TASB Elects Officers

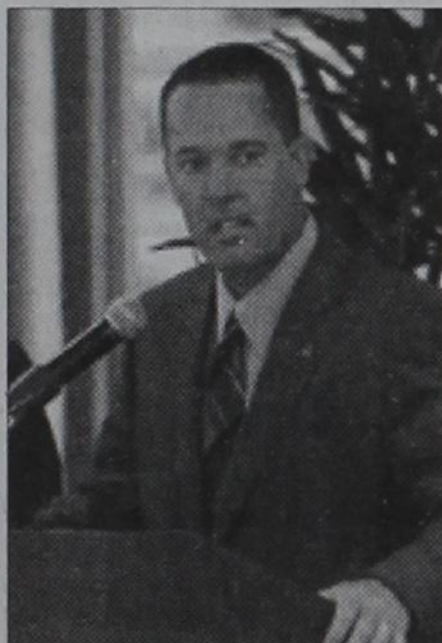
Bret Begert Named Vice President

Working Lands for Wildlife

NRCS and FWS Reach Historic Agreement to Extend Wildlife Conservation Efforts on Working Agricultural Lands

This agreement will help restore critical wildlife habitats and help Texas producers rest a little easier knowing their operations are protected long-term - a win for producers, for wildlife and for the American people.

TEMPLE, TX, Sept. 25, 2012 - Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Chief Dave White and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

Oklahoma Pursuit Ends in Wheeler Co.

According to the Beckham County Sheriff's Office in Oklahoma, 36-year-old Eugene Leroy Arnold Jr. of Sayre, OK, fled after a traffic stop early Sunday morning westbound on I-40. Oklahoma authorities followed the suspect, who was wanted for violating a protective order, into Texas, where the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office and a Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) trooper joined the pursuit east of Shamrock on I-40. Arnold then turned north on County Road 26 and crashed through a fence and drove into a field off of County Road W.

A Beckham County Sheriff's deputy (Oklahoma) made contact with Arnold and deployed his taser. According to the preliminary investigation, Arnold began fighting with the deputy and attempted to take the deputy's gun. During the struggle, Arnold sustained a gunshot wound and died. The Texas Rangers and the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office are continuing the investigation.

Farmers' Market Extends Season

The Wheeler County Farmers' Market will have an extended season this fall with no scheduled date for the last market. As long as the vendors have baked goods, canned goods, and fresh eggs, pecans, fruit, and vegetables they will continue to observe the announced schedule as always; Wednesdays from 4pm to 6 pm and Saturdays from 9 am to 11 am at the court house in Wheeler. The vendors can keep you posted on when they expect to be finished for this season. Our market has been healthy this summer with lots of loyal customers and vendors. Last Wednesday we had 5 vendors with lots of wares for sale including baked goods, canned goods, pumpkins, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, peppers, squash, cucumbers, melons, apples, and more. Just because school starts, or football season starts, or Labor day rolls around, it does not mean the market quits; so you loyal patrons of the market have added chances to take in the goodies to be had at our local farmers' market.

(FWS) Director Dan Ashe have announced an agreement that will provide long-term regulatory predictability for up to 30 years to Texas farmers, ranchers and forest landowners participating in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Working Lands for Wildlife (WLFW) initiative. Participants voluntarily implement proven conservation practices designed to protect wildlife habitat and species, such as the lesser-prairie chicken, on private lands.

"This agreement will change the way we manage at-risk species on private lands," said NRCS Texas State Conservationist Salvador Salinas. "It will provide landowners with a mechanism to keep working lands in production while complying with the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and will facilitate restoration of habitat for at-risk species. It also will help Texas farmers and ranchers rest a little easier knowing their operations are protected for the long term and that they are contributing to conserving vital natural resources."

"The American conservation movement has called for a new approach in species conserva-

To: The Clepper "Clan" September 7, 2012

Yesterday my daughter, Nyla, asked me what I wanted for my 90th birthday, stating that I am probably the oldest Clepper (Klepper) that ever lived. I looked

this up on the documents we have and it is true. I told Nyla I wanted no "party" or any other recognition. My age is due mostly to modern medicine and the Lord.

