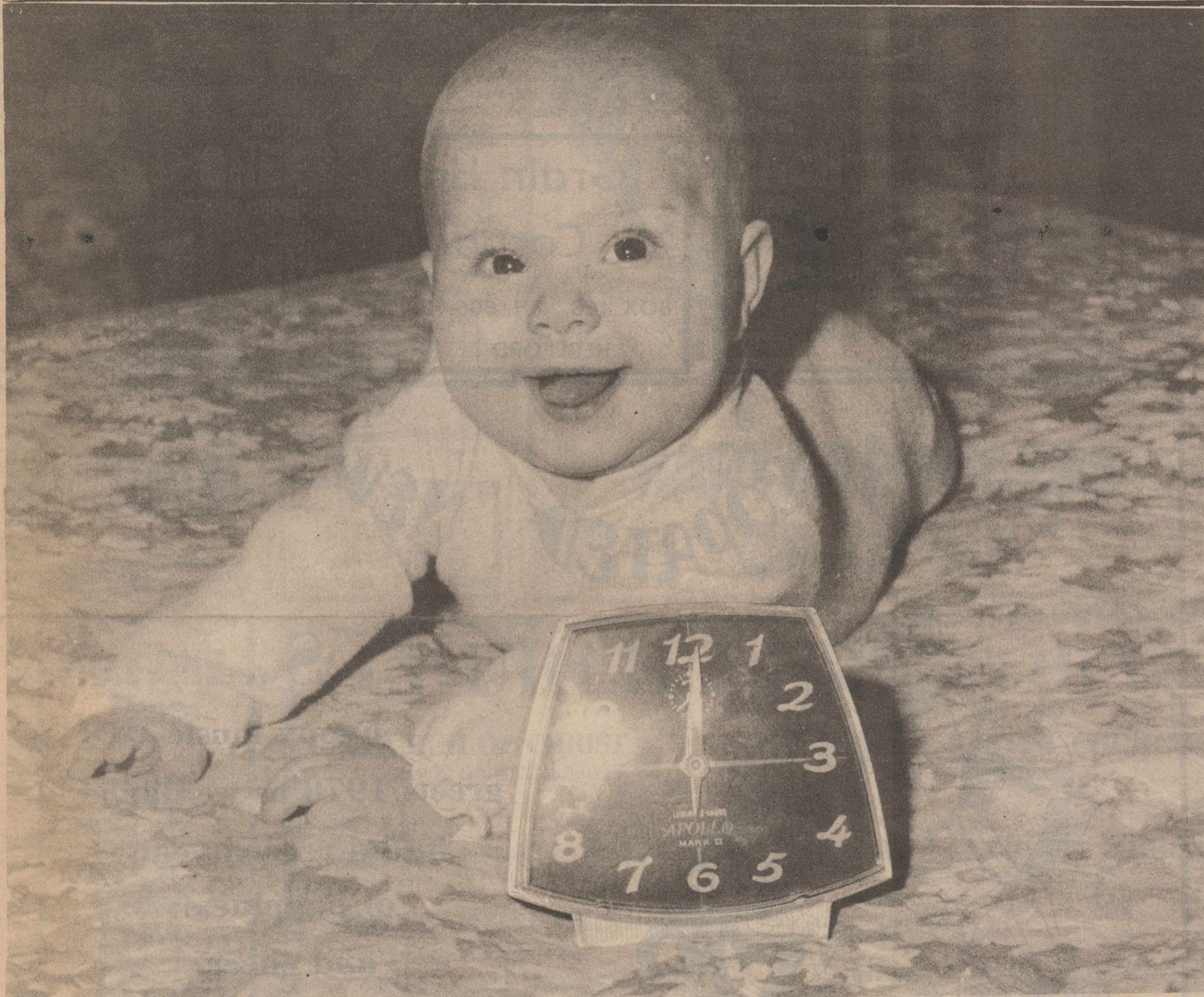

The Year 1977

JANUARY

Lonny Rhynes, was assigned Castro County Deputy in Hart. Rhynes was to assume duties Jan. 1. The Hale Center native was city marshal from Dec. 1974 to Aug. 1975.

