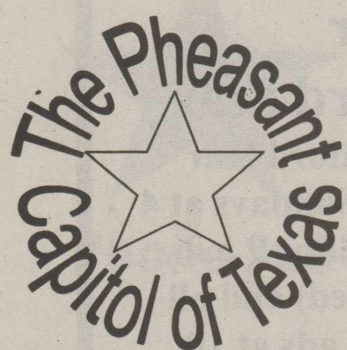

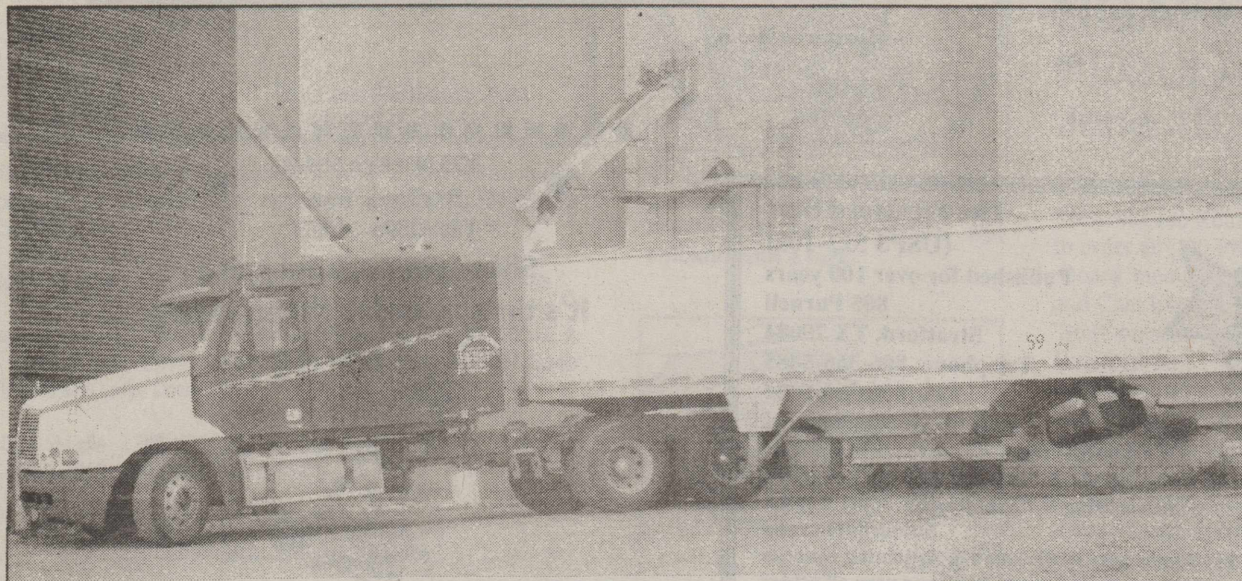

Stratford Star honored

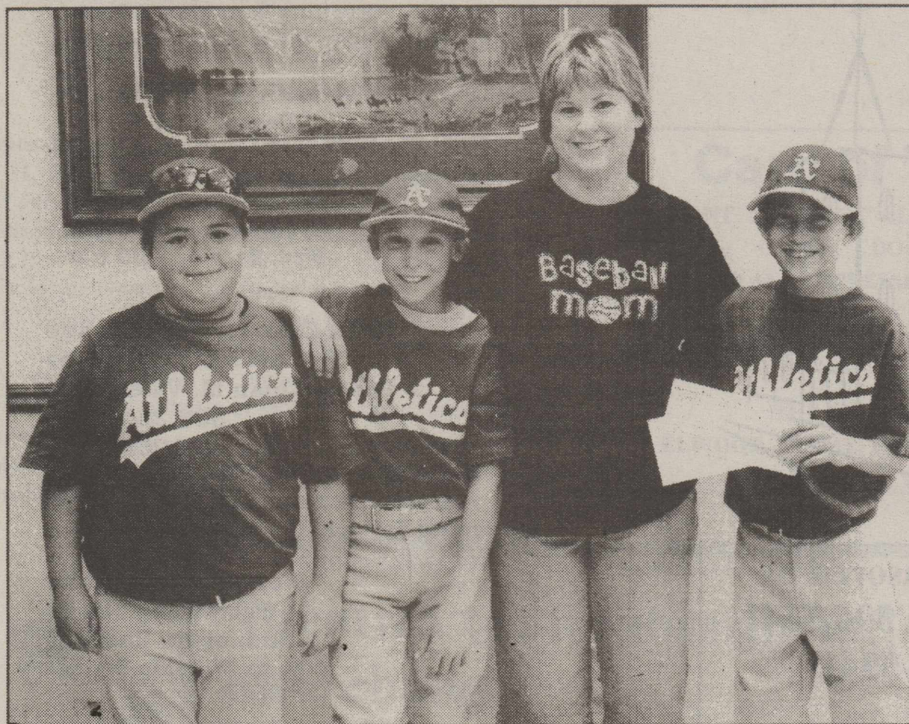
(Austin) – Recently the Stratford ISD Board of Trustees nominated Marty Robertson and Shari Hudson of the Stratford Star to the 2012 Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) Media Honor Roll. The state-wide Media Honor Roll programs recognized reporters statewide for fair and balanced reporting of news about public schools. Media representatives from more than 470 Texas newspapers, radio, and television stations, and online publications were honored by their local school districts.

