A graduate of Drake University, Iowa, the 27-year-old captain was a section leader for Class 80-04 throughout its training. The other section leader, Capt. Betty Terry Maples, received the Leadership Award for Section-one.

The Flying Training Award went to a Belgium student, 2nd Lt. Chris Christiaens. Lieutenant Christiaens also picked up an Outstanding Graduate Letter as did countryman 2nd Lt. Theiry Cloeckert and Norwegian 2nd Lt. Petter Sem-Henrickson.

Receiving the Outstanding Second Lieutenant Award for Section-two was 2nd Lt. John R. Landis, who also earned an Outstanding Graduate Letter.

Second Lt. Felix R. Gray netted the Academic Training Award while the Citizenship Award went to 2nd Lt. Richard K. Dockery. The Outstanding Second Lieutenant Award for Section-one went to 2nd Lt. Mark J. Harpole.

Turkey vital link in defense plan

"From the northern tier of the Middle East — stretching from Turkey east to Afghanistan — all of the countries are vulnerable and within easy reach of Soviet ground and tactical forces." That's what Lt. Gen. Richard L. Lawson, director for plans and policy for the Joint Chiefs of Staff, told a congressional committee recently.

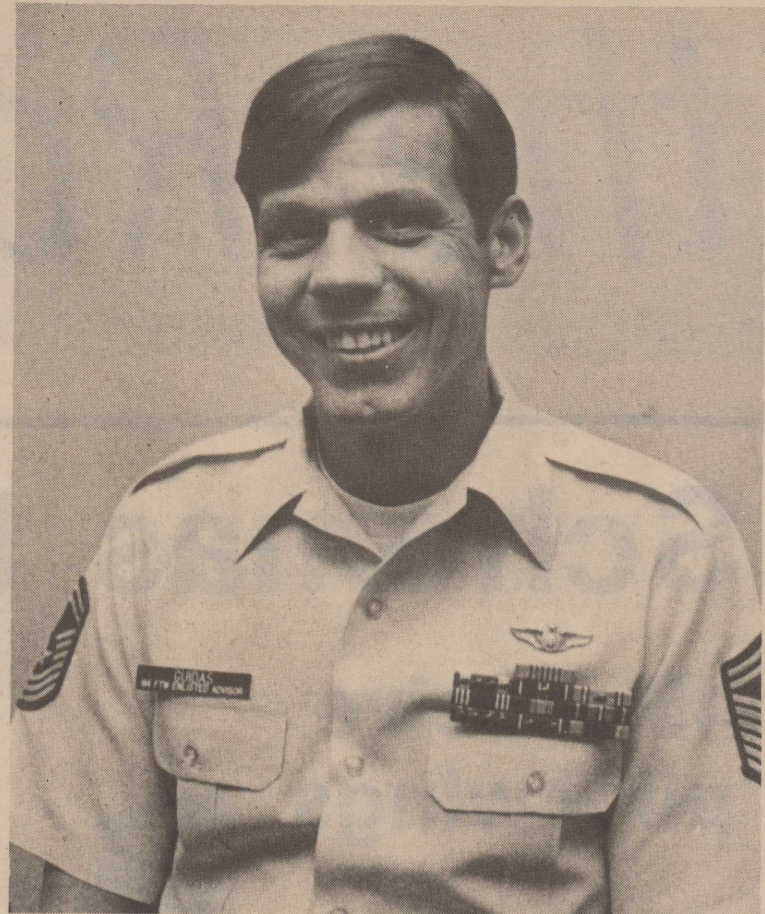
He added that "Soviet geographical advantage in this region has been heightened in recent years by declining presence and influence of the United States and our allies in the area."

One very important U.S. ally in that area is Turkey. Several thousand U.S. military personnel and their families are stationed in Turkey. They serve at several communications/electronics facilities, a major air base at Incirlik near Adana, and a number of smaller facilities scattered throughout the country. Two North Atlantic Treaty organization headquarters near Izmir also have sizable U.S. contingents.

Turkey is in a vital location. It lies partly in Europe and partly in Asia, sharing common borders with Greece and Bulgaria on the northwest, the U.S.S.R. and Iran on the east, and Iraq and Syria on the south. The Bosphorus, the Sea of Marmara, and the Dardanelles, known collectively as the Turkish Straits, connect the Black and the Mediterranean Seas.

