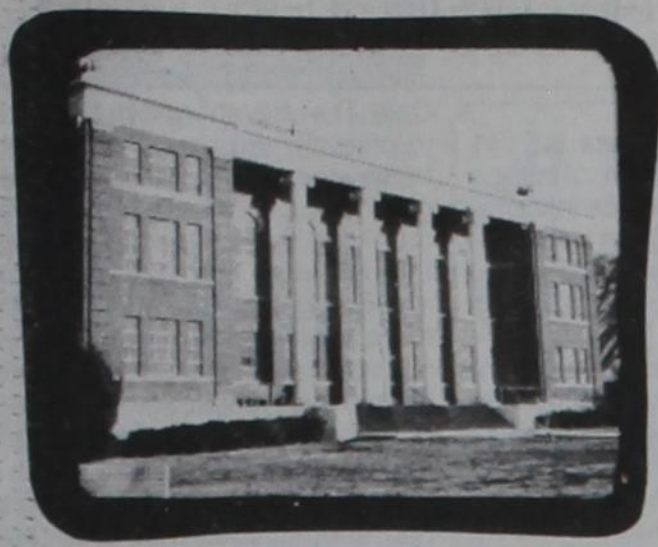

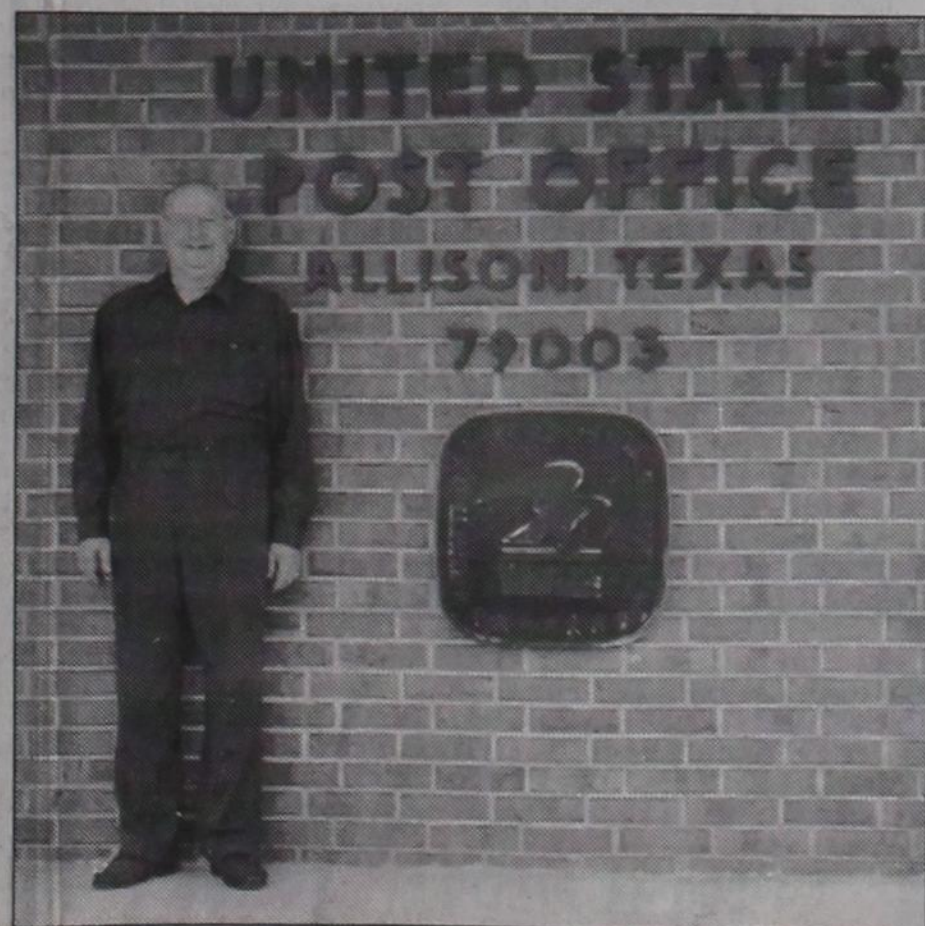

Commemoration Sun., Sept 19 Of Lyman Wagon Train Seige

130 years ago September 1874, the prairies were unplowed and the hills were unmarked, but a 3 day siege was occurring to Capt. Wylls Lyman and his 36 wagon supply train in South East Hemphill County by a combined force of Comanches, Kiowas, and Cheyenne Indians. This siege was part of the Red River War that the American Military was carrying into the remote region of the Texas Panhandle attempting to relocate the "Hostile Indian Forces" back to the reservations.

On September 19th, 2004 there will be a commemoration of the Lyman Wagon Train siege at the actual location beginning at 1:30 P.M. The re-enactors and living

Co. Commissioners Meet Monday; Re-enstate Burn Ban As Of Thurs.

The Wheeler County Commissioner's Court met in regular session on Monday, September 13, 2004, at the Courthouse Annex at 410 South Main Street in Wheeler. Seventeen items were on the agenda.

The court approved the minutes of the previous meeting as presented. The commissioners voted to accept the reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Treasurer, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment. The only change in the budget was a line item change in the account for the County Attorney.

The commissioners took a walk over to the courthouse square to observe a situation concerning the handicapped parking on the north side of the square. In order to make the area level for the parking, it will be necessary to cut and fill on each end of the area. This will have to be done in conjunction with Highway 152; work is scheduled to be done to the road in that area. The problem will be discussed with the Texas Highway Dept.

Due to the dry conditions in most of the county, the court voted to re-enstate the burn ban, as of Thursday, Sept. 16, 2004, for a period of three months.

Two proposals were received concerning the installation of equipment for wireless internet. The commissioners will do further study on this situation before accepting either bid.

The court voted to adopt a resolution to approve the Indigent Defense Grant program.

The commissioners voted to extend their contract with Texas VINE.

