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Statewide distracted driving deaths up 17 percent

April is National Distracted Driving Awareness Month, and AAA Texas is reminding drivers to focus on the road rather than on their smartphones. Many dangerous driving behaviors increased during the pandemic, such as speeding, red light running, not wearing seatbelts, impaired driving and distracted driving, according to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. Researchers found that higher-risk drivers accounted for a greater share of drivers during the pandemic than before it, and while only a small percentage of drivers increased their driving due to the pandemic, those who did were younger and disproportionately male – a statistically riskier driver group than the average population.

"Deaths continue to increase on Texas roadways due to distracted driving," said

AAA Texas Spokesperson Daniel Armbruster. "Research shows that looking down at your phone for two seconds, while behind the wheel, doubles your risk for a crash. AAA Texas reminds all drivers to never drive intoxicated or intoxicated as both have deadly consequences."

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 3,138 people died in distracted-related crashes in the U.S. in 2020, accounting for 8.1% of all roadway fatalities. That's an average of 9 people killed each day in crashes that are totally preventable. Additionally, another 400,000 people are injured each year in distracted-related crashes. According to the latest statistics from the Texas Department of Transportation, in 2021 431 people died statewide in crashes involving distracted driving. That was a 17% increase from 2020 and 14% increase from 2019. TxDOT reports there were

2,935 serious injuries due to distracted driving in 2021, which was a -33% jump from the prior year and 17% increase from 2019.

Distracted driving is especially dangerous for pedestrians and bicyclists. Non-drivers account for nearly one in five distracted driving deaths. Nationally in 2020, there were 480 pedestrians, 83 bicyclists and 14 other non-occupants killed in crashes that involved a driver who was reported to be distracted. It is unknown how many of these other pedestrians, cyclists and other non-occupants were also distracted at the time.

According to a AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety survey in 2021, more than half of drivers (51%) admitted they text and/or email on their phone while alone in the vehicle. Changing the social norm about distracted driving is critical for

A Moment in History

The railroad superintendent home was painted green and yellow and located on an entire block in the center of town. The block was located between Second and Third streets and Main and Scurry. The large two-story Superintendent's home was located toward the middle of the block, and faced Main. The railroad provided Joseph Potton's family with a smaller home, located on the southwest corner of Scurry, behind the superintendent's home. Soon, this block of land was coveted by the city. The town was

quickly growing and needed that space to expand.

John Ward was the second superintendent at the Rio Grande Division of the T&P. He and his wife Fannie moved into the two-story home from Indiana in 1895. Fannie said she wanted to be as far away from the T&P Hotel as possible because of the horrible mosquito problem.

A tall fence enclosed the area, and a large gate was kept shut and locked, that was until the Wards moved in. They were both very friendly and jovial people who enjoyed the company of others. Fannie insisted the gate be kept open.

John and Fannie Ward were Baptist, but it didn't prevent Fannie from inviting the Methodists to hold their Ladies' Aid in the home, and they continued to do so for the next 10 years. Fannie did not hesitate to play the "wheezy little pump organ" at the Methodist church.

The Wards did not have children of their own; however, they had taken in a young man while they lived in Indiana. Blake Van Leer came to Big Spring with the Wards, and graduated from Big Spring High School in 1911. The Wards continued to support his education as he was accepted to Purdue University.

Between 1905 and 1909, the railroad officials made the decision to move the superintendent home to the northwest corner at Second and Scurry streets with a new address given as 201 Scurry. The move would free the space and allow Main Street to build and extend further south. John and Fannie had a favorite Yucca tree or Spanish Dagger and wanted it moved with the house to Scurry Street, and so it was.

In 1911, John Ward resigned from the railroad and went to work as Head Postmaster for Big Spring in 1922. January 1928, he became ill and passed away on January 14 at the age of 65. Fannie moved to Berkley, California, where some of her family resided. She regularly traveled back and forth from California to Big Spring until she suffered a stroke in California. She died on May 12, 1937.

The superintendent house was torn down in the early 1930s. As the house was being demolished, Lester Fisher wanted to preserve the yucca plant and move it to his brother's home in Edwards Heights. In November 1934, the large yucca was pulled out of the ground and hoisted into the air by Ollie Williams trucking crew. They made the slow move from 211 Scurry to Albert and Edith Fisher's new home on Hillside. The yucca made the trip safely to its new permanent home.

