

Terry Ellison hired as new junior high principal

Terry Ellison, presently the assistant principal of the Dimmitt Middle School, grades four through eight, has been hired by the Lockney Independent School District to replace Raymond Lusk at Lockney Junior High. Lusk is leaving Lockney to take the superintendent's position in Wellman.

Ellison has been the assistant principal in Dimmitt for the past eight years.

He holds both a bachelor's degree and a masters degree. He graduated from Hardin-Simmons University in 1968 with a bachelor of arts degree. In 1977 he earned a master of education degree at West Texas State University.

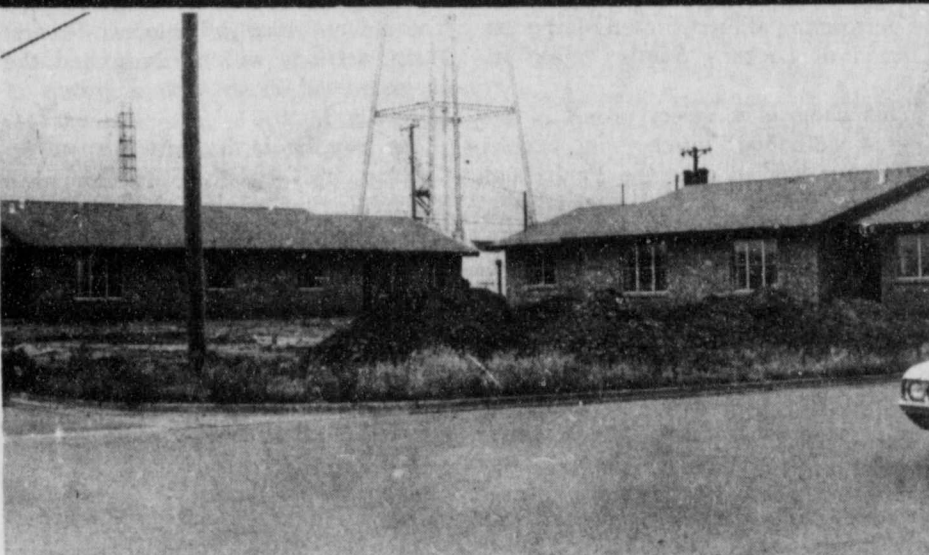
His first teaching position was in his hometown of Aspermont from 1970 to 1971 where he taught speech therapy. He moved to Dimmitt in 1971 and taught speech in grades 9 through 12 for a year. In 1972 he taught history to grades 7, 9, 10, 11, and 12 for four years before becoming vocational adjustment coordinator from 1976 to 1977. In this

position he ran a job program for the Plan A students. In 1977 he served in the assistant principal's position, serving in that position for the past eight years.

Ellison will be moving to Lockney with his wife, Zelda and daughter Tiffany, a third grader. They are affiliated with the First Baptist Church. Ellison has served on several committees and also as a Sunday school teacher.

Mrs. Ellison graduated from Hardin-Simmons in 1971 with a bachelor of science degree with a double major of business and education. She has 14 years teaching experience in English and typing. She presently teaches eighth grade English in Dimmitt.

Ellison is a member of the Masonic Lodge. His professional organizational affiliations include the Texas State Teachers' Association, Texas Association of Secondary School Principals, and Phi Delta Kappa.

Lockney Housing Authority project nears completion

Those who have observed the three Lockney Housing Authority project sights recently may have noticed that the units are nearing completion.

The three project sights include one south of the Lockney City Hall. This sight contains four units: two 2 bedroom units, one 3 bedroom unit, and one 4 bedroom unit. These units face the east and south and will be fenced.

The second sight, to the northeast of Baccus Motor Company, contains six 3 bedroom units and will also be fenced.

The third sight is on the lot at West Locust and Washington Streets. The units on this lot include six 1 bedroom units, and four 2 bedroom units. The one bedroom units are designed to accommodate the elderly and handicapped citizens. Access will be gained from Locust Street. Access for the two bedroom units will be gained from Washington Street.

