I'm going to take a moment to explain a few questions to readers. These questions are the ones most commonly asked by people we come in contact with. I'm sure there are more questions about why and what we do...if so, please, drop us a line or give us a call and we promise to answer your questions!

The MOST frequently asked question is why it costs more to send a paper outside of Titus, Lamar or Red River County.

That is directly due to the postage rates we must pay to mail papers. Although a 25¢ stamp will send a letter anywhere in the nation, it's not that way with second class mailing. Where the paper is going to, if it is bundled with six or more to the same zip code and many other regulations have a bearing on what it costs to mail papers.

It is much, much higher to mail a paper out of the county in which there is an office than to mail it within that county. Also, the heavier a paper is the more it costs to mail.

We rolled and threw the papers a few weeks ago just to sample copy everyone we could. Sample copy is when we give people free papers, whether they subscribe or not.

The second question concerns why we have had an increase in price. Well, that's just like anything else now-days. Our costs have gone up, way up, and we have to increase our prices to keep up with our bills.

Our cost of printing, our postage prices, and salaries, our phone bills, electric bills, they just keep going up. We still think that less than 20¢ per week is mighty reasonable, though!

Another question concerns why some news articles appear and some events go without coverage. There is only one reason for that. If we don't know about something...we can't print it.

Although we try hard to keep on top of things, we can't read minds or know everything in an area that is going on. Therefore, we need help. All it takes is a phone call or a brief message to let us know about a special youth meeting, an upcoming fundraiser or just who visited!

We have never intentionally left out a news item that we received yet!

Some weeks we have to leave out a picture or two, then run them the next week.

That's because we have to have a little over 50% advertising to do anything more than break even on our publications.

In straight talk that means that we just cannot add two pages to the paper in order to cram everything in if the ads aren't there to support it. Adding two pages costs big money when it comes to paying for our printing job, more money when it comes to mailing.

Subscriptions pay more mailing, but very little more! All the other bills must be paid for advertising.

Sometimes we can't find people to cover things like junior high school basketball. There is no way that we can attend the dozens and dozens of sports events that take place at our schools. We depend on the good people who help out by donating little of their time to write up stories.

We pay for coverage of major games, but that's about all we can. An average football season costs us about \$600!

These are a few of the questions that we are asked. We hope this explains why we do some things the way we do. If you have other questions...hey, just give us a call, drop us a line or yell at us across the street!

Below Zero Temps Freeze Pipes, Cause Havoc

It was a record cold. The mercury plunged to an all-time low of 4 below zero. Some thermometers registered 6 below, some 2, but the official opinion opted for the 4.

Accompanied by blaring winds that drove the windchill factor to about 40 below, it was weather such as this area seldom sees.

People struggled into heavy layers of clothing, tried hard to keep drafts sealed out and huddled as close to the fire as possible. Those with animals to feed were kept busy, and Christmas shopping became difficult as breath froze on scarves and coat collars!

The arctic cold front brought no moisture with it, and already dry ground proved poor insulation for

underground pipes.

Along with a lack of warmth, frozen water lines proved the biggest discomfort, with few businesses or households escaping without water to a least one portion or another of structures freezing up.

There were combinations of totally frozen all over the house, partially frozen, hot water frozen, or only cold water frozen.

But that was by far the least worry of all.

The real headache occurred when the weather began to warm up! That's when the pipes began to burst.

Major water lines in towns occurred, causing water departments to shut off water while they tried to

repair the lines. Digging in frozen ground certainly was an unpleasant and difficult task.

Sensor equipment to water towers froze up, and that further complicated the water department's jobs during the cold spell.

Leaks in walls, under foundations, out in yards and anywhere else that water pipes burst kept homeowners and plumbers busy Christmas day and the days after as they endeavored to put right what cold weather had put wrong!

With typical Texas aplomb old man winter then proceeded to turn his back for a while, leaving the area in the grip of a sunny warm spell that was not unwelcome after the bitter temperatures.