In terms of politics, Turkey is almost evenly divided between those who are conservative and frequently traditional in outlook and those who seek more rapid implementation of the Westernizing philosophy. This basic conflict underlies the party structure. It helps explain the political difficulties that Turkey has experienced since 1950.

A member of NATO, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, and the Council of Europe, this ally of the United States continues to regard NATO as the keystone of its security. (AFNS feature)

Avoid partisan politics

When it comes to politics, some people do more than just vote. If you plan to do more, it is important to follow the guidelines of Air Force Regulation 110-2 concerning involvement in politics.

You are encouraged to register and vote.

You may express your personal opinion on political candidates and issues, but not as a representative of the Air Force.

You may join a political club and attend political rallies if not in uniform and while off duty.

Money may be contributed to a political party but not to a partisan political candidate, to another member of the

armed forces or to an employee of the federal government.

You may encourage others to vote, but you cannot use your authority to influence or interfere with the outcome of an election.

Writing letters to editors of newspapers expressing your personal views concerning public issues is fine. But the letter cannot promote a partisan political view.

Political bumper stickers are OK on an automobile. Large political signs, banners or posters on the top or side of the car are not.

If in doubt, check with the staff judge advocate.

Motorcycle accidents on rise in Air Force

Six Air Force people died in motorcycle accidents during January and February.

The four fatalities in February made it the "worst February in nine years," said Col. Leland Lukens, director of aerospace safety at the Air Force Inspection and Safety Center here.

As warm weather approaches and the price of fuel rises, even more people are expected to use motorcycles.

All motorcycle operators are encouraged to complete the Air Force Motorcycle Safety Education Course. Colonel Lukens pointed out that five of the six who died had not completed the course. Neither had 59 percent of the operators injured in motorcycle mishaps last year. (AFNS)

Aerospace specialist

Future in space says AF official

"A large part of our Air Force's future will be in space," says Maj. Gen. William R. Yost.

As director of space systems and command, control and communications, at Headquarters Air Force, General Yost is involved with Air Force space efforts.

He detailed present and future plans at a recent meeting of Air Force Association chapters in Dunedin, Fla.

Viable dimension

"Space has become a viable dimension of our world and especially of our national defense posture," he said. "Space systems are crucial to the expansion of our terrestrial force capabilities."

General Yost said that the use of space systems today has provided our military forces "improved, reliable communications, more accurate maps, more exact navigation aids, better and more extensive weather information, and the capability for more reliable, quicker warning of attack."

"So we are in space," he said, "because it makes military and economic sense to be there. We are in space to provide support services to our terrestrial force."

General Yost looks to the future with optimism. "I firmly believe that in the next two decades, the military use of space will not only have become commonplace, but, more significantly, will have gained the kind of acceptance we accord to airplanes today."

Possibilities staggering

The possibilities for the future are staggering, he said. He said one item of the future could be a true space plane. This would be a "reusable single-stage-to-orbit vehicle which can take off from runways, not launch pads, and fly on any azimuth, to any orbit and at any time. We are working on the technology that may eventually support this vehicle."

Total battle management would be made possible by space assets, General Yost said.

"With the Global Positioning System, we'll know where our forces are; with new surveillance systems we'll know where the enemy is; and with space communications we can direct our forces to the optimum targets."

"The knowledge we have gained thus far is only the beginning, and those with vision will look beyond today to the challenge of the future," he concluded.

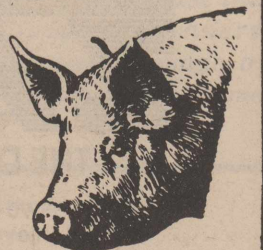

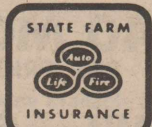

Air Force moves ahead on geothermal well plan

The Air Force has taken the first step in a project which could eventually mean a new energy source for Williams AFB, Ariz.

Air Training Command is currently selecting architect-engineer services to assist in drafting requests for technical proposals for a geothermal well at Williams. Also, negotiations with the Department of Energy for funding support of the first well are in progress.

Geothermal energy is a renewable energy source using super-heated water tapped from deep below the earth's crust.

