Mrs. Sherrell and three children Kenneth, and Penny reside in the one block north of the school house. Neighboring communities, fire trucks from Wheeler, and a fire truck from Allamore responded to help the fire department fight the fire. No cause has been determined for the fire at this time.

Anyone wishing to donate or consign equipment to the sale should contact Don King, County Extension Agent or any of the Vocational Agriculture teachers in the county; James Moffett, Mobeetie; H. C. Weatherly, Shamrock; Kenneth McCasland, Terry McCasland, Wheeler.

Commission charges on consigned items will be as follows: \$1 to \$50 - 25%, \$50 to \$1000 - 10%, over \$1000 - 5%, P. O. items - 12% of last bid. All donations are tax deductible.
The Show Barn is badly needed by the youth of Wheeler County. At present there is no place to have livestock shows and this has undoubtedly hurt the 4-H and FFA livestock programs.

Lyndon Loyds Purchase Daughtry's Ben Franklin

Mr. and Mrs. Lyndon Loyd have purchased and are operating Daughtry's Ben Franklin. The ownership of the business officially changed Monday, July 22. The merchandise was inventoried Friday, and Saturday afternoon and Loyd's Ben Franklin's opened for business Monday.

Federal Land Bank Raises Rates

Richard A. Sterling, Manager of the Federal Land Bank Association of Shamrock, announced today that the Federal Land Bank's billing rate on farm and ranch variable interest rate loans would be increased from 7 3/4% to 8 1/2% effective August 1, 1974. The billing rate on rural residence loans will be increased from 8 1/4% to 9% on the same date. The variable interest rate loan plan was introduced by the Houston Bank in July 1969 with a billing rate on loans outstanding to "float" with the variations in the money market.

In making this announcement, Mr. Sterling stated, "The Bank's decision to make this change was necessary because of the increased cost of bonds sold which had increased with every issue since the beginning of the year, with the most recent issue selling at an all time record high of 9.21% average effective rate. The Bank had delayed action in raising the billing rate in order to assess the duration of present high interest levels, and there is nothing in the present monetary situation to indicate any improvement in the immediate future."
The Federal Land Bank of Houston makes long-term real estate loans on farm and ranch land and rural residences throughout Texas and now has more than 913 million dollars in volume of loans outstanding. The local Association makes and services loans in Collingsworth and Wheeler Counties. Officers and directors of the Association are J. C. Emmert, President, Robert Terry, Vice-President, Tom R. Cunningham, Director, Woodrow Wood, Director, Fred Waters, Director and H.J. Finsterwald, Director.

A Queens Contest will be held in conjunction with the Rodeo. The judging will take place at 7:30 p.m. Friday, August 9, and the Queen will be crowned Saturday night, August 10 during the rodeo.

The Queen's Contest is open to Wheeler County girls from 9 through 18 years of age. Each girl should have a sponsor who will pay \$2.50 entry fee to cover the cost of the girls banner. The Queen and the first and second runner up will receive belt buckles. Judging will be based 75% on horsemanship and 25% on appearance. Horsemanship will be judged on a prescribed course to be completed by each contestant. Entries will close Monday, August 5. If you are eligible, find a sponsor and enter now.

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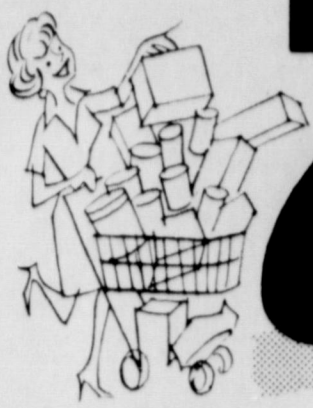

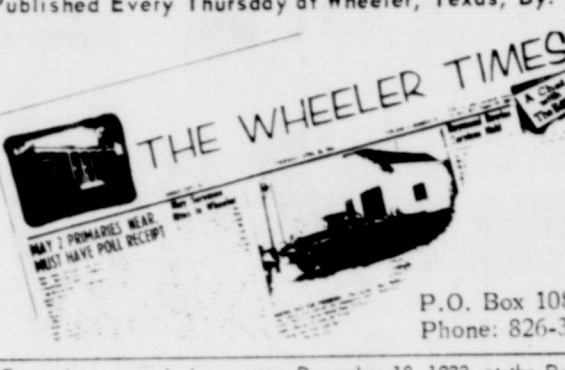

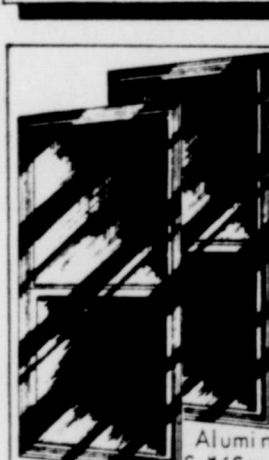