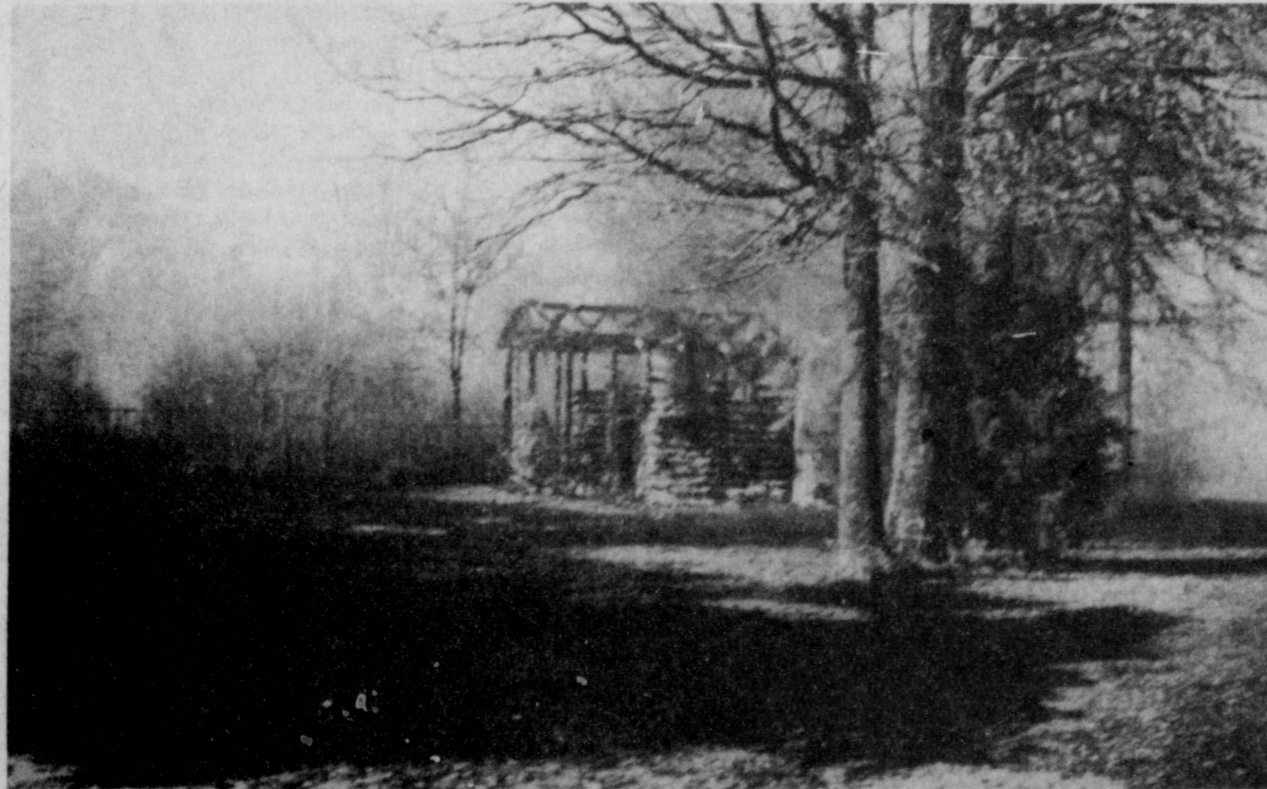

Burning Can Be Expensive!

Burning trash, dumping ashes or causing a fire by carelessness has resulted in thousands of acres burning off this winter. A number of homes, barns and other structures have been destroyed, and the cost of fighting these fires has to be covered some way, whether by taxes, donations or fund raisers.

Since many people still aren't paying attention, it has been pointed out that these fires might even be expensive to those who set them.

There is a state law that people who cause damage to other's property through carelessly setting fires can have a civil suit brought against them for damages!

It is estimated that 75% of these fires could be avoided!

Trash build up, especially with Christmas wrappings and boxes, is certainly a problem. But with the dry conditions currently prevailing, one tiny spark is all it takes to create a raging grass fire whipping in front of high winds.