The far reaching concept of the project is for a private firm to drill wells, construct a plant on Williams and sell power or chilled water back to the Air Force as a utility. Additionally, if an excess electrical power is generated, it may also be supplied to private customers in the adjacent Chandler area as well as to other Department of Defense facilities in Arizona.

Nearby wells

Interest in geothermal development at Williams arose from two nearby wells drilled in 1973 by Geothermal Kinetics Inc. The wells

reached a depth of 10,000 feet and found temperatures in excess of 300 degrees F. However, attempts to confirm the existence of a geothermal reservoir that could produce the required fluid volume were inconclusive.

A DOE study presented to Air Force officials last July showed a promising potential for developing geothermal energy at Williams and suggested that by drilling a well at one of two proposed sites on the base, and tapping heat from deep in the earth, air conditioning for the central base area could be provided.

Possible electric system

In addition, if a geothermal reservoir is found at the recommended drilling site with sufficient water flow and temperatures in excess of 350 degrees F it would be feasible to develop a geothermal electric system.

Officials estimate that the earliest possible starting date on the first well would be in the spring of 1981, after conducting an analysis to assess the impact on the local environment.

The Air Force will continually evaluate the project throughout its development. (ATCNS)

Inquiries mount

Editor's note: A recent rash of inquiries concerning the Civil Engineering service call system prompted this explanation of priorities by LCdr. Ronald E. Keene, chief of the operations branch. Commander Keene emphasized that the list of situations which justify an emergency job order is not complete and questions may be directed to the service call desk at Ext. 3647.

Emergency job orders are used to correct an emergency condition that is detrimental to the mission or reduces operational effectiveness. They include providing security to areas subject to compromise, eliminating hazards to

health or protecting high value property and equipment.

An emergency includes, but is not limited to, the failure of any utility, fire protection, environmental control, or security alarm system. Stopped-up sewers and fire hazards are also handled on an emergency basis.

Regulations establish that routine job orders should be completed within 30 days, urgent job orders within five days and emergency job orders within 48 hours.

In the event that an emergency job order has not been remedied within 24 hours, customers may call Commander Keene at Ext. 3512 for assistance.

Carter proclaims Earth Day

President Carter has proclaimed April 22 Earth Day, an occasion on which to celebrate "a decade of progress towards protection and enhancement of the world's environment."

It was only 10 years ago that the U.S. observed the first Earth Day, acknowledging its awareness of the terrible, possibly fatal, damage being inflicted on the environment.

The late awakening was explainable, in a sense. During two-and-a-half centuries of headlong growth America had taken its bountiful resources for granted, using (and abusing) them as if they were indestructible and infinite. Then people suddenly realized that they weren't.

The Ogallala Aquifer, which underlies the Lubbock and Reese area, is quickly being

depleted, largely because of great amount of irrigation that is necessary to grow crops in the area. However, Reese has found a way to conserve water for domestic use by maintaining a continuing passive program of conservation by example.

Water from the sewage pond and from the industrial waste pond is used to irrigate the golf course. This is a process which conserves primary drinking water and indicates Reese's awareness of the problems incurred in the area.

While the actual amount of water conserved in this manner is minor compared to the amount consumed throughout the area, every gallon reused extends the life of the aquifer by that amount.

Water is not the only form of pollution that Reese stages an

ongoing battle against. A new jet engine test cell was built and put into operation in 1978. This system uses acoustical baffles to deaden the sound of the engines during run-ups. In addition, the base recently changed training flight tracks to compensate for shifts in the population densities of nearby communities.

Furthermore, Reese has an ongoing program of pesticide control. By using sanitary measures such as draining playa lakes and carefully controlling food and waste disposal, the use of insecticides that are potentially harmful to humans is greatly reduced.

People at Reese and around the nation need to be aware of their duty to protect the environment, so each April 22 they take

time out to pledge again to each other that they will continue to do everything possible to halt the man-made pollution that could destroy them — to purify the air they breathe and make the waters of their land sweet again.

Actually, they have no choice. Put very simply, it's a matter of survival — not only of today's adults, but that of our children and their children's children, as well.

