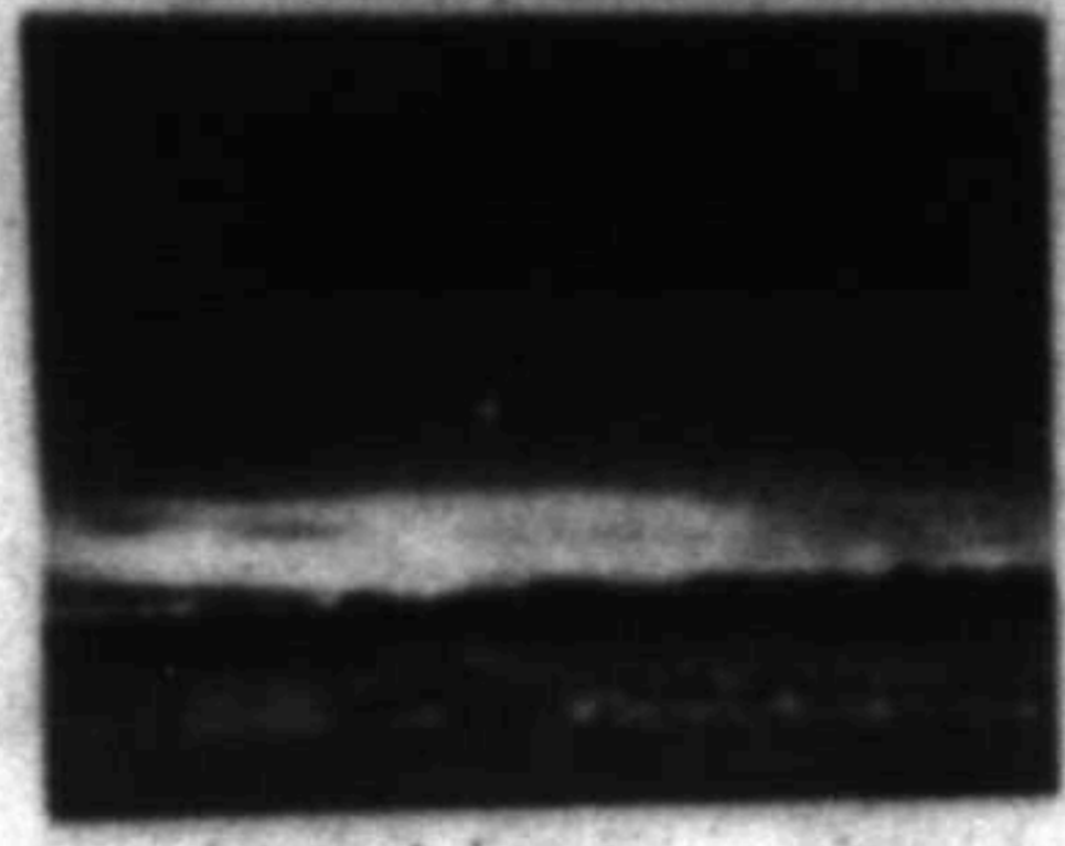

MISD announces leadership appointments

Midland ISD announced Friday three new appointments to leadership positions for the next school year.

Jeff Horner, Midland High School principal, will act as executive director of secondary education

for the 2014-15 school year. The director of secondary education position was vacant for the 2013-14 school year and was last held by Linda Jolly, who retired after the 2012-13 school year. Jolly also was a former Midland High principal.

Diane Lopez, Lamar Elementary School principal, will be the executive director of elementary

education, replacing Jane Rambo, who will now be the new executive director of district literacy.

Director of district literacy is a new position, which will evaluate and provide leadership with the instructional reading programs of the district and "act as an interface between elementary principals and district instructional services for

students."

According to the job listings on MISD's website, the positions will all pay between \$93,786.40 to \$133,446.20 annually.

Superintendent Ryder Warren said in a press release he will soon begin meeting with staff from MHS and Lamar to begin the search for new principals.

City looks to hire lifeguards, other pool positions

High school or college students looking for a summer job that doesn't involve cleaning movie theater aisles or mowing lawns have an opportunity with the city of Midland.

The city will host a job fair from 4-7 p.m. Tuesday at the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Center for positions at Doug Russell Pool and Washington Aquatic Center. Pool staff hopefuls will be interviewed on the spot or can call the MLK Community Center to schedule an interview at a different date.

The city will hire about 50 lifeguards, 10 cashiers and six pool managers. Parks and Recreation Manager Laurie Williams said. The city is also hiring additional summer building monitors for the MLK Community Center.

Lifeguard applicants must pass a lifeguard class, which tests swimming ability. The training will be in-house, at no cost to the applicant, and is certified by the American Red Cross.

Pool managers handle the scheduling for the lifeguard and cashier staff and ensure there is a proper number of staff for each pool.

"It's good experience," Williams said. "If you can handle being a lifeguard, you show that you are a responsible person."

The city is preferably looking for high school or college-aged applicants, but the only requirement is that they must be at least 15 years old.

Staff work during the two city pools season, which lasts from Memorial Day through the end of August.

Williams said there often is a sufficient number of lifeguards at the start of the summer but then the number will drop as the weeks go by. Williams said scheduling for the hires will be flexible.

"By the end of the summer, football and other activities begin, so it gets harder to hire," Williams said. "So we try to hire enough so we can get to the end of the season."

The pools' admission fee is \$1 per person. Children under 2 are admitted free. Swim passes cost \$25 per person or \$75 for a family.

The pools are also available for private events.

wood-fired pizza. **Art conscious:** You'll see the beautiful work by COA 2014 featured artist Cheryl Roush, but we were particularly struck by the work of a few others. Bonnie Siebert's three-dimensional mixed media works are eclectic gems of works. Elaborate detail went into her works as she portrays the like of can-can dancers and amid an explosion of trinkets. The simplicity of John Watterson's paintings of fruits is mesmerizing. Finding art in nature, a dissected fruit reaches maximum beauty in his vibrant works that transcend mere kitchen art. Originally from West Texas, Austin-based artist Jamie Rood works magic with photography, transform-

ing what could be rough images of oilfield workers and junked out trucks into hypnotic pieces. Try not to look away from his work. **Jazz it up:** Lubbock-based Alma Quartet brings its jazz standards to the COA that are right out of the Rat Pack era. But the musicians have a sense of humor about their work, as well. Don't be surprised if they give a jazz spin to the likes of The Cure or Radiohead. They play the courtyard from noon to 3 p.m. **Rock it out:** Adults might have to wait as younger adventurers will likely jump in line for some rock climbing. Looking up at the climbing wall, the view looked almost a mile high. But this writer isn't too fond of heights, so the climb is more in the two- to three-story range. The view should be spectacular, but we'll trust what you tell us.

