Milton Barrick Dies; Arlington Architect

ARLINGTON — Milton Barrick, 50, of 1311 Hillcrest Drive, an architect who had lived here about 14 years, died Saturday in a Dallas hospital.

A Rising Star native, Barrick graduated from Texas Tech in 1940 with a degree in

architectural engineering.

During World War II, he served with Army engineers assigned to the Air Corps in Canada and Alaska.

He was a member of the board of directors of the Tarrant County Council for Retarded Children, the American Institute of Architects, the Civitan Club and Aldersgate Methodist Church.

Surviving are his wife; two sons, Larry and Rex Barrick of Arlington; a daughter, Rhew Ann Barrick of Arlington; his mother, Mrs. C. M. Barrick of Abernathy; three brothers, Clayton and Hilburn Barrick of Abernathy and Dr. L. D. Barrick of Chatman, N.J., and three sisters, Mrs. W. W. Allen of Plainview, Mrs. Marvin Coy of Lubbock

and Mrs. E. H. Fuchs of Ruidoso, N.M.

Milton was graduated from Abernathy High School in 1935.

Last rites were conducted Monday at Moore Funeral Chapel in Arlington with burial in Moore Memorial Gardens.

Petersburg Man Found Fatally Shot On Farm

PETERSBURG (Special) — A Abernathy, Opal Pierson and 33-year-old Petersburg man was found dead of a gunshot wound view, and Mrs. Floyd Breeding at the side of his pickup truck of Chino Valley, Ariz. about 7:30 a.m. Saturday.

Billie Clayton Pierson of Rt. 1, Abernathy, was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Delbert Beaton of Abernathy.

Beaton ruled that Pierson died of an accidentally inflicted gunshot wound of the head.

The body was discovered on land owned by Pierson one mile northeast of FM-457 by Preston Samuel, who lives nearby.

School Board Member

Pierson was struck in the forehead by a shotgun blast as he apparently tried to remove a shotgun from a gun case, Beaton said.

The incident also was investigated by the Hale County Sheriff's Department.

A native of Petersburg, Pierson had lived in the Petersburg area all his life. He was a member of the Petersburg School Board and was a graduate of Petersburg High School.

Survivors include his wife; two daughters, Deborah Kay and Cynthia Michele, both of the home; two sons, Sammy Paul and Stacy Brent, both of the home; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. I. Pierson of Plainview; four brothers, Walter of Hereford, D. W. of Bovina, Joe of Burleson and Virgil of Petersburg; and five sisters, Mrs. A. D. Helms and Ethel Pierson, both of

Mr. Pierson was born May 13, 1935 in Petersburg, lived in Petersburg all his life and graduated from Petersburg High School in 1953. February 3, 1955

he married the former Delores La France. Engaged in farming in the Petersburg area for several years, Mr. Pierson was a member of the Petersburg school board and was a member of the South Side Assembly of God in Plainview.

Funeral services were held Monday at Southside Assembly of God Church, Pastor M. W. Putnam officiated. He was assisted by the Rev. Homer T. Goodwin of Hereford. Burial was in Parklawn Cemetery.

Things To Remember In Watering Gregg 25V

25V holds up longer than any other cotton after the last water — on most soils from 2 to 3 weeks longer.

The important thing to watch is the take-off date, which we recommend generally between July 15th and August 1st.

Start watering as early as you wish, but the first irrigation should be finished before the first bloom.

43% of our cotton this year is May cotton. The remainder was replanted June 5, of which we lost 13 acres, and this was again replanted June 15. We will start watering our 25V about July 5. Considering the year with its set-backs and replants we will irrigate only once, and will finish our 25V by July 25.

