Ward's 30-Yard Drop Kick Paves Way For Giant Victory—Evans

POLO GROUNDS, New York, Oct. 6.—The Giants won by a drop kick that traveled at least 30 yards. Don't get me wrong; I am not describing a football contest but the third game of the world series that was won by the Giants 2 to 0. Second baseman Ward of the Yankees was the innocent victim of the football stunt that paved the way for the Giants' second victory of the series.

The break of the game that sent the Giants out in front with a two run lead came in the third inning. The Giants had threatened in the first two sessions, wasting two hits in each inning without being able to score.

Scott opened the third with a single to left. On a hit and run play Bancroft hit sharply towards right. The Yankee second baseman dashed over to make the play. The slow moving Scott on first he had an easy double play in front of him. A false move spoiled the entire afternoon for the Yankees.

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Ward's drop kick was the break of the game. The Giants made enough runs through that boost to win the ball game. "Giants won on a drop kick" tells the story of the day's game that makes the National League's strong favorite to win.

The Yankees are decidedly up against it. Higgins and his team gave their backs to the wall. The pitching of the Yankees has been good enough but the club has failed miserably at the bat.

Yankee Unable to Hit.
 The Yankees made only five hits but were unable to score a run against Scott. At the opening of the game the Cincinnati released Scott outright because of a bad arm. Picked up by the Giants a short time before the close of the season, he is tonight the hero of the New York fans who lean toward the Giants.

In baseball it is customary to refer to a pitcher with a bad arm as a broken arm twirler. The fact that Scott held them helpless doesn't speak very well for the Yankee hitters. The pitching was that he worked in a manner that usually meets with the approval of the Yankee bats. Scott's fast ball was usually at the plate, likewise his curve. It was the style pitching favored by the Yankees, yet they could do nothing with it.

Nahf and Barnes in the first two games worked the corners. They made the Yankees go after bad balls. When Ruth was up they released at most entirely to the slow ball or floater. Throughout the third game Scott pitched in Ruth's groove, yet he failed to hit a ball out of the infield.

The Yankees threatened in only the fourth inning, when the score stood 2 to 0 against them. With Meusel on third and Schang on second and one out, the Yankees had the big opening to tie up the game. It was the irony of fate that Ward, who hit the ball over the left field fence in the second game should be taken out for a pinch hitter, Elmer Smith, who is left when with Cleveland hit a home run with the bases filled in the world series.

RESURRECTED FROM GRAVEYARD, SCOTT BAFFLES YANKEES

NEW YORK, Oct. 6.—Their aspirations cooled by the frigid blizzard of a ghost from baseball's graveyard, Elmer Scott today baffled the Yankees at their own tomb. They must recover from the blight of the phantom Long John Scott, whose resuscitation from the dead brought terror to the likes of which only one team in a world series history has recovered. The scarily pitching that yesterday brought terror to the Yankees caused the Yankee bats to pass through as if the balls were bits of ectoplasm, and defeated them, 2 to 0, in the third game of the world series. The defeat was the second in the series for the Yankees. In the series of 1921 the Giants set a precedent by winning the title after spotting the Yankees the first two games.

Long John's pitching bones were laid to rest last July. But Moses of the Cincinnati Reds officiated at the obsequies. He had pronounced John's pitching days over, the dirge was sung and the baseball world soon forgot that John Scott had ever lived.

Some words were communicated with spirit, land and Scott learned there was a dearth of pitchers. He turned over in his musty coffin, pushed out its sides and walked on earth. He liked it, decided to stay, got a job and showed faint signs of materializing. John McGraw of the Giants needed pitchers and he would have them, even if they had to be resurrected.

So the ghost figure of John Scott appeared yesterday on the mound. They call the pitcher's box after he was in the tricks of "the beyond," he put 'em where the Yankees couldn't see them. Everywhere a Yankee waved his bat there was emptiness. Sometimes Long John let them tap them, depending on the support, and his dependence was well placed.

Most every living being in the baseball world is thinking about Scott today, but the Yankees are thinking of other things. Miller Huggins never wants to see a ghost materialize again. And he's trying to forget about it by making desperate plans for today's game.

He believes that Carl Mays, who hasn't been having any great success with his underbanded delivery this year, might halt the advance of McGraw's men. If Mays doesn't bear out this belief, Huggins is prepared to make a still more desperate play and send Bush into the game with two days' rest.

McGraw, with two victories chalked up, can afford to take chances and he has nominated Hugh McCulligan for the pitching duty. Ryan, the youngster who relieved Nahf and worked so admirably for a short spell in the opening game, is to be kept ready for relief.

BEARS VS. COWBOYS IN CONFERENCE TILT