There are 20 units in all in the project and are geared toward low income, elderly, and handicapped citizens. The rent requirements for these housing units will be based on 30% of a families income with an allowance for the gas and electricity bills. Master water meters will be situated at each of the sights to allow for the upkeep of the yards of each sight.

All of the units will have off street parking so as not to hamper the flow of traffic on streets surrounding the units.

In a recent meeting of the Lockney Housing Authority Board of Directors, the board reviewed applications for an executive director and Linda Lemons was appointed to that position. Lemons will not begin taking applications for the units for a few more weeks, but when the applications have arrived the Beacon will inform the public.

FFA students return from trip to Capitan, New Mexico

Fourteen Lockney FFA students along with teacher Randall Robbins, his wife and two daughters returned last week from a trip to Capitan, New Mexico. The 5-day trip was sponsored by the Lockney FFA.

While in Capitan, the students stayed on the Lone Tree Ranch and enjoyed several activities including repelling down cliffs, trail riding, camping out. Highlighting the trip was the Lockney FFA Intramural Rodeo in which many of the students along with Robbins competed.

All twenty of the new housing units are described as single family dwellings. Limits will be placed on how many people may reside in each of the units. These limits will be much like those which now govern the Lockney Housing Development units on North Main.

Also those residing in the new units will be expected to meet certain guidelines. They include filling out an application which will be reviewed. Applicants will be researched and some of the things checked will be the renter's ability to meet financial obligations including past rent and mortgage payments. Also reviewed will be the renter's past association with neighbors. Records of past disturbances with neighbors will be checked along with records of property destruction and housekeeping habits from past residences. All of these items will be researched to protect the safety, welfare, and health of nearby residents. Criminal records will also be checked.

All of the new units are expected to be complete by the end of July according to the Barbara Ellis of Parkhill, Smith, and Cooper of Lubbock. "We don't expect to begin occupying the units until some time in August," said Ellis.

Executive director Linda Lemons said, "I have had lots of people in asking about the units, but at this time I don't have the necessary applications. Until they come in, I can't do anything. Lots of the people that have inquired about the units think that the rent is free, but it's not. It will be based on the family income, and many people don't seem to understand this."

Lockney area farmers begin 1985 wheat harvest

The first loads of wheat in the Lockney area were delivered to Lockney area elevators beginning on Saturday, May 25, and continue coming in.

The first loads of wheat in the Lockney area were delivered to Lockney area elevators beginning on Tuesday, May 28, and continue coming in.

The first load of wheat was brought into Patterson Grain on May 28 by Byron Brock. The load had a 59 pound test weight and a moisture count of 10.1.

Other elevators are also receiving wheat from area farmers. Barwise received their first load from Johnny Miller and it had a test weight of 56 and a moisture count of 13.5.

Loads coming in on May 29 included Charlie Carthel to the Lockney Coop with a test weight of 61 and moisture 10. That same day Muncy Elevator got its first load from Carthel Brothers. Test weight was 57 and the moisture reading was 12.2. On that same day the elevator at South Plains received its first load from Troy Taylor; it had a 60 pound test weight and a 7.50 moisture count. Lone Star Grain Company also received their first load on May 29 from Angel Araujo. The load tested 59 pounds and had a moisture content of 15.2.

Sterley Elevator received its first load on May 30 from C.L. Henderson. It tested 62 pounds per bushel and 10.9 moisture. The Sandhill Elevator received a load on June 1 from Stinson Stringer. It had a moisture reading of 12.0 and a test weight of 61.

Most all of the wheat that is being cut now is dryland and according to Kelton Shaw, owner of Patterson Grain and Lone Star Grain Company, "the yields are better than we had expected this year."

Delton Stone, manager of the Lockney Coop, said the dryland production is very good.

This year area farmers faced something that has not been seen in this area for many years: spring wheat rust. Most area farmers did not recognize the rust problem until it was economically unfeasible to apply fungicide to combat the problem.

Many made the decision not to spray their wheat since the problem seemed to be minimal; however, the rains in April and May aggravated what was a small problem and made it worse. With the moisture and the warm spring days, the problem became major. By the time farmers realized that, it was too late to spray the wheat.

