NATURE'S VERY OWN VARIETY SHOW - Sunshine and climbing temperatures made Tuesday a special fun day to enjoy. Hart schools, like almost every school in the Panhandle-South Plains area, had a weather holiday Monday because of the heavy snowfall.

Longhorns Trampled Friday By District Rival Horns

Hart traveled to Vega last Friday to play in the season finale for both squads. Vega took control early and used the big plays to down the visiting Longhorns by the score of 41-0.

The Hart Longhorns could not get untracked in their final game of the 1980 football campaign. Hart never really threatened and the Vega defense kept the usually potent Longhorns in tack.

On the other side of the field, the Vega Longhorns used a tough running game along with some timely passing to move the ball up and down the Longhorns from Hart.

Vega scored three times in the first quarter, and after three successful PAT's by Fred Fangman, Vega led 21-0. Scotty Cook passed 34 yards to Rick Jones for the first score with 10:30 showing on the clock. At 7:36 in the first period, Fangman dove over from the one for their second score. With .50 seconds remaining in the opening quarter, Cook ran for three yards to move the score to 21-0 after only one quarter of play.

Hart's defense tightened up in the second quarter, but with 6:32 left in the period, Vega's Rick Jones raced 69 yards around right end for the fourth Vega TD of the night. Fangman added the PAT to up the count to 28-0 in favor of Vega.

Hart managed to move to Vega's 37 yard line on runs by Daniel Guzman and Manuel Castenada, but an incomplete pass on fourth down stopped the Longhorn drive.

The half ended with Vega on top by

the score of 28-0.

Hart received the second half kickoff and on the second scrimmage play Guzman broke for 65 yards down to Vega's 3 yard line. However, offsetting penalties brought the ball back to the original line of scrimmage. This play seemed to do away with any hopes of a Hart Longhorn comeback.

On Vega's first possession of the second half, Cook directed a good drive, with Cook, himself, going the final 41 yards for the score. The PAT was no good so with 7:38 left in the third quarter, Vega now led 34-0.

Vega began their last drive late in the third quarter and with 11:56 remaining in the game, Brad Cannon scored Vega's final touchdown of the night. Fangman delivered his fifth PAT of the night to make the score 41-0.

Hart drove to Vega's 40 yard line late in the game, but a fumble ended the last chance for a Hart Longhorn score.

The final score read Vega 41-Hart 0. This was the first time all year that Hart was shut out on the scoreboard.

This was the last game for 10 Hart Longhorns Kevin Belt, Chad Black, Manuel Castenada, Jesse Gonzales, Dave Ingram, Benny McLain, Augustin Perez, Isaias Ponce, Danny Rodriguez and Santos Valenzuela.

Hart ends the year at 4-5-1 and 2-3 in district play. Vega concludes with an 8-2 season and 3-2 in district play. Springlake-Earth finishes the season with a perfect 10-0 year and 5-0 in district 3-AA.

Hart Band Director Thomson, To Be Featured Solist Monday

"Because the Plainview High School Band won the UIL marching competition earlier this month, it will

be marching in Austin Nov. 24 and Burks, assistant band director at PHS will be in Austin with them," said Dale Daniels, conductor of PCO.

"We regret Mr. Burks will not be able to be the trumpet soloist for this concert but we congratulate the PHS band on winning this important marching contest," said Daniels.

Boyd is a 1971 graduate of Plainview High School where he won the Outstanding Musician Award in 1971. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education Degree with emphasis in trumpet (cum laude) from Baylor University.