Injured Copperfield trick participant loses lawsuit appeal

LAS VEGAS (AP) — The Nevada Supreme Court has upheld a jury’s findings that illusionist David Copperfield and the MGM Grand hotel-casino were not financially responsible for a British tourist’s injuries during a signature vanishing act at a Las Vegas Strip show in 2013.

Gavin Cox and his wife, Minh-Hahn Cox, alleged that the multimillionaire magician, the hotel, two Copperfield business entities and a construction firm that was renovating the hotel caused permanent brain injuries for Cox when he fell while taking part in the trick as a randomly picked audience member.

In a complex verdict reached in May 2018 after several weeks of testimony, the jury found Copperfield, the hotel and Copperfield’s company, Backstage Disappearing Inc., negligent

but not civilly liable for Cox’s fall.

Cox had sought hundreds of thousands of dollars in medical costs and damages, but jurors found him responsible for his own injuries and he received no money.

Brian Harris, attorney for the couple, noted Friday that the court split 5-2 on its ruling.

Attorney: Cowboys player in SUV from which man was shot

DALLAS (AP) — Dallas Cowboys cornerback Kelvin Joseph was riding in a sport utility vehicle from which a man was fatally shot about two months ago, Joseph's attorney said Friday.

Cameron Ray, 20, was shot about 2 a.m. March 18 outside a nightclub in the Lower Greenville entertainment district of Old East Dallas, according to a Dallas police statement.

A newly released surveillance video showed two groups, one of which Ray was part of, engaged in a

brief altercation outside the nightspot. The video shows a black SUV drive by Ray's group, and shots were fired from at least one of its windows, wounding Ray. He died a short time later at a nearby hospital.

"Kelvin Joseph did not shoot Cameron Ray," Barry Sorrels, Joseph's attorney, said in a statement Friday. "Mr. Ray's death is a tragedy, and Kelvin extends his deepest condolences for the family's loss."

Joseph "was unarmed and was not looking for violence," Sorrels said. "He found himself in a situation that escalated without his knowledge or consent. Along with condolences to the Ray family, Kelvin apologizes to the Dallas community for being anywhere near this type of incident."

A Dallas police spokesman declined to confirm Joseph's involvement in the case, but *The Dallas Morning News* reported police detectives intend to question the 22-year-old.

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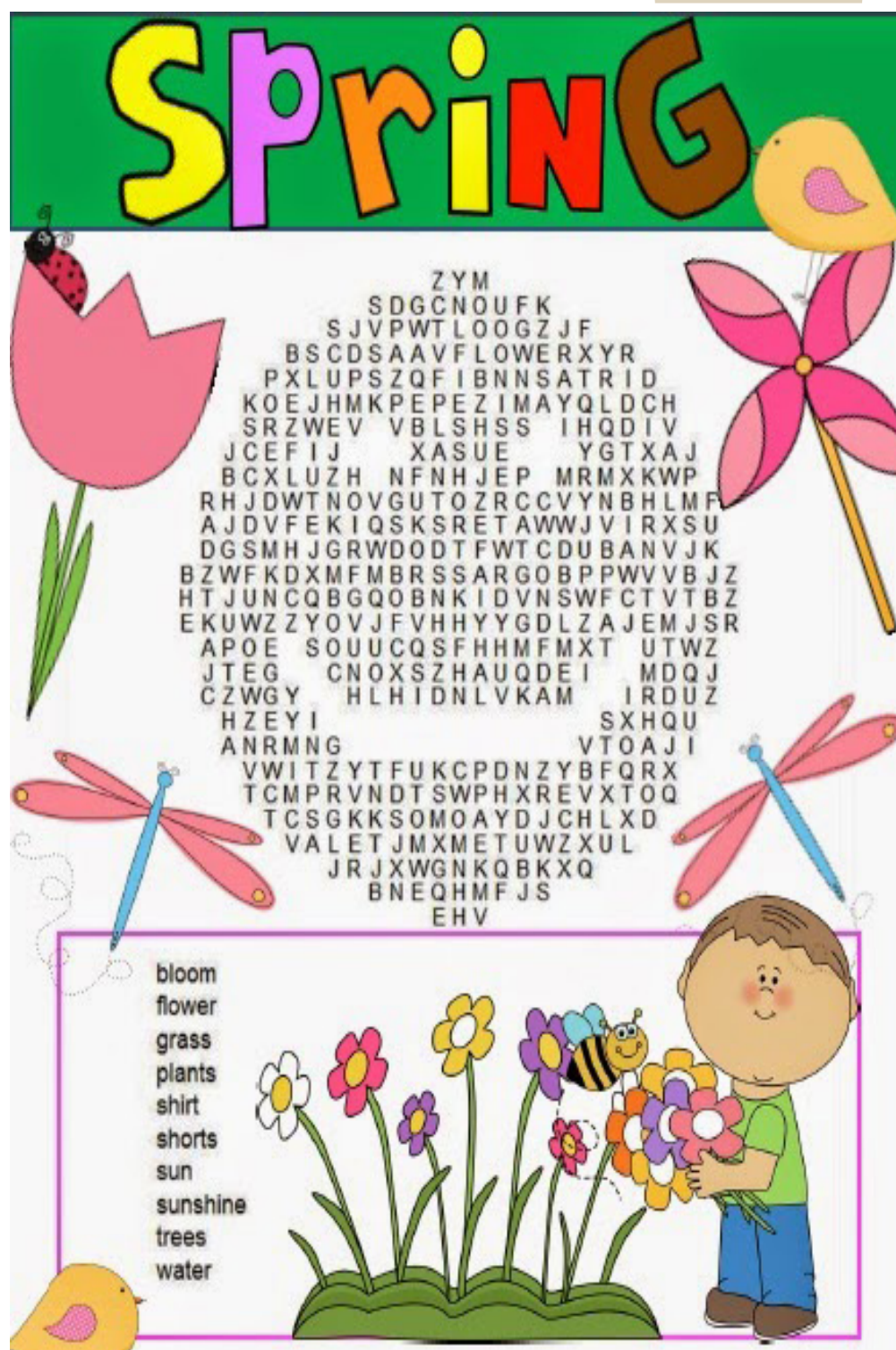

