Cook Of The Week



An unusual recipe, but very good, is shared by Mrs. Don Johnson. Janina urges cooks

who like to try the "different" to make her "sausage cake." The cookie recipe is a good one

for the little girl who wants to cook with mommy.

Janina grew up as an "Air Force Brat". She was born in Virginia and lived in Japan when she was six, seven and eight years old. Her father was also stationed in San Antonio and Amarillo.

She met Don at West Texas State University. He grew up in Estelline. The Johnsons have two little daughters, JaDonna, five, and Audria, two.

Embroidering, sewing and painting are Janina's favorite pastimes. "Playing with kids" is, however, at the top of her list of hobbies.

Janina will begin her fifth year in Hart schools this September. She teaches with the early childhood development program, working with children who have learning disabilities and those who cannot learn in a regular classroom situation.

"I love it," she says. She had earned a BS degree and teaching certificate before coming to Hart and went back in the summer for work in the early childhood program.

The Johnsons attend First Baptist Church.

SAUSAGE CAKE

1 lb sausage
2 c sugar
2 eggs
1 c evaporated milk
2 1/2 c sifted flour
1 t baking powder
1 t baking soda
1 t cloves
1 t cinnamon
1 t nutmeg

1 t allspice
1 t salt
1 c raisins
1 c nuts

Cream sausage and sugar together. Add eggs (beaten) one at a time. Mix together dry ingredients in different bowl. Add to creamed sausage and sugar small amount of evaporated milk and then small amount of dry ingredients until all of the milk and dry ingredients are mixed into sausage mixture. Use greased and lightly floured tube pan and bake in moderate oven until done - 1-1 1/2 hours.

IRISH POTATO CAKE

2 c sugar, 1 c butter creamed together. 1 c cooked potatoes mashed and added last. 4 T chocolate melted over hot water with small amount of butter. 1/2 c sweet milk, 2 c flour sifted with 2 t baking powder, 1 t each of cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg. 4 eggs beaten separately, 1 t vanilla and 1 c walnuts (optional).

To mix, add vanilla to creamed sugar and butter, also chocolate and egg yolks. Add potatoes. Then alternate flour and egg whites. Add nuts. Can be baked in layers or loaf. Cook in medium oven, test for doneness. Chocolate or vanilla icing is good with this or your own favorite variations.

ROLL COOKIES

This recipe is fun for children because the dough has good handling quality and children can make them into fun shapes and designs and they are pretty good to eat.

Cream 1/2 c white or brown sugar with 1/2 c butter. Beat in 2 eggs, 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 c flour, 2 t baking powder, 1 t vanilla.

Chill dough 3-4 hours before shaping as desired. Preheat oven 375 degrees and bake until done. Time depends on thickness of shape and design.

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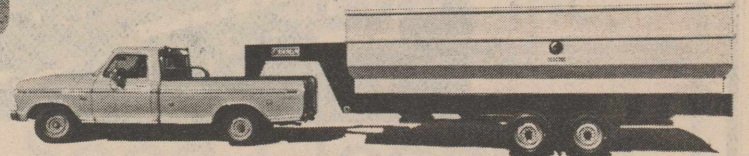

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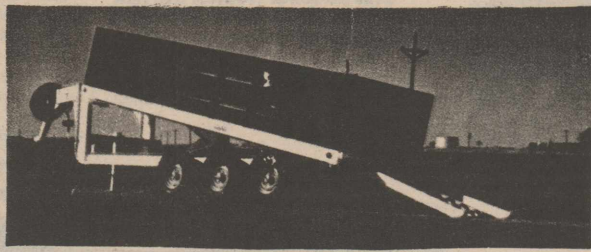
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Olton's Historic Pageant Set Friday & Saturday

A simple pleasant evening as uncomplicated as the early 1900's - that's what's in store for theatre-goers at the Prairie Theater Friday and Saturday, July 30-31.

Music, dancing, romance, pathos... the minute you enter the parking lot you will step back into the early history of Lamb County. The drama begins at 8:30 p.m.

Part of the set is a small house, built in 1898, which was moved recently from the old Tom Keenan ranch.

The little house is the home of Papa and Mama Renegan, the "foreigners", played by Mark Watt and Tammy Green.

In the center stage is the home of Abe and Tappie nesters from the north. Called "northern blue bellies" by the cowboys, they are played by Deryl Clark and Tammy Williams.

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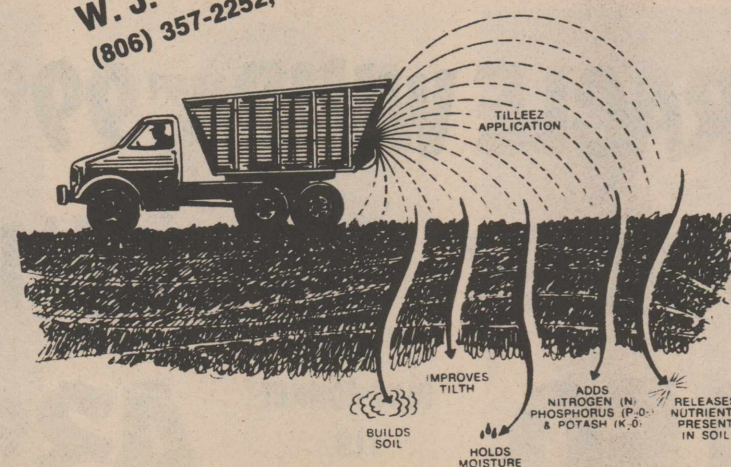
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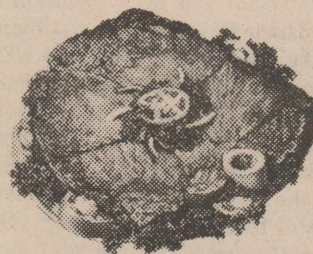


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