Many people just don't realize how easy these fires are to start right now. They think they are taking proper precautions by watching their trash until it dies down some. But one gust of wind and a floating spark is all it takes to set a fire that can hours to bring under control. Volunteer fire departments have gone out almost daily for over a month...many times they have gone out as much as 4 or 5 times a day.

Please, until there is a change in the dry conditions, don't burn. It is expensive to someone, somewhere...and could cost someone everything they own!

Extremely Dry Conditions Create Fire Hazards, Damage Plants

With one of the worst winter droughts on record occurring right now, fire conditions could not get much worse. Local volunteer fire departments answer multiple calls daily to grass fires, woods fires or even house fires.

The bitter cold has resulted in leaching all moisture from grass and brush, and the slightest spark sets off flames whipped by high winds.

In spite of repeated warnings, people continue to burn trash, a major cause of these grass fires.

While winter drought is, of course,

less serious to agriculture than summer drought, it's still a problem.

Another drought-related problem is damage to shrubs, plants and bulbs.

Without the usual winter moisture many plantings will be dead by spring. It is advisable, experts say, to water trees, shrubs and flower beds with perennials or bulbs in order to save them.

Winter wheat is suffering from the severe shortage of moisture, and stock ponds are steadily getting lower.

It can only be hoped that rain will come soon to relieve this problem.

Letter To The Editor

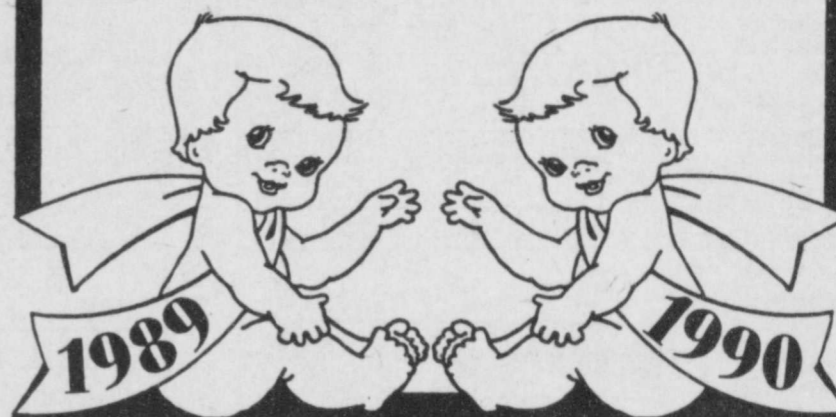
Dear Editor,

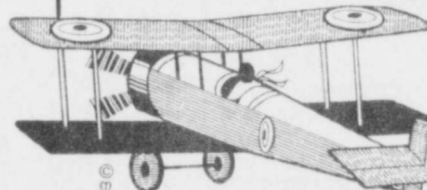

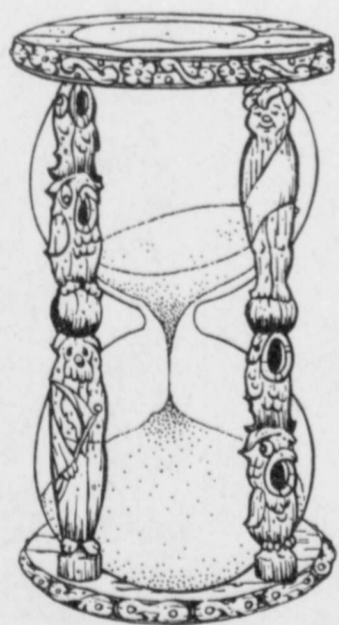

There would have been no virtue in the innkeeper making room if he had known that there was something important about the humble family he put into a stable...and things have not changed today.

