The service agents are Mrs. John Love and Richard Fletcher. Betty Fletcher is the office secretary, and the reporter is Mrs. Glenn Justice.

Included among the activities to be held this year are the annual barbecue dinner, the queen contest, a membership drive and

a citizenship contest, Mr. Justice said.

STRENGTHEN SMALL TOWNS

John F. Kennedy is getting plenty of advice these days, no doubt; maybe too much. But there is one piece of advice he needs brought to his attention again and again until the message becomes part of his permanent philosophy — and that is: What America needs most of all is to strengthen the economy of its small towns.

The cities will eventually get in shape to take care of themselves, if the small towns prosper. City living is so much less desirable than small town living, there is no question that the American people will be best served if the small towns are secured. There is nothing so typically American as the small town. Large cities are found everywhere, but the small town is almost exclusively American. Villages are found in Europe and Latin America, but villages are strictly and completely agricultural communities and usually one-crop communities, existing merely to collect farmers together.

But small towns are another matter entirely. They are often agricultural in part; perhaps, the farmer is inevitably more important to the small town than he is to the city. But that is not by any means the whole story

of the small town. The small town, in a word, is home; it is the American way of life; it is the combination of country and city. As such it has in the history of America developed the talents of citizens in every line of endeavor, not excluding the arts.

Statistics imply that the small town is suffering in this day and age. Therein lies the challenge for the future. And if the government is actually able to help America in any substantial way town.

If anyone knew exactly what should be done, and how much of the effort should be private and how much governmental, he would be in position to render the greatest possible service to America, and possibly all mankind. If any such have the formula, let him come forth with it right away.

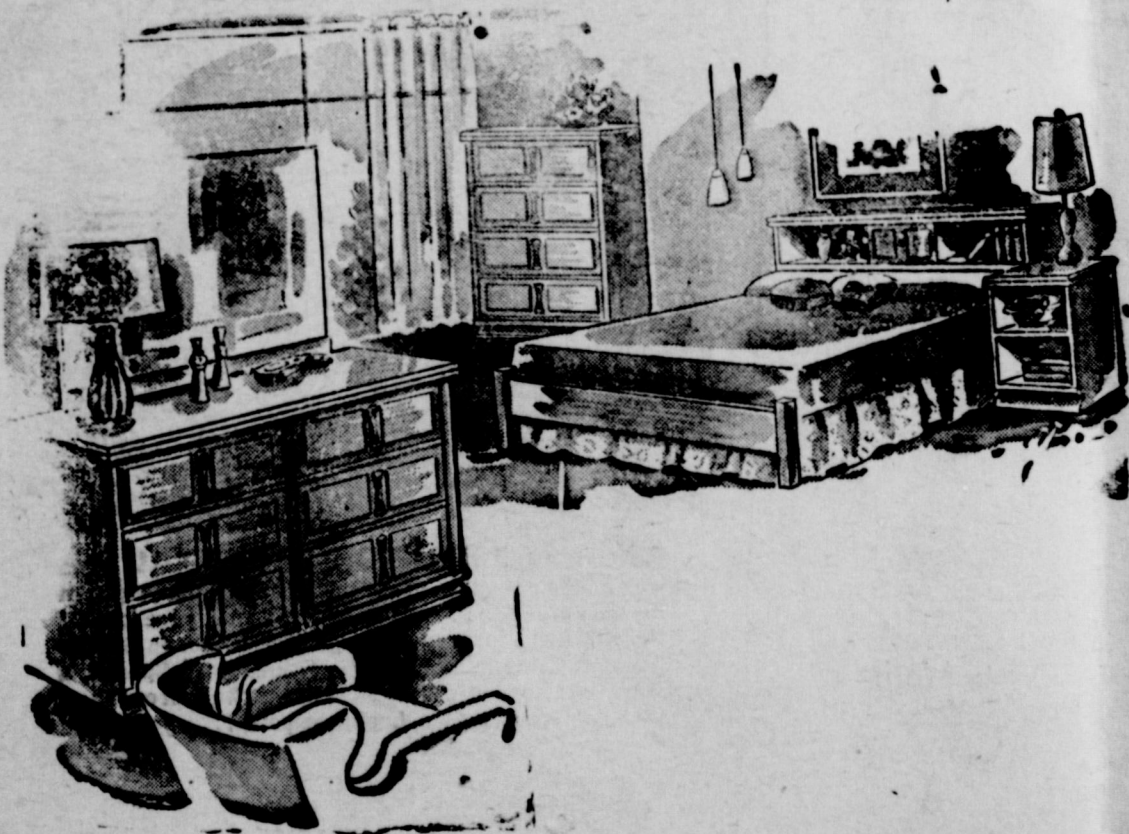
