Three stockmen from West and Central Texas will be judges when Mitchell County 4-H and FFA youths exhibit their animals here New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

The exhibitors will be competing for approximately \$2,000 in awards and selecting the winners will be these three experienced judges:

For swine - Jim Allison, swine herdsman at Texas Technological University in Lubbock.

For sheep - Sid Long, vocational agriculture teacher at Gail.

For beef - Payton Scott, stockman at Rising Star.

Classifying sheep for the a-

rena judging will be Richard Smith.

Approximately 190 animals are expected to go before the judges in 1972 edition of the Mitchell County 4-H and FFA Stock Show.

Planning, organizing and supervising the show will be a group of officials and superintendents from the county's 4-H & FFA Livestock Show Association.

At the helm of the association and its show are Mickey Cooper, the president; Harry Dockrey, vice president; and J.D. Hill Jr., secretary.

In the steer division Leon Light will be superintendent with Kenneth Merket of Lorraine assistant superintendent.

Charles Northcut will be su-

perintendent of the sheep division with Harry Dockrey as the assistant.

Superintendent for the swine show will be Bob McClure, R. B. Golden will be the assistant superintendent.

Don Stewart will serve as superintendent of weights and tags.

Preparing the stock show building and grounds--which this year will include a new wash rack added to the south side of the building--will be County Commissioners Marcus Vest, Drue Cawthron, Paul Hunter and Moody Richardson.

County Judge Bill F. Carter

will be the gent who presents awards as winners are selected by the judges.

Football Budget Balances

Colorado High and Junior High 1971 football season balanced the books financially during the '71 season except for the small amount of \$24.34.

That's the final figures compiled by Supt. Lloyd McKee after checking game receipts and budget estimates.

Although game receipts fell short of expectations--the actual money paid into the budget was \$12,192.56 compared to \$13,950 estimated for income--the football budget was only \$24.34 in the red.

That means budget allocations were held in check to make up for the dip in estimated income.

Boy, 18, Held For Carload Haul

An 18-year-old Colorado City youth is accused taking a load of furnishings from a Roby residence.

Billy George Dering Jr. was taken into custody here Sunday.

Fisher County officers moved him to Roby Monday to face burglary charges there.

Sheriff Lewis Claxton and his deputies report that a truckload of 21 separate items of furnishings were carried away from the Fisher County house.

In the load, they say, were a truck, a television set, 2 single beds each with box springs, a lamp table, an electric fan, an electric organ plus a seat for the organ.

That is not half the load, according to officers. Among the rest of the stolen loot were a large lamp, 2 small lamps, 2 large pillows, two mattresses, one cedar chest, an electric blanket, controls for an electric blanket, one couch and one divan, plus another control unit for an electric blanket.

Sheriff officers here arrested Dering, who is 5 feet 2

and 130 pounds, after report of a station wagon being seen in the vicinity of the burglarized house Saturday.

The unoccupied house was broken into Saturday night. An earlier burglary also is believed to have taken place at the same location.

When a description of the reported car was received here, Dering was taken into custody.

The furnishings have been recovered and were moved from Colorado City to Roby Monday.

Christmas Program For Self Culture

Home of Mrs. L. B. Elliott last Friday afternoon was setting of a Christmas meeting for members of Self Culture Study Club.

Mrs. E. L. Tiller related the story leading up to the birth of Christ as written in Luke 2.

In discussing Christmas Mrs. Lester Watson described a German Jul ceremony. She reported that in the fourth century the Christian Church advanced its holiday celebration of the birth of Christ from Jan. 6 to Dec. 25 to superimpose its own significance on the pagan festival.

"The Christmas season in Germany starts with Advent," the speaker continued, "It includes the four weeks immediately preceding Dec. 25 and every home has its special Advent interlaced with red ribbons. It holds four candles; one of which is lighted each Sunday prior to Christmas Day."

She explained that in the Bavarian Mountains toward midnight on Christmas Eve, peasants descend through the deep snow from their lofty farms, each with a torch or lantern to guide his path.

"This makes a fantastic pattern as these many tiny lights gradually converge on a village church," Mrs. Watson said.

St. Nicholas' Day for the German children is Dec. 6, Self Culture members were told. The children who have been good are rewarded with gifts; this is the origin of Santa Claus.

She carried a cascading bouquet of spider chrysanthemums, English ivy and cymbidium orchids.