Mona Gordy met with the court for permission to lay a water line in the ditch along County Road 2 for a distance of 920'. The request was granted with the understanding the line would be 36" deep and the county is not responsible if the line is cut during the maintenance

of the road. Mrs. Gordy stated they would place a water storage tank near the road for use by the area fire departments, should the need arise.

Two road crossings were approved. Enbridge Pipelines will lay a line under County Roads 28 and B.

The commissioners approved the joining of the TEXAS YES program. It will be of no expense to the county.

Gary Hukill, Sales Manager for Guardian Security Services presented the court with information concerning a security system for the courthouse. The county's present system is out dated, but the court is not sure what can be installed without checking with Texas Historical Commission.

The court agreed to appoint a committee to set up a "Sick Pool" for county employees. Employees can volunteer to donate some of their earned sick leave to be placed in a pool. Should the need arise by any employee in the pool for additional sick leave it can be borrowed from the pool after all their leaves are used. Fortunately, this has

Hitting The Streets

HITTING THE STREETS
APD Rookies To Train In The Field

Amarillo's 14 newest police officers spent five months striving for perfection.

Now it's time to get real. With 888 classroom hours behind them, graduates of the Amarillo Police Academy are starting 16 weeks of field training.

The new officers will work regular shifts periled with experienced officers who mentor them and sometimes let them fail.

"I'm expecting them (the rookies) to make mistakes. They wouldn't be human if they didn't," said Sgt. Michael Allen, academy coordinator.

Cpl. John Call, who has served five years as a field training officer, or FTO, agreed.

"You're learning. You're going to mess up," he said. "That's acceptable as long as you learn from those mistakes and go on."

The Amarillo Police Department takes field training so seriously that the FTOs document in detail what the new officers accomplish each day of their approximately 640 hours of field training.

The rookies must successfully complete 199 tasks during the FTO period, Allen said.