I was thinking that my birthday comes just before the election and do consider this election, not a milestone, but a turning point for America. Never have we seen such a difference in the direction our nation takes. For years we have been drifting down the path of bigger government. It started under FDR and reached full steam under LBJ. When you think or hear about breast cancer today, you may think about survivors you know, and the ones that did not make it through. Yes breast cancer still continues to attack the people we love and care for, but the survivor rates goes up every year. And it will continue to go up due to the fact that women and men are more aware and educated about this ever present disease.

Of course one of the best things we can do as women (and men) are self-exams and mammograms. Here are a few facts about breast cancer that we all need to pay attention to:

Breast cancer is second only to lung cancer in all reported cancer cases, accounting for a little more than 10 percent of cancer diagnoses around the world. Women are about 100 times more likely to develop the disease than men; however, the survival rates are about the same regardless of the patient's sex. About 570,000 people died from the disease in 2011. In Texas approximate 2600.

Breast Cancer Symptom Facts

One of the most common symptoms of breast cancer is an abnormal lump or mass in the breast. The most effective way to detect a lump is to perform a monthly self-exam. An annual mammogram, performed at a doctor's office, can detect lumps in their earliest stages, increasing the odds for a complete recovery.

Other common breast cancer symptoms include unexplainable changes in breast size, shape, or color. Patients and doctors often report that cancerous breasts remind them of oranges because they develop a reddish tint and bumpy texture. While this is a common symptom for some types of breast cancer, the absence of this symptom does not mean breast cancer isn't present, because many women with the disease never experience this sign.

Breast Cancer Treatment Facts

The most common treatment for breast cancer is surgery. Depending on the stage of the disease, surgeons might be able to remove the cancerous tumors while leaving the breast intact. In other cases, however, a mastectomy, though a more drastic surgery, is necessary in order to reduce the risk of recurrence. Many patients also receive medication and radiation treatments. Radiation greatly reduces the risk of a patient developing breast cancer again, but it sometimes causes side effects that are difficult to tolerate. Medication can also cause unwanted side effects in some women.

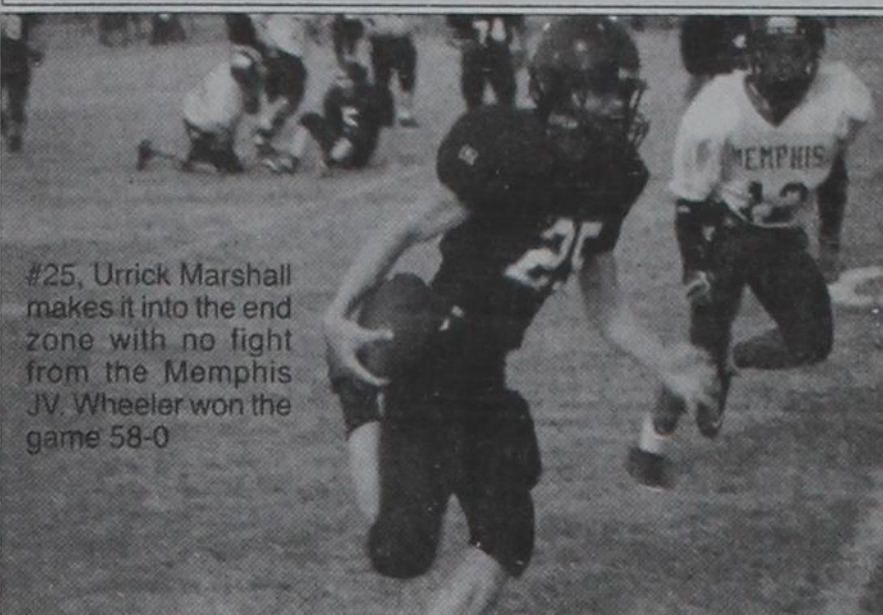
Breast Cancer Survival Facts - when treated with contemporary methods
Women and men diagnosed with stage 0 breast cancer have a 100 percent chance of survival after treatment. Those diagnosed with stage II have a 98 percent chance; virtually everyone survives this stage for at least five years. After stage II, survival rates drop quickly. Those diagnosed with stage IIA breast cancer have a 92 percent survival rate, while those with stage IIB face an 81 percent chance. Stage IIIA has a 67 percent survival rate, and with stage IIIB the rate drops to 54 percent. Those with stage IV breast cancer, the most advanced stage, face a mere 20 percent chance that they will live five years after the diagnosis. When diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer, the patient and treating physician have the difficult task of developing an aggressive treatment plan while maintaining a reasonable quality of life for the patient. Treatment plans at this stage are very personal and require much time and consultation between the patient, physicians, and family members. It is important to note that, while stage IV survival rates may be less than optimal, many individuals can and do survive stage IV breast cancer for a good number of years after their diagnosis, adding several quality years to their life.