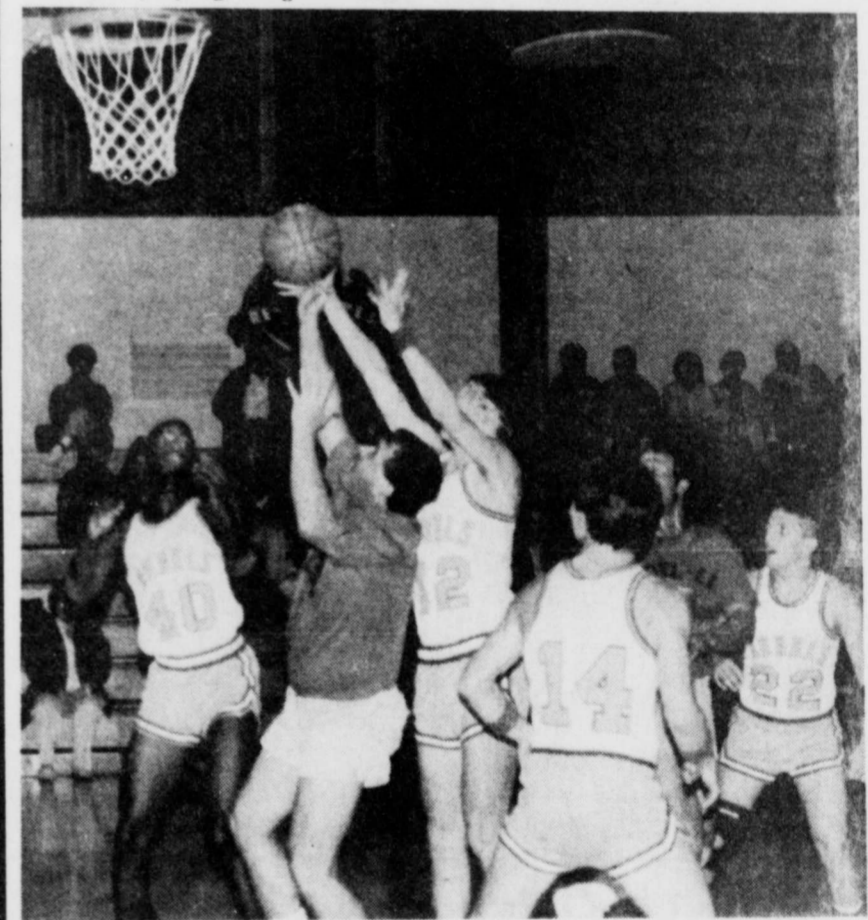

Action Oriented Therapy Program Presented At Bogata School

Cindy Phillips, MS, LPC, from Dallas, presented a program "Why Parents Need Help Raising Kids In The '90's" to the Bogata Elementary and Junior High School students and faculty last Friday morning.

She stated that, by understanding how values have shifted in society, parents can start to understand reasons for the behavior and how a youth's value system effects their decision making process in the 1990's.

She pointed out that there are stages of value development. In age groups 0-7, imprinting in children and others how they should be expected to act and what is expected of them; 8-13 years, is modeling them to respect

themselves and others, to take pride in their ability to learn the values of others; 14-20 years is socialization.

These years are important to teenagers because they are at the age where they go more places and see how others act.

In Dallas, the average child is picked up at the age of 13 years for some kind of a crime.

Today values on children is peer pressure. Major influences of values come from parents and someone these children idolize. The youth's value system today is first, money, TV, friends, music, school, health, church seems to be the last on the list. Values should be family, church and school.

Phillips pointed out that with so many parents working nowadays, it is difficult to communicate with children, and as a result of peer pressure, parents sometimes expect too much from their children.

Throughout history,
Christmas Day has been a
date on which noteworthy
events have occurred

December 25th is best known, of course, as Christmas—declared centuries ago as the day of Christ's birth. But, while no one can say for certain if accuracy has kept pace with tradition, numerous other noteworthy events have in fact occurred on Christmas Day.

In the year 800 A.D., Charlemagne was crowned Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire by Pope Leo III on Christmas Day. And, in 1066, another world-renowned leader, William the Conqueror, fresh from his success at the Battle of Hastings, ascended the throne of England on December 25th.

