Westbrook advances to area competition

The Westbrook Wildcats have been in the Class A state basketball play-offs four of the last five years but have never advanced any farther than round one of the Bi-District game, until now...the Wildcats will advance to the Area competition as they defeated the Ira Bulldogs by a score of 75-59 in Highland on February 21 by playing a "tenacious, swarming defense," commented Westbrook Coach Jim Hill.

Although using defense to win the play-off game, the Wildcats were having their problems early on in the first period.

The 'Cats got on the scoreboard quickly in the beginning moments of the game, but Ira would go on to take a 10-4 lead before Coach Hill was in a position to call a time-out to reorganize his troops.

After falling behind, the defense began to pick up and managed to cut the lead to one thanks in part to Spencer Cannon who added a bucket with :02 seconds remaining in the period to make the score 12-11.

With the momentum going into the second period, Westbrook wasted no time as Bubba Botts hit a twelve foot jumper to give the Wildcats their first lead since the early seconds of the opening quarter, 18-17.

The Mitchell County Grand Jury returned 11 indictments and two no-bills on Friday, February 22. Nine of the indictments were sealed.

Commissioners hear illiteracy statistics

The Commissioners' Court of Mitchell County met in called meeting on Friday morning, February 22, and heard from representatives of the Mitchell County Literacy Council.

Louree Upton asked the court to consider that the Mitchell County Librarian be given the authority to sign grant requests for the Literacy Council.

She presented, in defense of that proposal, a recently submitted grant application which had been refused for not meeting the required deadline, and said she thought that the ability of the librarian to sign the applications rather than waiting for a meeting of the Commissioners' Court would circumvent any further such problems.

Members, however, agreed that it would probably not be legal to so obligate the County.

They said they would request final clarification from the county attorney, but that they felt they would have to be consulted regarding any matter which in any way involved tax expenditures.

Members did, however, agree to accommodate the Literacy Council's needs by holding called or emergency meetings, if required, in order to authorize grant applications in a timely manner, and avoid disapprovals of those

applications based on missed deadlines.

Ms. Upton gave members of the court some information about the work the Literacy Council is doing, and about the need for such work in the area.

She said there is a surprising amount of illiteracy in the area, and that the council is in need of more volunteer tutors.

According to U.S. Department of Commerce figures, Ms. Upton said after the meeting, based on a recent state legislative task force, approximately a third of the population of Mitchell County has at least some degree of illiteracy. Figures in Nolan, Scurry, and Howard Counties reflect the same trend, she said.

She told the court that the Literacy Council has long-range plans which include hopes for securing a grant which will pay for a program coordinator, books, supplies, and eventually more workers and further growth.

In other business on Friday, members discussed the potential need for eventual redistricting, and agreed to consider the possibility that it may be necessary.

Newly enacted legislation dictates that every county must compare its 1990 census population to its existing commissioner precinct boundaries and determine if the population variation exceeds constitutional limits of approximately 10 percent from See C-COURT, page 2
