WAYS AND MEANS—TARIFF AND WHISKEY.

After the crisis of 1837 he purchased largely from those who were forced to sell at a sacrifice, and it was then that he was supposed to have laid the foundation of the colossal fortune of which he died possessed, amounting, it is estimated, to about \$20,000,000. He was anxious enough to see the coming storm in 1860, and prepared for it. He entered into contract with manufacturers for goods that would be in demand during the war, and when hostilities came on the government found that he had monopolized the blankets and woollen goods of the country, and that purchases for army accounts would have to be made of him. It is conceded that in his dealings with the government he was fair and liberal, exacting nothing more than a fair profit on the investments he had made.

the position, and he was obliged to decline, though so anxious was he to have the management of the financial affairs of the government that he offered to relinquish his immense interest in business, and appropriate the profits during his term of office to the poor of New York.

Mr. Stewart was undoubtedly the greatest merchant of his day. Twenty-two hundred persons had employment in his stores, and the sales range from sixty to eighty-five thousand dollars a day. The duties paid by him on imported goods, average thirty thousand gold dollars per day.

In personal appearance there was nothing remarkable about Mr. Stewart. Of medium height and rather slender build, brown hair and beard, thoughtful but not stern expression, and distant manners, he was always restrained, but never cold or repellent. He had the reputation of being hospital but unostentatious, and enjoyed the name of an honest and thoroughly upright man.—Galveston News.

OTTING AFFRAY.

A cutting scrape occurred between two sailors on Kuhn's Wharf about half-past one o'clock A. M. Sunday. It seems that a man had been blood between the parties for some time; and Thos. Sullivan, the man who did the cutting, bears a very bad character for his free use of the knife. At the time in question Sullivan, who is employed on the steamer San Antonio, saw Jan. Burns, who is a sailor on the steamer San Jacinto, in a saloon, and entered the room for the avowed purpose of raising a fight, and speaking a few words, cut Burns in the region of the groin, inflicting what was thought at the time to be a dangerous wound, but which afterwards proved to be not dangerous in itself, and only a bad cut on the thigh. He was taken to the City Hospital, from which he was taken by the captain of the San Jacinto, after bearing the statement of Dr. Campbell that the cut was not deep, and only required a little sticking plaster to keep the edges together until it healed.

Sullivan was committed to the county jail on the charge of an assault with attempt to commit murder. He will be examined this morning at 10 o'clock by Justice Johnson of the second precinct.—Galveston News.