Today's Highlight in History:

On April 18, 1775, Paul Revere began his famous ride from Charlestown to Lexington, Massachusetts, warning colonists that British Regular troops were approaching.

On this date:

In 1865, Confederate Gen. Joseph E. Johnston surrendered to Union Maj. Gen. William T. Sherman near Durham Station in North Carolina.

In 1906, a devastating earthquake struck San Francisco, followed by raging fires; estimates of the final death toll range between 3,000 and 6,000.

In 1923, the first game was played at the original Yankee Stadium in New York; the Yankees defeated the Boston Red Sox 4-1.

In 1954, Gamal Abdel Nasser seized power as he became prime minister of Egypt.

In 1955, physicist Albert Einstein died in Princeton, New Jersey, at age 76.

In 1966, Bill Russell was named player-coach of the Boston Celtics, becoming the NBA's first Black coach.

In 1978, the Senate approved the Panama Canal Treaty, providing for the complete turnover of control of the waterway to Panama on the last day of 1999.

In 1983, 63 people, including 17 Americans, were killed at the U.S. Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon, by a suicide bomber.

In 2002, police arrested actor Robert Blake in the shooting death of his wife, Bonny Lee Bakley, nearly a year earlier (Blake was acquitted at his criminal trial but found liable in a civil trial).

In 2015, a ship believed to be carrying more than 800 migrants from Africa sank in the Mediterranean off Libya; only about 30 people were rescued.

In 2016, "Hamilton," Lin-Manuel Miranda's hip-hop stage biography of America's first treasury secretary, won the Pulitzer Prize for drama.

In 2019, the final report from special counsel Robert Mueller's Russia investigation was made public; it outlined Russian interference in the 2016 presidential election but did not establish that members of the Trump campaign conspired or coordinated with the Russian government. (Mueller offered no conclusion on the question of whether the president

obstructed justice.)

Ten years ago: Defense Secretary Leon Panetta apologized for gruesome photographs published in the Los Angeles Times that purported to show U.S. soldiers posing with the bloodied remains of dead insurgents in Afghanistan two years earlier. Dick Clark, the ever-youthful television host and producer who helped bring rock 'n' roll into the mainstream on "American Bandstand" and rang in the New Year for the masses at Times Square, died in Santa Monica, California, at age 82.

Five years ago: Turning back to the economic populism that helped drive his election campaign, President Donald Trump signed an order affecting government contracts and U.S. trade agreements, one that he said should help American workers whose jobs were threatened by skilled immigrants; the signing took place at the headquarters of tool manufacturer Snap-on Inc., in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

One year ago: The government announced that half of all adults in the U.S., or almost 130 million people 18 or older, had received at least one COVID-19 shot. Maren Morris won three awards and Luke Bryan was named entertainer of the year at the Academy of Country Music Awards.