The goal is for them to hit the streets in mid-November as full-fledged officers with the equivalent of two years of experience, Allen said.

That's a lot to compress into 16 weeks, but the key is to take it slowly.

For four weeks, the rookies handle roughly 25 percent of the work and each FTO handles 75 percent.

During the next four weeks, the new officers shift to completing about 50 percent of the work involved in their shift. They also initiate more of the face-to-face interactions with people, taking what Allen calls an "out-front role."

A good FTO will let them struggle at times, or even make a bad decision, he said, unless it might endanger lives or cause some other serious problem.

"The worst thing is not making a decision," Allen said.

Call said rookie officers must learn new ways of dealing with people.

"You treat each of these people totally differently," Call said.

Ultimately, success is handling the situation appropriately, with the least amount of force necessary, he said.

As field training progresses, the rookies reach a three-week evaluation phase in which they do all the work and the FTO is there mainly to observe.

Call said APD's program ensures that rookies work different shifts and are paired with different FTOs during each phase.

"Each recruit is going to learn different things from each FTO," Call said.

"There's going to be techniques and tactics that each officer uses."

APD has 55 FTOs chosen because they are solid officers with a flair for teaching, Allen said.

Trey Hart is one of the new police officers. He is the son of Jim and Landi Hart of Shamrock, Texas, and grandson of Doug and Mia Robertson of Shamrock, Texas.

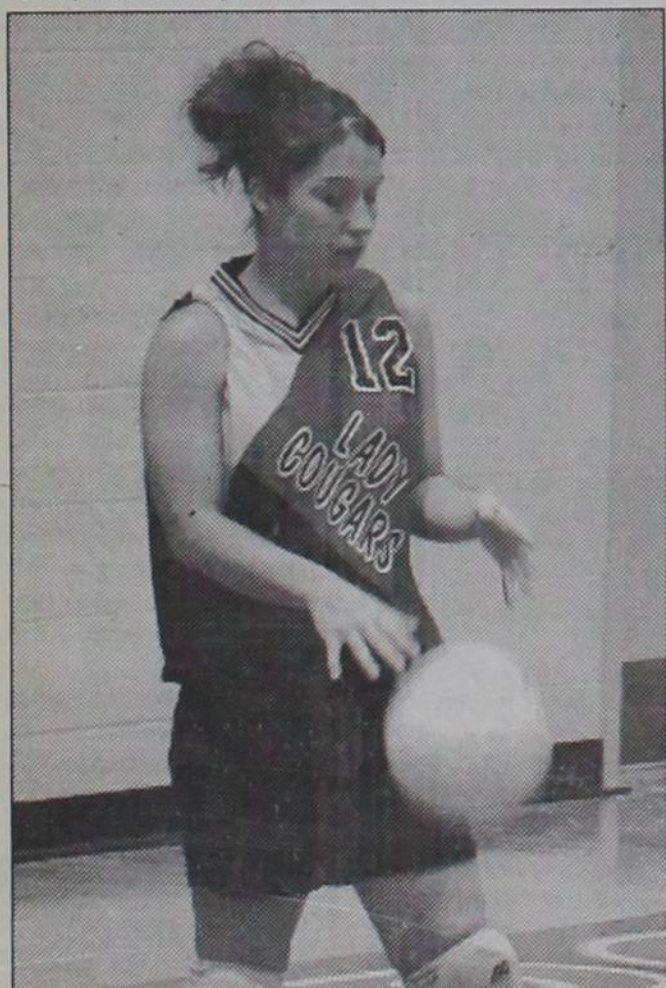

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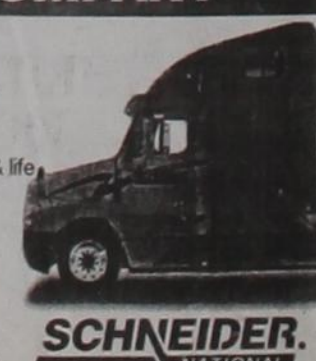
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FOOTNOTES

