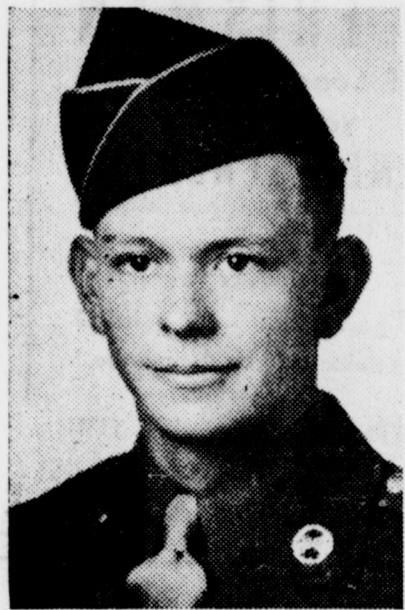


Selke Boys Are Serving With Army

FIRST DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY IS SATURDAY; VERY FEW CONTESTED OFFICES ARE ON BALLOT

Texans, and especially Hale county voters, will have fewer names to scratch on the first democratic primary election ballot this year than in many years. Interest is lacking all over the state as many state and district offices have unopposed candidates. Hale county precinct 3 voters will have only two local races to pick their choice in; the precinct 3 commissioner's race, left open by retiring L. M. Rankin, for Jim Nunn, Lee Thomas and J. L. Mann to vie for; and the county clerk's race, with incumbent Inez Ott challenged by Mrs. Fannie Norman.

Approximately 5,000 Hale county residents will be eligible to vote in the Democratic primary Saturday. There are 4,396 poll taxes and exemptions in Hale county, and an undetermined number of eligibles of over-age voters. Early this week 75 absentee ballots had already been cast for the primary, Miss Inez Ott, county clerk, said.

Presiding judges in voting boxes in the south and central Hale county area are: Happy Union, C. W. Buchanan; Cotton Center, Peyton Barington; Lakeview, T. E. Lutrick; Sunshine, J. Frank Davis; Hooper, E. C. Sheling; Abernathy, M. Z. Holland; Hale Center, W. G. Sears. The precinct convention is to be held Saturday for the election of delegates to the county convention which meets July 29 in Plainview.

Work Is Started On Resurfacing Highway

Austin Road Co. of Dallas, contractor for re-surfacing of U. S. Highway 87 between Abernathy and Hale Center, is setting up machinery in Abernathy to start work on the 16-mile project. The new black-top coating will go over the original concrete pavement and the shoulders which were added a few years ago. Re-surfacing will begin at the Hale-Lubbock county line in south Abernathy and extend to Hale Center, covering the highway at an average width of about 26 feet. The new toping will cover a width of 58 feet on part of the highway through Abernathy, according to a report by R. W. Ferrell, who is superintendent of the local project for Austin Road Co. Ferrell said about two months of work will be required to complete the job, and that the machinery would be re-set at Hale Center when work passes the half-way mark from Abernathy.

Memorial Service Set Sunday For Martin Vernon Collier

Abernathy will pay tribute to the memory of Pfc. Martin V. Collier in a memorial service at First Methodist church Sunday afternoon, starting at 4 o'clock. He was killed by a German sniper on May 12 while serving with an infantry regiment in Italy. Martin was the son of Joe B. Collier, who moved from here to Friona a few months ago.

A detailed program for the memorial service has not been announced but Rev. Frank Beauchamp, Methodist pastor, said tentative plans are as follows: brief talks by Martin's Sunday school superintendent here, his Sunday school teacher, a World War I veteran (who will also represent Martin's church's official board), a community representative, a representative of all local churches, address by an army chaplain, special music, special arrangement of the flags, and probably a guard of honor.

The following letter and obituary are from the Friona newspaper: May 18, 1944

Mr. Joe B. Collier, Abernathy, Texas.

Dear Mr. Collier:

Doubtless you have already received word from the War Department concerning your son, Martin, who gave his life in the service of his country. As his regimental Chaplain I have talked with him on many occasions. I desire, therefore, to express my sympathy to you for your great loss — and ours, also, for he proved himself a good soldier deserving the flag we all love. At a time such as this words barely express our feelings, nor do they compensate in a time of sadness and bereavement. Nevertheless, I believe you will find comfort in the knowledge that your son received the honors of a military funeral, conducted with full religious service in accordance with the Protestant faith. His body rests in a beautiful, well-cared for American cemetery on foreign soil. American soldiers guard the grounds and above him floats the flag he so faithfully served.

Killed On Italian Battle Front

Pfc. Martin Vernon Collier was born at Ringling, Okla., May 13, 1911, and departed this life on May 12, 1944, while in the line of duty, some where in Italy, one day before his 33rd birthday. Pfc. Collier finished high school at Granite, Okla., in 1929, and attended Chillicothe Business college, at Chillicothe, Mo., in 1930. He moved to Abernathy with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe B. Collier, in December, 1930.

