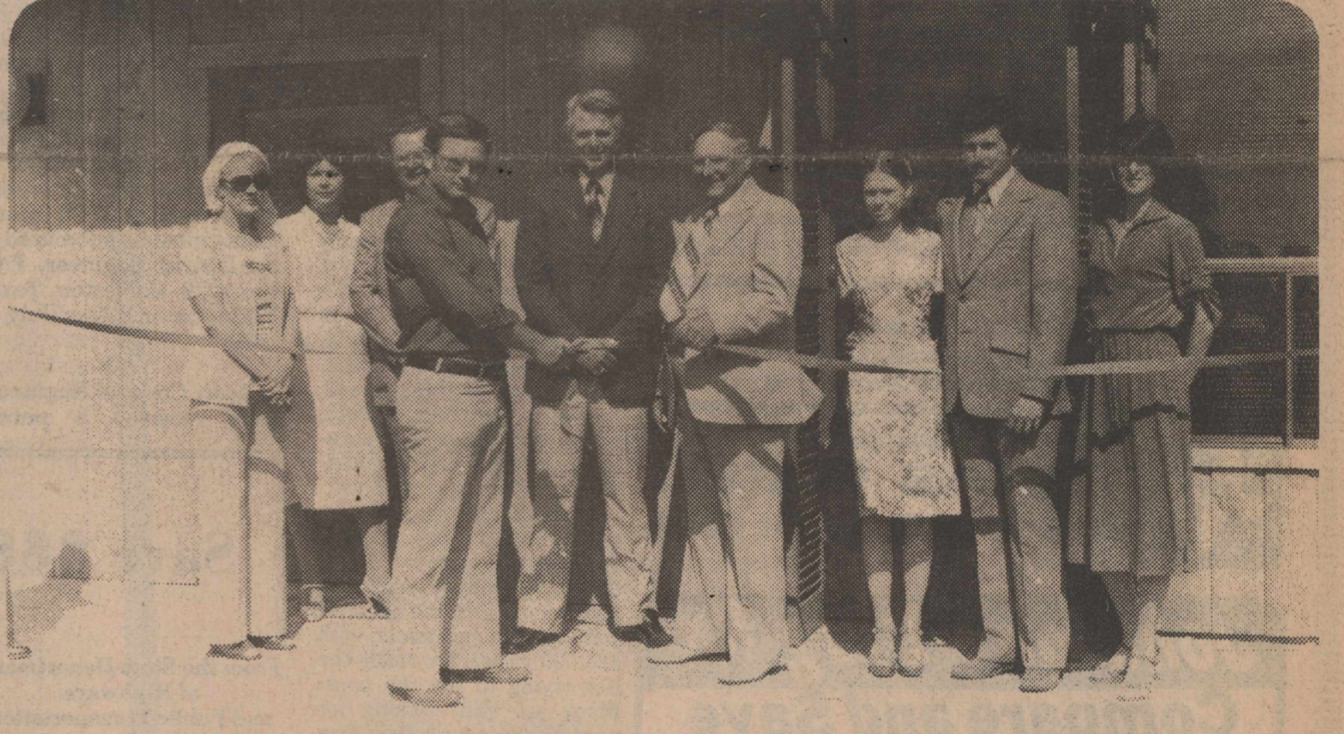
Reporting one fatal accident each were Cameron, DeWitt, Jim Wells, Kleburg and San Patricio Counties. Hidalgo County reported two fatal accidents.

Highway Patrol officers investigated 318 traffic accidents in the district during May, of which there were 140 Personal Injury accidents and 171 Property Damage accidents reported. In Aransas County, there were no fatal accidents, no deaths, five Personal Injuries and six Property Damage accidents.

A comparison summary of accidents investigated by the Texas Highway Patrol for the first five months of 1978 and 1979 shows there were six less fatal accidents in 1979. There were 72 fatal accidents in 1978, as compared to 66 in 1979. In Aransas County there were three fatal accidents and three deaths in 1979, as compared to four fatal accidents and 11 deaths in 1978.

There was a decrease of 93 Personal Injury accidents in the district for 1979. There were 805 in 1978, as compared to 712 during 1979. In Aransas County there were 22 Personal Injury accidents for 1979, compared to 1476 in 1978. In Aransas County the number of Property Damage accidents increased from 29 in 1978 to 46 in 1979.

Aransas County had a total of 71 accidents for 1979, as compared to 59 in 1978.