These breast cancer survival facts underline how vital it is to do monthly self-exams, get a yearly mammogram, and see a doctor as soon as any symptoms arise.

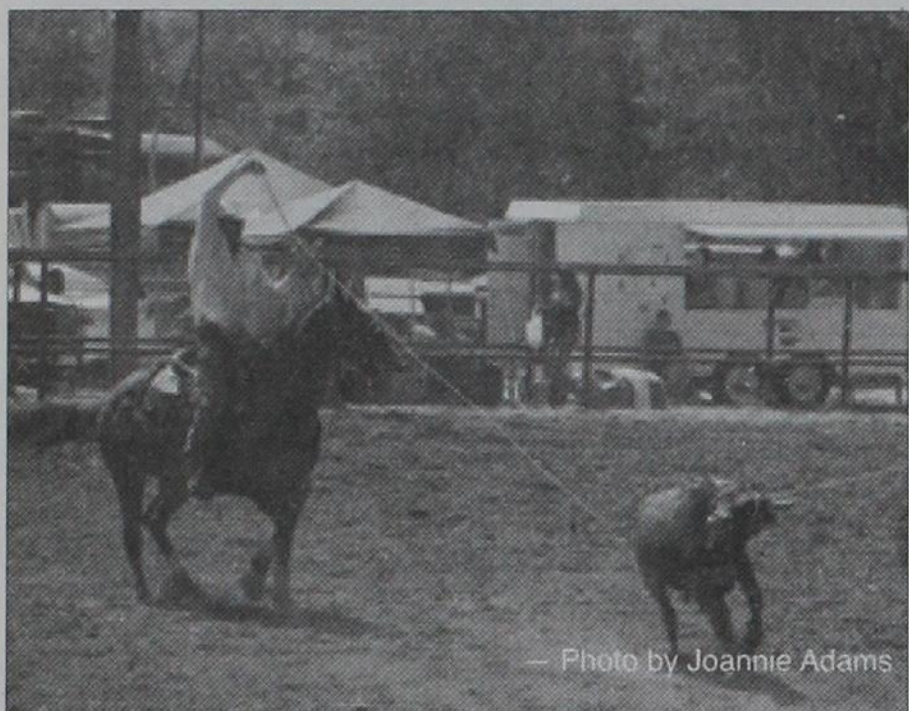

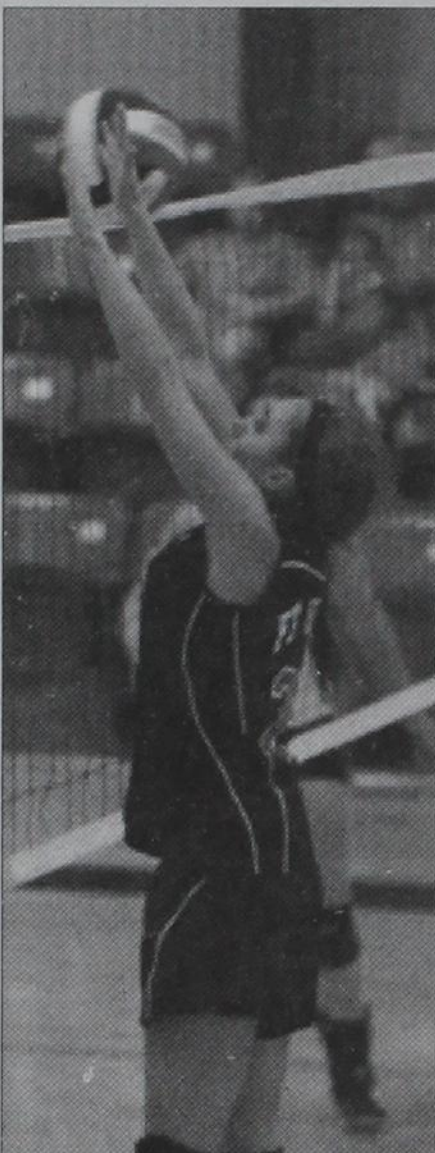

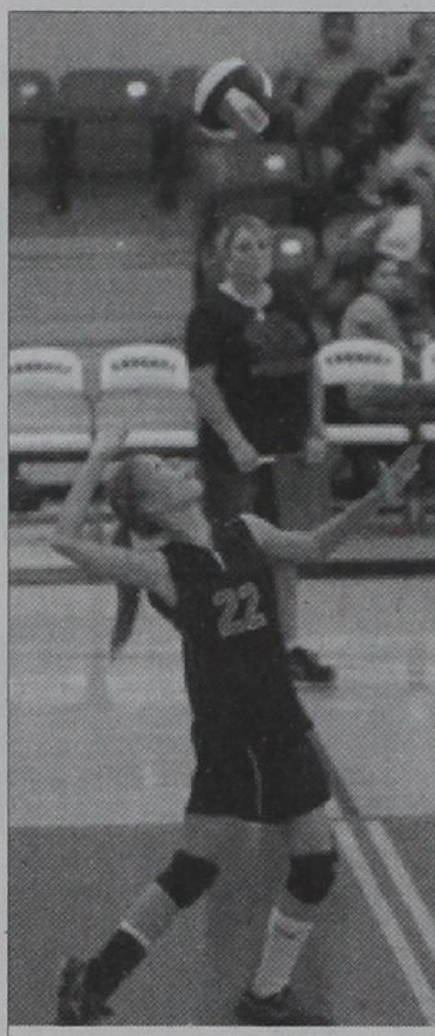