Before entering the service, Pfc. Collier was engaged in farming near Abernathy with his father. He was called into the service in May, 1942, taking his basic training at Camp Shelby, Miss., and received additional training in Louisiana, California, and at Camp Dix, N. J. He sailed for overseas duty in December last year, and landed in North Africa Jan. 7. He had been in Italy about six weeks at the time of his death.

He was an active member of the Methodist church at Abernathy until entering the service of his country, and a gold star will be placed on the church's flag in his memory. He was preceded in death by his mother, who died on June 2, 1938. Pfc. Collier is survived by his father, Joe B. Collier of Friona, and two sisters, Mrs. Carl Hudgins, Abernathy, and Mrs. J. H. Boyle, Granite, Okla., and a large circle of close relatives and friends.

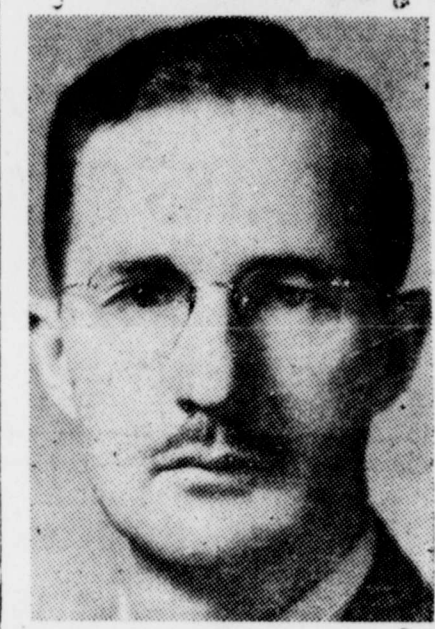

Major Chapman Is With AAF in Italy



FIFTEENTH AAF IN ITALY —
Major Wilson A. Chapman, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. V. Chapman of Quitaque, formerly of Abernathy, has only a few miles more to go to have completely encircled the globe in his assignments with the USAAF, his last assignment bringing him to one of the oldest and scrappiest fighter groups in Italy.

On graduation from Texas Tech, Major Chapman was employed as a petroleum engineer with the Shasta Oil company in Midland, Tex., but, foreseeing the imminence of the need of a huge air corps, he soon applied for and began pilot training in the USAAF.

Commissioned in March of 1941, Major Chapman, then a lieutenant, left for the South Pacific where he distinguished himself in many sorties against the Japs. One highlight of his career there was a day he led his flight of four planes against an overpowering number of Jap Zeros and Mitsubishi bombers, of which he personally destroyed one fighter and probably destroyed a bomber. For his excellent and aggressive action in that attack he was awarded the Silver Star.

Before he returned to the United States to instruct others in fighting with the P-38, Major Chapman added two more Zeros to his score.

Now with a famous P-51 Mustang fighter group commanded by Lt. Col. Robt. Nivens of Columbus, O., Major Chapman, as group operations officer, has sent his pilots out to add more than 40 German planes to the group's already large total in the first 15 missions since the major's assignment.

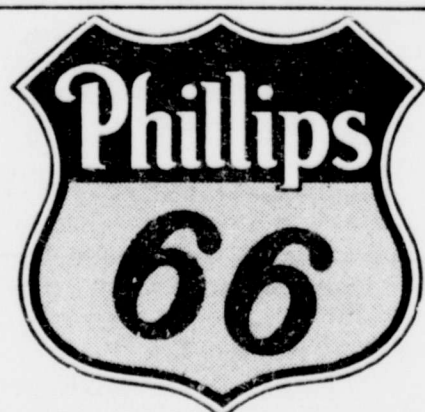

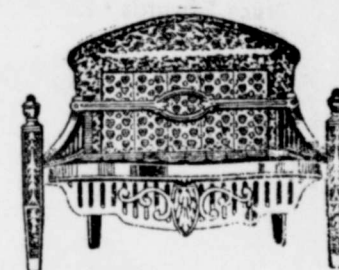

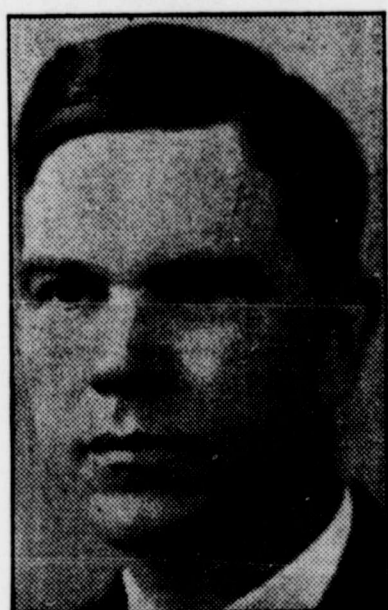