"Life Flight LD" The Ambulance Service With A Long Reach

Think of an ambulance in the air, and you have the basic idea behind Life Flight LD (Long Distance).

A Merlin II-A turboprop

jet, Life Flight provides service to and from any area in the continental United States, Mexico, Central and South America and Canada. The plane can go 1,200 miles

before it needs refueling and cruises at a speed of 300 miles per hour.

Each flight carries a crew of a pilot, co-pilot and a registered nurse who is

trained in comprehensive emergency treatment and with flight nurse experience, and equipped to care for three passengers.

Life Flight LD operates out of Hobby Airport in Houston, under the direction of Hermann Hospital, in conjunction with the University of Texas Medical School in Houston. It began on August 1, 1976, with one helicopter.

The program was originally designed to service the 130-mile radius from Hermann Hospital to work with the fire departments, and law enforcement agencies. It has since expanded to utilize three helicopters, in addition to the Merlin II-A, which began long distance flights on June 1, 1979.

Life Flight LD is fully equipped with all emergency equipment found in a ground ambulance, such as cardiac monitors, oxygen, suction, intravenous fluids, splinting equipment, mechanical ventilators and complete emergency medications. Through Life Flight LD, it is now possible for Hermann Hospital to transport surgeons and medical physicians to disaster areas within the jet's air travel range.

which has a proper landing site. Fees for use of Life Flight LD are \$100 for takeoff, \$1.35 per mile round-trip, \$35 per hour for

the nurse, and charges for whatever medications are necessary.

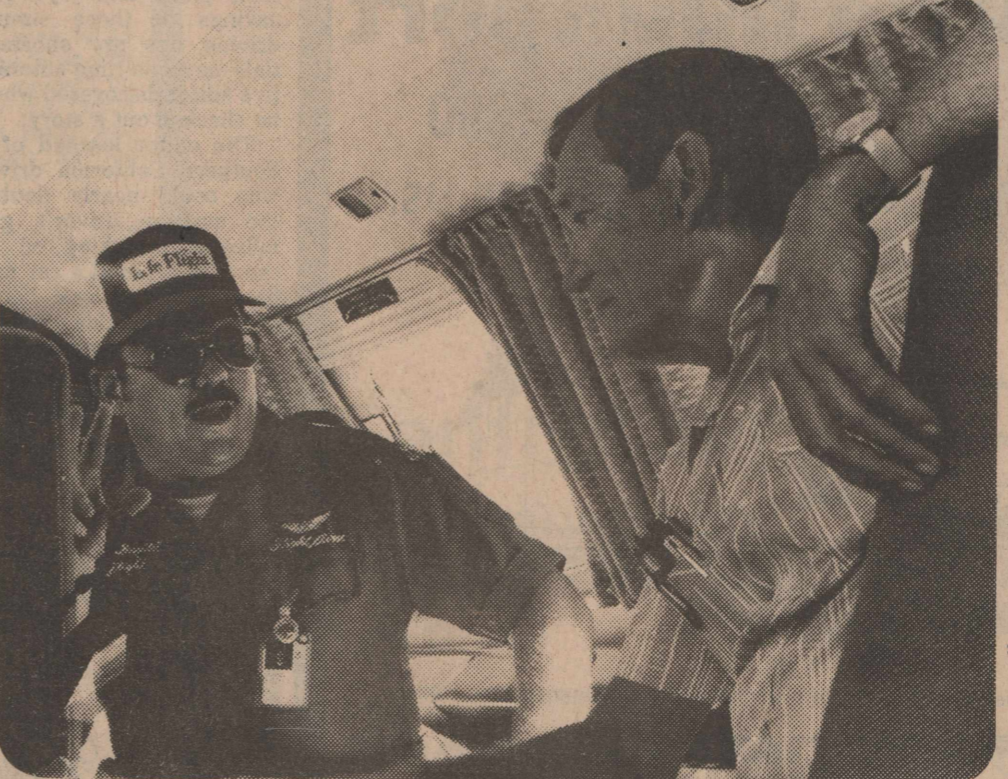
A physician will be available to fly with a patient if

there is a need or a request, but only one member of the patient's family is allowed on the trip. [See FLIGHT, page 8]

Sales Tax Up For Rockport

Rockport is scheduled to receive a check for more than \$36,000--the latest rebate from the city's one percent optional city sales tax, according to State Comptroller Bob Bullock.

