RESCUERS WILL REACH ENTOMBED MAN SOON

(By Associated Press)
CAVE CITY, Feb. 11.—Connection between the rescue shaft and the tunnel in which Floyd Collins has been imprisoned for twelve days, is expected very soon, it was declared today by H. T. Carmichael, superintendent of the crew.
Carmichael said that more crevices were being found in the rocks, and the crevices were getting larger and sand was giving away to gravel. Cave crickets are also being encountered in greater numbers by the diggers, indicating that the shaft is near the cave.
The shaft had been driven to a depth of forty-two feet this morning.

NAMED TO STUDY DEBT QUESTION

PARIS, Feb. 11.—The finance committee of the Chamber of Deputies in an agreement with Premier Herriot, today appointed a sub-committee and charged them with the duty of studying the question of inter-allied debts.
The sub-committee whose duties are officially described as a study of the financial clause of the treaty of peace, consists of fifteen members, three of whom belong to the opposition, and the committee will meet next Friday.

ASKS NEW LAW FOR SPEEDING

DALLAS, Feb. 11.—Licenses for automobile drivers, with a penalty of suspension for one month for the first offense of speeding or careless driving, with increased penalties for the second and third offense, is a measure advocated by the chiefs of police and city marshalls' association.
A bill on this subject has been drafted by a committee of the association, and is to be presented to the legislature, it was said.

SAYS SHORTAGE FOUND IN FUNDS

(By Associated Press)
AUSTIN, Feb. 11.—Irregularities in the business department of the Texas prison system, including the payment of bills as many as three times, were charged today by M. E. Bogle, prison system auditor, who testified before the joint investigation committee.

Bogle said he was assaulted by R. E. McAdams, manager of the Ferguson farm; and Ennis Herring, son of J. A. Herring, chairman of the prison commission, and three unknown men. He said that he found McAdams short in three accounts which explained why McAdams attacked him. Bogle said he reported the attack to Gov. Neff, at the time.

The investigating committee will move to Huntsville tonight where it expects to resume hearings tomorrow.

THE FUTURE MARKET

The United States Department of Agriculture, with figures as a basis for advising, recommends that hog production be increased, and corn acreage be increased.

The year finds the nation short on hogs, and the department predicts fair prices for pork and pork products. It is also predicted that the beef and dairy products will increase in value, or at least the market will be better.

The survey also encourages an increase in poultry and says that the outlook for sheep and wool is favorable. There are as many horses and mules as will be needed, and the horse and mule market is not encouraging for increasing horses and mules.

While dealing with the above items of farming and livestock raising, the department does not mention cotton. That is a question which is dangerous to speculate on. The general opinion among cotton men, and farmers is that the market will be somewhat on the "blink" this year. This opinion is based on the fear of a heavy production.

However, it is too early to speculate on cotton futures. Many things can take place to cut the production, and while it is generally agreed that the acreage this year will set a new high mark, it is not always the largest acreage which produces the heaviest yield.

The farmer who heeds the advice of the department of agriculture, however, and who plants hogs, poultry, and something to feed and fatten for the market, will have a bank account when the one idea farmer will be buying on credit.

IT WILL CURE THE EVIL

The police and city marshalls of Texas have suggested what would no doubt help the speeding evil, if it would not cure it entirely. A bill revoking the license of motorists convicted of speeding for one month, and increasing the penalty for the second and third offense will be offered in the legislature at the request of the traffic officers.

Of course the offense would also call for the usual fine, and this too would be increased for the second and third offenses. And, why not? What's the use of convicting a speeder and then turn him loose on the highway to try to make up the time he lost. Stop him from driving for a time, and if that does not cure him, nothing will.

THERE ARE OTHER DRY SPOTS ON THE MAP

West Texas is not the only section on the map where rain is sometimes a little shy. Associated Press reports from some of the Central and Eastern counties in this state say that wells are going dry and water hauling is necessary in some localities.

Press reports state that Waco is supplying towns in that section with water, water trains being necessary to transport water to localities where wells have dried up and where there is a scant water supply. Bastrop county, it is said, has not received sufficient rain since last May to put out water, and water wagons are operating in that county. Farming activities are being retarded on account of the drought.