If people all work hard enough at it — not just on Earth Day, but year-round — they can do much to restore that beautiful America of which the 19th century poet sang, the majestic land of "amber waves of grain, (and) purple mountain majesties above the fruited plain . . ."

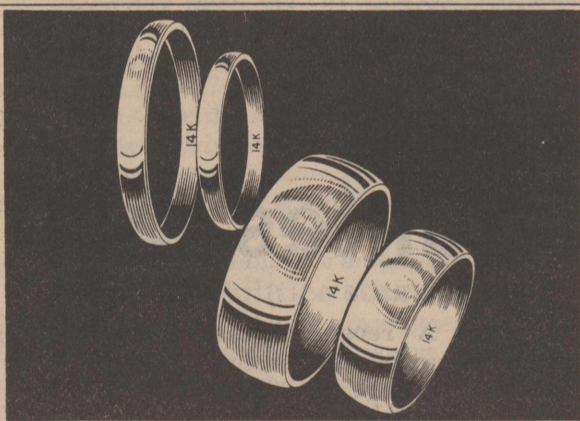

Retirees remain active

Many are those who have departed a base for the last time as an active member and returned to civilian life as U.S. Air Force retired.

Some have left and never looked back, having no desire to stay in touch; but, many have retired feeling that a big part of their life was missing. Since September 1978, and unofficially even before then, the Air Force has had a program to increase retirement involvement with the active force.

Established by regulation as a Retiree Involvement Program, it quickly gained acceptance and in 18 months has grown to the point that the Air Force now has 104 retired affairs offices at bases in the United States and overseas.

At Reese, retirees are offered an open invitation to a luncheon held on the second Thursday of each month. The luncheons will feature a buffet line and a guest speaker covering such topics as veterans' benefits, congressional legislation affecting the military and its retirees and other subjects of interest.

According to TSgt. Paul E. McIntire, Personal Affairs, a stepped up program is now in the planning stages. Details of the new program have yet to be announced.

In Air Training Command, the program is doing well with 12 of the command's 14 bases having active retiree affairs offices, according to SMSgt. Paul E. Quinlin, NCOIC, Personal Affairs Division, ATC Headquarters. "We've got 62 military people, 384 retired members and 14 widows of deceased Air Force personnel actively working with the program," he said.

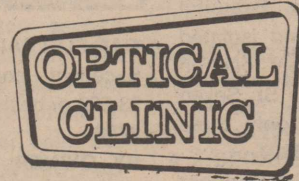
Sturon ended the campaign unbeaten with a 13-0 record.

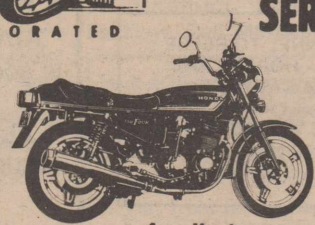

Blake tops card for boxing match

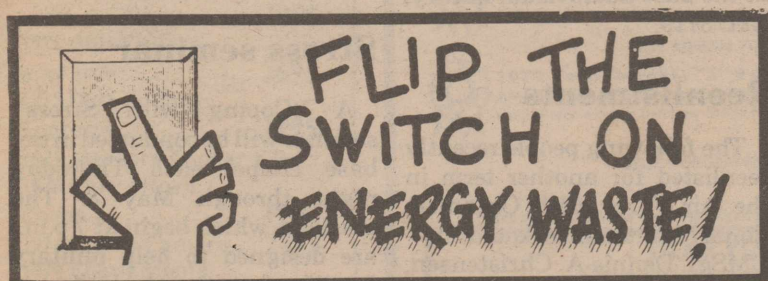

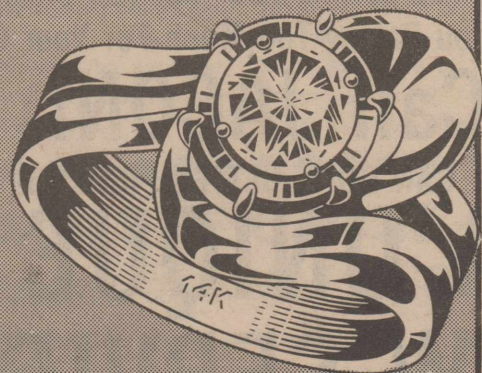