School is in: A new feature at this year's COA is A La Arte. A selection of classes and demonstrations add a new level of interest to the arts. With additional fees for each class ranging from \$1 to \$20, people can learn to decorate Oreo cookies from Susie's South Forty Confections (\$1) or take an acting workshop from Pickwick Players (\$5). But libation appreciators can partake in Mixology 101 from Blue Door owners Erica and Cody Reeves (\$15) and learn about craft beer and homebrewing techniques from Basin Brewers (\$5). They even offer recipes for your own brew. Of course, you must be 21 with a valid ID for both. Celebration of the Arts runs from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. today at Midland Center, 105 N. Main St. Admission is free. acmidland.org.

Man sentenced in connection with July homicide

A Midland man was sentenced to 14 years in prison for supplying and hiding a gun used in the July shooting death of a young Midland mother. Carlos Martinez III, 21, pleaded guilty Friday to a third-degree felony charge of tampering with or fabricating physical evidence and a first-degree felony charge of murder, according to a press release from the Midland County District Attorney's Office. Also charged in the case are Deshae Breausha Carroll, 22, of Midland, and Arron Joshua Castillo, 20, of Lubbock.

Carroll pleaded guilty to the tampering with evidence charge on March 20 and was sentenced to three years in prison. Castillo awaits trial for first-degree murder and faces five to 99 years in prison if convicted. The shooting occurred at about 1 a.m. July 11 at the Midland Village Apartments. Police found Kyara West lying in a large grassy area on the complex's west side with multiple gunshot wounds to the head and chest area, according to Reporter-Telegram records. Carroll told police that Castillo, the alleged shooter, told her he had shot West multiple times. Previous reports state Martinez allegedly supplied the murder weapon to Castillo on July 10 and told police he did not know why Castillo needed the gun. But further investigation showed that Martinez had previously supplied that same gun, a .38 special revolver, to Castillo for

use in an April shooting of West's mother, Trudy West. After the shooting, Martinez told police that he disposed of the weapon in some bushes.

MPD: Woman hospitalized after rolling car

A woman was taken to a local hospital Friday night after she flipped a car on its side while driving east on the Interstate 20 service road right near Rankin Highway. A Midland Police Department officer on scene was not sure of the extent of her injuries. The woman lost control of a Chevy Aveo at about 9:15 p.m. after she turned onto the south service road from I-20 and rolled the car onto its side, the officer said. No other vehicles were involved in the wreck and the woman was the only

person inside the car, he said. Police were still investigating the incident late Friday, but no charges had been filed as of Friday night. No additional details are immediately available.

MPD: Man catches fire from tank battery

One man is in critical condition with severe burns and another suffered injuries that were not life-threatening Friday afternoon after a tank battery caught fire near Midland International Airport. Work crews were reportedly trying to change the tank battery before 2 p.m. when it suddenly ignited, catching the man in critical condition on fire, according to a Midland Police Department press release. The Midland County Fire Marshal's Office is still investigating the exact cause of the fire near Farm-to-Market Road 1788 and Loop 40, the release said.

Homicide officers disciplined

 HOUSTON — Eight Houston homicide division police officers have been disciplined for what Chief Charles McClelland says were policy violations and deficiencies in investigations. The punishments McClelland announced Friday range from one sergeant receiving an indefinite suspension and two others, a lieutenant and an officer, each getting a written reprimand. The others implicated in an internal affairs investigation that began last year received suspensions of two to 10 days. All may appeal their disciplines. McClelland said the Harris County district attorney has decided not to pursue any criminal charges against them. McClelland said the investigations of 24 cases were affected and nine remain open. The sergeant who received the indefinite suspension was involved in 21 of them. The chief says when the department missteps, it admits it and takes corrective action.

Broadway singer Lawrence Hamilton dead at 59

 LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Broadway star Lawrence Hamilton, an Arkansas native who performed for a U.S. president and a Pope, has died at age 59 in a New York City hospital. His sister, Evelyn Hall, said that Hamilton died on Thursday after complications from surgery at Lenox Hill Hospital located in New York. Hamilton, a Foreman native, has starred in Broadway hits, including "Play On," "Jelly's Last Jam" and "Ragtime." Some of his other professional credits include serving as a musical director for opera star Jessye Norman; a vocal coach for pop group New Kids on the Block; and performing for former president Ronald Reagan and at the Vatican for Pope John Paul II. "We are all saddened by the loss of Arkansas Broadway star Lawrence Hamilton," Gov. Mike Beebe's office said on Twitter. "He was a good friend to the Beebes for many years." Hamilton told The Associated Press in a 2002 interview that he used to spend his high school summers working at a southwest Arkansas poultry plant while dreaming of making it on Broadway. "Trucks would pull up with these stinky chickens and turkeys," Hamilton told the AP. "I had to grab them by the legs. My knuckles would swell up. I told my dad, 'I'm a pianist. Look at my hands. I can't do this.'" Hamilton studied music education at Henderson State University in Arkadelphia and later became a member of the Arkansas Black Hall of Fame and Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame.

Prosecutors rest case in Texas shoe stabbing trial

HOUSTON — Autopsy photos shown Friday at a Houston woman's murder trial detailed numerous uniquely shaped wounds on her boyfriend's head and body that an assistant medical examiner says the 5½-inch stiletto heel on the defendant's shoe made.

Ana Trujillo is accused of striking 59-year-old Alf Stefan Andersson at least 25 times in the face with her shoe during an argument in June at his Houston condominium. The defense says Trujillo, 45, was defending herself from an attack by Andersson.

Dr. Jennifer Ross told jurors the cuts and wounds found on Andersson's head, arms, hands and back were in the shape of a square and the letter "I" and consistent with the bottom of Trujillo's stiletto heel.

Ross, who is with the Harris County Institute of Forensic Sciences, was the last of the prosecution's 17 trial witnesses. She said she was able to determine that Andersson had at least 25 blows to his head, but that there probably were more that couldn't be detected because they landed on top of each other.

"Is this an object that is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death?" prosecutor John Jordan asked, referring to the blue suede high-heel shoe he held in his hand.

"It is possible," Ross said.

She said Andersson's cause of death was determined to be "blunt-force head and facial trauma" with the "most damaging injuries" to the head.