As a result of the rust problem the irrigated wheat production this year will be down. In a year when conditions were otherwise just right for an excellent wheat crop, the yields have been decreased. Full assessment will be known closer to the completion of harvest.

Said Delton Stone, manager of the Lockney Coop, "I doubt that we will see much of the irrigated wheat make more than 40 bushels to the acre. The dryland wheat was apparently further along and did not get hit by the rust, but the irrigated got hit real bad."

Gossett pursues career despite hearing loss

Reprinted here are excerpts from an article from the Bryan-College Station Eagle, May 18, 1985, by Daniel Puckett. Subject of the article is Ruanna Myers Gossett, daughter of Wiley J. (Jackie) Myers and Marjorie Myers, both of Lubbock. Ruanna is a granddaughter of Mrs. Olive Myers of Lockney, and niece of Merle Mooney of Lockney.

Ruanna Gossett is bright, graduating in the top half of her class. She was one of 136 people who recently received doctorates in veterinary medicine from Texas A&M University.

She's competitive, being one of only three in her class to earn an internship for post-graduate work. She will be moving soon with her husband, Lonny, to Raleigh, North Carolina, to begin the internship at North Carolina State University.

She's popular, having won an award based in part on a vote by the members of the class. Last year she won two awards: outstanding student of her veterinary class and one given to the student who best demonstrated exemplary dedication, perseverance and loyalty to the study of veterinary medicine. This year she won an award given to a graduating student who has significantly enhanced the prestige of the college.

But when Gossett crossed the stage during graduation, she couldn't hear the applause. She's deaf.

Dr. Gossett concedes that her hearing loss had made those distinctions harder to achieve. "Some (handicapped) people just give up," she said. "But if I had just sat at home every day and hadn't tried, I think I'd be a little disappointed with myself."

A hearing aid restores her hearing to about one-half of the normal level, but that's still not enough to understand conversations unless she reads the speaker's lips. In lectures, instructors are often too far away to register on the hearing aid, and they often turn away

from the class to point to specimens or slides. So she used a special device that receives signals sent by a microphone that the lecturer wears. She sometimes borrows other students' notes to catch what she missed.

In surgery, she can't read lips because of the doctors' masks. She says that she tries to make up for the problem by being prepared.

In small-animal medicine, the area she prefers, Gossett uses a stethoscope with an amplifier. She said she can't hear some problems, like heart murmurs and some breathing difficulties. "I will always have some trouble with that, but knowing my limitations, I can make up for them to a certain extent."

Gossett has had a long time to learn to cope. Her parents and teachers noticed her hearing loss when she was six years old. By that time, she says she had taught herself to read lips.

The native of Lubbock didn't let her deafness stop her. She attended public schools and went to junior college on a tennis scholarship. She earned a bachelor of science in chemistry and biology from the University of Texas at the Permian Basin.

Dr. Gossett credits her parents and her husband Lonny with the encouragement needed to follow her dreams. "My parents have always known it would be difficult for me, but they never told me that I couldn't do something. They never limited me."

There are some things she can't do, like use the telephone. Her husband answers the phone and sometimes puts her on another phone. He listens and mouths the words the caller is saying so that she can carry on a conversation.

Dr. Gossett is not sure about her plans in veterinary medicine. "I might want a residency or I might want to go into private practice. We don't know if we will stay in North Carolina or return to Texas. I have all sorts of possibilities."

Checkpoint Charlie, a gap in the Berlin wall, is the best-known crossing between the Communist and noncommunist worlds. On the western side tourists, anticommunist demonstrators and allied guards watch heavily armed East German sentinels watching them.

In anticipation of tourists this summer blue-uniformed East German workers have begun to spruce up Charlie. Already the wall of concrete and barbed wire built in 1961 has been replaced by one of smooth white stone. One of the high, prison-style watchtowers was torn down. Now East German guards look their allied counterparts straight in the eye from 150 feet away.