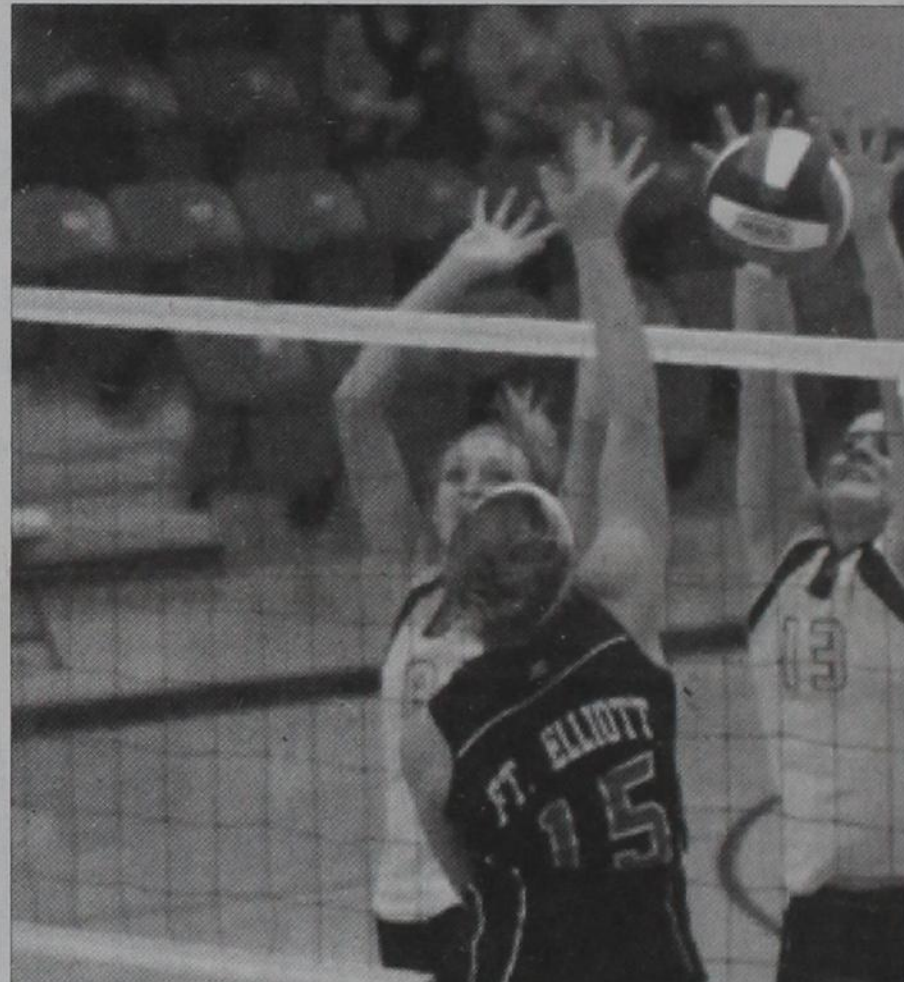

Xcel To Make Fuel Cost Surcharge

Xcel Energy residential and small commercial customers in Texas will see a small fuel cost surcharge on their year-end bills, pending regulatory approval, as the company balances its fuel accounts.