"What type of force was necessary to cause that type of injury?" Jordan asked.

"A rather significant force," Ross said.

Autopsy photos also

showed injuries and bruises on Andersson's left arm and the palm and fingertips of his right hand. Ross told jurors these injuries suggest Andersson had been on the ground, with his arms and hands raised, defending himself from blows by someone above him.

Ross said bruises and other injuries on Andersson's back could be consistent with someone being hit on the back while running away.

An X-ray of the shoe showed that the stiletto heel was made of steel, she said.

Oklahoma inmates to seek execution stays

OKLAHOMA CITY — Lawyers for two Oklahoma death-row inmates say they believe they will be successful in their challenge to the state's execution law, despite adverse U.S. Supreme Court rulings for condemned men from Missouri and Texas.

Clayton Lockett and Charles Warner sued the state of Oklahoma in February over what they called a "veil of secrecy" surrounding execution protocols and the origins of the drugs used in lethal injections. Although the state has released the method of execution it intends to use, the lawyers want to know where the drugs are coming from and who will be testing them to ensure efficacy and purity.

Recent cases in Missouri and Texas also seeking information on drug suppliers were not taken up by the U.S. Supreme Court though lawyers for Lockett and Warner aren't concerned because they're not pursuing claims in federal court.

"We're in a unique situation here because we only have state law claims," said Seth Day, one of the inmates' lawyers.

Day said he hasn't fully studied the Texas case, but he believes an Oklahoma challenge to secrecy laws will have a different outcome.

"Those cases involved different levels of secrecy, none of which are as broad as ours, and none of which would have precluded the courts from obtaining that information," Day said.

Judge dismisses lawsuit over drone strikes

A federal judge on Friday dismissed a lawsuit against Obama administration officials for the 2011 drone-strike killings of three U.S. citizens in Yemen, including an al-Qaida cleric.

U.S. District Judge Rosemary Collyer said the case raises serious constitutional issues and is not easy to answer, but that "on these facts and under this circuit's precedent," the court will grant the Obama administration's request.

The suit was against then-Defense Secretary Leon Panetta, then-CIA Director David Petraeus and two commanders in the military's Special Operations forces.

Permitting a lawsuit against individual officials "under the circumstances of this case would impermissibly draw the court into 'the heart of executive and military planning and deliberation,'" said Collyer. She said the suit would require the court to examine national security policy and the military chain of command as well as operational combat decisions regarding the designation of targets and how best to counter threats to the United States.

"Defendants must be trusted and expected to act in accordance with the U.S. Constitution when they intentionally target a U.S. citizen abroad at the direction of the president and with the concurrence of Congress," said Collyer. "They cannot be held personally responsible in monetary damages for conducting war." The lawsuit sought unspecified damages.

Hina Shamsi, director of the ACLU National Security Project, called it a "deeply troubling decision that treats the government's allegations as proof

while refusing to allow those allegations to be tested in court."

Motorist beaten by mob still in critical condition

As Steve Utash lies in a Detroit hospital bed, with his brain swollen and a gash in his head, he appears to remember the brutal beating that a neighborhood mob inflicted days earlier.

"He wakes up and his arms start struggling and he says, 'Help me! Help me!'" said Terry Eherick, a family friend.

Utash remained in critical condition Friday — two days after accidentally hitting a 10-year-old boy with his company pickup on Detroit's east side and being pummeled by at least a half-dozen people after stopping to check on the child.

The mob left the 54-year-old tree trimmer from suburban Detroit on the pavement outside a gas station.

No arrests had been made Friday, and police officers continued to canvass the neighborhood looking for witnesses who can identify any suspects in the beating. Sgt. Michael Woody said.

A grainy, surveillance video from the gas station camera shows the boy, David Harris, with a group of friends as he steps from a curb into the truck's path Wednesday afternoon. Woody said investigators don't have video footage of the attack on Utash.

Detroit Mayor Mike Duggan said Friday that Utash did "the right thing by stopping to check on the boy" and that anyone who can identify his attackers should step forward.

"This senseless vigilante style attack is not the essence of who we are as Detroiters and will not be tolerated," Duggan said in a joint statement with City Council President Brenda Jones.

Army hair rules draw racial bias claims

WASHINGTON — New Army regulations meant to help standardize and professionalize soldiers' appearance are now coming under criticism by some black military women, who say changes in the hair requirement are racially biased.

The Army earlier this week issued new appearance standards, which included bans on most twists, dreadlocks and large cornrows, all styles used predominantly by African-American women with natural hairstyles. More than 11,000 people have signed a White House petition asking President Barack Obama, the commander in chief, to have the military review the regulations to allow for

"neat and maintained natural hairstyles."

Some black military women, who make up about a third of the women in the armed forces, feel they have been singled out with these new regulations.

"I think that it primarily targets black women, and I'm not in agreement with it," said Patricia Jackson-Kelley of the National Association of Black Military Women. "I don't see how a woman wearing three braids in her hair, how that affects her ability to perform her duty in the military."

Even before the current controversy, the association had already planned to showcase the hairstyles of African-American women in the military throughout the years at its national convention in Phoenix in September.

While she also feels the new regulations unfairly target black women, former association president Kathleen Harris said she could understand why the regulations needed some uniformity. "The military is supposed to be conservative," she said. "My thing is that some folks look gor-

geous in their twists, and some people go overboard. The twists are not small twists but they're real large ones and it doesn't fit the cover, your hat."

The changes and several other Army appearance modifications were first published Monday in the Army Times.

The changes also banned several male hairstyles, including Mohawks and long sideburns. Body piercings were also specifically banned, with an exception made for earrings.

Also banned were the use of wireless earpieces outside a vehicle and tattoos visible below the elbow or knee or above the neckline. Current soldiers would be permitted to keep any tattoos not deemed racist, sexist or extremist.

Mozilla CEO resignation raises free-speech issues

SAN JOSE, Calif. — The resignation of Mozilla's CEO amid outrage that he supported an anti-gay marriage campaign is prompting concerns about how Silicon Valley's strongly liberal culture might quash the very openness that is at the region's foundation.

Brendan Eich stepped down Thursday as CEO, just days after his appointment. He left the non-profit maker of the Firefox browser after furious attacks, largely on Twitter, over his \$1,000 contribution to support of a now-overturned 2008 gay-marriage ban in California.

"There was no interest in creating an Internet lynch mob," OkCupid co-founder Sam Yagun, whose dating service site was among those engaged in online protest, said Friday. "I am opposed to that with every

bone in my body."

