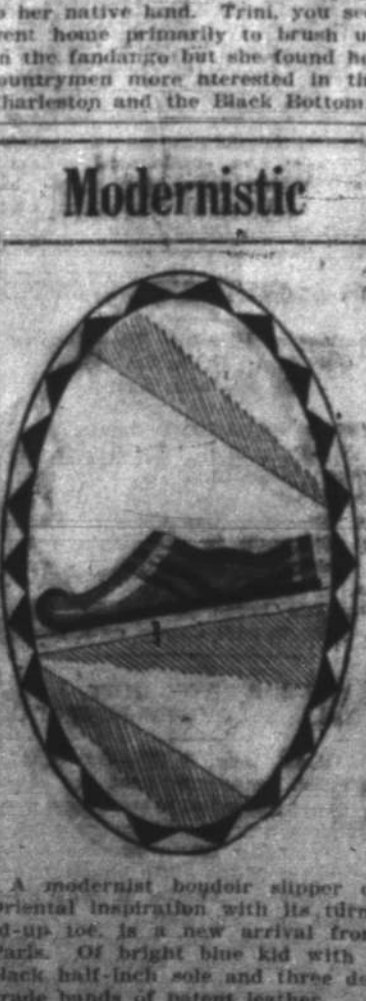

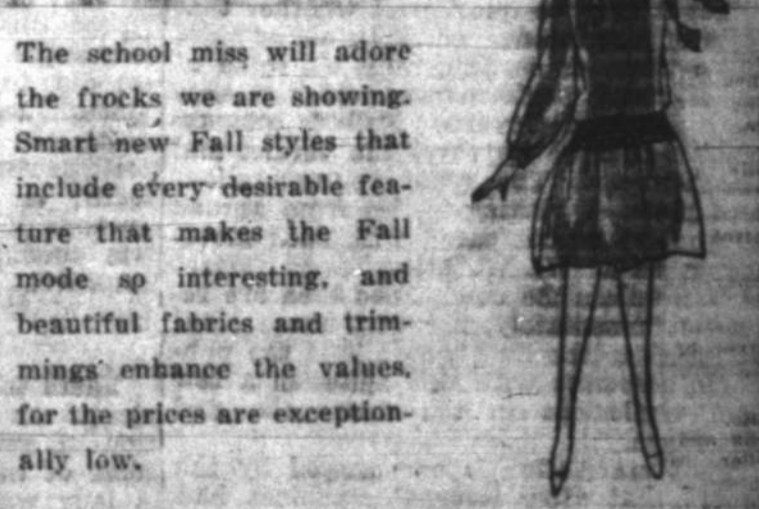

ROSWELL AUCTION SALE ATTRACTS BIG INTEREST

All men in the state of New Mexico are displaying no little amount of interest in the auction sale of oil and gas leases on public lands to be held at Roswell and Lovington, N. Mexico, State Land Commission, August 18, 1927.

Over 11,000 acres of land in Lea and Chaves counties are included in the sale, with over 40,000 acres in Lea county.

Most of this acreage is in the neighborhood of the Texas company's No. 3 Lucy Robinson permit in 25-13-21, passover, which creates new interest in northeastern Eddy, northeastern Lea and southeastern Chaves counties.

Many scouts and land men from all parts of the oil country are attending over this advertised acreage. The minimum bid allowed is 33 cents per acre and it looks like there will be some keen bidding.

A gas separator has been installed in the Texas company's No. 3 well, which is making 29,000,000 cubic feet of gas from 3,883 feet with the tools in the hole, and will determine the gas content of the gas. Estimates place the gas spray from this well at 25 barrels a day.

G. M. Getty's No. 1 Rawson permit in 14-20-23, southeast Eddy county has been driving its share of attention since it picked up a nice-looking sand at 1373-1408 feet. The well was shot with 10 quarts at 1373 feet and again at from 1373-1383 feet with 20 quarts. The result of the shot has not been determined as yet but if a producer it will be the first producer for the Canadian district.

The Getty No. 1 Lenora permit in 23-22-27, picked up the salt at 535 feet. This is looked on as an indication that shallow production will be found, for it proves that the well is structurally higher than any other well in the territory.

The Texas company No. 1 permit 22-24-22, in southeast Lea county, near the Winkler county line, are still fighting for the tools low at 2400 feet. The bit penetrates a gas which blew the tools up, catching in the pipe.

The Henderson Dexter Blair, No. 1 Wyatt, in 24-17-33 in drilling low level 2475 feet. This is one of the deepest tests in Lea county.

