## Parmer County Stock Show sale sets new record

For the third time in a row, the Parmer County Stock Show set a new first day financial record.

The 65th show brought in \$143,525 the first day -- with add-ons to come later. Last year the first day total was \$129,058, and with later add-ons, the final total was \$195,962.

For the two previous years it was \$108,125 in 2011 and \$88,225 in 2010.

To show how far the county stock show has come, these numbers compare to the \$40,965 total in 1971.

This year there were 133 kids involved in showing animals, up from around 100 kids last year. The addition of the Dairy show helped.

# Lazbuddie teacher seeks to adopt a little girl

This story began when a Lazbuddie teacher and her family -- Gene and Jessica Maulding, and children Ty and Tenley, were attending Faith Christian Church in Clovis last November.

The youth pastor was discussing his group's latest fund-raiser for an orphanage in Juarez, Mexico. Shown on the large video screen above the pulpit was a photo of a little girl who was at the orphanage.

"She looked so happy and full of life. I found myself staring at her the entire time it was up," said Mrs. Maulding, who teaches pre-kindergarten at Lazbuddie School. Her husband sells chemicals for Novozymes.

It was learned that the little girl, Alondra, had suffered greatly as a baby and needed surgery.

"During this time, I don't think there was a dry eye in the congregation. While crying my eyes out, all I could think was that Gene and I needed this baby. I honestly have no idea what the sermon was about that day. God spoke to me the entire time and assured me that if we were willing to trust and obey him, He would provide everything to help us adopt Alondra."

God also touched Gene's heart and the couple asked for information on adopting Alondra. The couple checked further into this, and learned that the little girl was available for adoption.

In December, the Mauldings met with an adoption attorney in Ruidoso, N.M., who instructed them on the process needed. But more money is needed for it to work out.

Debbie Wium, a Muleshoe woman whose children attend Lazbuddie School, volunteered to help. Mrs. Wium is an Avon representative.

Mrs. Wium called the Tribune to say she has started an Avon fund-raiser to help the Maulding family.

Mrs. Wium said the fund-raiser will continue for two campaigns. The first order will go in on Jan. 29 and the last order on Feb. 12.

"It is obvious to me that the only people who believe that city officials control the streets are the politicians themselves, and part of the reason for that claim has got to be job retention."

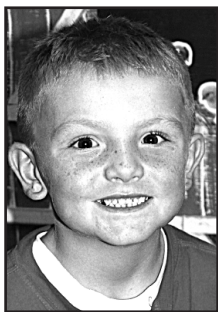
This is what I keep telling you folks. Parts of major cities are now run by gangs. If you visit a large city, beware of where you go.

# Kelsay reports lower crime rates

The Farwell City Council on Jan. 15 received an end-of-the-year report from Police Chief Kelsay that shows crime rates are considerably lower last year while arrests are up.

Kelsay said there were 9 burglaries in 2009 but only 2 in 2011. Thefts dropped from 26 in 2009 to 6 in 2011.

While only 2 arrests were made in 2008, last year the Farwell Police Department made 20 arrests.

In other business, the Council:  
 -- Approved building permits for George Martinez to build a porch at 607 Ave. B, and Lesley Curtis to stucco a house at 804 4th St.

-- Learned that the new Distribution Center in Farwell should be operational as of Feb. 1. The ramps are finished and caliche is being hauled in to finish the construction.

-- Heard a report from the Water Department saying they are catching up on meter reading right now. The fence around the water tower is almost complete.

The Department is replacing worn-out meters and recycling the brass from them. They earned \$647 by recycling this material.

-- A gas leak at the Community Center is under repair.

-- Learned that the Farwell Fire Department is participating with Texico for firefighter certification classes. At the introductory meeting, around 12 people showed interest in taking the certification class.

Although the class will be in New Mexico, the certification is honored in Texas as well. It is an 8-week course and will begin soon.

The Fire Department is also looking into repairing or replacing lights in the fire building.

-- Heard from Craig Greisbrecht that the EMS year has been busy. They received 13 calls in the first 14 days of the year.

They reported a busy year for 2011 as well. Craig cited 64 written reports for last year along with about 20 more that happened before he began his reporting period.

He gave two estimates to replace the double ambulance bay doors at the EMS building. The current one is in bad shape and is not insulated. The Council approved the bid for a commercial door that is insulated with windows. The doors will be replaced soon.

-- Heard a report from the Senior Citizens Meal Site.

In November, they were open 18 days and served 422 people. They provided 95 to-go plates as well.

In December, they were open 12 days and served 274 people and 59 to-go plates. The holiday season and inclement weather affected the amount of days they were able to serve, but the Center is trying to stay open as many days as possible.

They mentioned possibly repairing the ramps and floor in the serving area for better access and will determine the best possible options for the repair work.

