Germans Land 40,000 Men In Finland

COPENHAGEN, Aug. 8.—A German army of 40,000 landed in Finland today and are marching toward Helsingore the capital.

It undoubtedly has St. Petersburg for its objective.

War Not Declared Between Austria-Hungary and England

(BY UNITED PRESS)

ROME, Aug. 8.—Italian officials today make the sensational claim that Austria declined to aid Germany against England because war has not been declared between Austria and England

The German cruisers Goeben and Breslau were expelled from Messira yesterday. They dispatched a wireless to the Austrian fleet to come to their assistance, but, it is stated here, Austran naval authorities refused.

The German's imminent danger now is their capture or destruction at the hands of the combined French and English fleets.

Belgian Commander Refuses to Grant Armistice to Germany

BRUSSELS, Aug. 8.—General Lenon, commanding Liege, has refused to grant the German request for an armistice. Fighting has been continued.

Taking the offensive and moving out from the port, a Belgian command annihilated a German cavalry division which had crossed the River Weser.

Seven German regiments have surrendered.

Belgian losses are estimated at 7,000.

Railways over which the German advance was pinned have been cut.

Enraged when the armistice was refused, General Von Emmich ordered the entire German army against Liege.

A terrible slaughter ensued on both sides. The Belgian fire was effective.

22,000 English Soldiers Land to Help Fight German Forces

PARIS, Aug. 8.—A fleet of British transports conveyed by a squadron today landed 22,000 crack regulars at Oslind, Polais and Dunkirk.

The English fighters are going to the aid of the Belgians. As they arrived on Belgian territory, the wildest enthusiasm reigned throughout the province.

The French, English and Belgian forces will now fight shoulder to shoulder against Germany.

A hundred thousand British will probably be landed on the coast of Belgium to help fight Germany.

No Austrians on Soil Of Servia is Report

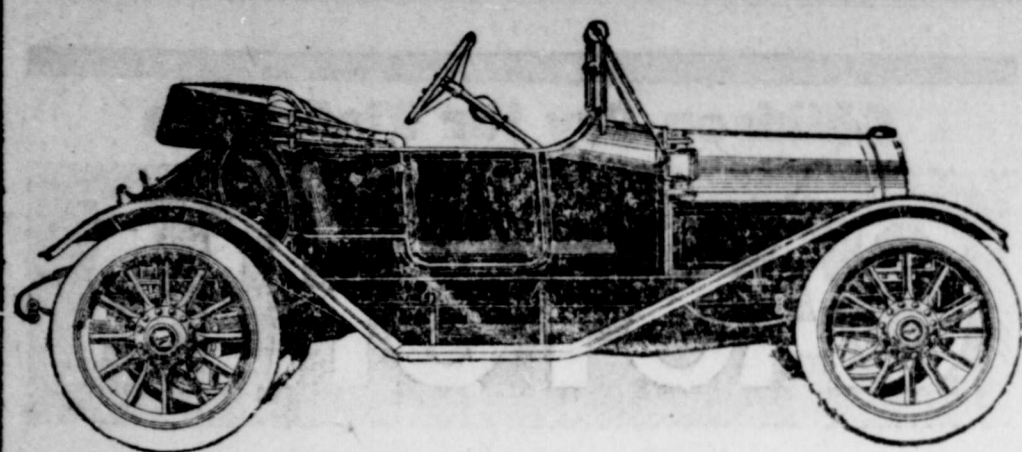

to get away from the bigots who rule nearly absolute in Europe. Rather than to undergo the hardships of living under a ruler, although his power was limited by a constitution, Mr. Miller's father moved to America where he with his family might enjoy the freedom which has caused many of the old world to change their places of abode.

"The killing of Archduke Ferdinand was only a spark in the great war which is being waged in Europe," said Mr. Miller. "The thing has been ready for years. The assassination is used today as only a pretext of the nations involved in war. The whole matter is the outcome of the strife which has existed between nations, the desire of one emperor to covet more territory. It is Teuton against Slav, each desiring to rule absolute over a large territory. The countries as England and France have been brought into the war by necessity. They are not the primary forces. France has jumped in against Germany has cause of an enemy which has existed since the Kaiser took two provinces belonging to France in 1870."

Being a son of the Fatherland, Mr. Miller is watching with the closest attention the news which is coming from the French, Belgian and English cities, concerning the terrible fight now in progress at Liege. He believes that Germany

will have another side to report soon.