The Longhorn Basketball team won second in a post holiday Amarillo tournament. The varsity girls won second in the Amarillo tournament, and won a consolation trophy in an Olton Tournament.

The School Board members discussed the school plant and faculty needs for the next five

years. Top priorities discussed were a new auditorium, new lights for elementary and many other new projects.

Everette Heller was ranked high among area corn growers enrolled in a national corn growing program. Heller's crop yield 209.3 bushels per acre.

Newly organized Hart Jaycees had a banquet Jan. 17 and installed new officers. Fifty four Jaycees and wives were in attendance. One of the first projects was undertaken to

raise money for the High Plains Gas Users.

Vic Hart won Reserve Grand Champion Lamb at the Amarillo Fat Stock Show. The 120 lb. Suffolk sold to Cloth World of Amarillo for \$3.74 per lb.

The Hart eighth grade boys and girls began to prepare for a basketball tournament scheduled in Hart.

Classes for adults were announced to have been rescheduled.

FEBRUARY

Kelly Jones won Grand Champion Barrow in the Hereford Fat Stock Show. Kelly's Duroc weighed 213 lbs. Larry and Marlin Marble exhibited Reserve Champion in the Cross Barrow.

A dance was held Feb. 5 to benefit for the Heart Fund. Admission would be a donation with all proceeds going to the American Heart Association.

The teachers of Castro County met in Hart. Approximately 150 attended and enjoyed a Mexican Fiesta

dinner.

Dancers and spectators which joined to help raise money for the Heart Association helped raise approximately \$1000.

Jaycees from Hart were to sponsor a volley ball tournament.

Hart Buyers Club met Feb. 14 to see local youth exhibit 58 barrows, 32 lambs and one steer.

Glen Black and Keith Reed were selected as delegates to attend the annual American Legion Boys State for the summer in Austin.

Sharla Carson was selected to play in the East-West All Star game which was played Mar. 19 in Amarillo Civic Center. Named Most Valuable Guard for her performance, she was also named to the All State third team.

Jonalyn Jones was named vice president of Farmers State Bank at the regular board of directors meeting Mar. 16.

Hart High School's annual staff won an "Award of Achievement" for the 1976 Longhorn yearbook.

Bryan Irons was selected as an alternate to play in Texas High School Coaches Association All-Star football game which was played in the summer in the Cotton Bowl in Dallas.