But Eich's abrupt departure has stirred the debate over the fairness of forcing out a highly qualified technology executive over his personal views and a single campaign contribution six years ago. And it raises questions about how far corporate leaders are allowed to go in expressing their political views.

Some are also questioning whether the episode undercuts the well-groomed image of Silicon Valley as a marketplace of ideas and diversity of thought, and whether, in this case, the tech world surrendered to political correctness enforced through a public shaming on social media.

OkCupid never demanded Eich resign, and after discussing the issue with Mozilla, Yagun ended the call for a Firefox boycott Wednesday afternoon.

In retrospect, however, Yagun said he wished he had framed the Firefox

boycott in a slightly different light.

"I would have loved to have engaged in a debate over what happens when freedoms collide," Yagun said. "We have freedom of speech, which I would defend to the end. And we have what I believe is a fundamental liberty of people to marry and love whoever they want. We took a stand that matters to us personally and as a business — and I think the world will be a better place because of it."

Eich's departure didn't end the controversy — it

just changed it.

The National Organization for Marriage, which backed California's same-sex marriage ban, called on consumers to boycott the Firefox browser.

Organization President Brian Brown said Eich had been the "target of a vicious character attack by gay activists who have forced him out of the company he has helped lead for years."

While a handful of workers at top tech firms including Apple, Yahoo and Google supported the gay-marriage ban, the vast

majority gave money to oppose it.

Mozilla Chairwoman Mitchell Baker touched on the delicate balancing act in her Thursday blog post announcing Eich's resignation.

"Mozilla believes both in equality and freedom of speech," Baker said. "Equality is necessary for meaningful speech. And you need free speech to fight for equality. Figuring out how to stand for both at the same time can be hard."

Eich's technical reputation is strong. He created JavaScript and helped write the code to run Netscape's Navigator web browser before co-founding Mozilla.

Mozilla, which is based in Mountain View, Calif., declined to make any further comment Friday. Eich

did not respond to requests for comment.

Harmeet Dhillon, vice chairman of the California Republican Party, said Silicon Valley can be intolerant, and noted 52 percent of California voters supported the anti-gay marriage measure.

"Many people have told me they're afraid to identify themselves as conservatives," she said. "We face issues of political correctness all the time."

Eich's resignation should serve as a chilling reminder to workers at all levels that their off-duty behavior or personal opinions could still cost them their jobs if their employers are worried about a backlash hurting their business, said Lewis Maltby, president of the National Workrights Institute.

Permian Basin
rig count up nine
this week to 524**

The number of rigs searching for oil and natural gas in the Permian Basin increased nine this week to 524, according to a report released Friday by Houston-based oilfield services company Baker Hughes.

Texas ended the week with 877 rigs, an increase of 11.

In other Texas basins, the Eagle Ford added one rig for a total of 224; the Granite Wash finished the week with 54 rigs, an increase of three; and there were 25 rigs in the Barnett, up one.

At this time last year there were 467 rigs in the Permian Basin and 825 rigs in Texas.

The number of rigs exploring for oil and natural gas in the U.S. increased nine this week to 1,818. There were 1,498 rigs listed as searching for oil, up 11; 316 as searching for natural gas, down two; and four as miscellaneous, unchanged. A year ago this week there were 1,738 rigs in the U.S.

By trajectory, there were 393 vertical drilling rigs, up nine; 1,224 horizontal

drilling rigs, up 13; and 201 directional drilling rigs, down 13.

The top five basins by rig count this week were the Permian; the Eagle Ford; the Williston with 185 rigs, unchanged; the Marcellus with 79 rigs, up three; and the Mississippi with 74 rigs, up one.

The top five states by rig count were Texas; Oklahoma with 193 rigs, up five; North Dakota with 178, unchanged; Louisiana with 99, down six; and New Mexico with 90, up two.

In the U.S. there were 1,754 rigs listed as on land, up 13, 17 as in inland waters, down one; and 47 as offshore, down three.

The Gulf of Mexico ended the week with 46 rigs, down three.

The number of rigs searching for oil and natural gas in Canada decreased 63 this week to 235. There were 110 rigs

listed as searching for oil, down 45; 125 as searching for natural gas, down 18; and zero as miscellaneous, unchanged. At this time last year there were 206 rigs in Canada.

The total number of rigs in the North America region — which includes the U.S. and Canada but excludes rigs in the Gulf of Mexico — decreased 54 to end the week at 2,053. A year ago this week there were 1,944 rigs in North America.

Oil closes at
\$101.14 per barrel**

Oil prices rose slightly Friday after a monthly U.S. jobs report showed

stronger hiring in the U.S. in recent months.

Benchmark U.S. crude for May delivery rose 85 cents to close at \$101.14 a barrel in New York. For the week, the contract fell 53 cents. The price has vacillated around \$100 per barrel for most of the past month.

Brent crude, used to set prices for international varieties of oil used by many U.S. refiners, rose 57 cents to close at \$106.62 a barrel in London.

The U.S. Labor Depart-

ment said Friday that employers added 192,000 jobs in March. That's slightly less than analysts had anticipated, but the Labor Department also revised upward the number of jobs added in previous months, which likely pushed oil higher, according to energy analyst Jim Ritterbusch.

When the labor market and the economy improve, demand for gasoline and other fuels rises and generally pushes oil prices up.

The average retail price of gasoline rose less than a


penny to \$3.57 per gallon, according to AAA, OPIS and Wright Express. That's 9 cents per gallon more than a month ago and 7 cents per gallon less than last year at this time.

In other energy futures trading in New York:

■ Wholesale gasoline rose 1.9 cents to close at \$2.931 a gallon.

■ Natural gas fell 3.1 cents to close at \$4.439 per 1,000 cubic feet.

■ Heating oil gained edged up 0.2 cents to \$2.908 a gallon.

11 appeals judges to review meat labeling ruling

A full federal appeals court will review meat labeling rules that would require country-of-origin information on packaged steaks, ribs and other cuts of meat.

The meat industry went to court in an effort to block the government regulation, which went into effect last year. The industry says the regulations are costly and provide no health benefits to consumers. The rules require labeling with where animals are born, raised and slaughtered.

A week ago, three judges on the appeals court refused to block the rules, but suggested that their decision might be incorrect and that the entire appeals court consider the case.

The American Meat Institute said it is encouraged by the appeals court's decision to present the case to all 11 members of the court.