Other Texas customer classes — industrial and large commercial — will receive refunds.

Xcel Energy's Texas-based operating company, Southwestern Public Service Company, filed its plan for the fuel cost true-up today at the Public Utility Commission of Texas. If approved, Texas residential customers using 1,000 kilowatt-hours per month pay a one-time surcharge of \$3.38, split between two billing cycles, beginning with December bills. The surcharge expires after this amount is collected.

Fuel charges, which make up about half the cost of a typical month's bill, cover the costs for coal and natural gas used in area power plants, as well as the costs for purchased power. Xcel Energy does not earn profits from fuel charges, which are passed through dollar-for-dollar. As fuel costs are collected, they are deposited into accounts used for paying fuel bills. These accounts are tracked by customer class and reviewed periodically to ensure the accounts are balanced.

A true-up can lead to both surcharges and refunds because usage patterns differ among the customer classes. Residential and small commercial customers tend to use more power — and thus more fuel — during the summer months. Usage patterns among large commercial and industrial customers tend to stay roughly the same across a 12-month period.

In May, the early cancellation of a fuel cost surcharge, just as some classes began to use more power, led to a slight under collection of fuel costs for the residential and small commercial classes, creating the need for an additional fuel charge to balance fuel accounts.

The early expiration of that surcharge, combined with a lower fuel cost factor implemented in April, led to a \$10 savings on typical residential bills of 1,000 kilowatt-hours.

tion," Salinas said. "We are working to remove fear around the Endangered Species Act and to empower private landowners across the country to keep working lands working while simultaneously protecting and sustaining at-risk species."

The agreement builds on a \$33 million investment NRCS announced last spring dedicated to ward producers who develop and implement conservation plans to manage and restore high-priority habitats for seven specific wildlife species across the country. The species are greater sage-grouse, New England cottontail, bog turtle, golden-winged warbler, gopher tortoise, lesser prairie-chicken and the Southwestern willow flycatcher. NRCS, FWS and numerous state and local entities are partnering to implement WLFW.

NRCS, FWS and numerous state and local entities such as Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Pheasants Forever, Playa Lakes Joint Venture and many others are partnering to implement WLFW in

Texas. With this agreement, farmers, ranchers and forest landowners who implement and voluntarily agree to maintain the proven conservation practices in WLFW will have addressed the related ESA regulatory responsibilities for up to 30 years. These landowners will be able to operate their farms and ranches as agreed upon, providing economic benefits and species conservation simultaneously.

Under the WLFW partnership, federal, state and wildlife experts jointly identified at-risk or listed species that would benefit from targeted habitat restoration investments on private lands. Using the best available science, these wildlife experts prioritized restoration actions on a large regional scale to focus assistance most cost effectively.

WLFW attempts to remove uncertainty from the ESA for farmers, ranchers and forest landowners by converting the potential for regulation into proactive, voluntary approach that provides incentives and assistance to landowners who improve species habitat.

NRCS or one of its partners will visit the farmer or rancher's property to run an initial assessment and work with the landowner to develop a conservation plan that fits his or her needs and desires. The conservation plan identifies a core set of proven conservation practices that will benefit the species. NRCS sets aside financial assistance to implement the recommended conservation practices. During FY12, Texas NRCS obligated \$662,000 for LPCI on 32,000 acres.

The federal government will grant farmers, ranchers and forest landowners regulatory predictability in return for voluntarily making wildlife habitat improvements on their private agricultural and forest lands. Participating producers must adhere to the requirements of each conservation practice during the term of their contract, which can last from one to 15 years. If landowners would like to receive regulatory predictability for up to 30 years, they must maintain the conservation practices as outlined in the NRCS and FWS agreement.