It is a known fact that with all crops, whether grain sorghum, soybeans, small grains, or others, that the early maturing varieties need irrigation in the growing season sooner than the long-season varieties. 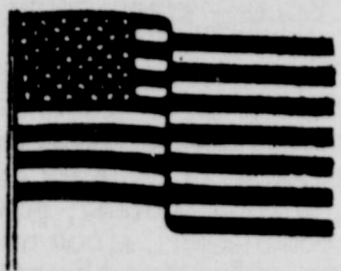
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NEW STORY FOR OLD GLORY

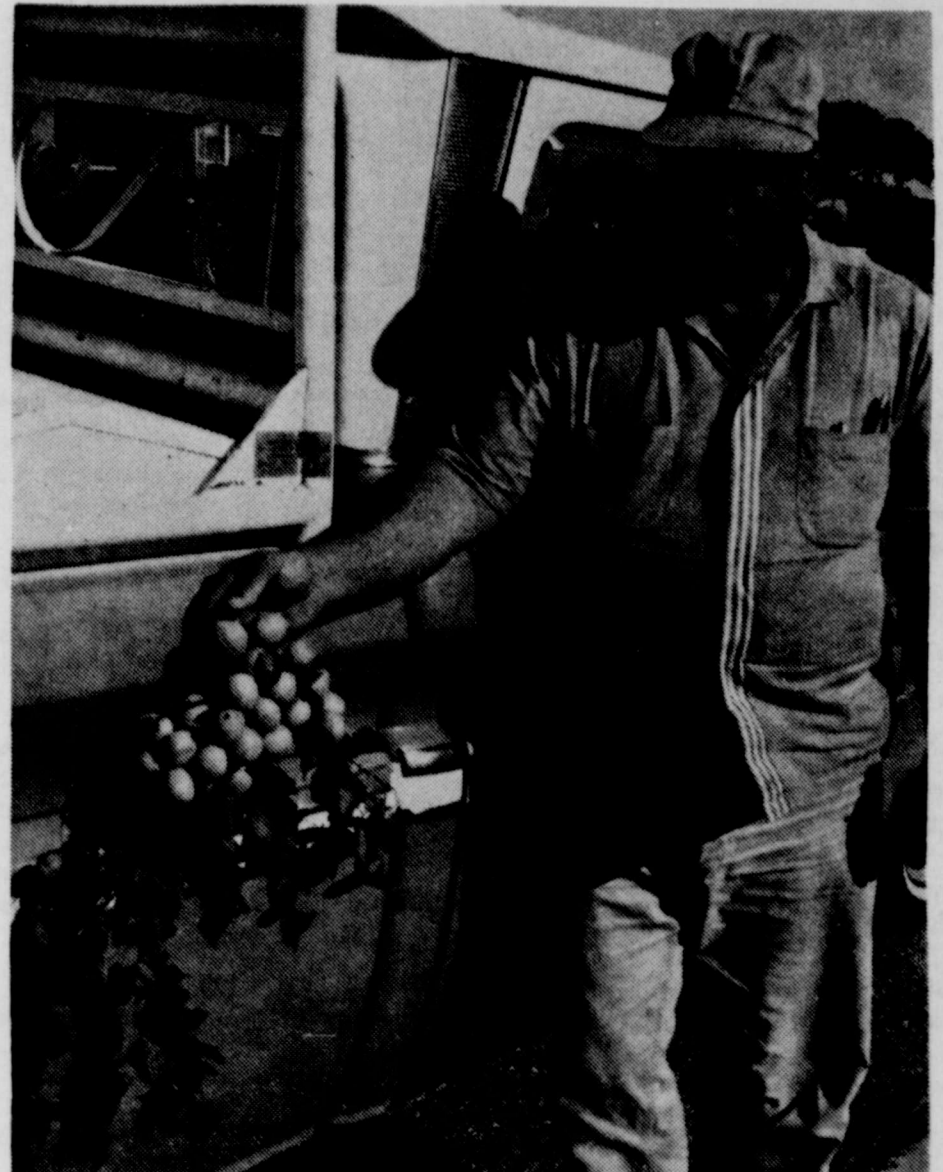