Huge Sums Go to Replace Country Schoolhouses

BEDFORD, Ind., Feb. 11.—That the flimsy schoolhouse, like the hickory stick of the Three-R days, is drifting into obscurity, is indicated in a survey made by the Indiana Limestone Quarry-

men's Association, which shows that last year more than \$225,000,000 was spent in replacing antiquated school buildings with materials of a permanent nature.

Reports to the association said that a far greater number of school buildings were replaced than remodeled, and that contracts already awarded give promise of 1925 exceeding the previous year in volume of school building construction.

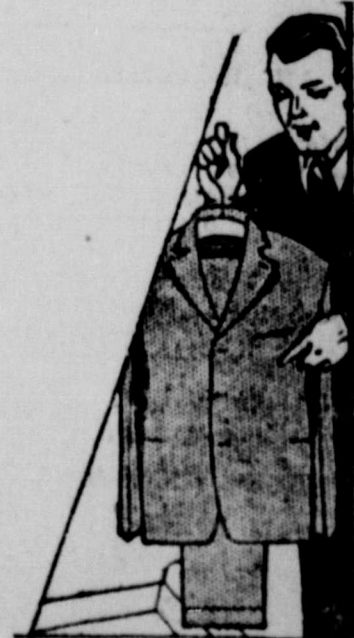

CONDEMS LAND FOR PIPE LINE

SAN ANGELO, Feb. 11.—Work of laying the pipe line for the Humble Pipe Line Company across the twenty mile stretch of land owned by J. D. Suggs has been resumed.

Mr. Suggs recently stopped the work on account of a disagreement between himself and the company, and the county court of Irion county Monday appointed a commission to condemn the land, fixing a reasonable value on the right-of-way for the pipe line, and work was ordered resumed. The commission will meet next Monday. The procedure of the law is the same as that followed by railroads and other companies in acquiring a right-of-way across land.

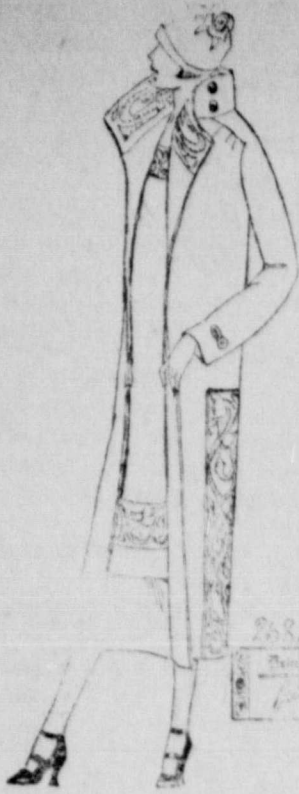

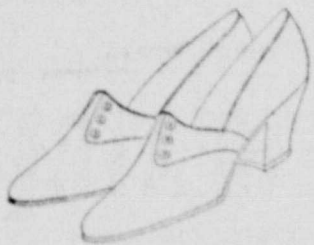

GAS WELL STOPS ORIENT TRAIN

BIG LAKE, Tex., Feb. 11.—A 60,000,000 cubic feet gas well of the Big Lake Oil Company, running wild yesterday, delayed a train. A high wind blowing the gas across the track made it dangerous for the train to try to pass.

John Hoffer, deputy oil and gas inspector for the Texas Railroad Commission, estimated that the big gasser was flowing 60,000,000 cubic feet of gas daily, and is said to be one of the largest gas wells in the world. An expert gas well man, with equipment, is rushing here from Tulsa, Oklahoma to place the well under control.

The wind blowing from the North blocked railroad traffic on the Orient, and trains will not be permitted to pass until the wind shifts, or until the gas is placed under control. There is danger of fire, but every precaution is being taken to prevent the well from becoming ignited.

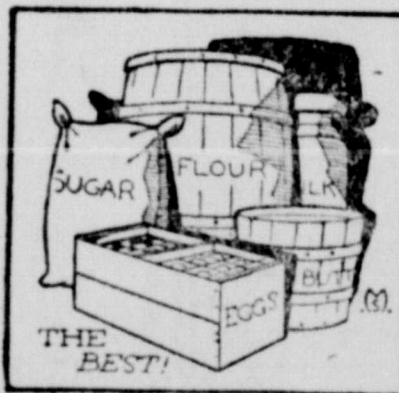