The city's sales tax revenues through the period ending May 31, 1979, amounted to \$36,770.74. This is more than double the \$16,329.75 for the same period last year.

Rockport's total sales tax revenues for 1979 to date amount to \$93,867.64. Last year's total revenues at this point were \$78,552.47.

City and State sales taxes are sent to the State government in Austin, and the city's share of the sales tax is returned to the city monthly.

"Low Down" FROM THE Congressional Record

SENATOR WILLIAM PROXMIRE (WIS.) "...The passage of Senate Resolution 119 yesterday means good news for female applicants for the job as page in the U.S. Senate. The former restrictions embodied in the Senate Resolution 112 passed in 1971 stipulated that any Senator appointing a female page had to file an agreement with the Sergeant at Arms stating that the Senator:

First, will assume full responsibility for the safe transportation of the female page he appoints between the Senate and the page's place of local abode and return and—

Second, will assume full responsibility for the safety, well-being, and strict supervision of such female page while such page is in her place of local abode.

"Clearly...this sex-based restriction has limited the opportunities for employment as a page by females. Even though a Senator may take a sincere personal interest in the well-being of a female page, he cannot possibly oversee a page's daily trips to and return from the Senate. Nor can he supervise her activities away from the Senate.

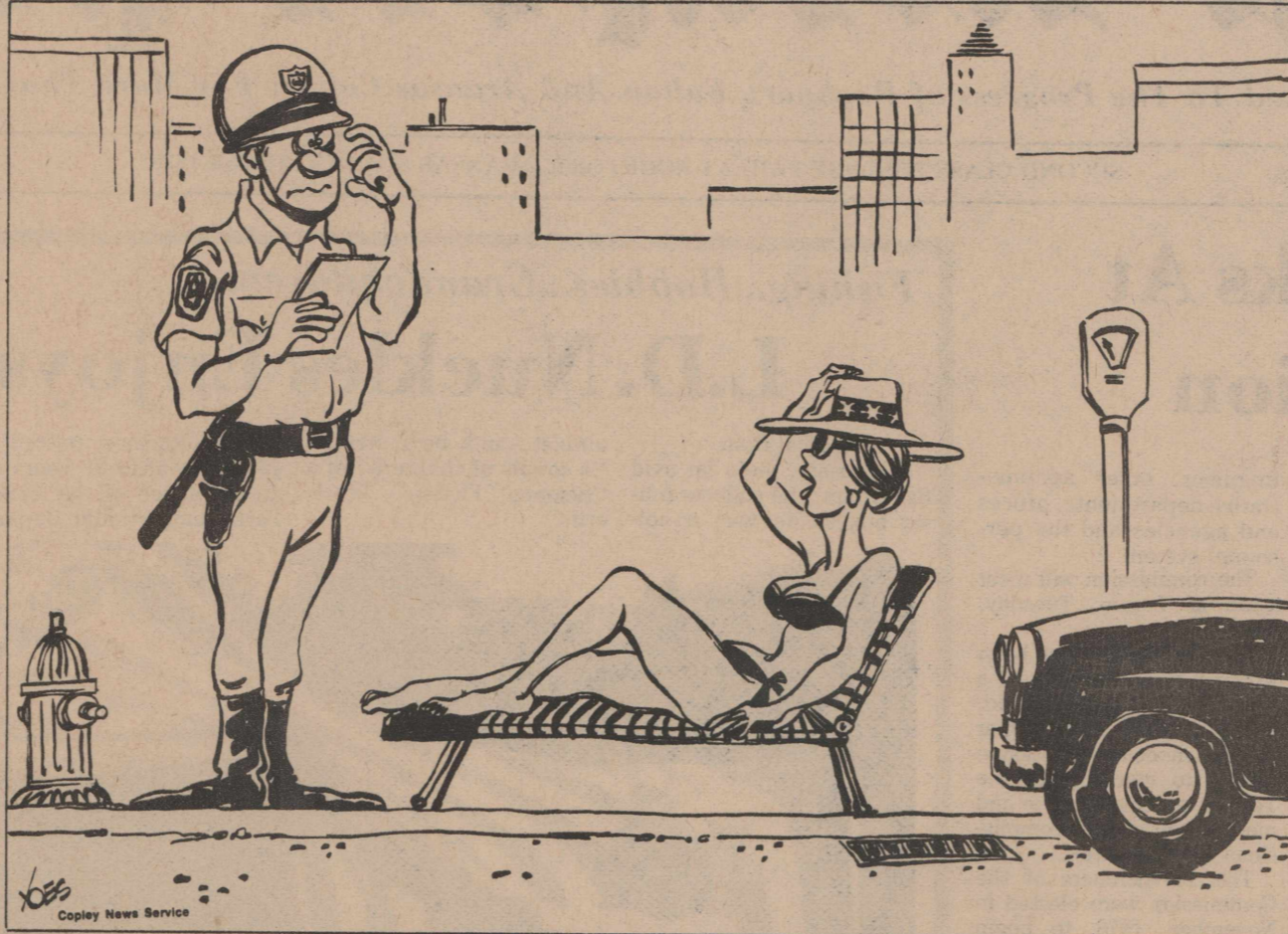
"Under Senate Resolution 112, now deleted, a Senator could have been held legally responsible for any injury to a female page under his supervision and this responsibility could not be waived by a statement from her parents.