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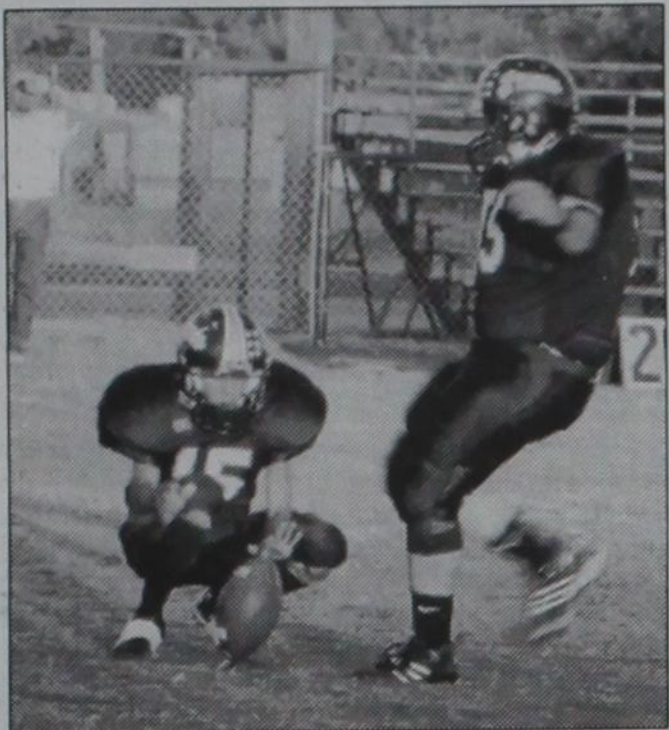