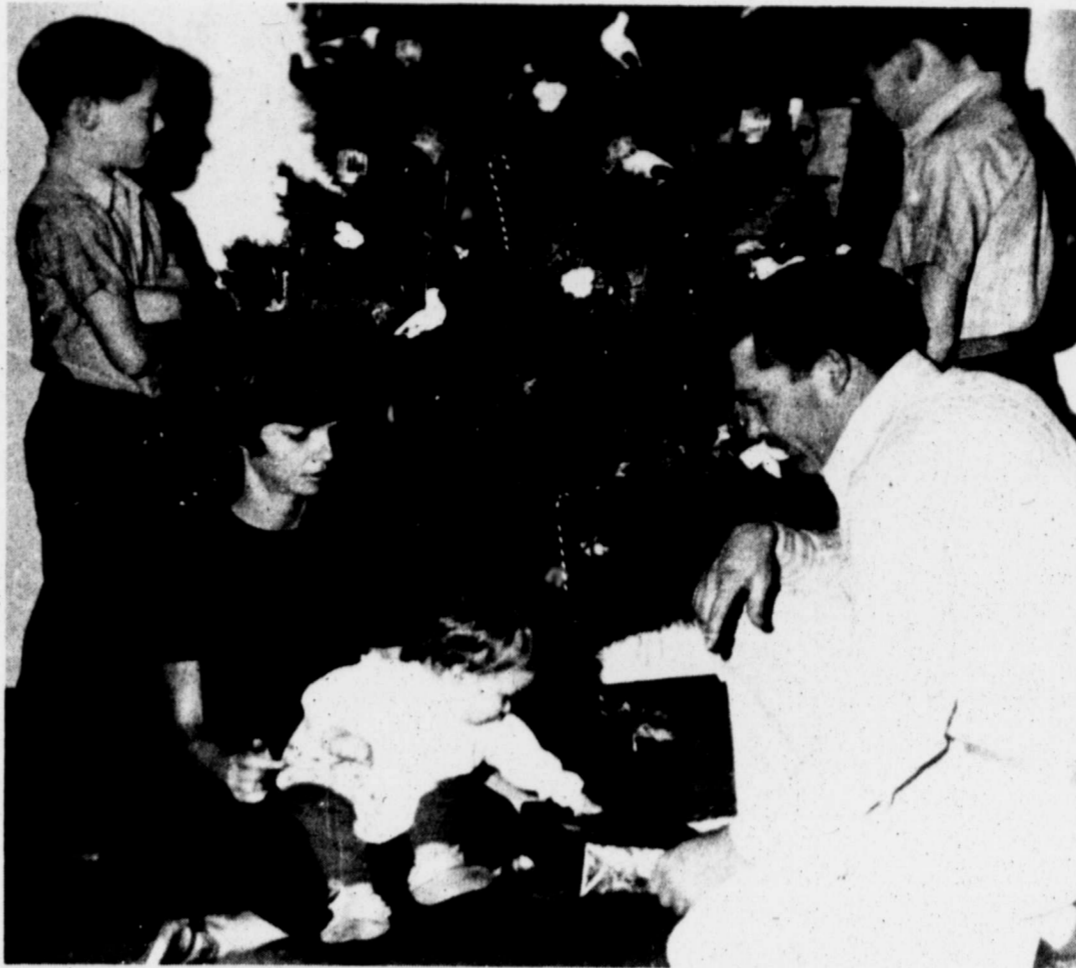
Miss Sandi Adair, bride's sister, and Donald Wayne Horton, brother of the bridegroom, were honor attendants.

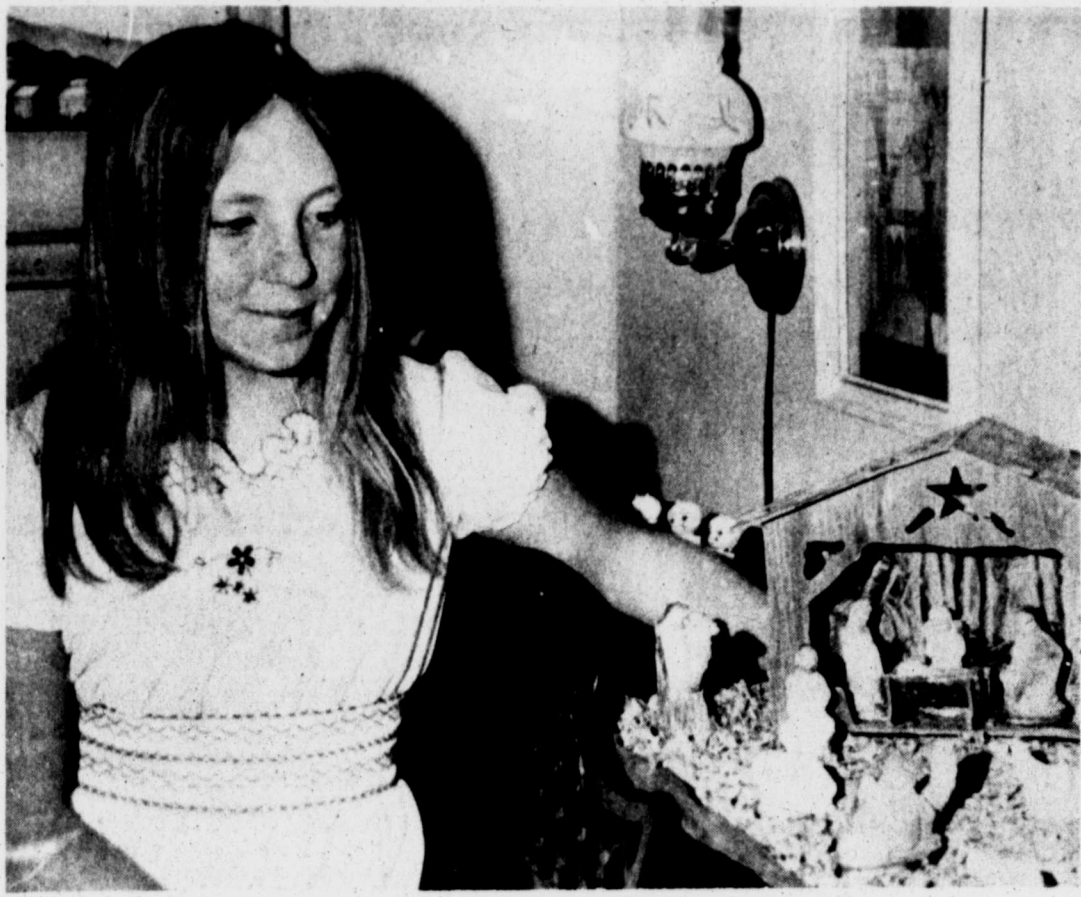