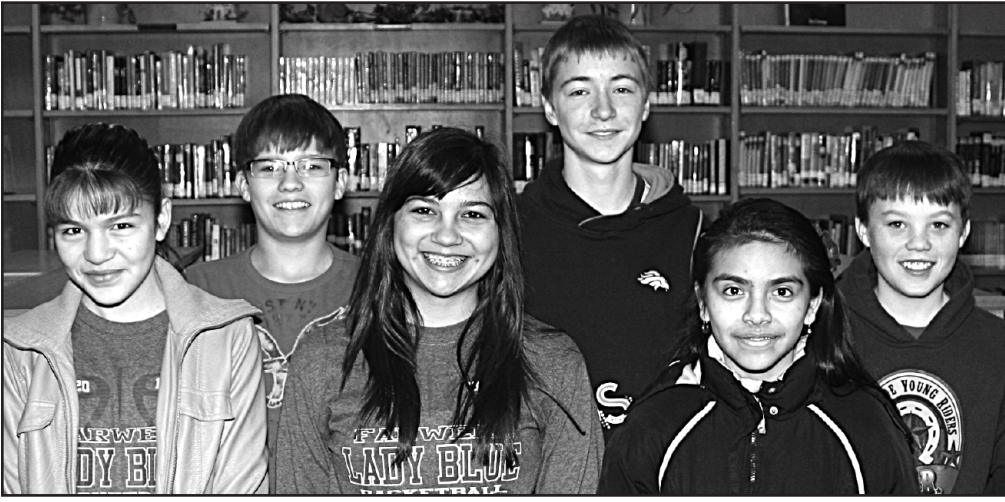

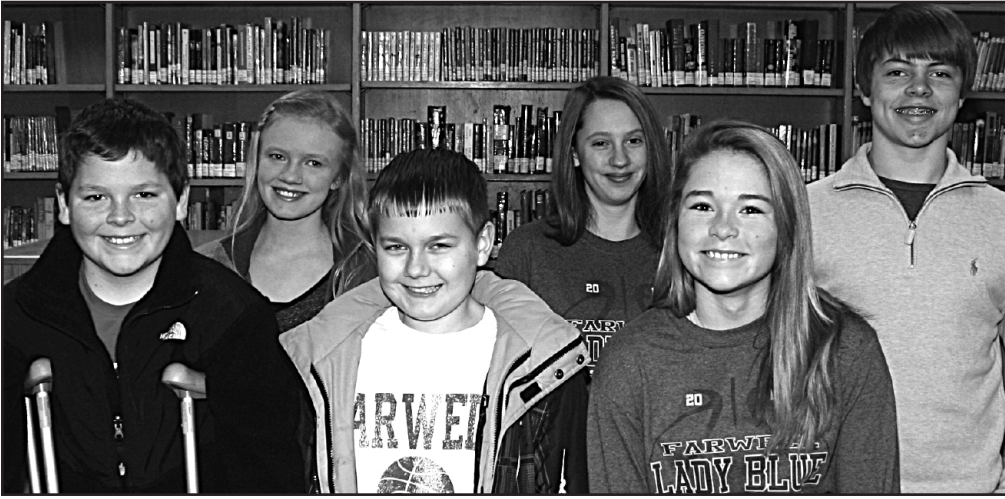

### Just Passing Through

WILL ANDERSON

This is a continuation of last week's column on nullification -- the fact that a state is only pledged to follow the U.S. Constitution

Based on that, each state retains the right to "nullify" any measure passed by Congress inside its own borders if that particular measure violates the Constitution.

Nullification in its most extreme took the form of secession from the Union altogether in the Civil War, and after that nightmare it seemed to be dead and buried.

It was declared from time to time, most notably by Southern states in the years of the Civil Rights Movement of the 1950s and 1960s with no effect -- the dispatch of Army units and the federal call-up of national guard units in each state settled the issue.

Nullification may be rising again, however, and the end result is by no means certain in the issues it involves today. State Sovereignty Acts have been proposed or adopted in a majority of the states in recent years.

-- The Affordable Healthcare Act of 2010 (Obamacare) directs states to establish "healthcare exchanges" to facilitate the massive restructuring of one-sixth of the U.S. economy.

New Mexico joined the states that declared its own directed state exchange. Texas and 24 other states (so far) declared they would not do so -- "it is a Federal statute, let the Federal government do it itself."

-- A variety of cities in the U.S. have established themselves as "magnet cities" for illegal immigrants, declaring the Federal statutes for immigration will not be enforced inside their city lines.

They do this for their own reasons and the Federal government does not respond for its own.

--A major issue that may bring nullification to the front burner will be

the gun control measures now being prepared by Congress and the Administration.

The 2nd Amendment states that "a well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms shall not be infringed."

As a part of the Constitution, it cannot be stricken or distorted by

an act of Congress or by executive decree.

