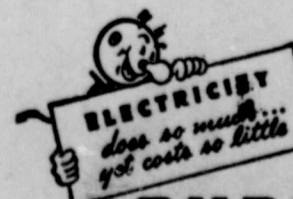

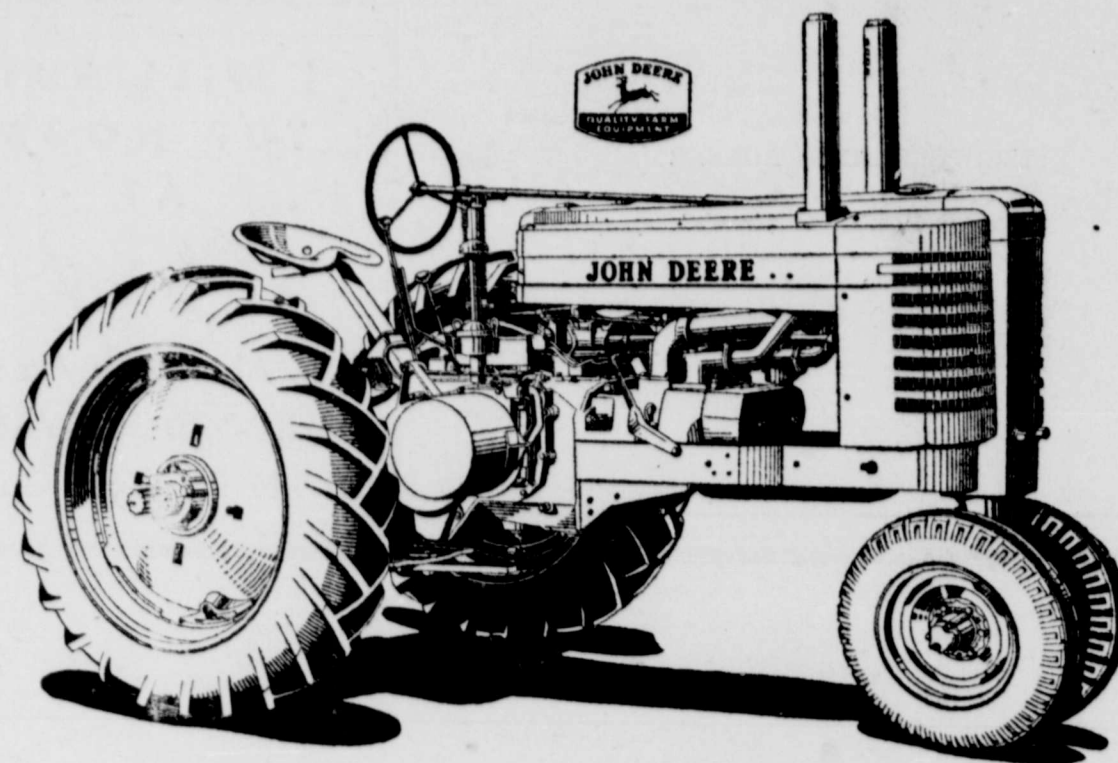

Refrigerator Roll Recipe:

1 cake yeast, 1/4 cup lukewarm water, 1/2 cup fat, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 cups scalded milk (cooled), 1 lb. all purpose flour, 1 t. salt.

Miss Schultz pointed out that keeping the right temperature is most important. The milk is scalded at the start, cooled to lukewarm before the yeast is added. The right temperature for rising of the dough is 90 degrees and the best place is in the stove oven with a bowl of hot water which will provide moisture. Also, the least handling of the dough is important with no added flour after the first rising.
