Everette Heller Wins Guessing Contest

Temperatures dropped this week with the invasion of gray, moisture-laden skies. According to the government rain gauge at Farmers Grain and local weatherman, Aubrey Myers, a total of 1.83 inches of moisture has been recorded for the month through Sept. 28.

Myers reports 9.04 inches for the year, as of Aug. 30.

Earliest freeze recorded in the area was Oct. 7, 1952; latest first freeze was Nov. 22, 1934.

Average earliest date for 32 degrees or below is Nov. 3.

VOTER REGISTRATION

In order to vote in the November 2, General Election you must have your voter registration up-dated. It must be a blue card and have an expiration date of February 28, 1978. Last date to up-date is October 1, 1976.

If you have moved you will need to transfer to your new address by October 1, 1976.

If you are 18 years of age or will be by the November General Election, register now so that you will be a registered voter 30 days prior to the election.

If you qualified in the primaries, you will not need to re-register.

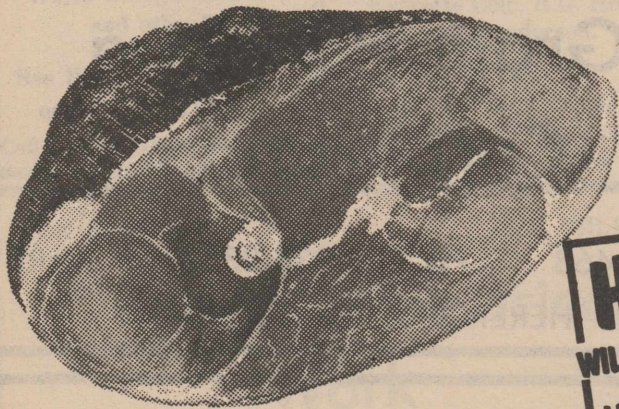