Health care bill helps add 3 million to Medicaid

Three million Americans signed up for Medicaid under President Barack Obama's new health care law as of the end of February, the administration said Friday, offering its first full accounting of how much the safety-net health program has grown since implementation of the law.

Many were newly eligible because of the law's Medicaid expansion, while others already eligible but not yet enrolled came forward due to publicity around the law and its requirement for individuals to carry insurance or risk paying a fine, analysts said. It brings to around 62 million the total number of people covered under Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program.

The 3 million figure is incomplete because a handful of states didn't report their numbers, and it doesn't include sign-ups in March.

But together with the administration's announcement earlier this week that more than 7 million Americans had signed up for private insurance through the law's new online marketplaces, it allows administration officials to boast that the nation's new health care program has already covered 10 million uninsured Americans even in the face of unflagging Republican opposition.

"The increase in Medicaid enrollments across the country is encouraging, but more work is left to do to ensure that the millions of uninsured Americans eligible for these programs gain coverage," said Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius in a blog post.

About half the states have accepted a Medicaid expansion in the health law.

New push on immigration bill causes GOP rift

WASHINGTON — A push to give legal status to young undocumented immigrants who serve in the military is roiling the immigration debate in the House, dividing Republicans and reviving some movement toward substantive immigration legislation this year.

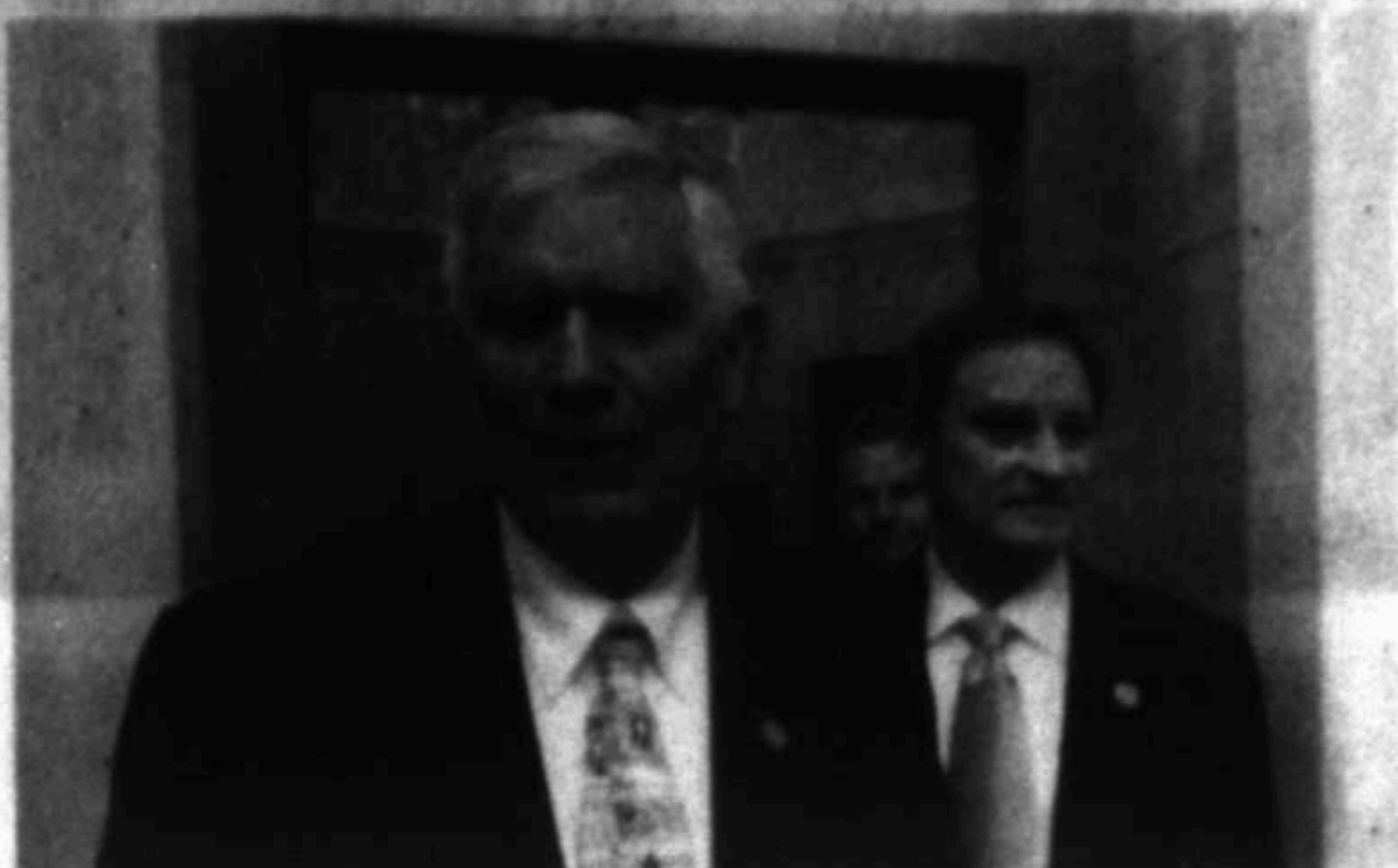
Republican advocates of loosening immigration laws are moving to attach the measure to the annual defense policy bill. It would offer a path to permanent residency for undocumented immigrants who came to the country before the age of 15 and enlist in the military. But they are running into vociferous opposition from anti-immigration hard-liners.

"It is very frustrating to hear controversy from members who have never served their country and don't understand the impact that immigrants have had on our freedoms," said Rep. Jeff Denham, R-Calif., an Air Force veteran and a sponsor of the amendment.

"That's bunk. Next question," snapped Rep. Mo Brooks, R-Ala., one of those opponents.

Speaker John Boehner, R-Ohio, shelved immigration legislation in February, in large part to keep the contentious issue from publicly dividing his party in an election year and inflaming Latino and immigrant voters, who tend to vote in lower numbers in midterm elections.

But the issue roared back this week when opponents of the overhaul went public

with their efforts to thwart the Encourage New Legal Immigrants to Start Training Act, or Enlist Act. The bill is a more modest version of the Dream Act, which would offer citizenship to young illegal immigrants through a variety of pathways, including military service and college education.

"It ensures that illegal aliens will be put on the same footing as American citizens who are competing for enlistment privileges in our national defense," said Brooks, who threatened to bring down the entire defense policy bill if the immigration measure is attached.

Rep. Steve King, R-Iowa, and a longtime opponent of any easing of immigration restrictions, went to the conservative website Breitbart.com to declare, "As soon as they raise their hand and say 'I'm unlawfully present in the United States,' we're not going to take your oath into the military, but we're going to take your deposi-

tion and we have a bus for you to Tijuana."