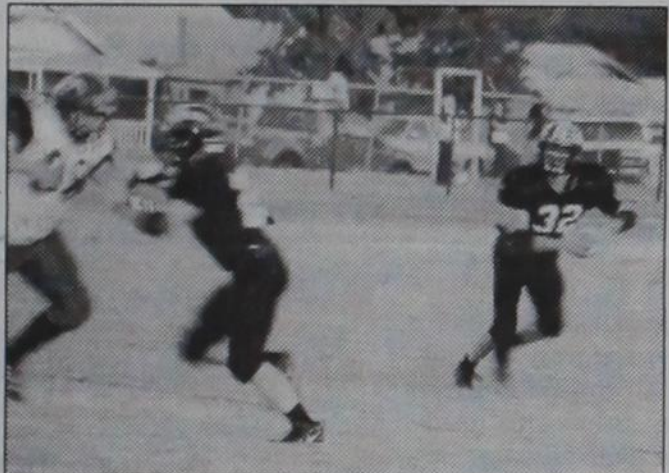

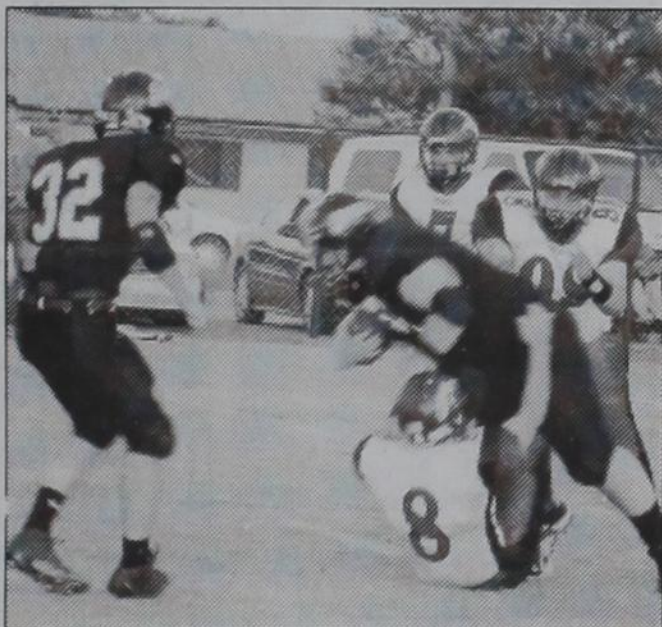

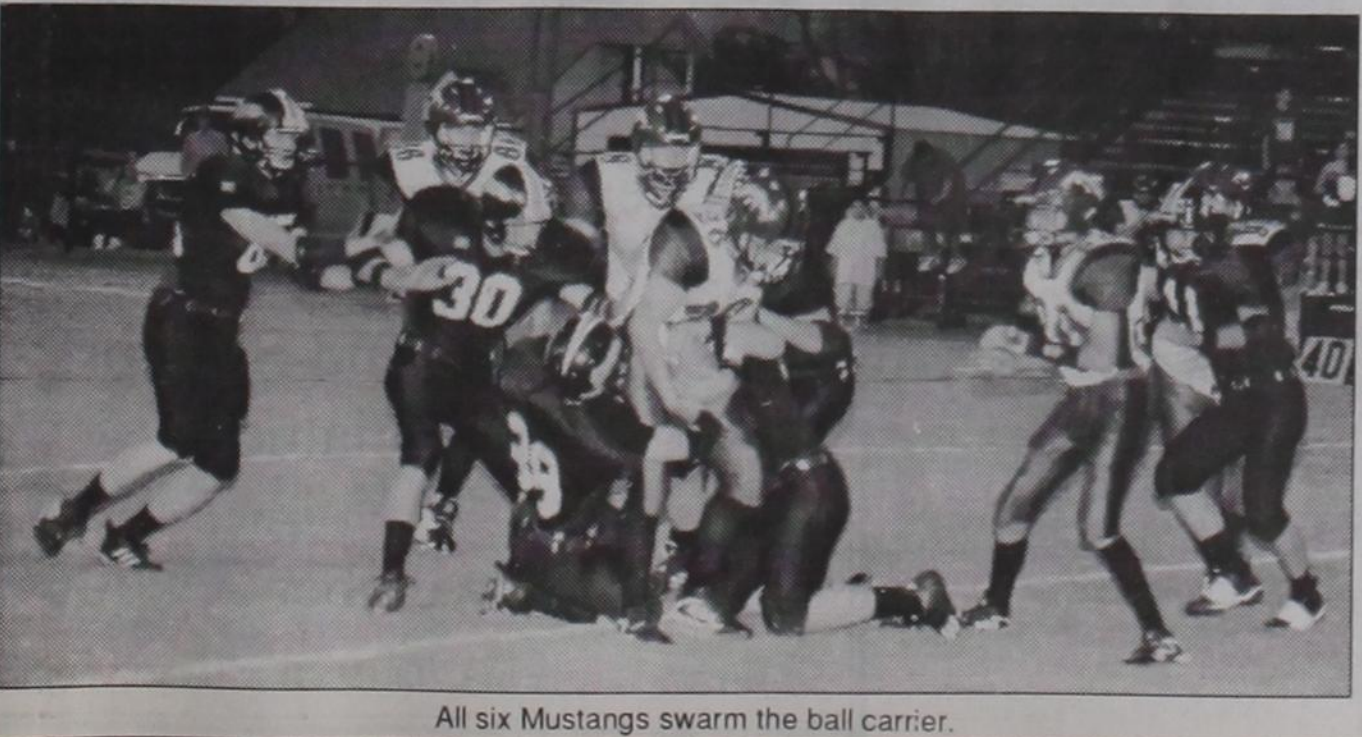

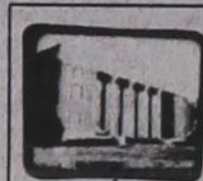
as it is in Heaven! Following the will of Jesus has brought me peace and joy! And the great hope of Heaven eternally!! If I stay in the Lord's will!
