MAVERICK ROAD TO BALLINGER

Commissioner Currie of Miles, has a crew of hands at work on the Maverick-Ballinger road, and the road is being graded all the way from Maverick to the commissioner's line within five or six miles of Ballinger.

Mr. Curry's precinct takes in the territory north of the river, including Maverick, and to within five or six miles of Ballinger, and his constituents are receiving good service from him in the building of this road.

C. A. Dooze who represents some of the land owners along the road, went out and assisted in straightening out some of the corners, and not only making the road a safer highway, but shortening the distance and consequently saving the county expense in building and maintaining the road.

When this road is graded to the Ballinger precinct line, the expense of keeping it up will not be so great, and the people from the Northwest part of the county will have a more direct route to the county capital.

Ballinger seems to be a good road, and of course will look a lot better. The citizens and business men should get together and start a good road campaign that would pull Ballinger out of the rut. Roads which were graded and put in good shape need attention and are going to the bad for the lack of upkeep.

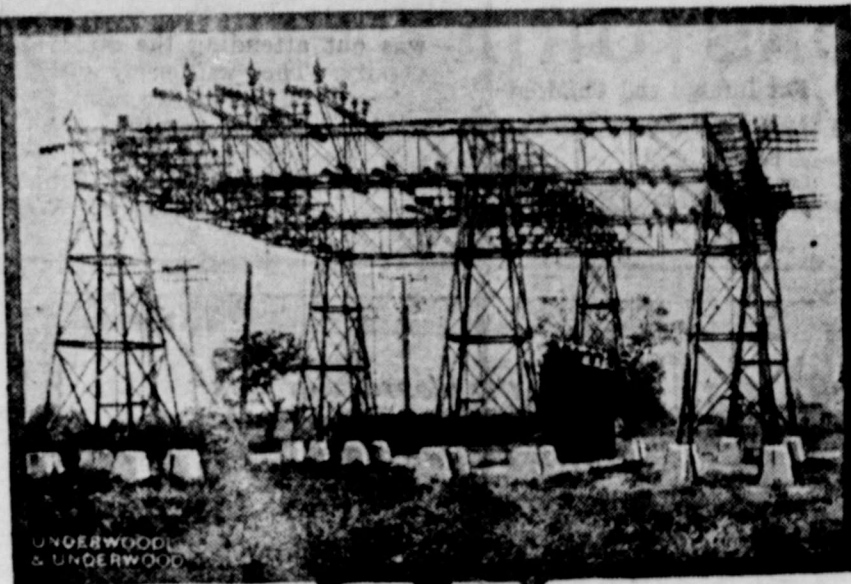

3 BANDITS GET 60,000 MAIL BAG SAYS PALLAGRA REPORT UNTRUE

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 4.—Three bandits today held up and slugged Tommy Felaido, post office messenger at Wood River, Illinois, and escaped with three mail pouches, one of which is believed to contain \$60,000 in currency. The currency was consigned to the Standard Oil refinery at Wood River. It is believed that the bandits had a tip that the money was being conveyed to the oil refinery.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4.—The pellagra situation was discussed here today in a closed session of health officials from a dozen states in the South and the Surgeon General Cumming of the public health service. Some of the officials said that they would dispute any claim that the disease had reached the serious stage in their territory, and contend that the reports have been greatly over drawn.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 4.—At the request of Pope Benedict, fifteen Nights of Columbus have decided to start a campaign to raise one million dollars for the purpose of inaugurating American welfare in Italy, it was announced at the International convention of the K.C.s. here today. The fund will be raised by popular subscription among the membership of the order.

RUNNELS COUNTY BOY BURIED AT BROWNWOOD

The remains of David L. Petty, who was killed while on the battle front in France, were buried at Brownwood Wednesday afternoon according to the Brownwood Bulletin. David Petty formerly lived in this county, when his father Sam Petty, lived in the Maverick country. Ellis Petty, now of Maverick, is brother of the young man who gave his life for his country. In giving an account of the arrival and burial of the remains the Bulletin says:

The body of David L. Petty, son of Sam Petty of the Novice neighborhood, west of Brownwood arrived from overseas this morning. This afternoon services were held at the chapel of the McInnis Undertaking establishment, conducted by Rev. A. E. Findley. The body was then taken to the Baugh cemetery where final interment took place, services there being conducted by the Masonic fraternity. Owing to the fact that the body was not expected to reach Brownwood until Thursday afternoon the funeral program had to be re-arranged. Young Petty was killed in action in France, November 9, 1918, just two days before the armistice was announced.