The House Armed Services Committee is expected to draft the defense bill in early May for floor action the week of May 19.

Rep. Howard McKeon, R-Calif., said Friday that he

will not offer the Enlist Act as an amendment in the committee. But Denham said he expects the measure to be declared in order to be offered as an amendment on the House floor.

That would trigger the kind of public fight Boehner had hoped to avoid.

The politics of the push are clear. Both Denham and his co-sponsor, Rep. Mike Coffman, R-Colo., represent swing districts with sizable Latino populations. And, as Denham's shot at his opponents implied, both men have long records of military service. Denham in the Air Force during the Persian Gulf war and in Operation Restore Hope in Somalia. Coffman in the Army and Marine Corps, including combat in the Gulf War.

But even the strongest immigration overhaul advocates are leery of using the defense bill as a vehicle

"Anything that has to do with immigration is controversial," said Rep. Mario Diaz-Balart, R-Fla., who continues to press for a vote on a comprehensive immigration bill. "Add to that the potential of should it be in this bill or not," he said, and he is undecided about the wisdom of the confrontation.

Brooks said he fears House passage of even the modest Enlist Act would invite Senate negotiators to expand the immigration measure's scope. Immigration activists are holding out no such hopes.

He points to the immigration overhaul — including a path to citizenship for the 11 million undocumented immigrants already in the country — that passed the Senate last summer, as well as Boehner's brief attempt in January to unite his conference behind a set of broad immigration principles.

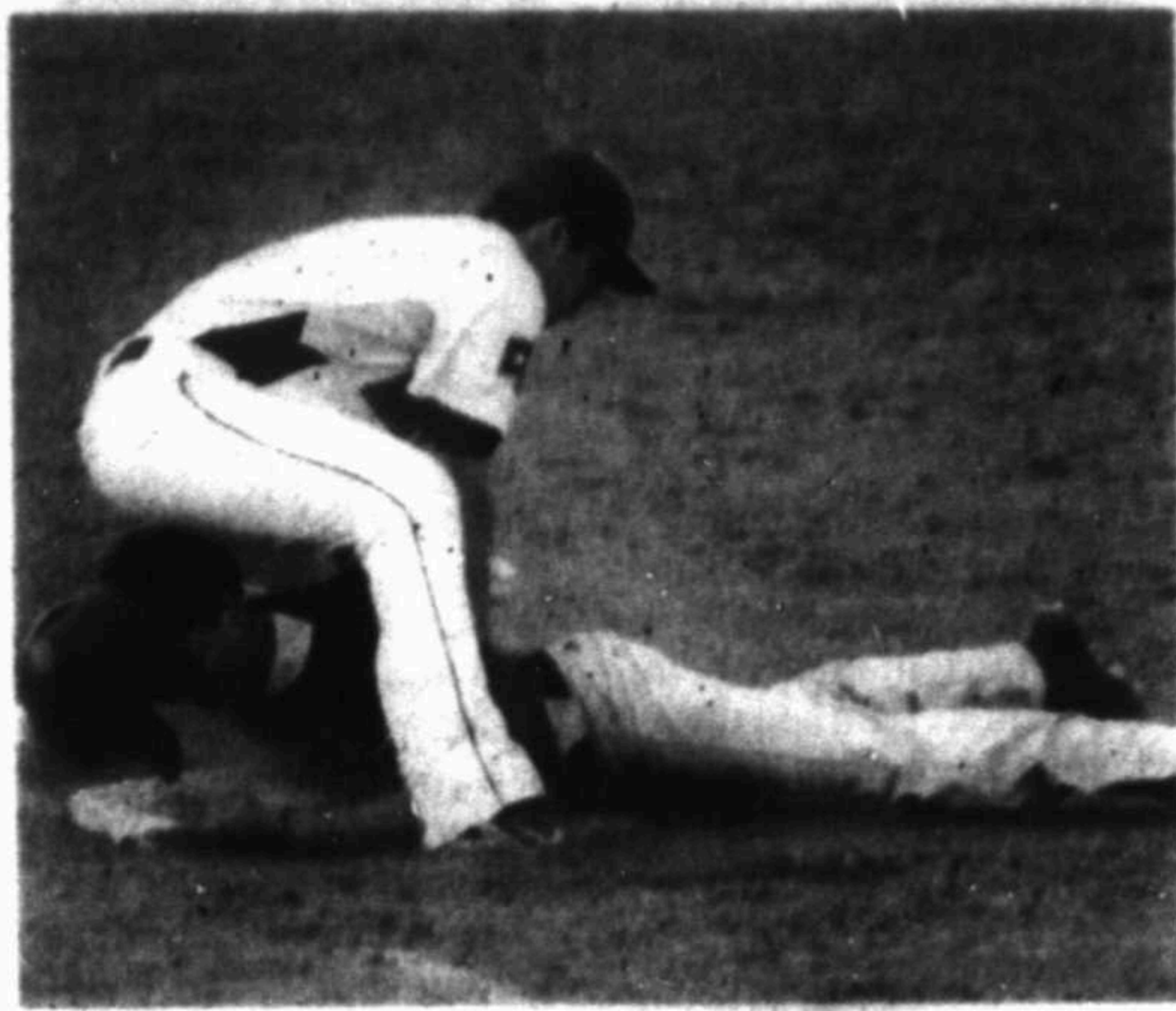

Donovan, Calipari in bonus duel at Final Four

ARLINGTON — Florida's Billy Donovan has both the SEC trophies from this season. Kentucky's John Calipari has the biggest bonus check, at least for now.

If the Gators get past Connecticut in today's semifinals and win their third national championship under Donovan on Monday night, the coach will have the biggest postseason payoff among his Final Four counterparts.

If Calipari makes it two titles in the past three seasons with the Wildcats, he will take home \$700,000 through incentives that are common for college coaches but more lucrative at some schools.

Kentucky is clearly on the higher end in basketball. Calipari can make as much as \$800,000 each year off the success of his team — he's leaving at least \$100,000 on the table this year because Florida won the SEC regular-season and tournament championships.

But even the \$700,000 he could get this year is more than the combined maximum for the other three coaches with a shot at the title.

Donovan would make \$400,000 with a championship, followed by Connecticut's Kevin Ollie at \$166,666 and Wisconsin's Bo Ryan at \$120,000.