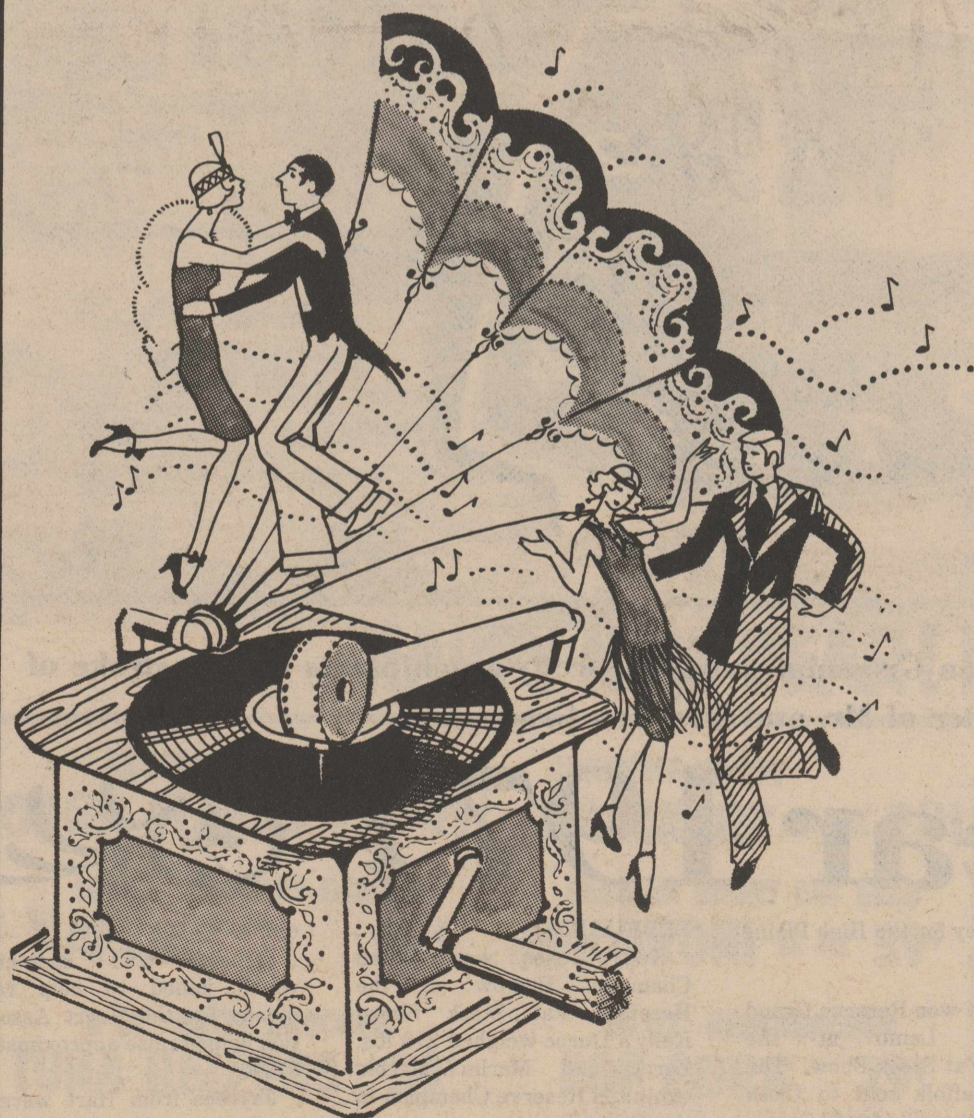

Jana Mapp, with a \$100 scholarship for college.