"Senate rule L, now in effect, clearly states that a Senator may not discriminate in his employment practices on the basis of sex. Therefore, the lifting of such references under Senate Resolution 112 will not impair or reduce this basic right of employment to any degree. Indeed, rule L strengthens the nondiscrimination requirements.

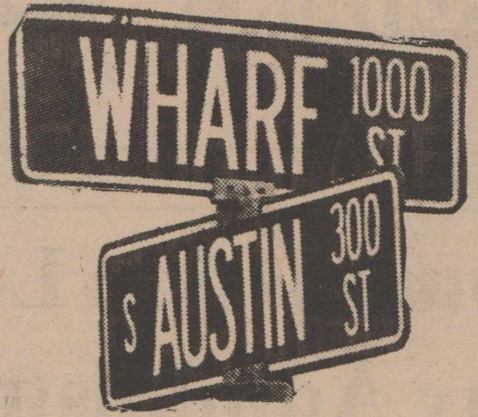

Permit Requests

Army Corps of Engineers have received a permit application from Getty Oil Company, Houston, to erect and maintain structures and perform work for drilling wells for producing oil and gas in San Antonio Bay. Work is to be done in the bay in State Tracts 58, 81, 94, 95, 112, s/2 of 111, 86 and 89, central to a point approximately 10 miles south from Seadrift. Comments must be submitted to the District Engineer, P.O. Box 1229, Galveston, Texas 77553, on or before July 4, 1979.

Army Corps of Engineers have received a permit

application from Getty Oil Company, Houston, to erect and maintain structures and perform work for drilling wells for producing oil and gas in Copano Bay. Application would add State Tracts 33 and 42 to the oil field development area which presently consists of State Tracts 68 and 69, central to a point approximately six miles northwest from Rockport. Comments must be submitted to the District Engineer, P.O. Box 1229, Galveston, Texas 77553, on or before July 4, 1979.

The Army Corps of En-

gineers has received an application for a permit to erect and maintain structures and perform work for drilling wells and for producing oil and gas, from the Kilroy Company in Houston.

The proposed work will take place in the Gulf of Mexico, Matagorda Island Area in State Tracts 804-S, 805-S and 806-S central to a point approximately 13 miles southeast of Rockport.

Plans of the work can be seen at the Corpus Christi Area Office. The application will be processed according to Section 10 of the River and Harbor Act of 1899.

Environmental impact has been considered in Environmental Impact Statement, Crude Oil and Natural Gas Production in Navigable Waterways along the Texas Coast. No known endangered species or their habitat will be affected by the proposed work.

Comments will be accepted and made part of the record in determining if it would be in the best public interest to issue a permit. Comments should be submitted to the District Engineer, P.O. Box 1229, Galveston, Texas 77553 on or before July 12, 1979.

THE GENUINELY PHONEY HEARING ON A ZONING ordinance alteration requested by the Rockport Sailing Club is now two weeks old. Time enough for one to ponder, reflect. Members of the club, capable of building incomes that allow them to afford \$85,000 yachts (cost figure by a "concerned citizen" fiscal expert) were still naive enough to accept the word of an irresponsible city secretary and ask for a hearing without reading the zoning ordinance.

But the best part of the show was "concerned citizen's" leading orator. He was a man who either knows council stupidity well or one who is a daring gambler. At least he was willing to take a chance, confident that no one on the council would question either the content of his petition and, more importantly, not question the validity of that vast number of signatures. He came off a winner, and I suspect that even the mayor hasn't caught on.