"A program's got to reach a stage of saying, 'Whatever decision we make, we're making it within our means,'" said Oklahoma athletic director Joe Castiglione, who has one of the nation's highest-paid football coaches in Bob Stoops. "I know people focus on some of these salaries and I understand that, but there's a lot more investment being made into areas that directly, hopefully positively, impact the experience for student-athletes."

Winning helps that experience as much as anything, and coaches usually have quite a bit extra spending money when they make long postseason runs.

Donovan, who recently signed a three-year extension that raised his average salary to \$3.7 million annually over the final six years of the contract, has made an extra \$250,000 so far this season. The 18th-year Florida coach would get another \$150,000 by winning the title.

Calipari already has \$350,000 coming his way — \$100,000 each for reaching the Sweet 16 and the regional finals and another \$150,000 for making the Final Four. A championship would mean another \$350,000 for a coach who has a guaranteed income of \$4.8 million this season.

"It seems like we're working to keep coaches and if there's a lack of success people are questioning about keeping coaches," Castiglione said. "So you're always balancing one or the other. When programs see success happening at others, they want to emulate it. Sometimes that means they're coming after your best personnel."

Connecticut athletic director Warde Manual is already on record as saying he wants to rework Ollie's contract after the Huskies made a surprising run to the Final Four.

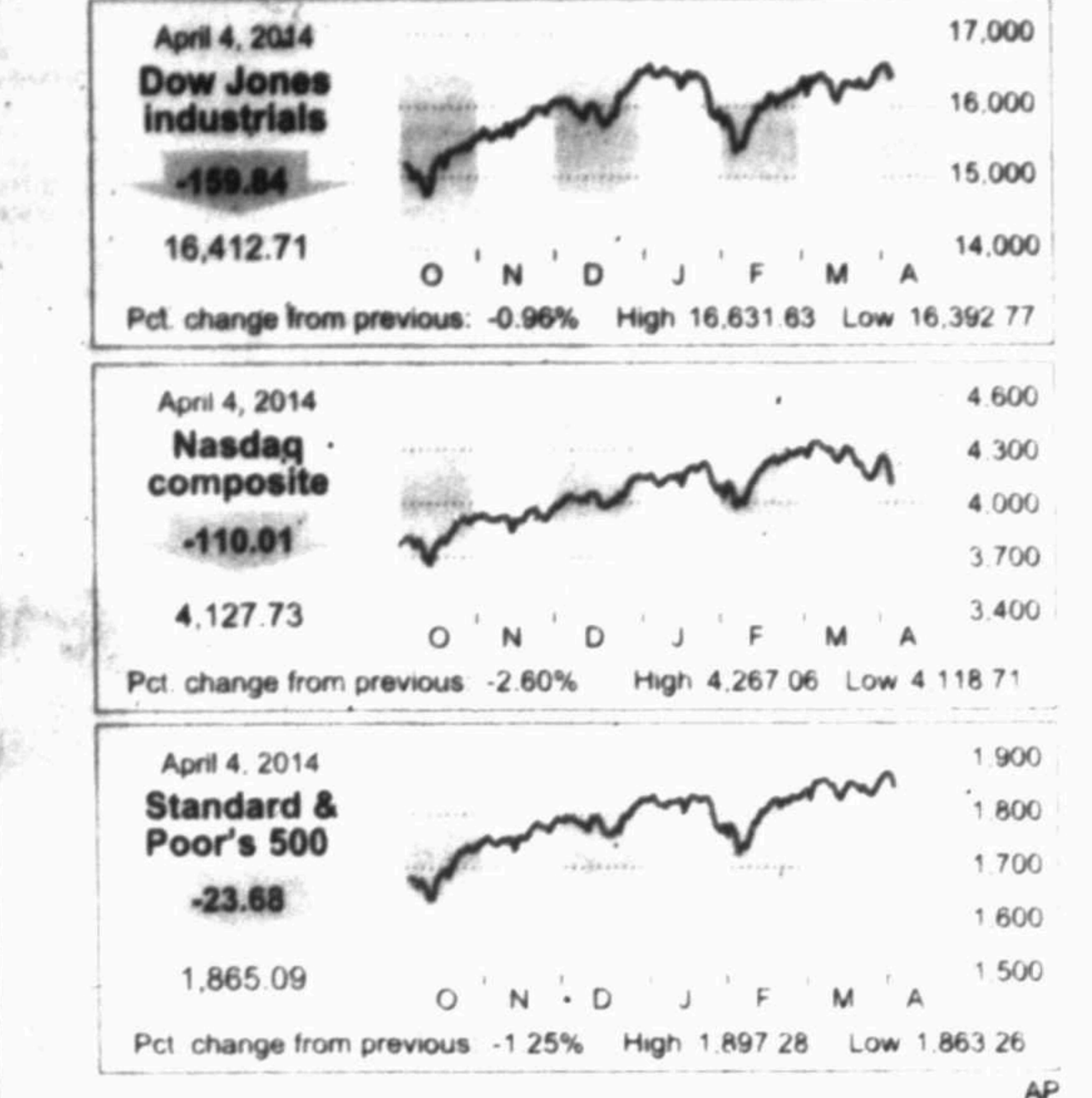

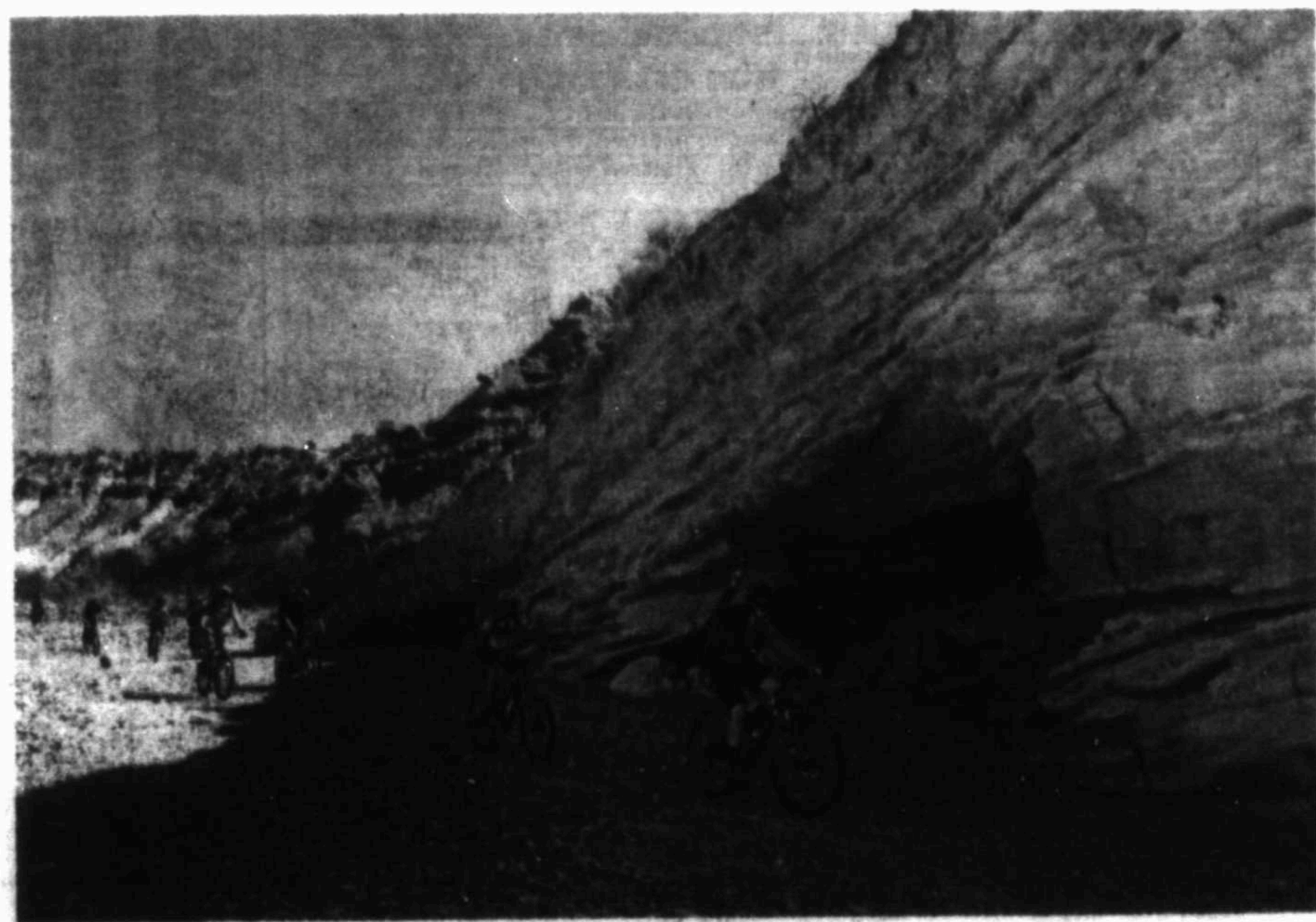

Head to Big Bend for the best mountain biking in Texas

TERLINGUA —

You haven't really bicycled Texas until you've ridden the West Texas desert, weaving past flat-topped mesas and cactuses that snag your legs just for spite, one eye constantly peeled for a hairy-legged tarantula.

Road riding's fine, and commuting gets you where you're going, but biking through Big Bend Ranch State Park feels like visiting the moon. Beyond crunching gravel and clattering stones, you spin through a world that's eerily quiet, except for the wind. It's beautiful — thorny plants, jagged rocks and all.

Recently I made my third multi-day mountain biking trek through the park. The adventure coincided with the fourth annual Chihuahuan Desert Bike Festival, a gathering of mountain biking geeks that features guided and unguided rides for cyclists of all skill levels on trails at Big Bend Ranch State Park, Big Bend National Park and Lajitas Resort.

But the message here isn't about the three-day party that drew almost 500 rid-

ers this year — it's about the Big Bend region as the state's most unique mountain biking destination.

"The mountain biking is great out here, and it's open all year," said Mike Long, owner of Desert Sports in Terlingua, a co-sponsor of the laid-back festival. It's best seen between October and April; otherwise high temperatures might melt your bike tires or wilt your motivation.