BALL BENEFIT ON AT MAEROY

In order to help out in financing the local baseball club, the Maeroy Theatre entered into an agreement today to divide a generous part of its proceeds Friday night, next week with the Baseball club.

CUT EXPENSE TO AVOID THE TAXES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4.—A cut of more than two hundred fifty million dollars in ordinary expenditures of the government for this fiscal year is necessary if additional taxes be avoided, the House Ways and Means committee was informed today by Secretary Mellon.

Mr. Mellon said that the present estimate of the total cost of this year would be four billion and five hundred and fifty million, of which three billion eight hundred and thirty million must come from taxation. He said that even with the suggestion of reductions in internal revenue yield for the year could not safely be permitted to fall below three billion five hundred and seventy million dollars, the estimated yield under the existing law.

LAW ENFORCE- MENT IS KILLED

AUSTIN, Aug. 4.—The Burkett law enforcement bill was killed in the Senate today by a vote of 14 to 10. This means that the measure can not be considered again this session. This also means the defeat of the governor's law enforcement recommendations. No debate was had in the senate on the measure, the vote being called for without debating from either side.

The senate adopted the majority report of the penitentiary investigating committee, providing for enactment of laws regulating the penitentiary system and the ousting of Commissioner Pryor.

GRAFT REPORT BIG BOOGER-BOO

AUSTIN, Aug. 4.—The graft investigating committee confined the majority of its probing this morning to information regarding the "man in a black hat," to whom State Health officer Carrick referred to before the finance committee, as a man attempting to bribe him to overlook irregularities in the health department.

Bank President Wilmot explained how the \$1,823 was placed to Dr. Carrick's credit, and said that it was placed there by Dr. Davis, who preceded Dr. Carrick as State Health Officer, and that it had been formerly carried as a Texas fumigation fund. The fund was placed in the savings account to Dr. Carrick's credit, Mr. Wilmot said.

Assistant Attorney General Bryant testified that he officially advised Dr. Davis to deposit the money to Dr. Carrick's credit and that he suggested to Dr. Carrick that he ask the legislature to authorize some disposition of the fund, as it was collected on the border for fumigating cars and automobiles without official authority, no law having been passed authorizing the collecting of such a fee. The fund was created during the term of Dr. Goddard who preceded Dr. Davis in office.

When Governor Neff first told of his graft charges, Dr. Carrick appeared before the finance committee and reported how a man in a black hat came to him with a bank book and showing him that \$1,823 had been deposited to his credit, and for him to do what he pleased with the money, buy clothes with it, or do what he wanted to. Dr. Carrick stated that an attempt had been made to bribe him.

CHEAP BEEF AND HIGH TARIFF

There is no more convincing proof that we are returning to normalcy than the announcement of free barbecues. There was a time when it required a millionaire town to put on such a spread, but any progressive community can put it over now. Beef is cheaper barbecued than it is in some markets—Ballinger Ledger.

No body is willing to rasp the feelings of the cattlemen, nevertheless one might venture to say there are worse things than cheap beef. Cattle enjoy, under the emergency tariff act, a "protective" duty of 30 per cent ad valorem, an advance of 20 per cent provided for under the Democratic tariff bill formerly prevailing. But this apparently is of small interest to our cattle, inasmuch as they don't seem to have any more protection when being sold than if they were sold under absolute free trade. If this protection given to the cattlemen, by the intellectual and benevolent Congress now sitting, is of any use, why don't cattle go up? If it is not worse than useless, why were cattle higher under the 10 per cent tariff than they now are under the 30 per cent? And hogs—hogs are not "protected" by

a tariff. Yet hogs are relatively high—have been going up since the emergency tariff bill passed. There was never quite such a fraud as the protective tariff as applied to agricultural and animal products. A protective tariff is good for manufacturers because they can retard production inexpensively, therefore feed the market systematically, without overdoing it. But farmers and cattlemen can not retard production nor market systematically. Their business is governed by the seasons and they can not shut down in summer and start up again in winter, or vice versa. When a steer begins eating his head off he must be marketed. He can't be warehoused. Not until he has been slaughtered can he be dressed and locked up in the cooling-house, to await a more prospective day. And that operation is performed, not by the cattle men, but by the packer—who is ample protected against foreign meat.—Dallas News.