REFLECTING, I REALIZE THAT SMALL, BUT NOISY, groups of fanatics who care for nothing but their own ends, willing to circulate any manner of propaganda for so long as it meets their ends are nothing new to this country, nor the world for that matter.

Counterparts of "concerned citizens" were what in the middle of the last century came to be known as the "Know Nothings." They opposed the landing of immigrants on these shores, and the Roman Catholic Church. They live nationally today as the Ku Klux Klan, and of course as Rockport's "concerned citizens." Their success, when they are successful, comes when they manage to lure sound citizens to believe their propaganda. They have won a great battle in Rockport and are presently intoxicated with power. And so I've no doubt that having routed the city council several thousand taxpayers will in due course be paying huge insurance rates and maintenance costs for a swimming pool that isn't and never could be a swimming pool.

THERE ARE NATURALLY THOSE WHO WILL commend the council for its bravery in ignoring the wisdom of the ACND No. 1, the Corps of Engineers and half a dozen other governmental and civic agencies. But what a loss to Rockport! Thousands of dollars are already lost annually by motels, restaurants, grocery markets and other businesses because the city cannot meet the needs of visiting sailors. And in a resort-oriented community, one where everyone but city officials strive to make things more attractive to visitors. Consider but a single example.

For years there was an annual Corpus Christi-Rockport race with nearly 100 boats participating. Boats carried crews of from three to half a dozen men, women and youngsters. In addition, hundreds of sailboat followers drove to Rockport for the event. All that is over now—gone with the wind—and the revenue that local business derived. Why? Last year it was decided that docking in Rockport was too much of a battle. That is but one single event. True, of course, that the RSC harbor would not have met all the requirements of visitors whose numbers have increased annually, even as they have already.

Establishment of the harbor would have been a visual asset to the entire community and benefitted virtually everyone, however indirectly. Instead, thanks to the city council, the "pool" will remain a neglected, dangerous place, but still be the private domain of a handful of selfish people who will use it for perhaps three months during the year. By contrast, development of a harbor would have meant almost daily year around use by some 400 people, not to mention visitors.

I am now old enough to realize that fear and stupidity are not new to the world, but it grieves me deeply to see such a blatant display at one's front door.--ahab

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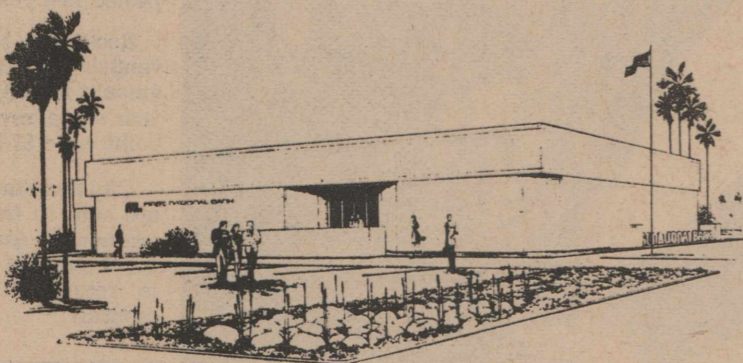
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Save \$\$\$, Save Fuel

From the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation

According to recent surveys, the American driving public in general looks on fuel conservation at this time as a need to save money because of the escalating cost of fuel. But whether the drivers want to save money or to save fuel, the final result is the same—less fuel is consumed.

Many drivers once knew how to drive in a fuel-efficient manner, usually learned in a desire to conserve a high schooler's allowance for other pleasures. And many first-time car owners used every bit of know-how to up the mpg of their pride and joy. The savings of those simple driving tips are substantial—as a one-time automotive editor discovered when he checked out a story.

The editor learned of a Southern California driver who could nearly double the average driver's gas mileage. Checking on it, the editor rented a car and drove it for several hours over Los Angeles streets.

Later he met with the expert and asked her to follow the same route. Against his 13.2 mpg over that route, in the same car the expert got 23.33 mpg.

She explained her system, which she called "featherfooting," as driving as if there were an egg between her foot and the accelerator.

You can save money and fuel by using her tips—but don't use a real egg.

Driving an automatic transmission-equipped car? Use gentle starts to get it into the highest gear quicker...that means more turns of the drive wheels per piston stroke...which means less fuel used.

Car running rough? Something as simple as a tune-up can possibly wring another five miles from every gallon of fuel.