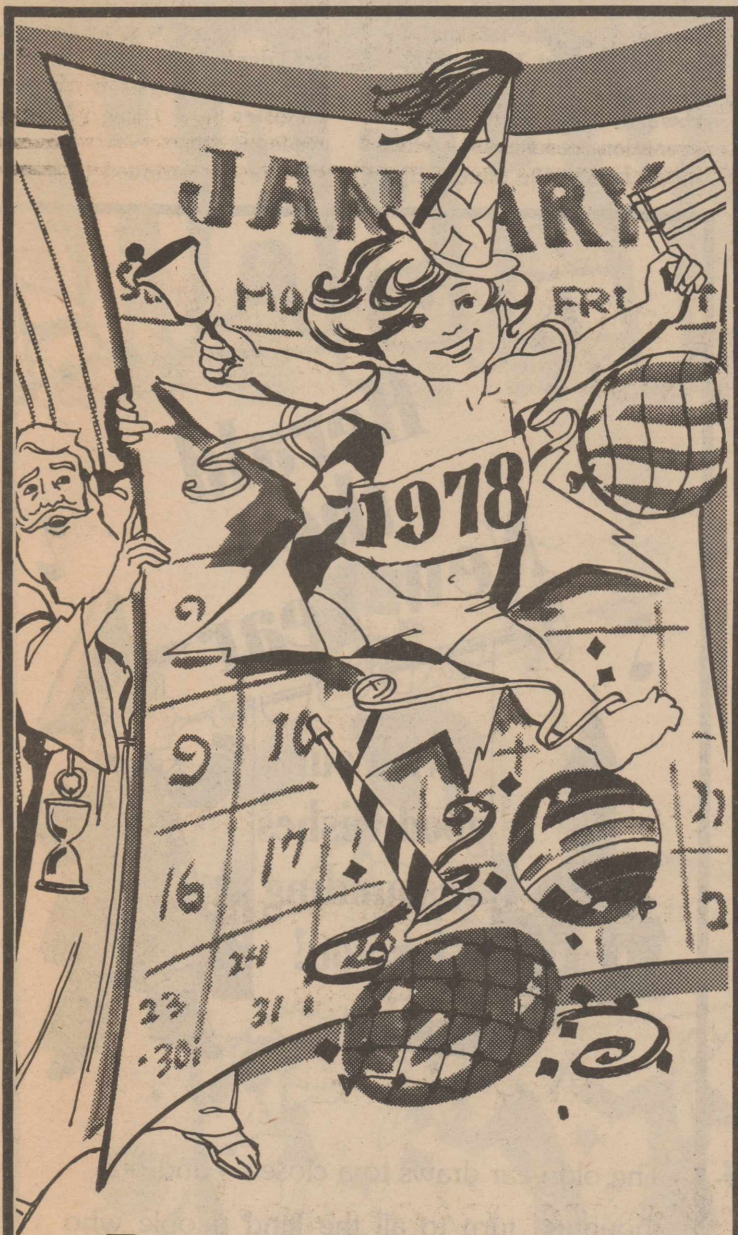

board members voted to change the school calendar which resulted in classes beginning Wednesday, Aug. 24 rather than the previously slated Aug. 18 start.

Kerry George, outstanding Hart High School football player, was one of 62 incoming freshmen to sign letters of intent to play football at Sul Ross University this fall.

In the heaviest voting in Briscoe County history, precincts one and three turned out to condemn cloud seeding by a vote of 430 to three, a margin of 143 to one.

Longtime resident Perry Hart was parade marshal for the annual Hart Day parade.

LuDonne Bonsal was crowned Miss Hart 1977 in coronation ceremonies which helped launch the annual Hart

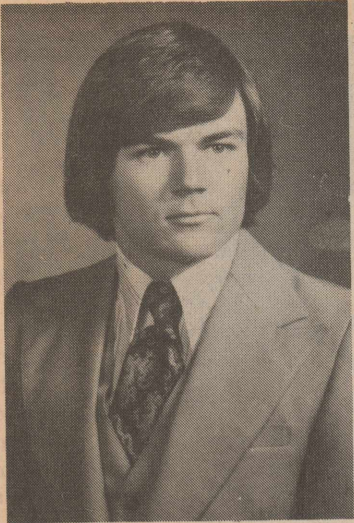

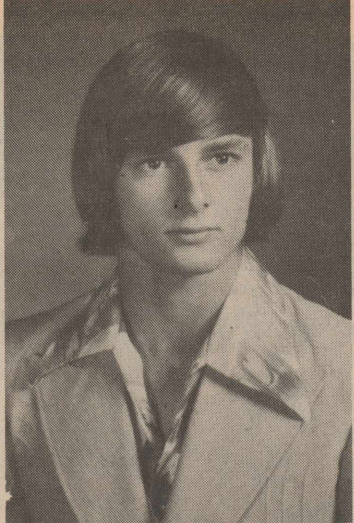

- 1/8 t salt
- 2 t soda

Pour in 13x8 inch pan.

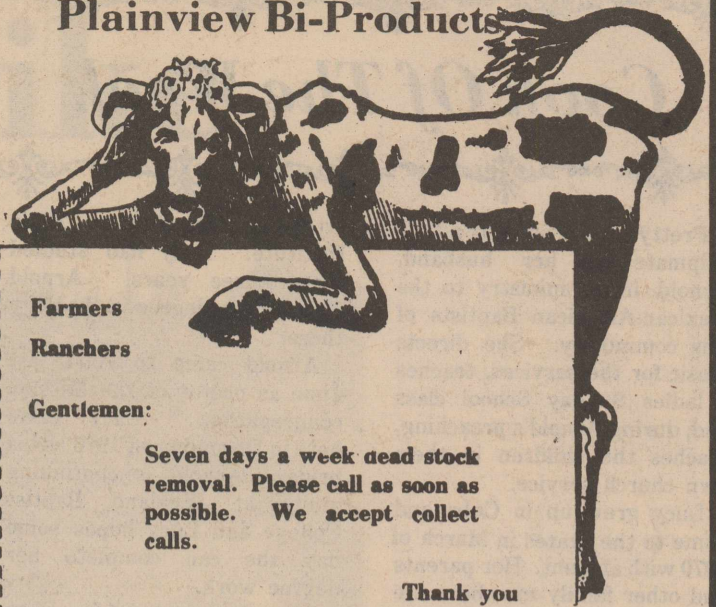
Topping:

