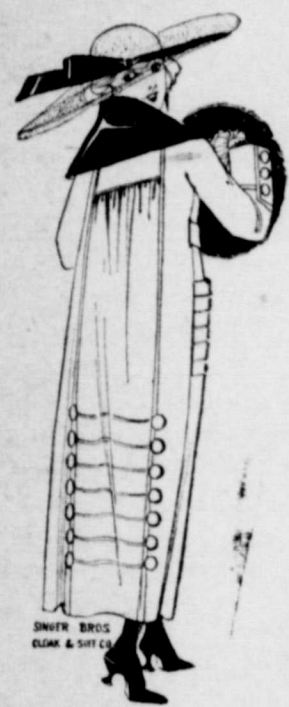

POLITICAL OPPOSITION TO TREATY IS BOLSHEVISM

MORE TALK OF SANTA FE CHANGE

K. S. Hull, superintendent of the Santa Fe, made a trip over the Ballinger branch of the line this week, and while out this way stated that if the people desired that the schedule of the Santa Fe be changed so as to give a through train from San Angelo to Temple in the morning, that such change could be agreed upon.

The proposed change was suggested some time ago and it seems to meet with the approval with every man who has expressed himself concerning the change. Those who understood the benefits to be derived from such change are very anxious that it be made at the earliest possible time.

The proposed plan would change the hour of departure east for the morning Santa Fe train and instead of leaving here at 9:45 a. m. it would go east at about 4:45 and instead of being a local train to Brownwood it would run through to Temple.

Such change would give double daily service east for passengers and mail and would serve travel east by giving daylight connections at Temple both north and south, and would deliver mail twelve hours earlier than on the present schedule.

Diaz Wood left for Lebanon, Tenn., Friday afternoon, where he goes to enter Cumberland Law University. He expects to return home for the holidays.

Kansas City, Sept. 6.—Before a wildly enthusiastic audience of twenty thousand people today at this place President Wilson defended the peace treaty with the league of nations.

This is the home town of Senator Reed, one of the treaty's bitterest opponents.

"The treaty opponents who view the document with 'jaundiced eyes' opposing it because they have some private political purpose, at last will be hanged and they will regret that Gibbett is so high," declared Mr. Wilson.

The president reiterated that it was a case of "put up or shut up."

He said that the opposition must produce something better than the league of nations or step aside.

"The mere negotiation without offering anything constructive to replace the treaty is bolshevism," said Mr. Wilson.

Mr. Wilson said that he respected the man who honestly but ignorantly opposed the treaty, but he denounced those who are opposing the treaty for political reasons.

"The Philippines will get their independence under the league of nations through the treaty," said the president, "and the American spirit has conquered the world. The war was won by the United States."

FRANCIS FUNERAL

HELD AT CHURCH

As The Ledger goes to press the friends and relatives of J. W. Francis are gathered at the First Presbyterian church where the pastor of that church, Rev. H. P. Bates, is conducting the funeral services.

The remains of Mr. Francis arrived here at twelve-thirty Saturday at noon. They were carried to the church where they remained until after the services when they will be interred in Evergreen Cemetery.

The remains were accompanied to Ballinger by the family. Mr. Francis died at Temple Friday morning at five o'clock. He was a citizen of Ballinger for 28 years and this city mourns his death.

MEXICAN ARRAIGNS

CARRANZA REGIME

Washington, Sept. 6.—Warning Mexicans that intervention by the United States is imminent, General Salvador Alvarado, one of the leaders in the Carranza movement throughout its course, has addressed an open letter to Carranza himself and General Obregon and Gonzales, in which he arranges conditions in Mexico in seething fashion.

Alvarado, who attracted attention of all the Pan-Americans for his administration in Yucatan, estimates that the present daily death list in the scattered fighting between federal troops and rebels is one hundred. In Mexico City alone he says 8,000 children die each year for want of proper food, clothing and shelter.

Alvarado, after trying to make the radical theories of the new Mexican constitution work in actual practice, declares the system must be changed. He declares Mexico has passed from the extreme of an irresponsible obstructionist congress to the other—a despotic corrupting and ultra-personal presidential regime with out responsibility of legal restraint.

He excoriates the administration of Juarez, charging that justice is sold to the highest bidder.

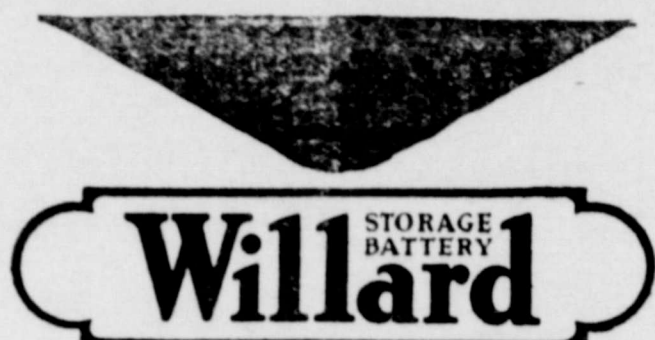