YATES POOL EXTENDED

The Yates pool in Pecos county was in the process of being extended one mile to the northwest Monday by the McMann-Markland No. 1 Yates which was drilling with 20 feet of oil in the hole. The depth was given as 1,265 feet in gray lime, the oil in the hole coming from 1237-1241. There is very little water in the hole.

The McMann test resumed drilling Sunday after waiting three days for the cement to harden. The depth at that time was 1,227 feet. The well at present determines there is some oil one mile from the California well which is a pincher in 700 barrels.

The Alaman and Bell river well No. 2 was at 1,000 feet Monday in sandstone. The Marland A-1 is setting 8-inch casing at 815 feet. The McMann-Transcontinental A-1 is drilling at 1,130 feet. This well in 535 feet north of the same company's No. 3-A which has been drilled in after making 100 barrels per hour. The 3B is still a 325 feet where it has some gas in it, having some trouble mudding the casing.

It is one of four wells on 7,500 acres owned by Westcoast Thompson Holding Corporation, the completions being made at the installation of the Westcoast interests under terms of the contract with the Southern Crude Purchasing Company. Other tests to be drilled in the T-38 A-1 and the T-38 A-1. The first test is at 2417 feet and the 38 A-1 got the pay at 2390, drilling then to 2316. The Southern crude has two wells in the line to be drilled to the gas, then halted, to be let standing indefinitely. The other wells to drill in are yet to be located.

YATES FIELD EXTENDED

SAN ANGELO, Aug. 9. (AP)—The most extensive shallow oil pool in the world was apparently established Tuesday in eastern Pecos, two new wells in the Yates field extending the producing area a mile northwest and two miles and a half west of the nearest production. The McMann-Markland, a mile northwest of the California Yates 1, was flowing at the rate of about 3,400 barrels daily. To the west the McMann-Markland Smith number one scratched the top of the pay, at 1,468 and shut down for casing and storage. It built a quarter boiler of oil each fifteen minutes. It is in section 24, block 184. The McMann is in section 24, block 184.

TWO-STATE ROAD BUILDING PLANNED

COMBINED MEETING ASKED FOR TEXAS AND N. M. COMMISSIONERS

STAMFORD, Aug. 9.—The five-hundred length of interstate connecting highways of West Texas and eastern New Mexico may be improved through co-ordinate efforts of the highway commissioners of both states. Correspondence indicated by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce in highway officials of the Lone Star State and New Mexico find both groups entirely agreeable to forming some definite move toward co-operative work.

Arrangement for a joint meeting of the Texas Highway Commission and the New Mexico Highway Commission is being contemplated by some time this fall. W. C. Davitt, State Highway Engineer of New Mexico, has written Manager Homer D. Wade, of the West Texas organization, that he is taking up the proposition of improving interstate connecting highways with members of the New Mexico Commission and that he is finding them ready to act at any time. A telephone communication with Walter J. chairman of the Texas Highway Commission, indicated his favor in the matter, and since both commissions have expressed themselves as being agreeable to action along this line, it is thought that a joint conference will be called at an early date at some convenient point.

It is believed that a concerted move on the part of the two states to improve the line-up along the border would be of mutual advantage, not only to the particular districts of West Texas and Eastern New Mexico, but to the entire territory of both states.

New Gins Erected Dean & Webb, former owners of the Slaton Cotton Oil Mill, have practically finished the erection of a new gin in the McClung community seven miles northeast of here. This will serve a very productive section of Slaton's trade territory.

Tudor Brothers, R. H. and F. B. Tudor, are building a new plant in the Tosey community, five miles northwest of Slaton. Their plant at that point burned near the opening of the ginning season, last year. These men now own and operate three gins in this vicinity, and the new gins will be a fourth.

A third new gin is under construction in Wilson, ten miles south of here. R. H. Tudor, of Slaton, W. A. Dykes, of Lubbock, and Harvey Sexton are the builders. It replaces the Edwards & Thornton gin which burned there near the close of the last ginning season.

Messrs Tudor and Dykes were the builders of the Slaton ice plant which is now owned and operated by the Texas Utilities company. The Tudor brothers are pioneer gin men in this section.

might wait forward quietly within the prison here today while counsel for the two men continued to wage a desperate last minute fight in the courts to save the lives of the two men.

For the actual execution there remained little to be done. More than a week ago the chair in which the two will be executed was made ready. Straps were oiled and adjusted and the apparatus gone over. Some time before the hour when the men are to die, the state executioner will make a final inspection but his visit probably will be secret.

Machine Guns Mounted The preparations for the most part were precautionary. Today visitors found it as easy as usual to enter the prison yard but to move without assistance will be more difficult. The number of guards, already more than normal, will be increased and only those having important business will be admitted.