“We are fortunate in our community to have a newspaper, such as the Stratford Star, that is willing to publicize the many accomplishments of our students and staff,” said SISD Superintendent Jerry Birdsong. “Not all communities are blessed to have folks dedicated to ensuring that the local school district is recognized for its achievements. TASB is a nonprofit organization established in 1949 to serve local Texas school districts. School board members are the largest group of publicly elected officials in the state. The districts they represent serve more than 4.9 million public school students.

STRATFORD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSEES REGULAR SESSION June 18, 2012

The Stratford ISD board of trustees met in regular session on Monday, June 18, 2012. President Joe Reinart established a quorum of members present and called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Board members present: Joe Reinart, DeWain Trayler, Michelle Lutes, Tres Hess, and Chet Everett.

Staff present: Clint Seward, Misti McBryde, Paul Uttley, Lynette Kautz and Dinah Horsford.

Mr. Seward led the invocation.

Joe Reinart read thank you notes from Kaci McBryde and Linda Haynes for their service awards and Brenda Brownlee for the retirement reception.

Mr. Birdsong gave the superintendent report. He reported a final district enrollment of 592. He reported that several trees behind the Mary Allen Elementary had to be cut down because of the drought last year. He is getting bids for fencing for that area. He gave the board his vacation dates. He will attend the IMAT training in Wichita Falls next week.

Lynette Kautz gave the business managers report. Monthly expenditures are at 62.73%, revenue 93.24%, and tax collections are at 98.04%. Transportation cost for the month for the district was \$1.29. She gave the quarterly investment report. SEE ATTACHMENT #1.

Mrs. McBryde gave the elementary report. She reported on preliminary raw data scores that she has received from the STAAR test. About 50 K-4th grade students are currently attending summer school. The breakfast/lunch program has had about 50-90 students participating in it. This is a federally funded summer program and allows any child under the age of 18 to eat breakfast and lunch each day free of charge. She reported a final enrollment for the MAE campus of 265.

Mr. Seward gave the junior high report. His final campus enrollment was 154. He reported on the TEPSA conference he attended in Austin. There are about 22 junior high students attending summer school. He talked to the board about the possibility of adding an enrichment period to his campus schedule for next year. He reviewed the raw data score information he receive on the STAAR test.

Dr. Uttley gave the high school report. He gave the monthly recognition. It was as follows: Ellie Daniels received a fifth place medal in the UIL State Feature Writing competition in Austin on May 21st. Derek Vasquez received a Division 1 Rating in Austin on May 26th. He was also named Outstanding Soloist. Two stories from the Elk Express that were sent to the Amarillo Globe News were made into feature stories in May. The articles were written by Mary Ann Spurlock and David Acosta. He reported that Casey Lantelme played in the ASCO All Star football game in Lubbock and Justin Mungia played in the Greenbelt Bowl. The senior trip was a big success. He complimented the junior class, their sponsors and parents on the prom. He reported on TAKS and EOC test results. He reviewed with the board the plan of action the high school will take next year to improve on test scores. He reported a campus enrollment of 173.

Chet Everett made the motion and Tres Hess seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

A public hearing was held on the NCLB application.

The board took a short recess at 7:45 PM.

Mr. Birdsong passed out information on busses for sale through MCI. The bidding process has begun. It must run for 2 weeks. Tres Hess made the motion and Michelle Lutes seconded to authorize the superintendent to administer the necessary paperwork on the board's behalf to acquire/purchase a new activity bus. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Birdsong presented the TASB Media Honor Roll. Chet Everett made the motion and Tres Hess seconded to recognize Marty Robertson, Shari Hudson and the Stratford Star as a member in good standing of the statewide TASB 2012 Media Honor Roll. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Birdsong presented the Chapter 41 agreement. As a chapter 41 school, we are compelled by law to enter an agreement with the state for the purchase of attendance credits. Michelle Lutes made the motion and DeWain Trayler seconded to do option 3 which is to purchase attendance credits from the state. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion was held on the proposed tax rate. DeWain Trayler made the motion and Tres Hess seconded to adopt a proposed M & O tax rate of \$1.17 and I & S tax rate of \$0.055129 based on the certified estimate of taxable property in the District, and that we authorize the superintendent to take any and all action necessary to ensure that the appropriate truth in taxation notices are filed and hearings held as a result of our adoption of this proposed tax rate. Motion carried 5-0.

Discussion was held on the Tax Ratification Election timeline.

No bids have been received for the old bus barns.

Joe Reinart read a letter of resignation from Gerry Foos. Chet Everett made the motion and Michelle Lutes seconded to accept the resignation with regrets. Motion carried 5-0.

Mrs. McBryde presented Jennifer Harris for employment. Tres Hess made the motion and Michelle Lutes seconded to approve employment of Jennifer Harris subject to assignment. Motion carried 5-0.

DeWain Trayler made the motion and Chet Everett seconded to authorize the superintendent to execute professional contracts on the board's behalf prior to the July board meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 8:39 PM.