Tires underinflated? Not only does underinflation wear them out faster, the rolling resistance on the road reduces mileage 1 mpg or more.

New antibiotic works against multi-germ infections and against some bacteria that have built up immunity to other drugs. The FDA has approved it.

Is your boy protected against mumps? Doctors report that large numbers of boys are not—and the disease is extra-dangerous in post-puberty males. The Center for Disease Control recommends immunization, even re-immunization, if there is any doubt.

Vaccine against lung cancer is expected to be tested on humans in about 18 months. First participants will be workers in high-risk industries. Results will take twelve years to evaluate.

Ophthalmologists are using laser beams to treat proliferative diabetic retinopathy. Perhaps 40 percent of diabetics have some degree of retinopathy, which can lead to impaired vision and blindness.

New whole-body scanner produces pictures of internal organs without X-rays. It works by picking up the emissions of radioactive isotopes injected into the body.

Healthful Hints

Q. Why is alfalfa beneficial for so many different things?

A. Because the root of the alfalfa plant burrows so deep into the ground, it reaches minerals that are inaccessible to most other plants. Alfalfa contains vitamins A, E, K, B, D and U. It is high in protein and contains phosphorus, iron, potassium, chlorine, sodium, silicon, magnesium and trace elements. Alfalfa has eight enzymes known to aid food assimilation in the body.

Alfalfa has been found to be effective for aiding stomach ailments, gas pains, water retention, the pain and stiffness of arthritis, peptic ulcers, and treatment of recuperative cases of narcotic and alcohol addiction.

Alfalfa is available in seeds for sprouting, tablets and in tea form.

Q. I know that the mineral magnesium is essential to good health. I would like to take about 500 mgs. a day, but, if I take as much as 250 mgs., I get diarrhea. What can I do? I don't think I get enough from the foods I eat.

A. You probably have been taking the most commonly available form—magnesium oxide. It does have

this effect on some people. However, if you will switch to chelated magnesium, I think you will not have this problem. (Chelation is a relatively new process being used with most minerals that allows the mineral to be more easily assimilated by the body.) Most health food stores will have chelated magnesium on their shelves. If they don't, I'm sure they'll be happy to get some for you. Until next week. Folks,

Eat Yourself Slim

We never outgrow our need for calcium. It is an essential mineral absolutely vital to life and health. Every year of our life, approximately 20 percent of the calcium in our bones is replaced.

Of the total calcium stored in our body, 98 percent is contained in the skeletal bones and 1 percent in the teeth. The bone calcium also

acts as a "storehouse" upon which the body can draw when the need for calcium occurs.

Pregnancy and lactation are the periods of greatest need. If the pregnant woman's diet is not sufficient in calcium, her bones and teeth will be required to supply it.

Unfortunately the teeth, unlike the bones, do not repair themselves. Years ago this led to frequent loss of teeth during pregnancy. It may still be true today in

some parts of the world, but not generally in the United States where years of effort has increased understanding of diet and nutritional needs resulting in healthier mothers and babies.

While 99 percent of the calcium is confined to the bones and teeth, the remaining 1 percent also plays a vital part in maintaining health.

A tiny amount is necessary for the normal contraction of muscles, specifically the heart. The normal rhythmic beating of the heart muscle is impossible without sufficient calcium.

Muscle cramps which often occur during pregnancy, are relieved by the addition of calcium. Blood clotting is also dependent upon the presence of calcium, a tiny amount, to be sure, — but vital.

The permeability of cells,

which means the ability to absorb nutrients, is another essential role of minute amounts of this mineral. It even helps to convert the food that is eaten into energy. The transmission of nerve impulses is another function of this important element.

The multiple role of calcium in our body contradicts the convictions of those who insist that milk is for infants and the young. Unless there is allergic reaction or digestive tract inability to tolerate milk — the prime source of calcium — everyone will wisely add milk to his diet throughout his life.

The U.S. Recommended Dietary Allowance for calcium is set at 800 milligrams per day. This amount is supplied by two glasses of milk. Children require more calcium for growth and 3 to 4 glasses of milk per day are recommended. Four glasses

daily is also the recommended amount for pregnant and nursing mothers.

Those who cannot drink milk can obtain their calcium from other sources. Among these are dried legumes, yogurt, baked beans, dark green leafy vegetables, broccoli, hard cheeses and small fish whose soft bones can be eaten.

The addition of dry non-fat milk in the preparation of eggs, casseroles, desserts and beverages is an excellent way to add milk to your family's diet if they resist drinking it.