IRISH REPUBLICAN PARLIAMENT TO MEET

DUBLIN, Aug. 4.—A full meeting of the Irish republican parliament will be called. An official announcement of the call with the date for the meeting will be published tonight. It is reported that a reply to the Ulster overtures by Sinn Fein parties has been received, but that it was not favorable.

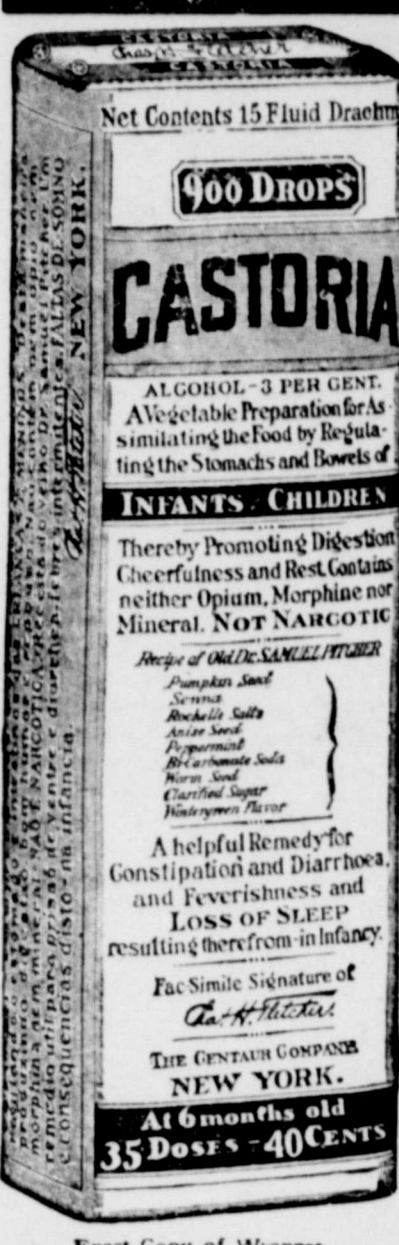

LOCALS LEAP TO LEAGUE LEADERS

SAN ANGELO, Aug. 4.—Ballinger leads the West Texas League today, by virtue of its 5 to 4 victory over San Angelo Wednesday while Sweetwater was touching Abilene with which Ballinger had been tied.

Angelo made a thrilling ninth inning rally that fell one mark short of tying the count and left a runner stranded on third. Darkness was falling fast, the game having gone almost 2 1/2 hours, and had the score been tied, it would probably be impossible to play another frame.

In the absence of Umpire Roy Aiken, who was summoned to Abilene by Acting President Hodges, Hunter Hill, veteran Texas League player and manager, now a scout, umpired satisfactorily to everyone. The defeat for San Angelo was the seventh sustained in the last nine games with the Bears who have swept three straight games from the Nags during the half. Brisco, Knight and E. saw were the visiting slug-gers Wednesday, while Lewis Robinson and McKay divided batting honors among the locals.

Hill was very wild and was relieved by Cooke in the sixth with the bases full and none out. Cooke retired the side scoreless, fanning two men, but in Angelo's half when it came his turn at bat and there was a runner at every station, Higginbotham was substituted as a pinch hitter and fouled out weakly to Bailey. Burleson then pitched the last three innings but was hit hard in the eighth.

Cantrell kept the hits scattered, and despite five errors made to his back, the Nags could not bring their running record up to that of the visitors.