An area about the prison will be shut off and tomorrow night no one but those who can pass the muster of the guards will get near. Machine guns will be mounted on the walls. This afternoon several searchlights were taken into the warden's office and it is expected these will be placed at regular intervals from which they can command the surrounding streets. Within their cells in the death house Sacco and Vanzetti prepared to pass what may be their last full night on earth in a manner no different from those that have gone before them when they were transferred to the death row. Neither ate the food that was offered him. In an adjoining cell Celestino Madairis, sentenced to die with them, though for another crime, lay upon his cot weeping when the meals were brought when he rose to eat. For him there has been no hunger strike. Sacco has not eaten in more than three weeks. Vanzetti has fasted much, but has eaten at times.

Bomb Is Found CHICAGO, Aug. 9. (AP)—A hobo who had gone into a vacant building today to sleep, heard the ticking of a clock and discovered a time bomb powerful enough to wreck a postal sub-station next door.

The bomb was set for 11 p. m. today. The postal station is located in a congested district where are located many cheap hotels and rooming houses. Tear bombs were used and one shot was fired early today in the breaking up of a parade of radicals, both men and women intent on marching on the loop district in protest against the scheduled execution of Sacco and Vanzetti.

Police Halt Parade NEW YORK, Aug. 9. (AP)—Mounted policemen tonight broke up an attempt of Sacco-Vanzetti sympathizers to parade to city hall. The parade, for which permission had been refused, started after a peaceful protest meeting had been staged in Union square.

A crowd estimated by police at 2,000 moved along Fifth Avenue and marched several blocks south before policemen riding into the throng scattered the parade.

thirteen minute guns were fired by a battery at Fort Meyer, nearby. The casket was lifted from the caisson by eight privates and at the army band played "Nearer My God to Thee" it was taken to the grave.

Just before the body reached the cemetery officials now in Washington and many friends and former comrades-in-arms of General Wood gathered at the grave side. Among them were Secretary Kellogg, personal representative of President Coolidge, Postmaster General Newcomb, Acting Secretary F. Trubee Davidson, of the war department, and Acting Secretary Robinson, of the navy department.

Notables All There In this group, too, was Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., former assistant secretary of the navy and son of the man who was second in command when the "Rough Riders" made their memorable charge up San Juan Hill. He has a daughter, for whom he participated in that charge also were present.

As Major W. H. Watts, an army chaplain, read the Episcopal burial ritual, Mrs. Wood, veiled, and in deep mourning, leaned heavily on the arm of her son, Leonard, Jr. Near her stood Jacob Wood, only brother of the general and both were Osborne and Miss Lusit Wood, the general's children.

Colonel John T. Axton, chief of army chaplains, delivered a brief eulogy, saying high tribute to "a man who was a distinguished citizen, a great soldier of a great nation, a marvelous administrator, a loving father and affectionate husband, a most fraternal brother, and one who most splendidly served his generation."

Tributes Paid "If all those who have been touched by the influence of Leonard Wood were privileged to be here and drop a petal upon his grave," Colonel Axton said, "Leonard Wood would sleep tonight beneath a wilderness of flowers."

After the Lord's prayer had been said, a bugler advanced to the head of the grave and sounded "taps," the soldier's requiem. Then a squad of infantry fired three volleys as the casket was slowly lowered into the grave. After the casket had been lowered, a bugler sounded in farewell salute.

Before the flag-draped casket disappeared, and after the other members of the family had departed, Jacob Wood leaned over and in four hours laid his hand on the coffin. He then stood beside the grave for five minutes before leaving.

make use of leisure time, is stressed along with reading, writing and arithmetic.

Courses Form Problem "Now the problem confronting us in the rural school field is just where will we end our course of study with reference to two distinct types of students—those who will attend school no more, and those who are preparing to enter college for the professions. This matter will be one of the main features discussed at the annual meeting. If the student is to be prepared in the rural school for entering college, something more than has been done in the past must be accomplished. The method that is in use at the present time is for the pupil to do his last year or two years of high school work in one of our city schools in the county and from this school earn additional credits that have more trouble in this is the fact that many rural schools do not equip a student through ten grades to permit his passing the eleventh satisfactorily in the city school. Should these pupils stay ten grades in the country, or would the better plan be to take only nine grades in the rural schools? Should the rural school have as its first consideration the preparation of these pupils who intend to go to college, for entrance to the city high school, or should the first objective be preparing the entire student body of the rural school for a fuller realization of country life with the best possible educational advantages? These topics will be among those discussed at the meeting."

Hundred and thirty trustees and five members of the county board of education, serving in Lubbock city and rural schools make up the group which will convene at the Tech pavilion in an all day program.