Remember, like other needed nutrients, you can also take an overdose of calcium. For this reason I do not suggest bone meal or pure calcium as a dietary supplement, unless specifically prescribed by your doctor. Too much can collect in the kidneys as stones. Get your cal-

cium from a good diet and you can't go wrong.

Dear Shirley: What is a good substitute for meat during a shortage? — Mrs. B.W.

Dear Mrs. B.W.: Try casseroles using legumes, cheese, fish with non-fat dry milk mixed in and preferably cooked in an iron utensil.

Dear Shirley: Do polyunsaturates increase the requirements for Vitamin E? — Miss C.M.

Dear Miss C.M.: Yes, the use of polyunsaturates generally increases the need for Vitamin E. However, if you are on a good diet you need not be concerned about getting a sufficiency.

Mustard is more than that yellow sauce spread on hot dogs.

It varies from spicy and sweet to hot. The mustards used in Oriental foods are fiery. Dusseldorf or German mustard is dark, with both hull and seed used. English mustard is simply dry mustard, mixed with water.

Dijon mustard, the brown mustard from France, is good for more than spreading on a sandwich, although it does give a nice kick to corned beef on rye.

The brown mustard can add spice to appetizers, soups, main dishes and salads.

It's a mixture of seed, cloves, cinnamon, allspice. Only black seeds — the hottest — are all. Try the mustard with tarragon, rosemary, thyme. Use it in low-calorie add-a-lot-of-zip-with-calories.

sends out David McCorkle, New York City caterer, actor and chef.
McCorkle uses Dijon mustard in a variety of dishes, sometimes substituting it for salt, pepper and other common seasonings.
He makes two of his favorite recipes in bulk, once a month. This Dijon Mustard Butter is good to have on hand for baked potatoes and quick sauces. Soften 1 stick of unsalted butter and stir in 2 tablespoons of mustard and some fresh minced parsley. Form back into sticks and chill until needed.
He also makes a quick vinaigrette with just mustard, oil and vinegar, preparing a big batch and refrigerating it. The recipe follows:
BAKED CHICKEN DIJON
6 half chicken breasts
3 tbsps. Dijon mustard
2 sticks unsalted butter

1 clove garlic, crushed and finely minced
1/3 cup fresh parsley
1 cup freshly grated Parmesan
2 cups fresh, soft-bread crumbs
Melt butter in small saucepan until fragrant but not brown. Blend in mustard and garlic (you may use more garlic if you wish), stirring well. Remove from heat and let stand until cool enough to touch but not solidified.
Mix parsley (don't substitute dry), Parmesan and crumbs, blending well. Dip chicken breasts in butter mixture, coating all surfaces, then in crumb mixture, patting crumbs into the chicken to coat well. Place in shallow baking dish. Any leftover butter mixture may be frozen, and used again to repeat the recipe.
Chicken may be refrigerat-

ed at this point for several hours, covered. Bake in 350-degree oven for about an hour, until golden and tender. Serves four to six.
ARTICHOKE APPETIZERS
1-lb. can artichoke bottoms (or 8 fresh)
8-oz. package cream cheese, softened
1 egg yolk
2 tbsps. Dijon mustard.
Drain artichoke bottoms. Or prepare fresh artichoke bottoms, using lemon on cut surfaces to avoid discoloration. Trim bottoms so they will lie flat on the baking dish.
Combine in mixer bowl or food processor the cream cheese, yolk and mustard. Blend very well. Using a small spoon, fill each artichoke bottom. Refrigerate any leftover cheese

mixture, or spoon onto small crackers to bake with artichokes, or use as dip.
Bake filled artichoke bottoms (or cheese-mixture-topped crackers) in 350-degree oven for about 15 minutes. Appetizers are done when cheese mixture is slightly puffy and a delicate golden color. Serve immediately.
DIJON VINAIGRETTE
2 to 3 tbsps. Dijon mustard
1/4 cup red wine vinegar
3/4 cup olive oil
Combine mustard and vinegar, blending with a wire whip. Slowly, as for mayonnaise, pour oil into mixture in a very thin stream, beating all the while. Mixture will thicken. Makes enough for salad for six. Recipe can be increased and leftovers refrigerated.