It can only be touched through the process that requires a two-thirds vote of both Congressional chambers (or the legislatures of two-thirds of the states) followed by ratification within 7 years by three-fourths of the state legislatures.

**Letter to the Editor**

Dear Editor,

I am a mother of 2 amazing, wonderful, creative, talented and spirited boys. My kids and my husband are my life. From cleaning house to mowing the lawn to trips away from home, we are centered around family.

God has blessed us by allowing us to be able to live close to many relatives. As crazy and wild life can be sometimes with family and schedules, these moments are cherished. Upon the birth of my second son, I was fortunate enough to be a stay-at-home mom for 3 years. That time will always be dear to my heart.

To play with my kids, love them, and teach them about their Heavenly Father and the world around them is my greatest desire. I want to make incredible memories with them to last a lifetime. Whether it is going hunting, fishing, pulling dandelions, playing in the mud, or going on an elaborate vacation, these times are filled with memories and lessons which hold immeasurable value.

God references children as blessings in many Biblical passages. Also, He tells us we should have a child-like faith and that the Kingdom of God belongs to those who have such.

Being a parent is a blessing and a God-given responsibility. I am humbled and thankful that God chose me and my husband to be parents to our precious little boys.

As any parent knows, time has a way of passing us by. In a blink, my little babies are now little boys growing into the life God has destined for them. While I know that they will always be my boys, I want to treasure and enjoy the years I get to spend with them and not take these precious years for granted.

However, my time with my family is slowly being replaced with school, homework, sports, and the crazy hustle and bustle of what we call life. In the process of "life", my kids and my family are slowly being robbed of my children's childhood.

What I mean is that we have 5 days a week of school and homework for most of those days. By the time school ends, homework is done, dinner is fixed, baths are given, it is time for bed ... only to wake up and do it all over again.

Plus there are extra-curricular activities.

We have 2 days during the weekend. In our family, one usually revolves around an athletic schedule. The other begins in Sunday School and church. I believe that all of these are valuable and teach great lessons, but my children have little time to ride bikes, jump on a trampoline, climb a tree, build a fort, play hide and seek, work with their dad, or go camping.

Are these things not equally as important as athletics and academics? Some would disagree, but I think there is just as much to learn off the court or field as there is on it. Also, I think there is just as much to learn outside the classroom as there is to learn inside it, especially with the recent stance the government has taken on education.

Now, not only is my child required to attend x amount of days in school, but it is dictated which days and for how long. As well, our holiday schedules, breaks, and vacations revolve around a calendar given us that we as parents have very little say in.

Myself and my child are punished if too many days of this schedule are missed. The state dictates what my child should learn and the rate at which he should learn as measured by "the test."

By the way, preparation for the infamous "test" begins in kindergarten. As well, my child is measured by numbers and graphs on a piece of paper that compares him to where he should be performing.

If a child is not progressing at a rate that suggests successful scores on the test, we send them to tutorials, allow them to skip recess to catch up, and give them more structured and intense interventions.

I am told, as a parent, what foods are good for my child and what I can and cannot pack in his lunch. Ironically, the government is so concerned with health that we have restrictions in packing lunches, but at the same time recess, PE, and play time for our children are dwindling.

As if this were not enough stress for our little ones, there are the extra-curricular activities. When I was young, it was to provide opportunities for kids, teach about sportsmanship, and to have an outlet.

Nowadays, if you want your child to be successful in activities they have to start just out of the womb to keep up. Then if your child were to stop doing something, regardless of the reason, you and your child are subject to other's opinions imposed on you.

I have found myself and my family in a crazy, vicious circle of rushing from one thing to the next that is depriving us of the thing I cherish most -- time with my family.

When is enough, enough? My children belong to me

and my husband, not the government. God has given ME this incredibly blessed responsibility and task of raising my boys, yet I am the one they see the least. It seems backwards in my opinion.

God does not delegate my child's worth according to test scores, athletic stats, or whether or not he quit a sport at the age of 7.

Our children's worth, our worth, is defined in who we are in Christ. Those who believe are heirs to His throne and will share in His glory. In judgment, God will not be concerned with "the test" but rather our hearts. As a parent, I need to be more concerned with what God tells me is best for my children, not what the government legislates as best.

I know the values of education and extra-curricular activities. However, at least in my home, we have got to find a balance that works for our family.

When I look back on my life and the time I spent with my children, I want to have memories made to leave a legacy of a solid foundation and belief system that does not falter even when society or the government does. I do not want to have only regrets because I was so caught up in the system of hustle and bustle that I failed as a parent to instill the real values of this life into the lives of my children.

The day will come when sports statistics and testing scores do not matter. No longer will they be relevant. However, morals, ethics, values, family and a legacy of Christ will never expire. As parents, we have a right and an obligation to do what is best for our children. These decisions should not be dictated by our government or our school systems.

I believe that as families, it is time to take a stand for our children.