Their countries still don't see eye to eye about what Checkpoint Charlie

actually is. The Western allies say it's only a "demarcation line" between the allied and Soviet sectors of Berlin, which was jointly occupied by the United States, Britain, France, and Russia at the end of World War II. A museum on the west side of Checkpoint Charlie has an exhibit showing the ingenuity East Germans have used to get over it: 4,875 have escaped, at least 80 have died trying.

The blond-looking new wall is fortified on the eastern side by a system of mine fields, tank traps, and automatic firing machines. "They're trying to make Charlie look less like the entrance to a prison," says one British official who passes through the checkpoint regularly. "Which, of course it is."

Social Security News

Jim is typical of many disabled people who receive social security or supplemental security income (SSI) checks. He'd much rather work but isn't sure if he could hold a job. And if benefits were cut off, he could be out on a limb.

After getting a part-time job offer, Jim talks with a social security representative. He learns there are several provisions that help disabled people who want to work. That is, incentives to help those who wish to work in spite of their disabling impairment. They ease the transition from disability to ability. And they provide safeguards if things

don't work out.

Trial work period: Most disabled beneficiaries can continue to receive full benefits for up to 9 months while testing their ability to work. After the trial work period, a decision is made as to whether the work was "substantial and gainful." If it is, benefits end after a 3-month adjustment period. If it is not, payments continue.

Unsuccessful work attempt: In some instances, short periods of work above the substantial gainful activity level can be treated as unsuccessful work attempts and discounted when considering whether disability has ceased.

Deductible work expenses: Most impairment-related work expenses a person pays for can be deducted in deciding whether he or she can perform substantial gainful work. Examples include medical devices and equipment, attendant care, unusual transportation costs, and drugs and services required because of the impairment.

Special rules help disabled people who work:

Extended period of disability: A severely disabled person who stops work or whose earnings fall below the substantial gainful activity level within 15 months after the trial work period generally can have payments started again without the need for a new application.

Continuation of medicare: If social security checks stop because a person who is still disabled returns to work, medicare coverage generally can continue for 2 to 3 years after payments stop.

Continuation of SSI payments: In some cases, an SSI beneficiary who is still disabled can continue to be eligible for SSI payments and Medicaid even though performing substantial gainful work. As a person's earnings increase, however, the SSI payment will gradually decrease until it is phased out. However, a person may continue to be eligible for Medicaid and social services if he or she cannot work without this assistance and does not earn enough to pay for similar help.

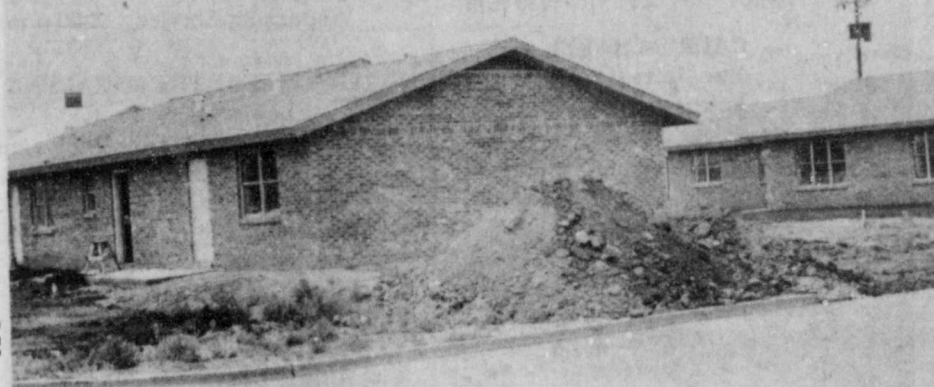

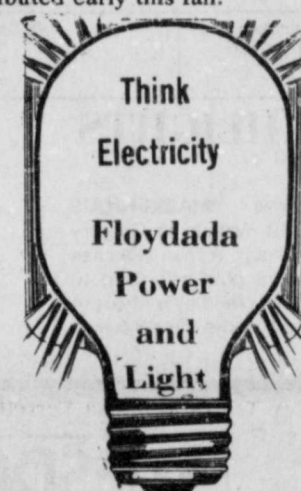