1/2 tsp. salt

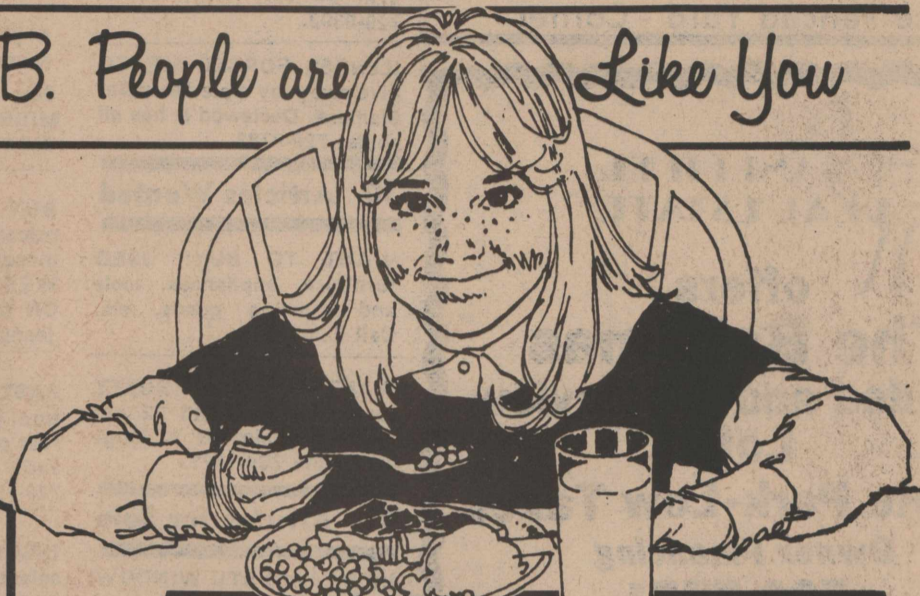
Mix all together well and pour into a pie dish lined with the following crust:

Mix until crumbly with a table fork; add 3 tablespoons ice water or enough to make a soft dough. Roll out on a floured board to fit pie dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. When cool top with whipped cream or substitute.





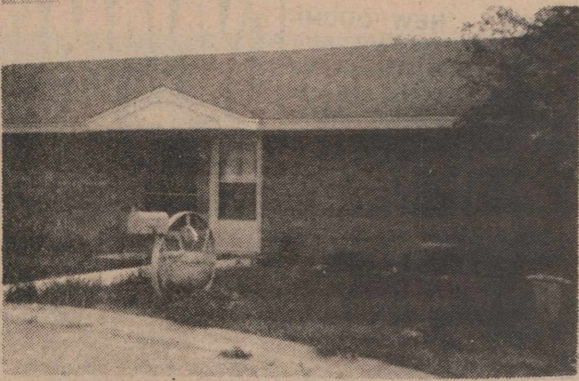

Decor Score

Q. I want to convert the living room in our new condominium into an English library - at least that's the atmosphere I want. I'm thinking about Queen Anne style furniture.

A. As with most condos today, my living room doesn't look at all traditional. The walls are plain white and there is absolutely no architectural detailing.

Please help me with a plan and suggest how to begin. - E.V.

A. I've seen very plain rooms transformed into unbelievably elegant rooms complete with an English ambience.

You're right to start with a plan. Why don't you divide your planning into four general areas - walls, floors, windows and furnishings.

Let's start with the walls. Do you want to go to the expense of wood paneling? We often have a picture of old gleaming wood walls in an English library. Certainly fine wood walls are prohibitively expensive today for most homemakers. However, some very fine wood paneling is available and should be considered.

Don't feel though that the walls must be paneled. You could also consider applying wood moldings to your existing painted walls. Look in history and architectural books to gather ideas for installing the molding.

You could paint the walls one color, then apply molding. You could paint the molding a contrasting color or add color to the inside portions of the walls decorated with molding. Add molding to the ceiling and base-

boards at the floor. I think the richest look when you use molding is to paint it all the wall color. This forms a delightful and subdued background for your furniture and accessories. Now about the floor. If you have wood already, you are indeed lucky. If not, consider installing a wood floor or vinyl with a simulated wood look. Top your wood or simulated wood floors with Oriental rugs. They will give you the richness you want. Scour secondhand shops for rugs if new ones are beyond your budget. Or consider some of the Oriental reproductions on the market. It is possible to create an 18th century ambience with modern versions of the old designs. Third, you can establish a traditional look through your window treatment. You might use shutters or wooden venetian blinds with decorated tapes (a favorite device in elegant 18th century homes). You might also use a valance in fabric.