Combine 1 c. brown sugar, 1 c. chopped pecans, 1 c. coconut. Mix together and place on top of first mixture. Don't stir. Bake at 325° for 45 minutes.

Icing:

Combine 1 c. sugar, 1 lg. can evaporated milk, 1 stick margarine, 1 t. vanilla. Bring mixture to a boil and cook for two min., pour mixture over slightly cooled cake.

ORANGE-NUT BREAD

- 1 orange
- 1 c raisins
- 1 c pecans
- 1 c hot orange juice
- 1 t soda
- 1 c sugar
- 1 t vanilla
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 c flour, sifted
- 1 t baking powder
- 1/4 t salt

Use sharp knife to peel outer rind from orange. Using finest blade on food grinder, grind rind, raisins and pecans. Put in a bowl, pour in hot orange juice. Beat in soda. Stir in sugar, vanilla, egg and flour sifted with baking powder and salt. Mix well. Bake in a greased loaf pan for 50 minutes at 350°.

STRAWBERRY SALAD

- 2 pkg strawberry Jello
- 2 pkg frozen strawberries
- 1 1/2 c boiling water
- 1 c sour cream
- 1 flat can pineapple drained
- 1/2 c pecans

Dissolve Jello in 1 1/2 cup boiling water. Add frozen strawberries, sour cream and pineapple (drained). Add pecans and mix all ingredients gently. Let it set.

 - 2 c Pet Whip frozen Whipped Topping, thawed
 - 8 oz can crushed pineapple, drained
 - 1/2 c pecans, chopped
 - 1 T milk
 - cherries, chopped, optional
- Cream together sugar and butter. Add egg, vanilla and salt. Beat until smooth and creamy. Spread mixture in baked pie crust shell. Chill. Combine Pet Whip, pineapple,

pecans, milk and cherries until blended. Spread mixture over chilled filling. Chill pie until ready to serve.