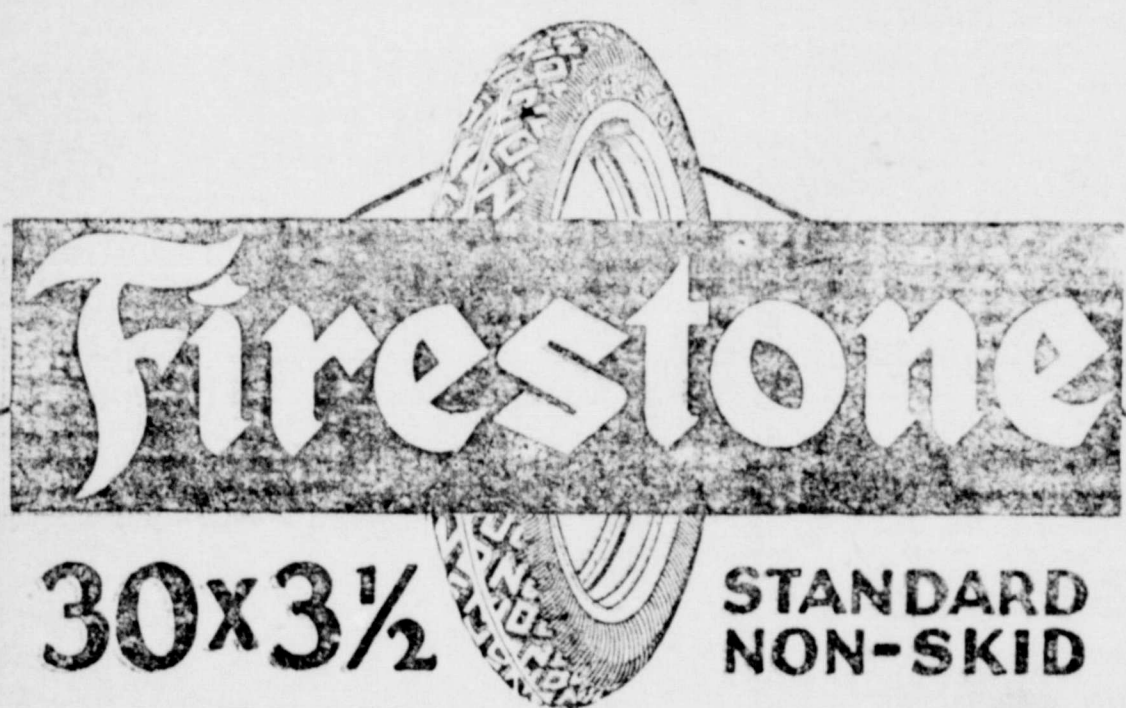

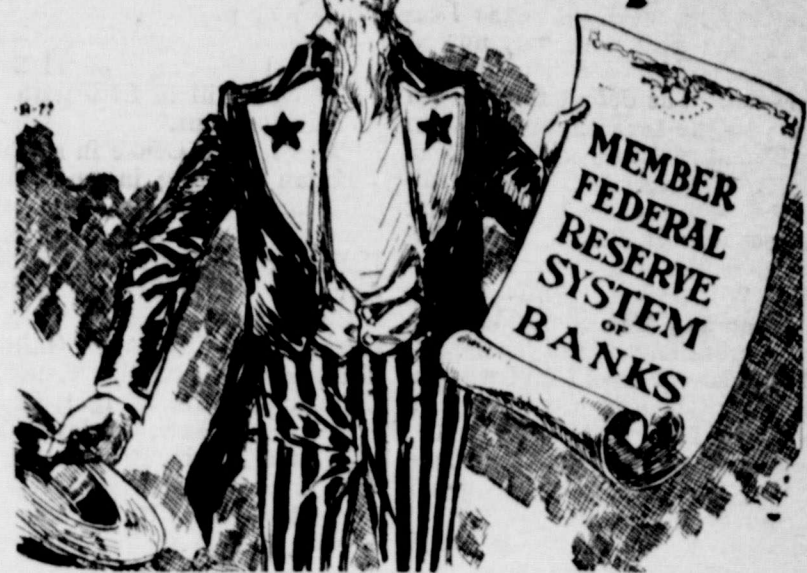
