GRAHAM BROTHERS BUILD NEW TRUCK

One Ton Type To Be Produced in
Large Quantities For Sale at
Low Price

Higginbotham Bros. & Co., the local Dodge Brothers dealer, has been notified that Graham Brothers, Detroit and Evansville, now have in production a new ONE-TON truck. The truck is described as being lighter, sturdier and lower in price.

The list price is placed at \$1,175 f. o. b. Detroit. The price of the previous Graham Brothers ONE-TON truck was \$1,265.

Larger production, it is understood, makes it possible to build the new truck at a lower price.

It is announced at the same time by Graham Brothers that important improvements have also been made in the 1-1/2 ton truck, including body refinements, uniform wheel and rim sizes and 56-inch rear springs. The list price of the 1-1/2 ton, of the new production, is \$1,375.

The higher court was expected to announce a date for the hearing.

SAYS CLERKS PAY TOO LOW

(By Associated Press)
CHICAGO, Oct. 9.—Wages now being paid to the members of this organization were described as "deficit wages," by President E. H. Fitzgerald, of the Brotherhood of Railway Clerks, Freight Handlers and Station Employees.

The statement was made by Fitzgerald in presenting his second day's argument before the state unit of the United States Railroad Labor Board in furtherance of the brotherhood's request for a restoration of the 1920 wage scale. Fitzgerald contrasted the wages now in effect, saying that the wages asked for were advocated by Secretary of Labor Davis.

DR. BUTTE MAY SPEAK HERE

Dr. Geo. C. Butte is billed to speak in Brownwood on October 28th and in San Angelo on October 29th. He will pass through Ballinger en route to San Angelo, and will not go further West than Angelo, doubling back through Ballinger.

As Dr. Butte is to pass through Ballinger going and returning from San Angelo, those interested in his candidacy will make an effort to get the candidate to stop here for an address, and have taken the matter up with Dr. Butte. If he accepts an invitation for governor to deliver an address here.

SHENANDOAH FLIES OVER WEST TEXAS

BRITISH TO NAME NEW PARLIAMENT

(By Associated Press)
LONDON, Oct. 9.—The House of Commons will be dissolved and a general election will be held on October 29th, it was announced today after King George held a council at Buckingham Palace, at which he signed the proclamation.

The announced date for the election which will define the political complexion of the government which will succeed Great Britain's first labor ministry, was made after Prime Minister MacDonald, coming this afternoon before the commons which last night defeated his government, declared that the king had assented to his request for the dissolution of parliament.

MAY MODIFY STOCK EMBARGO

HOUSTON, Oct. 9.—The probability of a modification of the quarantine against a part of Harris, Galveston, Brazoria and Fort Bend counties within the next two weeks was expressed as probable today by Dr. Marion Innes, federal government inspector, in charge of the work of stamping out the disease among cattle in Texas.

The slaughter of additional cattle continued today. The figures made public by Dr. Innes show that out of 10,000 or more head of cattle ordered killed, the firing squad had thus far only killed about 3,000 head.

FEDERAL TROOPS DEATH CLAIMS CHASING BANDITS LEAGUE CAPTAIN

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 9.—Federal troops have been sent in pursuit of bandits who early today kidnapped Paul Ewell, an American, who is manager of a British mining property at Parral, Chihuahua. The Mexican government acted after representations had been made by the American charge d' affaires.

FORT WORTH, Oct. 9.—The naval dirigible Shenandoah sailed from here this morning at 9:45 a. m. clock on its cross-continent flight to the Pacific coast. The airship will follow the Texas & Pacific railroad to El Paso. It arrived here late yesterday and spent the night at the moorings at the government helium plant. Thousands of people turned out to witness the departure of the giant dirigible.

Making an average speed of about 52 miles an hour, traveling a distance of 1,800 miles without a stop in 34 hours, and beating its scheduled time by about seven hours, the giant naval dirigible Shenandoah landed at Ft. Worth at 7:25 Wednesday evening. The airship left Lakehurst, New Jersey, Tuesday.

Spending the night at Fort Worth, the Shenandoah took the air to continue its trip to the Pacific coast Thursday morning. It is the first cruise across the United States by a dirigible and thousands of people gathered along the route to witness the big ship. The dirigible followed the T. & P. West from Abilene, passing out of Texas at El Paso Thursday afternoon.