- 1 c vinegar

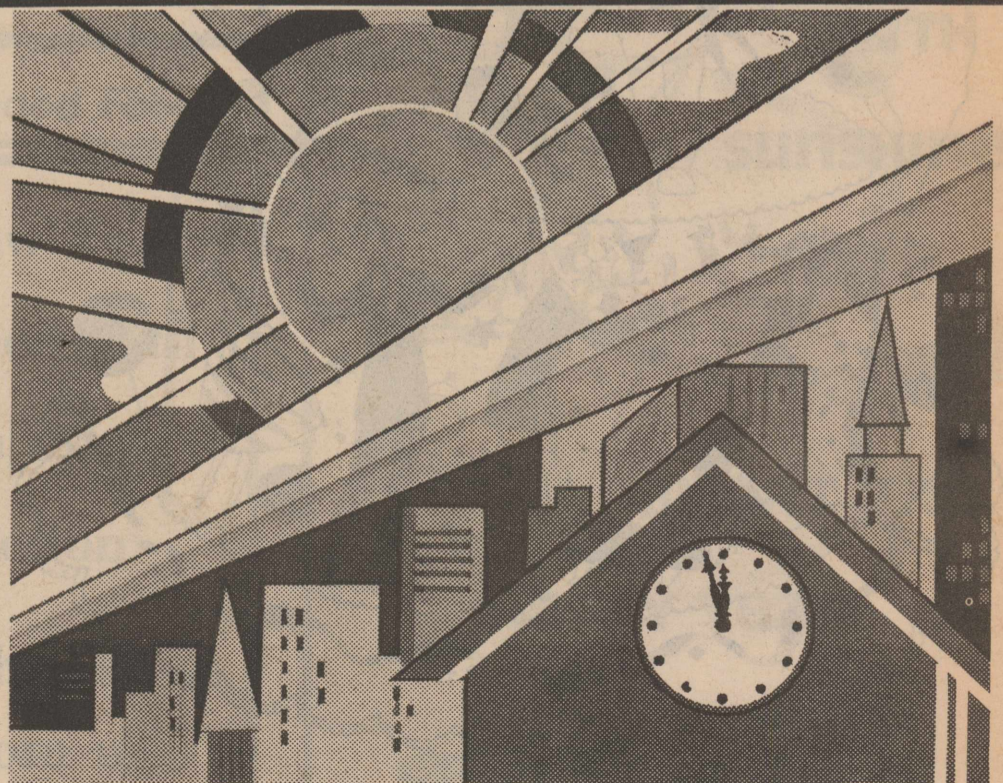

Lonnie and Cindy Davis were first place winners in a mixed doubles tennis tournament held Sunday, Sept. 11.

Hart Lions named Lesa Higgins as their new Sweetheart.

Irene Keating, Castro County Extension Agent, received the Distinguished Service Award for 1977 at the National Association of Extension Home Economists held in Soston.

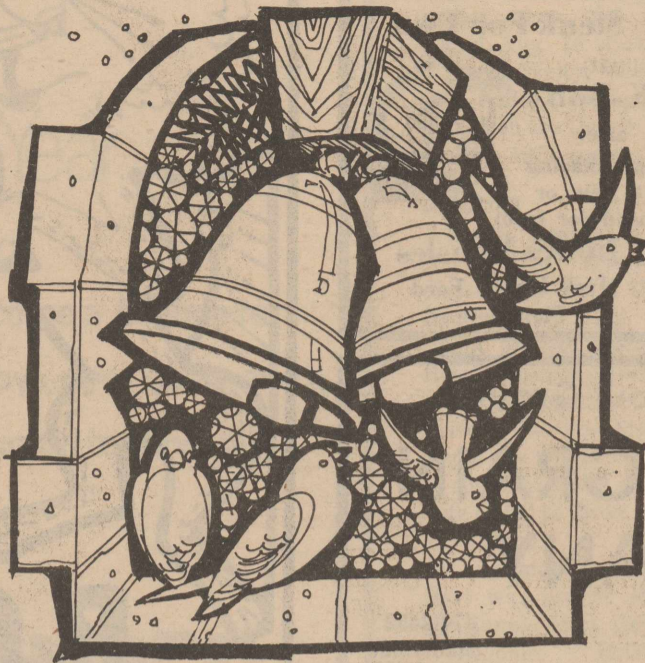

1 c sugar
1 T each salt, celery salt, dry
mustard

Combine vinegar, oil, sugar

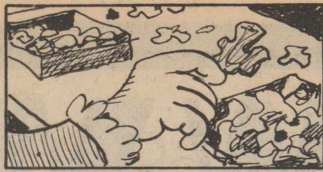
Band Boosters Meet Jan. 5

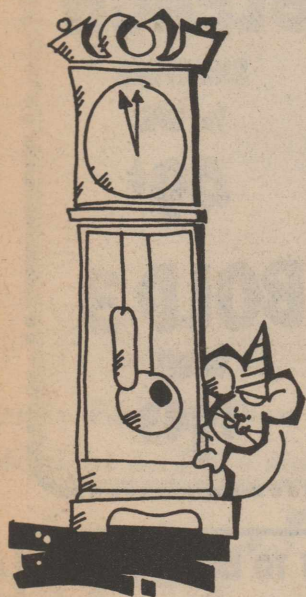