Crossing the Atlantic, in 1492, Christopher Columbus's ship, the Santa Maria, landed on the island of Hispaniola, today occupied jointly by Haiti and the Dominican Republic, on Christmas Eve.

Columbus left a colony of his sailors behind and headed back to Spain, convinced he had found not a "new world" but a short cut to the Far East.

One of the most famous occurrences of the American Revolution happened on Christmas evening in 1776, when George Washington and his troops crossed the Delaware River from their encampment in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, into New Jersey.

There was good reason for this—Washington rightly assumed that the Hessian troops employed by the British and ensconced across the river would be in the midst of celebrations and therefore less alert to forays by the revolutionary army.

Christmas cookie recipes for baking and giving continue a tradition which is distinctly American

Across the country, and around the world, every family that celebrates Christmas keeps its own special traditions. A tradition that seems a part of

every Christmas celebration is a Christmas cookie exchange.

The baking and giving of Christmas cookies is a custom popular in many countries. In fact, the American tradition of baking cookies for friends and family (and Santa) is based on those traditions brought over by our ancestors... especially those from the Scandinavian countries and Germany. But, the addition of candies and nut breads to those holiday baking traditions is distinctly American.

It is the custom in most countries to create the prettiest cookies and treats of the year at Christmastime. Taking the time to decorate a cookie, make a special candy or create a tasty nut bread for dear friends, is a traditional way of telling them that they are treasured.

The home economists at Oster recommend that busy cooks make their specialties ahead of time and freeze them. Another time-saving tip for this busy season: Combine old traditions with new... give a pretty cookie tin that contains

homemade treats and purchased bakery delights. Then, even busy cooks can continue this cherished Christmas tradition.

Sprinkle top of cookies with sugar. Bake in preheated 375°F oven for 10 minutes. Cool on wire rack. Decorate as desired.
Yield: 3 dozen cookies.

CRANBERRY ORANGE NUT BREAD

- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 1 tablespoon grated orange peel
- 1/4 cup soft shortening
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 1 cup whole pecans or walnuts
- 1 cup fresh cranberries, sliced

Preheat oven to 350°F. In large mixer bowl, combine dry ingredients. Add juice, peel, shortening and egg, mix at a low speed until well blended. Stir in nuts and cranberries.

Put into a greased 9x5x3 inch pan. Bake 55-60 minutes. Cool slightly before removing from pan.

Remove from pan and finish cooling on wire rack.
Yield: 1 loaf.

OLD FASHIONED FUDGE

- 2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 squares (2 oz.) unsweetened chocolate
- 2 tablespoons light corn syrup
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts, optional

Butter a 9x5x3 inch loaf pan. Combine sugar, milk, chocolate, corn syrup and salt in a 3 quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat until sugar is dissolved, stirring constantly.

Bring to a boil and continue to cook until mixture reaches 238°F, or until a small amount of mixture forms a soft ball when dropped into cold water.

Remove from heat. Add butter, but do not stir. Cool to 110°F. Do not disturb pan. (Bottom of pan will feel lukewarm). Pour mixture into small mixer bowl.

Add vanilla extract and beat at a medium speed until mixture loses its gloss and holds its shape. Add nuts if desired and spread into prepared pan.
Cool and cut into squares.
Yield: 1 pound.

MOLASSES GINGERBREAD CUTOUTS

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup vegetable shortening
- 1 egg
- 1 1/4 cup molasses
- 4 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- Sugar

In large mixing bowl, cream together sugar, shortening and egg at a medium speed until fluffy. Add molasses, mix until combined. Stir together flour, salt, soda and spices. Add to mixing bowl and mix at a low speed until well combined. Refrigerate 2 hours.

Roll out on floured surface to 1/8" thickness. Cut with shaped cookie cutters. Place on greased cookie sheet.

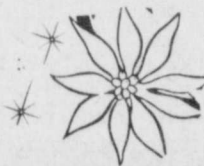
