Don Meredith To Speak At C. of C. Banquet

Abernathy School To Provide New Service

The Abernathy Public Schools were recently approved, by the American Council on Education, to become an official testing agency for the General Educational Development Test.

The G.E.D., as it is commonly referred to, is an equivalency test for the high school diploma. Most governmental agencies, including the Veteran's Administration, will accept it in lieu of a high school diploma. Some colleges and universities will permit veterans and non-veteran adults (including women) to enroll for cou-

se credit by presenting evidence of successful completion of the G.E.D.

Almost all large industry accepts in lieu of the high school diploma. The G.E.D. test is composed of five sub-tests and one may spend as long as two hours on each test.

The Abernathy schools offer this test as another service to the adults of this community. The test fee or cost is \$15.00. A screening test will be given each adult before he or she actually takes the test. Interested adults may contact the school guidance counselor.

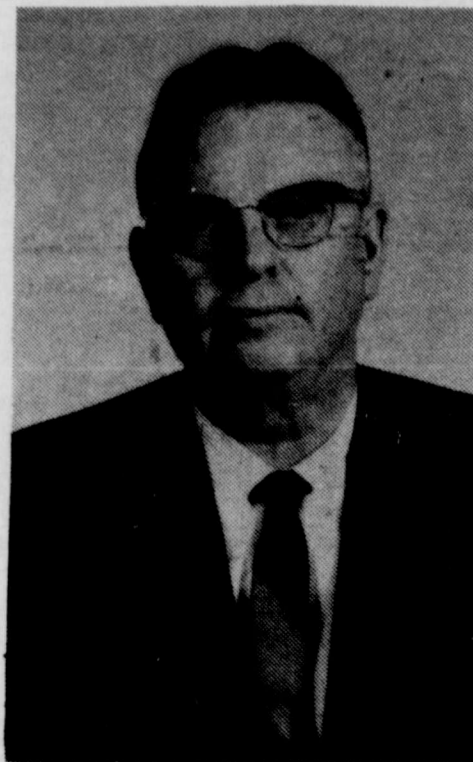

Soil Conservation Practices Noted In This Area

J. W. Harris, owner of a 1/2 section of land located 1 mile west of Abernathy and Hilburn Barrick, operator of this farm are believers in Soil and Water Conservation. They practice what they believe.

To prove this they have built 26,912 ft. of parallel terraces; established a 7 acre waterway to western wheat grass to prevent water erosion from runoff from the terraces. They have seeded a 33 acre field to sideoats grama grass. This field was very steep and subject to water erosion.

Technical assistance was furnished by Soil Conservation Service employees to layout the work and supervise construction. Cost-Share assistance for the installation of the conservation practices was received through the Great Plains Conservation Program.

Ride out by this farm and take a look at a very good job being done to conserve our most valuable asset, our soil and water. These men are to be congratulated on a job well done.