Roy Reeder returned home Wednesday night from Dallas, driving a new Hudson sedan. The new car is of the 1925 model, and is the second one delivered in Texas, the first being delivered to a party in Dallas this week, and Mr. Reeder got the second one received at Dallas.

ST. LOUIS WINS RED CROSS MEET

WASHINGTON, October 8.—The next annual meeting of the American Red Cross Association will be held next October in St. Louis. Overruling the report made by its rules committee the convention now in session here voted today to convene next year for the first time outside of the national capital.

THEATRE CASE GOES TO JURY

The lawsuit over the Fo-to-sho Theatre which has been occupying the time of the local district court most of this week, was placed in the hands of the jury shortly after noon Thursday. Both sides in the case completed offering evidence with the adjournment of court Wednesday afternoon and the forenoon of Thursday was devoted to argument by the attorneys.

There are seven attorneys in the case. Doss & Roynton, of this city, and Judge F. L. Snodgrass, of Coleman, represent the plaintiff, H. T. Hodge, and Parish & Crager, of this city, and Wright & Harris, of San Angelo, represent the defendant, S. A. B. Hamilton. Judge W. A. Wright closed the argument for the defense and Judge Snodgrass closed for the plaintiff.

In addition to the suit filed by Hodge to force the contract of sale in which the plaintiff alleges defendant sold him the Fo-to-sho Theatre and building, the defendant filed a cross action to recover damages from the plaintiff on account of plaintiff suing out a writ of sequestration and closing the theatre for about one month. The questions passed up to the jury to decide include the question of damages and the question of whether Hamilton made delivery of deed to the property, which the plaintiff alleges was signed and delivered to him to be placed in the bank with plaintiff's check for \$5,000 pending approval of the title by attorneys. It was after the deed had been placed in the bank that plaintiff alleges defendant undertook to call the deal off.

WORLD SERIES IS TIED AGAIN

In today's game the Giants scored their lone run in the first inning when they touched Zachary for two hits. With two men out and two men on bases in the fifth inning, Harris of the Senators, swatted a double, bringing in Washington's two runs.

FIRE DAMAGE MILLION DOLLARS STILL RAGING

CONROE, Tex., Oct. 9.—Fire which broke out in the plant of the Delta Land and Timber Company here this morning had done damage estimated at \$1,000,000 by noon, and was still raging unchecked.

The entire property, valued at \$3,000,000, is threatened and will be destroyed if the fire is not checked. Hundreds of men are fighting the blaze.