Make the trip and you'll find yourself meandering past an old mining operation, checking out the ruins of a wax factory, zipping around a sparkling mound of white rock crystals that glisten like giant grains of salt or stopping to admire handprints painted on a rock overhang hundreds of years ago.

"A big chunk of it is just where you are," Long said. "The Hill Country is beautiful, but this is a different kind of scenery — it's that whole big sky, open country thing. Most people don't live in an area where they can ride two hours and not see a house. The isolation appeals to folks."

My husband, Chris, and I, along with three Austin friends, set out on what's called the two-day Epic Loop, rolling

from the Barton Warnock Visitor Center near Lajitas north about 30 challenging miles to the headquarters of Big Bend Ranch State Park at Saucedo. The next morning we got up and added another 27 or so to the tally, looping back down to Barton Warnock on a different road.

Some (superhuman) folks do the entire loop in one day, but I prefer to maintain consciousness — and feeling in my muscles.

That first day was a doozy, with plenty of uphill. Highlights? Scampering up rocky ledges and down screaming hill-sides straight out of an old Wile E. Coyote and Road Runner cartoon. Single-track sections of trail unfurled like silk ribbons in the breeze, and by the time we rolled into Saucedo my quads felt like they'd been wrung out like dishrags. A lasagna feast whipped up by a cook named Victor fixed that, though, and afterward I collapsed into a giant fluffy bed in the Big House.

Day two was bliss. We rolled out of bed, fueled up with eggs, biscuits, bacon and gravy, climbed onto our two-wheeled steeds and headed toward Madrid Hill, one of the most scenic points in the journey. We panted like spent nordic skiers at the top, glancing back at the desert, which swept away for miles in a prickly, crumpled sheet of greenish-gray.

We plugged up another gorgeous pass called Pila de los Muchachos, careened down the other side, then paused for lunch near the crumbling, abandoned Madrid House, where I flopped onto the ground

like a fish flipped out of a lake on a hook.

Something about squeezing every available ounce of energy out of my body makes me deliriously happy, and when I can do that under a bird-egg blue sky, with ocotillo and crazy looking desert grasshoppers parading through the background, I'm in heaven.

I'm not alone, either. Along the way we bumped into other folks exploring the desert on rugged, "29-er" mountain bikes. "I love the expanse," Brent Armstrong, 53, told us. He'd driven 12 hours from Lindale to ride the Epic Loop with his wife, Susan, 57. "I love the geography and I love the stars at night."

"We just like adventure," Susan Armstrong said. "I love the outdoors, and I like to be able to do whatever Brent does."

We even bumped into some cyclists from Austin, including Mark Barnett, 48, a member of the exhibits team at the Thinkery.

"It's just amazing," he said. "This is the hardest 60 miles on a mountain bike."

Hard, yes, but rewarding and unforgettable, too.
