District Convention Honors Won By Eastland Club Women

Members of the four federated clubs in Eastland helped win honors for Eastland in the thirty-ninth convention of Sixth District, Texas Federation of Women's Clubs, in Brownwood, April 5th and 6th.

Mrs. M. A. Treadwell of Thursday Afternoon Club was named Outstanding Young Woman from Sixth District. She will represent the district in the state contest at Mineral Wells for the 1954 Texas club woman. The requirements stated that the club representative

had to be a woman who had been a member of the club sending in her name not more than ten years and at least two years. She had to have a definite project and had to be doing outstanding work. The Thursday Afternoon Club's report to the convention noted that Mrs. Treadwell, the wife of a doctor, is the mother of three children, one of whom was born this year. Her project was the library. She has materially increased the number of children's books in the li-

brary. She was sponsor of the Children's Story Hour on Saturday. She was the hostess for the five-county Medical Auxiliary tea which showed cancer films and chairman of a mental hygiene tea with women of the community invited. She is an accomplished musician and with her husband is active in the Eastland Baptist Church.

The Thursday Afternoon Club received an award for having 100 per cent subscriptions to Texas Club Woman. It was one of 35 organizations in this district which had every club member reading Texas Club Woman, their magazine.

Mrs. Hart Shoemaker awarded the Thursday Afternoon Club \$5 for having the most women representatives who stayed through the entire convention. There were twenty representatives from the Thursday Afternoon Club and eight of them stayed for the entire convention. The federated clubs in Eastland are Las Leales, Civic League and Garden Club, the Alpha Delphians, and the Thursday Afternoon Club, all of whom had representatives in Brownwood.

Mrs. James Horton, a member of Thursday Afternoon Club and an appointive member to the executive committee, was named first vice-president of the officers of the Sixth District. Other Eastland women on the district board are Mrs. Joseph Perkins who was re-elected to the board of trustees, Mrs. Frank Castleberry who is chairman of the public affairs committee, and Mrs. Harold H. Durham who is a member of the education department.

Mrs. Horace Horton gave the Civic League and Garden Club report to the convention, and Mrs. Frank Castleberry gave the Thursday Afternoon report.

Mrs. Frank Castleberry also reported that Mrs. L. E. Dudley, president of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs, and a resident of Abilene, along with Mrs. Hart Shoemaker, Abilene, president of Sixth District, TFWC, have accepted Thursday Afternoon's invitation to be guests on Play Day when the members go to Charles Pettit's Flattop Ranch at Walnut Springs, May 20th.

Mrs. L. W. Leach, conducting the program, said, "Freezing is one of the simplest and least time consuming ways to preserve foods at home." She gave the five points to success in freezing foods as: (1) selection of good quality foods; (2) speedy but careful preparation; (3) proper packaging; (4) loading the freezer; (5) length of storage. Mrs. Leach showed different types of containers and wrapping material.

To demonstrate proper methods of cooking frozen foods, Mrs. Leach prepared a meal consisting of frozen foods. The menu consisted of veal scallopi, green lima, rolls, and frozen delight, and the drink, Grapefruit for the ladies and a special treat for the children, the Easter candies.

A short business meeting preceded the demonstration with Mrs. Robert Kincaid, the president, in charge.

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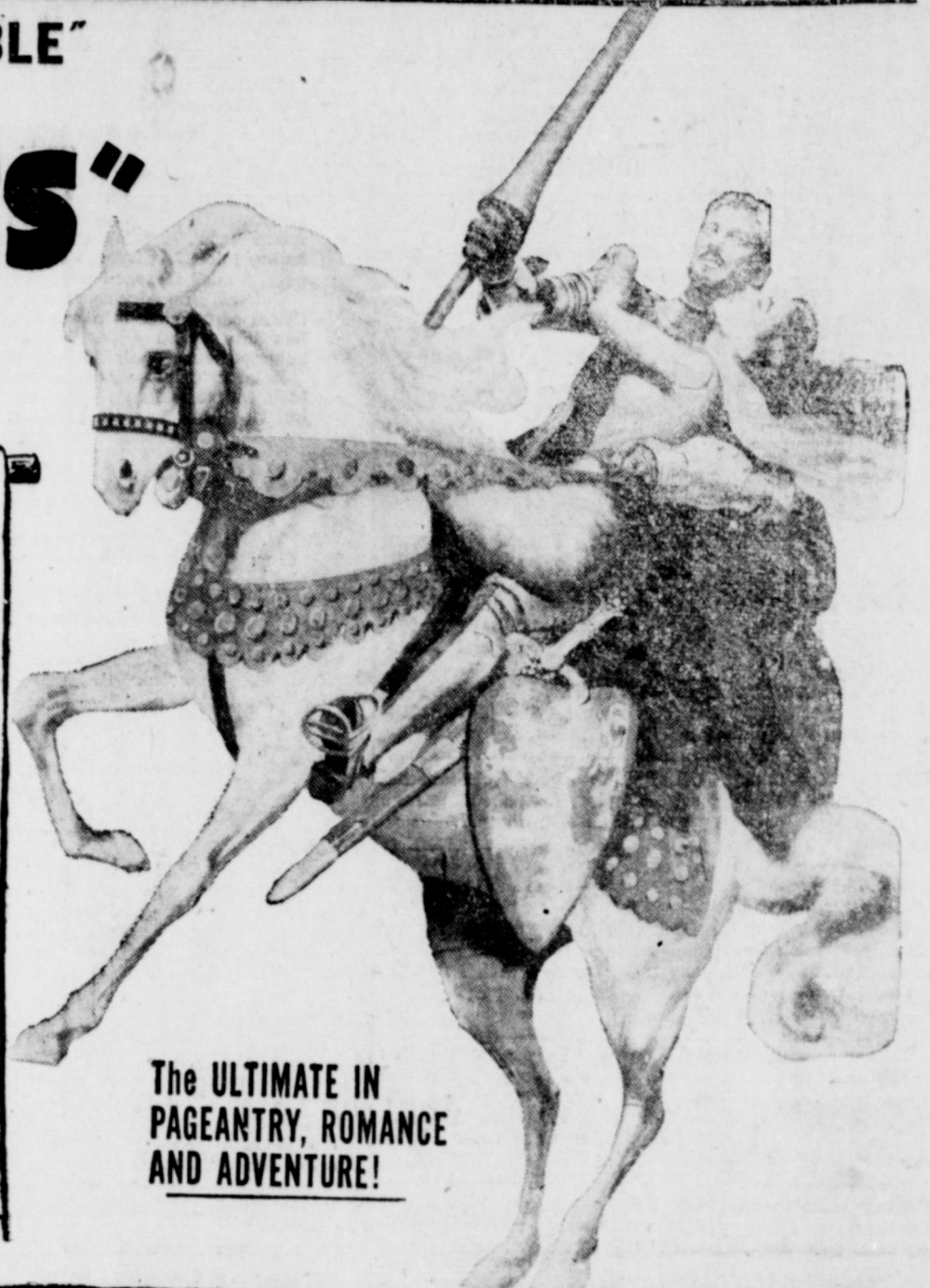
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