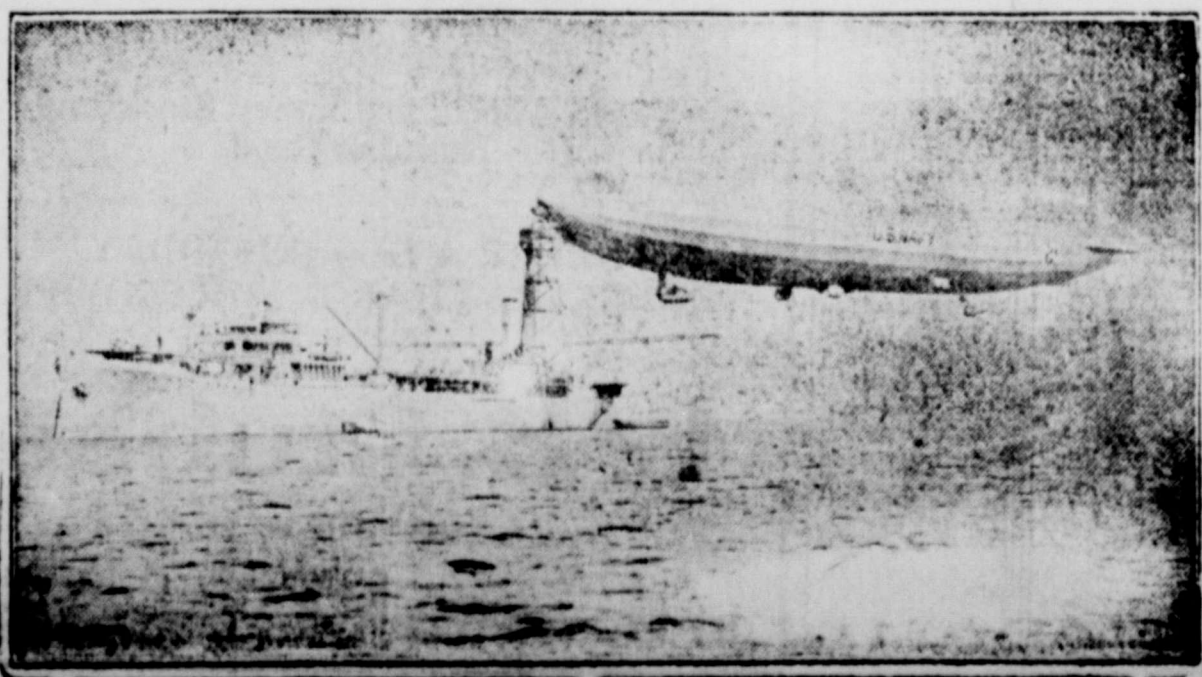

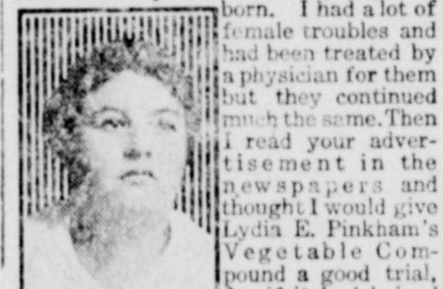

a quaint Algerian community, Bert Lytell being the secret buyer of the beautiful female slave.

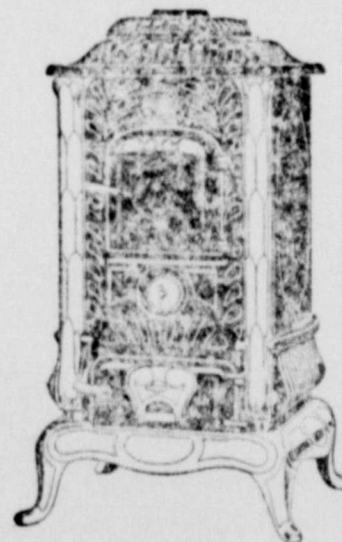

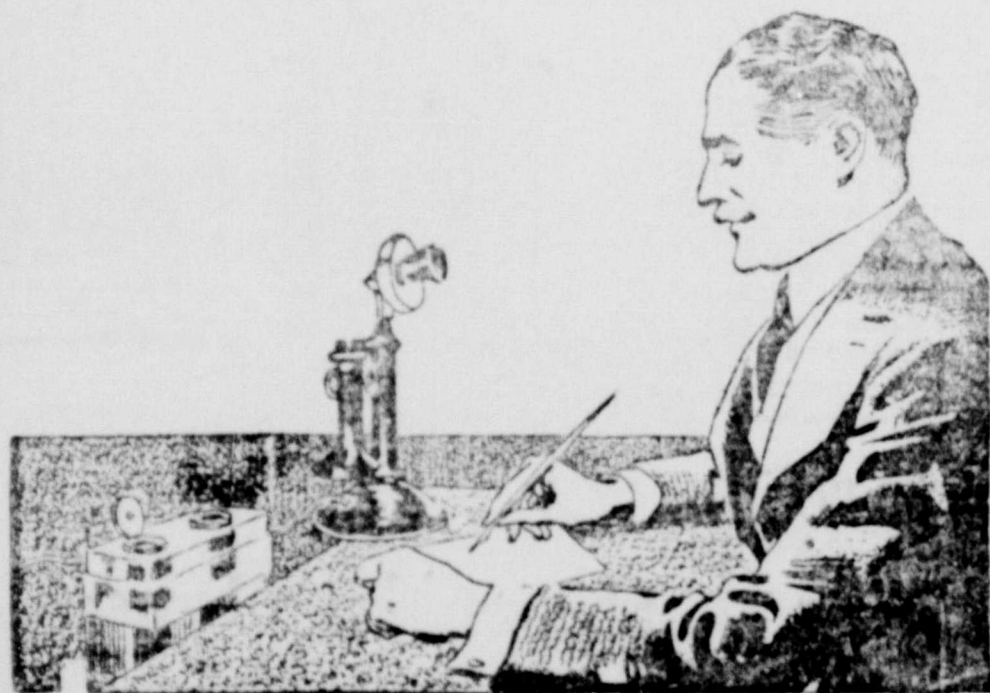

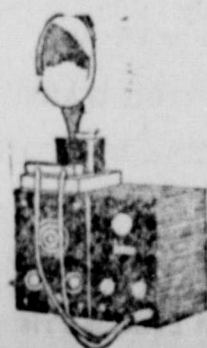
